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EDITORIAL ...

"... WILL HE GIVE HIM A STONE?"

We who are parents share a like concern for our children. We feel a constant urgency to provide for their needs both physically and mentally that they might be prepared for this life and the demands of the world to which they will be subject. Those of us who have a Christian background are concerned also for their life hereafter. Our responsibility can become a heavy weight on our shoulders when we see that the natural desires of mankind to pursue the things in this life often out balance the desires of that which would bring eternal life. In consequence of this, we are aroused in our anxieties to give many words of counsel to our young. The age old fact is, however, that our words of counsel are of little value unless we live according to them ourselves.

Our little children mimic our behavior. They learn more from example by what they see and hear us do and say than they do from our instructions. As they grow up, they feel the need to develop their individualism. Their right to choose others as their examples is often offensive to us parents. If a child has a basic urge to follow the examples that are substantially true, he will objectively compare the counsel with the one who gives it. Many young people have been turned in disappointment by seeing that the counselor did not live up to his own counsel.

These facts only increase our anxieties as we repeatedly feel the grasp of our individual weaknesses bring us to a point of despair. Our parental concern like a sharp knife stabs us at the very core of our personal motivations. If only I could rid myself of that which would be a stumbling block to my loved ones!

At this point of parental concern we might appreciate more the expression of Jesus Christ when he wept over the city of Jerusalem and upon one occasion said, "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, . . . how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!" (Matt. 23:37) We might also consider these words of assurance which Christ spoke to his disciples: "If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone? or if he ask a fish, will he for a fish give him a scorpion? If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?" (Luke 11:11-13)

I trust that there is none among us who as parents would deliberately give unto their children that which would not be to their good. As we are guided by this standard of behavior, we can in turn trust our Heavenly Father to give unto us and our children those things that are to our good through the medium of the Holy Spirit.

Looking into this scripture further, I see another viewpoint to objectively consider. Have we as parents unwittingly at times handed to our son or daughter a "stone" of our own biased wills that has resulted as a great weight upon their unseasoned judgment of good and evil? Has our undisciplined tongue issued forth the "serpent" of prejudiced words which would bring spiritual death to our own loved ones? Have our children looked to us for the truth that would nourish their souls and instead receive the "scorpion's" repelling sting of the precepts of our own making? At our best we are subject to be misguided in the upbringing of our own children. How can we therefore be assured that we have done all that is required of us?

The lifelong necessity of prayer is undoubtedly the first and most important factor in the raising of our children. The sincere expression of prayer can unburden the build-up of anxiety that is in the heart of a parent and consequently avert misguided words that would repel the son or daughter. Words of counsel cannot be expected to bring guidance to a child if they are blurted out in threats of anger or fear. A parent with self-contained sternness can more effectively counsel his child than one who lets his emotions get above him. Therefore the channel of prayer can alleviate anxiety giving the assurance that all young people seek.

The greatest experience of success as a parent would be in the realizing that their son or daughter has learned to shoulder the responsibility of their own behavior. To guide a child into the path of selfresponsibility is a talent that unfortunately many of us do not have. Somewhere and somehow we must find a means of filling in our lack of ability.

As we look about us we find that some in unfortunate circumstances have risen above such conditions by their own determinations. Many have made their life worth living by rising above averse conditions in exercising the abundant gift of hope that an all wise Heavenly Father saw fit to give them in their youth. By observing these facts we should realize that God can help us and our children if we are willing to put our trust in Him and look more positively to the actual accomplishment of good.

The responsibility of teaching our youth to communicate to God through prayer and teaching them to respond to the guidance of the Holy Spirit is an absolute necessity considering the many oppositions that exist today. A lesson of counseling that was brought to me in my youth was a challenge that my father placed before me when I was in my teens. He handed me the Book of Mormon and asked me to read it and pray over it that God might give me evidence of its truthfulness. It was several years after that that I felt the need to do as he asked. God being patient and merciful gave me evidence by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that I cannot deny except that I deny God also.

This challenge is written within the Book of Mormon itself: "Behold, I would exhort you that when ye shall read these things, if it be wisdom in God that ye should read them, that ye would remember how merciful the Lord hath been unto the children of men, from the creation of Adam, even down until the time that ye shall receive these things, and ponder it in your hearts. And when ye shall receive these things, I would exhort you that ye would ask God, the eternal Father, in the name of Christ, if these things are not true; and if ye shall ask with a sincere heart, with real intent, having faith in Christ, he will manifest the truth of it unto you, by the power of the Holy Ghost; and by the power of the Holy Ghost, ye may know the truth of all things. And whatsoever thing is good, is just and true; wherefore, nothing that is good denieth the Christ, but acknowledgeth that he is." (Moroni 10:3-6)

It is important that we teach our children to take all things to God in prayer that they "... may know the truth of all things." Teaching them in this manner will give to them the feeling of responsibility as well as giving them assurance through a higher power than themselves.

Joseph Smith as a young lad went to the woods to pray taking the words of James literally which says: "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him." (James 1:5) How important it is that we keep our faith in God simple and not let it become complicated with human reasoning. We are to be as little children in our attitude toward God. It behooves us then to train our children to exercise their faith early in life that they might retain their simple faith.

One of the greatest lessons of counseling to be found in the scriptures are the words of Alma to his son Helaman: "O remember my son, and learn wisdom in thy youth; yea, learn in thy youth to keep the commandments of God; yea, and cry unto God for all thy support; yea, let all thy doings be unto the Lord, and whithersoever thou goest, let it be in the Lord; yea, let thy thoughts be directed unto the Lord; yea, let the affections of thy heart be placed upon the Lord for ever; counsel the Lord in all thy doings, and he will direct thee for good; yea, when thou liest down at night, lie down unto the Lord, that he may watch over you in your sleep; and when thou risest in the morning, let thy heart be full of thanks unto God; and if ye do these things, ye shall be lifted up at the last day." (Alma 17:68-70)

Has not the Lord given us sufficient instructions on how to counsel our children? Do not despair then but extend yourself in faith according to the promises of God. Continue your full concern for your child's well being, but let it be in prayer and in patient counseling.

After the amazing reception given us in Ticul by the Xiu family, on Sunday morning, February 25th, 1951, we strolled with our hosts to a shady corner of the plaza. There I presented Ramiro Lara (old Nemisio Xiu's secretary) the letter of introduction I had received from Chief Shupe-She, my Pottowatomi friend from the States. After his translation, Xiu pondered it for awhile; then he stated that if he were able to arrange a guide for us back in to the walled city we would be required to pay expenses for his transportation, lodging and food. To this we agreed. Then he informed us that he would have to call a meeting of his leaders in several villages. Their approval would be necessary in order for us to go into the area we wanted to visit; this would take some time. We agreed to this. Consequently we had a wait of two weeks before we received an answer.

In the meantime we arranged to visit the great archaeological areas, Chichen Itza and Uxmal. So, after Xiu sent out his call by Indian drums and runners and received word that the leaders would come in to meet us, he consented to go with us.

What a trip it was! First we went to Chichen Itza, which was the first of the ancient pyramid temples we had ever seen, only having read of them in books.

They surpassed in beauty and magnitude any of our imaginations. Here we spent a couple of days, then returned to Merida and Ticul by bus. After a short rest we made another trip to Uxmal and saw the imposing Temple of the Dwarf and other structures there, with their exquisitely beautiful carved mosaics in stone. As we had done at Chichen Itza we took many colored slides of the area.

Finally the day came for the meeting which Xiu had called. We met at his casa, a thatch roofed hut

in a clearing, surrounded by a high stone wall. It was a Sunday morning, hot, humid and muggy. Just before leaving our casa (by this time they had found us a small stone house to live in), while we were dressing, I was directed by the Spirit to take my Book of Mormon with me to the meeting. The thought came to me that it would be a needless weight; even carrying a few silver pesos in my pocket that morning seemed a burden. I further reasoned that my Book was printed in English and they would not understand it if I read it to them. Thus I tried to pacify my mind but that did not work. Again I was admonished to take the Book, even the third time. Still I was reluctant to do so. Then Angela spoke up.

"Clarence, you'd better take your Book of Mormon with you this morning; you may need it."

To this I rejoined that it was too hot and the book was too heavy to carry.

"Well," she said, "If you won't take it I will, for I feel impressed that you will need it."

That did it! I slipped the Book in my coat pocket and we headed for Xiu's place, which was about three kilometers across town. To my relief I forgot having this extra weight on me and we made our way without incident to our meeting place.

On our arrival, you can imagine our surprise to find the grounds around Xiu's casa filled by a large gathering of people. There were representatives of forty villages, men, women and children. The men were dressed in clean white tropicals and sandals; the women folks wore white dresses that reached their ankles. The yokes and hems of their dresses were embroidered and they wore sandals of many colors. You would have thought we were VIP's of some great government. It filled us with awe and humility to receive such a welcome.

Soon we got down to the business before us. This, of course, was accompanied by music, instruments of ancient vintage and drums to beat out the time. Among other features of the program was the "Mosquito Song", sung by young Denisio Xiu. All this had the tange of the native jungle music.

A guide, Ignacio Carrillo was selected and arrangements made for expenses. Then came the big moment for us.

Don Nemisio Xiu arose and said in Maya, "We will now have a discourse from Senor Clarence Wheaton."

For a moment I was confused as to what to say, as I had not been informed that this would happen and I had made no preparation. So I made a silent prayer for guidance and I know that Angela did the same. We had not come there as missionaries, but on an expedition in search of the walled city in the jungles. In answer to our prayers, I was then made to know the reason I had been instructed earlier to bring my Book of Mormon.

I took the Book from my coat pocket and turned to the 3rd Book of Nephi, 5th chapter. I asked Ramiro to read and interpret the following for me.

"And now it came to pass that there were a great multitude gathered together, of the people of Nephi, round about the temple which was in the land Bountiful;

"And they were marveling and wondering one with another, and were shewing one to another the great and marvelous change which had taken place;

"And they were also conversing about this Jesus Christ, of whom the sign had been given, concerning his death. And it came to pass that while they were thus conversing one with another, they heard a voice as if it came out of heaven; and they cast their eyes round about for they understood not the voice which they heard;

"And it was not a harsh voice, neither was it a loud voice, nevertheless and nothwithstanding it being a small voice, it did pierce them that did hear, to the center, insomuch that there was no part of their frame that it did not cause to quake; yea, it did pierce them to the very soul, and did cause their hearts to burn.

"And it did come to pass that again they heard the voice, and they understood it not and again the third time they did hear the voice, and did open their ears to hear it:

"And their eyes were towards the sound thereof; and they did look steadfastly toward heaven, from whence the sound came; and behold the third time they did understand the voice which they heard;

"And it said unto them, Behold, my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased, in whom I have glorified my name, hear ye him."

Note: The Indians of Mexico and Central America had a knowledge of this event, as recorded by the Aztec historian Ixtlilxochitil, "... this happened in the year Ce Calli, which, adjusting this account with ours, comes to be at the same time when Christ our Lord suffered, and they say it happened during the first days of the year." (Kingsboro, Antiquities of Mexico)

When Ramiro had read this far he was interrupted by the most excited and animated discussion we had ever witnessed in all the years we had labored as missionaries among the Indian tribes. They went from one to the other, pounding their fists in the palms of their hands to emphasize their words, then waving their arms in great excitement. They raised their eyes to Heaven in an extasy of joy such as we had never witnessed before.

One of these men, Don Francisco Zapote approached me to let him take the Book in his hands. I consulted with Ramiro, who then gave it to him. This man was an orator. In the most eloquent manner he went from one group to the other, holding the Book to his heart and then presenting it at arm's length, with these words. "Es un tersara ser bien querido. Hach la clozit, a literal yacoutal mack." This was translated into English as follows:

"This book is a treasure to be cherished, and it must not be treated with indifference."

WHAT A THRILL! An experince never to be forgotten! Here we were, thousands of miles from home among strange people who had never heard of the Book of Mormon before, hearing such a testimony. Others voiced their opinions favorably too, but this was the only one to be interpreted for us. We still have this whole episode, in Maya and Spanish, on tape recordings, as we were provided with a portable recorder to take with us. They coupled this account from the Book of Mormon with their own accounts of the Bearded White God, Quetzal-coatl, the Fair God.

Soon we were requested to continue to read on from this account of the coming of Christ to America. We then had Ramiro go on, beginning with the 9th verse.

"And it came to pass as they understood, they cast their eyes up again towards heaven; and behold, they saw a man descending out of heaven;

"And he was clothed in a white robe, and he came down and stood in the midst of them, and the eyes of the whole multitude were turned upon him, and they durst not open their mouths, even one to another, and wist not what it meant, for they thought it was an angel that had appeared unto them.

"And it came to pass that he stretched forth his hand, and spake unto the people, saying, Behold, I am Jesus Christ, of whom the prophets testified should come into the world;

"And behold I am the light and life of the world and I have drunk out of that bitter cup which the Father hath given me, and have glorified the Father in taking upon me the sins of the world, in the which I suffered the will of the Father in all things, from the beginning.

"And it came to pass that when Jesus had spoken these words, the whole multitude fell to the earth, for they remembered that it had been prophesied among them that Christ should shew himself unto them after his ascension into Heaven" (3rd Nephi 5:1-13).

Again the excitement broke out. Old Xiu arose and in a very solemn and dignified manner stated that this was the same account that had been written in their old records. These records had been prepared on plates of gold, silver and brass, as well as on parchment. He told us that these records had been destroyed by the "black robed priests", meaning the Spanish priests who were with Landa during the conquest of Mexico. He said that this account had been handed down from that time, among their old people, by word of mouth. There were many other orations, then Xiu stood again and held the Book out to the audience and spoke very reverently in Maya.


"This is our Book. It is ours!"

So, here we have this wonderful testimony to share with the honest seeker after the truth. This vindicates our belief that ours is the true Church of Christ, restored in these last days. It proves that the Bible contains the word of God and that the Book of Mormon is an added witness for Christ. For, in all lands where this Gospel is taught, it is the same.

We began the next day to get the necessary equipment together for our trip to the walled city. This took several days and that is another story.

Before we left however, after explaining much of the Restored Gospel to them, they begged us with tears to return and we promised if the way were opened up and the Church approved that we would.

After we returned home we received our Church's approval and, during the fall and winter months of the same year, we returned on a mission. For the next six years we spent our time there and established the Church of Christ among them.

During our mission there nearly eighty members were baptized and several ordained to the ministry. The first church structure was built at Dzan; I assisted in the labor of constructing it. The Church of Christ thrives in Yucatan to this day.

THE GOSPEL CAME TO YUCATAN

I am going to ask each one of you to read a story that was written two thousand years ago. Please do not read my story until you have read Third Nephi, chapter 13, begin at verse 12 and read through verse 45. Lay this article down and take into your hands the ancient record of the Nephites. In an attitude of humility and with a prayer in your heart read the above mentioned verses. I am sure as you read in this attitude, the Holy Ghost will be your immediate companion, and the word of God will burn in your soul.

Now that you have finished the reading, I will relate a story that was told to me while in Yucatan. It came to me from the lips of an old Maya Indian Brother by the name of Susano Cabrero.

While in the jungle over thirty five years ago, he, his brothers, and several other men were preparing to break camp, and depart on horseback for a small town some distance away. At this time, a man with a long beard, dressed in a long robe, came to them, and began to preach. He told them that they must forsake the ways of the world and turn unto God. They must obey the teachings of the Son of God, for said he, "There is no other name under Heaven whereby men could gain eternal life." After talking to them in this manner he left them, and started afoot to the same town to which they were going. There was a small hill in the trail a short distance ahead. The men watched this person walk over the hill. It then occurred to them that they should let him ride one of their horses, for it was a journey of about seven hours to the town. They hurried over the hill, but to their surprise the man could not be They could not understand it. He had not found. time to have been out of sight, yet he was not there.

They traveled on, and when they arrived in the town they inquired if anyone had seen such a person come into town. They were told that he had been there. He had preached to the people and had already departed. When they inquired as to what time the man had arrived in town they found that it was just about the time he had disappeared over the hill that morning. In some manner he had covered the distance in a few minutes that had taken them several hours to cover on horseback.

These men had a desire to hear him preach again. They hurried on to the next town, and there they

Following is an account of a second witness to this Book. This was given to Apostle E. Leon Yates, who succeeded me in that mission in 1957. It was not brought to my attention till some time after I left the Yucatan Mission and went to the Holy Land in 1958 for a three year stay. Now, as a corrobating testimony to what I have written, I wish to add it to my account:

found him teaching the people. Susano said, as this man talked his eyes seemed to be focused on some point over the heads of the people as though he was looking at something in the heavens. They could not see the color of his eyes, but they seemed to glow and burn as a fire. He told them that the time was soon to come when they would hear of many churches in the land, but the churches would be teaching the doctrine of men. He said however, that there would be a man come into the land at some future date, and he would come preaching the Gospel of the Son of God. He told them that this man would come to a certan house in the city of Ticul. The house would be the house of a man by the name of, Nemisio Xiu. He told them to wait for that time to come and then for them to accept the teachings of this man that would come, for he would bring with him the Gospel. He said they would then hear the Gospel and they would understand, and that they should heed its call.

Susano Cabrera, said that some of the people who heard this man of the robe believed, and some did not believe. Those who did not believe him took him and cast him into a well, but he immediately came up out of the well unharmed. Just to refresh our memories, let us quote Third Nephi 13:32 and see what power the three Nephites had.

"But they did smite the earth with the word of God, insomuch that by his power they were delivered out of the depths of the earth; and therefore they could not dig pits sufficient to hold them."

According to Susano, this man of the robe was preaching the word of God, he did smite the earth with the word of God insomuch that he was delivered out of the depths of the earth. Finally as he departed from the city many tried to catch up with him but they could not. They could see his bare feet move as though he was walking, but it seemed his feet did not touch the ground.

All this took place about thirty five years ago. Susano and his brothers never forgot about it, and when Brother Wheaton went into Yucatan six years ago he went to the house of Nemisio Xiu. When he went there he did not go to preach the Gospel. He had been given a letter of introduction to Nemisio from the great council of American Indians, and he went to him for advice as to how he might proceed on his journey into the jungle in his search for the white Indians. However, while he was there in the home of Nemisio he took the Book of Mormon from his pocket and began to teach them the Gospel of Christ.

When Susano and his brothers heard about someone preaching in the home of Nemisio, they came to listen, and their understanding was opened. They remembered the man of the robe, and they accepted the Gospel of Christ with much joy and happiness.

Thus the Gospel came to Yucatan, and because of it many souls have been brought unto Christ. Brother Wheaton did not know when he went to the home of Nemisio Xiu that he was fulfilling the prophesy of the man in the robe, or in other words, one of the three Nephites. In fact Brother Wheaton never heard this story until I told it to him this year. The Lord works in wonderful ways.

We note in 3 Nephi 13: part of verse 21, "for ye (the three Nephites) have desired that ye might bring the souls of men unto me, while the world shall stand." The world is still standing, and many souls still need to be brought unto Christ. The three Nephites are still on the earth, and in accord with the promise Christ made to them, they are still ministering as Angels unto the children of men. "And it shall come to pass, when the Lord seeth fit in his wisdom, that they shall minister unto all the scattered tribes of Israel, and unto all nations, kindreds, tongues, and people, and shall bring out of them unto Jesus many souls, that their desire may be fulfilled, and also because of the convincing power of God which is in them; And they are as angels of God, and if they shall pray unto the Father in the name of Jesus, they can shew themselves unto whatsoever man it seemeth them good" (III Nephi 13:41-42).

Thirty five years ago it seemed good unto one of them to show himself unto Susano Cabrera and his brothers. This marked the beginning of a chain of events that has to this day brought many souls into the glorious light of the Gospel of Christ. This was the great desire that was in the hearts of the three Nephites. It was because of that desire that Christ gave them the power to remain on the earth. Indeed, in our day they are ministering as angels to the children of men.

FUTURE DIVINE RULERSHIP

Christ's coming cannot be ushered in with less than a divine preparation; it says in Eph. 4 that Christ set offices in His Church "for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ; till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ; that we henceforth be no more tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the slight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; but speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the Head, even Christ; from whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love" (vs. 10-16 and Col. 1:12, etc.). Because Christ loved the Church and gave Himself for it, it must be sanctified or "set apart" and cleansed by the words of Christ, as by washing with water, that it might be holy and without blemish. (Eph. 5:24-27) This has not been accomplished yet through any ministry. This could be done through the Gentile ministry, if they would use only Christ's words according to the new covenant. (Isa. 8:16-20; Heb. 8, 9, 6) The Gentiles must realize the humble place they occupy in the plan of God;

they cannot afford to be highminded or "wise in their own conceits", for they do not bear the root; the root bears them. (Rom. 11)

When the right time comes the Lord will use part of the Israelite "remnant according to the election of grace" to set His Church in order; then the fullness of the Gentiles will have come in; they will be subject to the Israelite remnant. (Rom. 11 and 9:1-5) Jerusalem is still trodden down by the Gentiles. (Luke 21:24) The last laborers that the Lord hired in His vineyard at the eleventh hour were the Gentiles; they shall be the first laborers to be called out of His vineyard. The last laborers in His vineyard shall be His chosen people, Israel. (Matt. 20:1-16; Rom. 9:1-5)

This will bring events down to the beginning of a divine rulership, which will start with a righteous high priest of Joseph's seed: those who were led from Jerusalem to this western hemisphere. He will be Christ's messenger and he will be a choice seer. There is a reason for him to also be a seer. The stick of Joseph states that he is going to bring forth the word of God. It also states that the Lord said, "And it shall come to pass that my people who are of the house of Israel, shall be gathered home to the lands of their possessions; and my word also shall be gathered in one." (Compare with Jer. 23:1-8.) A seer is "one who sees". He is also "a prophet". As Christ's messenger,

he shall be a "forerunner". A forerunner can be used "to usher in" a message for the Lord. According to Job 33:23, a messenger can be an interpreter. An interpreter is "one who translates", one who explains the meaning of something. Translation is an "act of translating, or rendering into another language".

The time is coming when all the languages that had their origin in the confusion of tongues at the tower of Babel shall be translated into a "pure language". The Lord says in Zeph. 3:8, etc. that He is going to "turn to the people a pure language, that they may all call upon the name of the Lord, to serve him with one consent", at the time when He turns back the captivity of Israel before the eyes of all. The word "consent" means that all people will be brought into agreement in serving the Lord. (Acts 3:19, etc.; Joel 2:25, etc.; Micah 5:7, etc.; Isa. 2:1-3)

No doubt the Urim and Thummim will be used to translate all languages into a pure language; this shall be done through Christ's messenger, as a choice seer of Joseph's seed who were led to this western hemisphere. "Choice" means "that which is most excellent". As a righteous high priest he will be an excellent, or divine, ruler. The Lord says of this choice seer, in the stick of Joseph, "And I will give unto him commandment, that he shall do none other work save the work which I shall command him. And I will make him great in mine eyes; for he shall do my work. And he shall be great like unto Moses, whom I have said I would raise up unto you, to deliver my people, O house of Israel." "And out of weakness he shall be made strong, in that day when my work shall commence among all my people, unto the restoring thee, O house of Israel, saith the Lord. And thus prophecied Joseph (of Egypt. L. S.), saying: Behold, that seer will the Lord bless; And they that seek to destroy him, shall be confounded" (p. 88, vs. 13-15, 24-26).

Let us compare this with Isa. 52:7, etc. Christ's messenger, as His servant, "shall deal prudently, and shall be exalted, and extolled, and be very high" (v. 13). (This agrees perfectly with what the Lord says of the choice seer, in the stick of Joseph, which we have just quoted.) Christ's servant shall bring good tidings; he wil publish peace and salvation. This servant (as the choice seer) shall, through the power of God, cause the people to "see eye to eye (or to serve the Lord "with one consent" (Zeph. 3:8,) when the Lord shall bring again Zion. At this time the Lord will have brought comfort to His people Israel, for Jerusalem shall be redeemed. At this time the Lord will have "made bare his holy arm in the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God" (vs. 7-10). Those who "bear the vessels of the lord" are told to depart, or go out from the midst of uncleanness. (Rev. 18; Jer. 51:1-10) They are not to touch any unclean thing. It shall not be a hasty or flighty departure, meaning it will be an orderly departure, not as though "running from danger", for the Lord will lead them and the

God of Israel shall follow after them. (vs. 11, 12(V. 13) starts out with the word "as", which is sometimes "used to introduce examples and illustrative phrases". It also means "to the same extent". Then v. 15 starts with the word "so", which means "to that degree described in the preceding context". or "referring to a preceding (sometimes following) statement or suggestion". The use of the words "as" and "so" brings out the fact that Christ and someone else are being compared in a physical way. (Christ was "wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities" (Isa. 54). Christ's servant shall also be marred. In the stick of Joseph, p. 88, Christ says of the choice seer, "And they that seek to destroy him shall be confounded." On p. 663, He says of His servant, meaning the choice seer, 'Behold, the life of my servant shall be in my hand, therefore they shall not hurt him, although he shall be scarred because of them. Yet I will heal him, for I will show unto them that my wisdom is greater than the cunning of the devil." V. 15 tells what Christ will do through His servant. (According to Ezek. 36:22-25 and Heb. 10:22, the word "sprinkle" means to "cleanse".) Christ will cleanse many nations through His servant. He will tell things at this time that the people of this dispensation have not been told. For as the choice seer, He will bring forth the word of God, which is not available yet. Christ's messenger has a great deal of work to do. As the branch, the Lord will make him strong for Himself; he shall be the man of God's right hand. (Ps. 80)

We have pointed out that Christ's messenger as a righteous high priest who will be a choice seer, shall, in the process of his preparations, make way for a royal priesthood and king of Ephraim's seed. For this king to use the stick of Joseph as the stick of Ephraim, it will have to be a full record; the stick of Judah shall also be a full record. This will be a part of the restitution of all things, which shall be done through the choice seer. This is all pointed out in this article.

When the right time comes there wil be another day of Pentecost; this shall be for all followers of Christ, instead of just for the Israelites as it was at Jerusalem. In Acts 2 it says that "in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh" (vs. 1-18). We believe this will be the day of refreshing spoken of in Acts 3:19-21. Then it seems that, according to v. 21, "the times of restitution of all things" will follow after this day of refreshing, which shall be brought about by the word of God, as we have it in the sticks of Judah and Joseph. The bringing forth of the remainder of His word shall be a part of the restitution of all things. Some time after this the Lord is going to show wonders in different ways as a sign before "the great and notable day of the Lord come; and it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Acts 2:17-21).

Then in Acts 3:19, it says that every one must hear the words of Christ, or "it shall come to pass, that every soul, which will not hear that prophet, shall be destroyed from among the people". This great and notable day of the Lord will be the "great and terrible day of the Lord" spoken of by Joel. But shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be delivered; for in mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the Lord hath said, and in the remnant whom the Lord shall call" (2:25, etc.). This will be the "remnant of Jacob" (the "remnant according to the election of grace" (Rom. 11), the remnant which shall consist of the seed of Joseph down through his sons Manasseh, then Ephraim) who will be a great blessing or cursing to all people. (Mic. 5:7) Mal. 4 calls this day "the great and dreadful day of the Lord" and describes(to a certain extent, the conditions at that time. Before this dreadful day comes the Lord says He will send Elijah (Elias in New Testament), "And he shall turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse." We have pointed out that John the Baptist was sent in the spirit and power of Elias and that he was not Elias. (Luke 1:13-17, 17; Matt. 11:7-15; Mark 1:1-6; John 1:19-23) John was sent before the face of Christ, that is, before Christ started His ministry on earth. John said he was the prophet spoken of by Isaiah (40:3). Vs. 1, 2, 4, 5 describes another spiritual preparation at which time, "the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, (notice) and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it." The great and terrible day of the Lord did not come before John's appearance, so it must come at a later date. (Mal. 4:4.) We are to remember Moses, the Lord's servant, and the law which He commanded "for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments". V. 5 starts with the word "behold", which means "to keep in mind". We must keep in mind that Moses did a great work for the Lord and that the law was very strict. We must keep this in mind; there is a correlation between Moses and the strictness of the law, and Elijah (or Elias). We will correlate other scripture with this to get its meaning. (Matt. 17:1-13; Mark 9:2-13) Here again there is a correlation between Moses and Elias along with Christ. If we had the fullness of God's word this would be easy to understand but, by bringing all scripture into context, we get its meaning. In part 1, we pointed out from Matt. 17 and Mark 9 that Christ's statement, "Elias truly shall come first, and restore all things", was future tense. The scribes knew that someone was going to come again, in the spirit and power of Elias. This is to take place in the future, for John the Baptist had already come. So we must keep in mind that someone like unto Moses shall be raised up to deliver the Israelites, and he shall come in the spirit and power of Elias, and the commandments the Lord will give him to enact shall be just as strict as the law of Moses. And through the

spirit and power of Elias he shall restore all things. (The stick of Joseph, pp. 87, 88, says this will be the choice seer, for the Messiah shall be made manifest to the Israelites "in the spirit of power:, and he will do the work that the Lord commands him. He shall be great in the eyes of the Lord. "He shall be great like unto Moses" (vs. 9-15). This will be Christ's messenger, a righteous high priest, the branch, who shall be the man of God's right hand, through whom He will start working. This will bring about a divine rulership among the holy priesthood, over which His messenger shall be a righteous high priest. Then when the way is prepared for a king and royal priesthood of Ephraim's seed, there will be a united divine rulership between this high priest of Manasseh's seed and a king of Ephraim's seed in the temple of the Lord. (Christ's messenger, as this righteous high priest, the branch, shall have the honor of building it.)

Jerusalem and Zion shall be redeemed through them. This kingdom shall never be destroyed; it shall be as a great mountain and shall fill the whole earth. (Isa. 52: 2:1-3; 1:24-27; Joel 2:25, etc.; Mic. 5:8, etc.; Dan 2:44, 45, 34, 35)

We believe this divine rulership will not continue beyond the lives of this priest and king, for the Lord will finish His work "and cut it short in righteousness; because short work shall the Lord make upon the earth" (Rom. 9:27-29).

We end our study by further explaining Christ's words to His apostles (as recorded in Matt. 19:27, 28; Luke 22:28-30) which we stated in part 9. "And Jesus said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That ye which have followed me, in the regeneration when the Son of man shall sit in the throne of his glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel," "Ye are they which have continued with me in my temptations. And I appoint unto you a kingdom, as my Father hath appointed unto me; that ye may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel." This is the reason that Christ told them, "I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom; and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matt. 16:13-20). In part 9 we pointed out that the twelve Nephite discipes shall judge the seed of Joseph, while they themselves shall come under the jurisdiction of the apostles; this is born out in Revelations. Christ told His apostles this would come about "in the regeneration" when He would be sitting in His throne of glory; so this judgment will take place after He comes. "Regenerate" means "cause to be reborn spiritually", "to reestablish on a better basis", "new birth requisite for entrance into the kingdom of God". Evidently this judgment shall begin after the dead in Christ are brought forth in the first resurrection; John "saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them." These are the thrones on which the twenty four elders shall sit in judgment, and the Gentiles shall also come under this judgment. (Rev. 20) We especially point out v. 12. This speakes of books, besides the book of life that will be used to judge all people. They shall be judged by the word of God in the complete records of the sticks of Judah and Joseph. (1 Cor. 15:51-54; 1 Thess. 4:13, etc.) This will be the earthly culmination of the divine rulership which the Lord started through His messenger, as a righteous high priest, then a king, both of the seed of Joseph through his sons, Manasseh and Ephraim.
