THE JUPITER JOLT: OR THE DAY OF THE LORD

When the disciples asked Christ to tell them when the temple would be destroyed, and "What shall be the sign of thy coming and of the end of the world?", He warned: "Take heed that no man deceive you" (Matt. 24:3-5).

Concerning the time of the coming of Christ, professing Christians are often too aware of the text, "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no not the angels of heaven, but my Father only" (Matt. 24: 36), and forget that God has placed a timetable for us so that we can "know that he is near, even at the door" (Matt. 24:33). This timetable is: "Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken; and they shall see the Son of Man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory" (Matt. 29-30); for "this generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled" (Matt. 24:34).

To Be Deceived or not to Be Deceived That is the Question

A flood of books, pamphlets, and articles fills the market with startling, new apocalyptic predictions centering around 1982 and the close of the century, the latter especially through the media of the occult: witchcraft, devil worshippers and their fellow travelers, cluster around the year 6000 (2000 A. D., Ed. Note) as the year to usher in a great new dispensation. The present inundation is triggered by two scientists coauthoring "The Jupiter Effect", with subtile, "The Planets as Triggers of Devasting Earthquakes". John R. Gribbin holds a doctorate in astrophysics and edits the international publication, "Science". Dr. Plagemann, a physicist, is engaged in a NASA study of the upper atmosphere phenomena.

Other publications climbing onto the Gribbin-

Plagemann bandwagon are: "Parade of the Planets", printed in the "Gospel Truth", the official organ of the "Southwest Radio Church"; "The Great California Earthquake of 1982", published in "Science Digest"; "And the Jupiter Effect", in "Science"; and "Planets Line up for Disaster", in the "Independence Examiner" for 10/31/74.

If, as the Southwest Radio Church maintains, the line-up of the planets heralds the fulfillment of numerous Bible prophecies of the signs in the sun, moon and stars, the sea and the waves roaring, men's hearts failing them for fear of the things coming upon the earth, then it behooves us who are watching for the return of Christ to know whether these things are true or whether it is but another "lo here, lo there".

In the past a scare scene was enacted in Europe. Three planets were to meet in conjunction and astrologers raised a hue and cry warning of a second Noachin flood. Boats were mobilized and people piled on them to ride out the disaster. One nobleman, unable to procure a ship, took his people up into a high hill and waited out the appointed time; but no flood descended from the heavens to destroy the wicked earth. Returning to his castle, riding his horse through the castle gate he was struck by lightning and killed; poetic or divine justice was enacted for his trusting in the pagan astrological gods.

That we be not deceived is the purpose of the following analysis of the "Jupiter Jolt" furore. "Ye, brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief" (1 Thess. 5:4).

Parade of the Planets - Christmas 1982

The author of this document applies the implications of the book, "The Jupiter Jolt", to the fearful, apocalyptic events of the Bible, believing that 1982 ushers in the events leading to the return of Christ along with the false belief that the righteous will be "raptured out" before the great tribulation of Dan. 12:1 and Matt. 24:21.

The astrophysical events suggested in the line-up of all the planets in early 1982 include:

- 1. Peaking of the sunspot cycle above normal with huge solar storms and flares.
- 2. Solar winds (positively charged plasma, atoms stripped of electrons) blowing past the earth and causing terrestrial storms of unusual violence, even to the slowing or increasing the earth's rotation and changing the length of the day.
- 3. The triggering of earthquake activity in magnitude and number throughout the earth, especially in regions of greatest stress build-up, particular mention being made of the San Andreas fault at the Los Angeles region, "where the pressure along the fault is becoming intolerable", and slightly less so in the San Francisco area of this same fault line.

Based on these "signs" in the heavens, the Southwest Radio Church finds much supporting evidence that "the sun shall be turned into darkness and the moon into blood", the earth restored to its former axis, days shortened by 8 hours, stars fall from heaven, and Christ return. This would require that a most unusual condition would arise in 1982 - the Southwest Radio Church suggests the possibility that the sun will nova, resulting in the apocalyptical prediction of the sun scorching the earth, followed by darkness. They don't take into account that a darkness arising from the cause would continue throughout the millenium. But all documents follow Professor Wood in stating that this condition is repetitive every 179 years, hence not likely to produce such dramatic results this time as the Southwest Radio Church postulates.

Plagemann and Gribbin predict that the solar disturbances will affect the upper atmosphere, triggering great storms, causing winds to blow in opposite direction from normal, pressing on high mountain ranges and changing the length of the day. The Southwest Radio Church finds this to be an 8 hour shortening. If this situation has arisen every 179 years, there have been 33 such since Adam, but all 33 together have only changed the length of the day in all that time by only a fraction of a second. It is likely that only an atomic clock can detect the change in 1982; the larger maximum in 1972 slowed the earth by only 1 millisecond.

God Does Not Require Scientific Explanation For His Miracles

The Bible opens with a miracle in the creation in 6 literal days; the plagues of Egypt are not satisfied by the blundering efforts of apologists who seek explanation in inadequate theories which take no account of the miraculous intervention of the God of Heaven. They introduce more problems than they solve. Apologists explain that the children of Israel

crossed the Red Sea on the shallow north end, but leave untouched the problem of why the hosts of the Pharoah with their thousands of horses and chariots were drowned in the raging waves of a shallow sea while the children of Israel did not wet the soles of their feet. A wind blew all night to make a dry highway for the crossing, but a wind without the power of God would not have stood up the waters on the right hand and on the left, as we are informed in Psalms. And if a wind without the power of God could blow the waters out of the Red Sea it would be strong enough to blow the children of Israel away with the waters also. So we can confidently affirm that miracles are by the power of God even when He uses weak nature as the vehicle of His mighty works.

And the Earthquakes

The Independence, Missouri "Examiner" for 10/31/74, in discussing the findings of Gribbin and Plageman in their book, "The Jupiter Effect", writes: It seems that some astronomers at the National Space Agency (NASA) got to twirling their computers, and they discovered that sometime in the year 1982 all nine planets of the solar syste, including Planet Earth, are going to be lined up in a row like birds on a telephone wire on the same side of the sun at the same time . . And if that happens, we are told the tugs and strains on the surface of the globe can be such that massive earthquakes will occur."

"Newsweek" for Sept. 16, 1974, referencing Gribbin and Plagemann's book, notes: "The Researchers do note, however, that each one of the eight large quakes to have hit an area within 50 miles of San Francisco since 1838 has taken place within the two years following a period of maximum solar activity."

The magnitude of earthquake activity depends on the stress build-up along fault lines and the peaking of sunspot cycles.. But Professor Wood's studies show that the peak of 1982 will be less than that of 1972. and far less than 1958. Of this Gribbin and Plagemann report, "According to Wood, the next two sunspot cycles will peak in 1982 and 1993, at levels slightly than the cycle just completed (which peaked in 1969) and a lot less than the maxima of the cycles which reached peaks in 1958 and 1947. number of sunspots in 1958 was about 183; in 1969, 103; in 1982 and 1993, 60, taken from Professor Wood as reported in "Nature". Very roughly indeed this suggests a declining pattern rather like a mirror image of the increasing peak activity shown in figure 3; in climatic terms, that is a return toward the conditions of the 1920's and the 1930's." That this is rather an important decline in sunspot activity, let it be noted that it is a 67% drop from 1959 to 1982. Only 3 times since 1700 A.D. has sunspot activity reached so low a number: in 1705 the sunspot number was 59; in 1804 and 1816 it went clear down to 43. Yet Gribbin and Plagemann seek to establish a questionable lineup of planets, with strong appeal to the occult, to the

gods and goddesses of ancient astrological lore. Do they not know that their horde of mythological gods have long since passed into oblivion, wholly and completely dead?

Astrology or Astronomy

Since a declining pattern is in conflict with the authors' thesis of maximum tidal influence upon earthquake activity in 1982 they must call to their aid "other methods being developed to predict future climatic trends", admitting, however, that "these ideas may not be quite rounded off", with the usual admission in their book, which they claim "contains only solid scientific evidences and reasoning", that these ideas "may still smack of underground associations with astrology".

Strange indeed that, through astrology, the pagan gods and goddesses, casting their baleful influence upon the minds of modern man through their personification in the planets and stars, should be the key link in support of a theory supposedly resting in "solid scientific evidence and reasoning". Ponder the amazing admission projected by these two computer-"The trail links astrology - for minded scientists: that is really what the study of planetary alignments is, even though we can explain their effects in sound scientific terms - astronomy, meteorology, geology, geoghysics and other sciences. Small wonder that pieces of this chain have lain about unrecognized for so long. But now they have been put together there is no question about the implication: in 1982 when the Moon is in the Seventh House, and Jupiter aligns with Mars and with the other seven planets of the Solar System, Los Angeles will be destroyed." Shades of Jean Dixon and the supposed disastrous sliding of California into the sea! A prediction which never developed.

Will the Planets Really Align in 1982?

Consider the evidence. Low sunspot activity combined with high solar flares and sunspot are against all scientific experience. Super peaking of sunspots occurred in 1780, 179 years later another in 1959, with a third half way between. If this peaking is repetitive the very earliest time for another peak, on my understanding of 90 year cycles, is in 2049, but if the commonly accepted 179 years prevail no major peaking could come before 2139 A. D. The Grenwich Observatory astronomer could only find a single lineup in 3999 B.C., nor could he find a second in the far distant past or in the foreseeable future. To this date we will no proceed to give evidence from two more astronomers and from the "Aeronautical Tables" for the years 1940 to 1960, projected into 1982. Surprisingly we find, not a linear alignment as of birds sitting upon a telephone wire, but only a cone of rather broad dimensions.

Drs. Alter and Muirdon show very close agreement, the maximum difference being one day, which could be accounted for by my straight line method of projecting from 1980 to 1982, wherein I could not correct for ellipticity of orbit. The lack of agreement arising from the aeronautical tables is caused by the greater distance for extrapolation from 1960 to 1982 where the effects of eccentricity become more pronounced.

Now to test the expected linear alignment of the planets in 1982. Will it really happen? This is the center and vital point in the whole marriage of science and astrology. From the times of conjunctions and oppositions of the above planets, it is seen that there was no alignment: each occurring at a different date. Let us pick out the five conjunctions and oppositions and find the positions of the remaining planets at these dates, thus measuring the spread away from linearity.

On Jan. 20, 1982, with Venus in inferior conjunction, Mercury lags by 48 degrees, an equivalent of 96 moons lying side by side, one moon diameter being half a degree. Mars is 50 degrees beyond, Saturn another 62 degrees, with 72 degrees separating Saturn and Jupiter. And remember that this data does not take into account the positions of Uranus, Neptune and Pluto. At least this early date in the year shows no semblance of linearity, for a cone of 167 degrees envelops these six planets.

On Feb. 5, 1982 the second planet to align with Earth is Mercury. This is the closest approach to linear alignment to be found in 1982, with a cone of 104 degrees. But this close approach can be of no comfort to Gribbin and Plagemann, for, when planets are geogetrically arranged at right angles with the sun, their tidal effects on the sun tend to cancel out up to a latitude of 55 degrees, which includes the total sunspot band. At this date we have a 104 degree separation of the conjunction of Mercury with Earth with the massive Jupiter, so their combined effect is almost totaled out, leaving only Venus of the tidal planets (herself somewhat weakened by the 72 degrees separation from the partially functioning Jupiter). No wonder Professor Wood's predicted low sunspot activity - not a line-up like birds on a telephone wire, but any tidal force largely negated by this rare configuration.

On April 4, when Mars crossed the line to Earth, Mercury has dashed around to the other side of Sun, making a 171 degree cone. Without Mercury the cone would be reduced to 54 degrees, but Mercury is one of the tidal planets; where are the outer planets?

This is the end of the story. As an anti-climax, two sunspot cycles 23 years too late are offered, to trigger giant earthquakes. This belated maximum of 1982 is bolstered by astrology, opposed by other astronomers, and by Professor Wood in his sunspot analysis. Choose whom you will believe, the ancient pagan gods, or modern astronomy. That these equations were

computerized adds nothing either in favor or against the theory. A computer does just what it is programmed to do. The input data determines the output. As far as the dramatic, apocalyptical production of the Southwest Radio Church, I believe that we can forget it and look for God to produce His own miracles in His own due time without science as a supporting crutch. All prophecy and the modern historical facts show that the apocalyptic predictions of the Bible are soon to be fulfilled. But we need not any superstructure built on science watered down with the occult to tell us the things of God. "To the law and to the testimony, if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them" (Isa. 8:20).

SERMON ON DECEMBER 29, 1974

There is one thing that I want to bring to light this morning; it has its good qualities and its bad. It is said that there is something about this local that doesn't seem to change. It seems that the same faces, people, feeling are here as you remember them. This is good; this is something stable that brings security in our lives, but sometimes changes are necessary and beneficial. I have also heard this same comment made in a derogatory manner; all of us have: that individuals could be gone from Independence for years, then come back and find a few faces have changed but this is about all. For this reason, sometimes changes have their place.

I don't know how many ministers we have in this local, probably about a dozen. They teach, rotating around, some more than others, reminding us of the Gospel and its place in our lives. The change doesn't come about sometimes. The teaching is listened to, received, but never really applied to the full degree that the speaker feels such a need to bring to you. Sometimes this lack of change becomes discouraging, in the minister's thoughts. It seems like maybe we don't feel that we have any room for improvement. Now, I don't think that is true! I am sure that no one of us here in this room thinks that we are the perfection stage, that Christ has come to be satisfied with His Church. So, we feel that there must be need for some degree of change in our spiritual condition as it exists today. It is this change that I want to bring out to us.

I'll start with November 8, 1949. I'll say many of you weren't in existance at that time. Those of you that were probably are not nearly as familiar with that date as my mother is. That's my birth date. Most of you who were of majority age at that time were probably more interested in the election. I believe it was

President Truman; I'm not too familiar with that part of our history. But that was the very first miracle in my life. There was not only the creation of an animal, a living creature, as so many of us have witnessed in the lives of our domestic stock, but the creation of man. I had one thing that they didn't; I had a soul. I was given a soul at that very young age, although I don't recollect much of that time. This is part of the promises that God has given to us, a soul to be with us throughout our lives. This is the big difference that brings us above the animal world or any other type of creature that might exist.

The next miracle — no, I won't say miracle — the next blessing in my life I just pulled out of the top of my head this morning, thinking of all the blessings that have ocurred in my life. I was too young to recollect the happening, probably about the size of my son, Eric, 2 years or younger. I was told that I was being tossed in the air by a friend, thrown up and caught before I fell, as so many babies like to have done. Only, our friend missed! As I was tumbling down, my head a few inches from the concrete sidewalk, he was able to catch my ankle. If he hadn't, I might have been spared the opportunity of standing before you! This is another blessing that I had in my life.

One blessing I do remember. I was living with Grandad and Grandmother Wheaton; I got into the neighbors' trash and got a hold of some pills. I guess I must have thought they were candy. I proceeded to down them, one at a time. I don't know how many; I don't think anyone else did either. I think, if I remember right, they could have been fatal. I was very sick. Prayer was brought to me in the laying on of hands in administration, and I recovered.

I was baptized in the Phoenix local; this was anoth-

er blessing. I remember praying quite a bit about it and wondering if it was the wise decision to make. The Spirit, while not telling me in words, gave me the understanding that it was the right step. I have no regrets today.

At one point in my life I wa Danel Boone. I was leading my sister, Jody on a journey back to the safety of the house, down in the Ozarks. I got totally lost! We wandered and wandered and wandered! My sister would say, "How much farther," I would say, "Oh, just around the hill, just around the hill". We were going in circles. I don't believe I was ever so lost in my life as I was that time. I don't know how old I was then, not too old. Through prayer again (on our parts, nobody else realized we weren't close at hand) we just happened to come close enough to hear their voices. Otherwise, we would still be lost! It is a totally lost feeling to be by ourselves, without anywhere to go!

On another occasion I took my younger brother, Rick and talked him into roping a wild horse that was out in the woods; nobody would ride it. I remember saying that we just had to keep the rope on it. We roped it, alright, then, while I was busy tying it up to a tree, the horse reared back. My finger was caught in the knot. Let me tell you, it hurt! It pulled the skin clear back to the bone on this little finger. I had a pair of gloves on; I was lucky nothing was broken. I just hung on to my finger and kept running till I reached home.

You learn; you learn through mistakes. I've had God's blessings on many occasions. I was cutting home through the neighbors' pasture once and lost the Boy Scout knife I had earned. I'm not sure whether I had become a "Webelo', or whatever, but I had won a Boy Scout knife — and I lost it. I thought about it and knew it had to be in that pasture; the weeds were maybe 2 feet tall. I knew how hopeless it was, but I felt I just had to go back out and try to find it. So I wandered and wandered; the tears blurred my eyes so much I could hardly see the ground. I knew I was wasting my time, that it wasn't much to bother about, but I prayed that I would find it. All of a sudden, through the teary fog, the knife was there! Again a small blessing.

Once I was out in the woods by myself, it was wintertime, about December. I was looking for great horned owl nests, to take pictures. I still like raising these birds. This time of year they were nesting; the mother owls were sitting on eggs, even during snow. I was climbing, one at a time, each tree that seemed likely to have a great horned owl in it. I came to a shag barked hickory; they are pretty shaggy and hard to stay on. I had on a pair of telephone spikes. I was climbing up this tree, no rope or anything, just holding on. I was close to 40 feet in the air. I had checked out the opening and there was nothing in it. I started down, a piece of bark was torn and — boy, did I come down! The tree bent at an angel, as I was coming down, the tree came closer and closer and

soon it hit my head! I went flying out into space and landed in a pile of mud. The day had warmed enough to thaw the ground and I sank pretty deep! I got up and looked myself over and thought it was funny. But I didn't forget to say my prayer of "thank you". So many times we come so close to danger; we sometimes forget to give credit where it is due.

Another occasion I remember was a very great blessing. I had become extremely interested in the Church. I think I was 18 years old. I felt that something was lacking, that I had a need, a great desire to do more than I was doing that God would have need to use me in some way. I had been making this a matter of prayer; I hadn't told anyone, but was praying privately. Then came a reunion; Grandad Wheaton stood up. It had never dawned on me, never, while sitting at any of those meetings that anything like this could occur! But the minute I saw him stand to his feet, I knew that something was going to happen and that it pertained to me. When he said that there were men to be called, I knew I would be named.. To me that was a testimony; it gave me the strength to accept my call. I had been praying secretly for a way that I might serve Him a little bit more; His answer came directly forth. I knew it right then; something clicked!

I remember the time I was heading to work at the Nature Center. It was a rainy day, like this; I was doing 60 MPH in my Volkswagen. (That was back when it was legal to go 60, although in my Volkswagen it was hard to do.) In the rain storm a man decided that he was in the wrong lane to make an exit that he was about 50 or 60 feet from, so he cut across my lane, caught my bumper and dragged my Volkswagen along with him. Let me tell you, I was scared. I couldn't see anything but water ssplashing against my windshield. The car was rocking and I was so busy trying to beep my horn, steer the thing and keep it from turning over that, at the moment, I didn't realize how close it came to a serious accident. God watched over us. Through our prayers and those of our loved ones, he protects us.

I have given this testimony before, of one time when I was giving a nature walk at the Nature Center. A little girl came running up, out of wind, on her way to the Nature Center. I stopped her; she seemed to be so shook up about something. She told me in a hurried breath that there had been an accident down at the river, where a group of girls had been playing. What they had been doing was this, a counselor in charge had been letting them swing over the river on The river was flooding and this wasn't a a vine. very wise thing to do. The vine broke, luckily when it was over the ground, and the girl went headfirst into the mud. She was knocked unconscious. The counselor had panicked and was in shock. She was sitting there with the girls consoling her. About all I could do was help treat the little girl, who was also in shock, and send the others to the Nature Center to direct the ambulance drivers down to the woods. While I was sitting there alone with the little girl, she began to shake and jerk, unconscious still. It really scared me and I said a prayer that she would be alright. No sooner had I finished praying than her eyes opened and she smiled. To me, this was a testimony from God of how powerful He is. His ways of answering prayers are so outstanding that you just can't overlook them.

I was wood-pulping with my cousin, Jay Moser one winter. I have told this before too. We were cutting alongside the Missouri River bank. We were cutting and pulling trees back up the river bank instead of letting them fall into the water. We were using a big truck and a big rope to keep them from falling over. Jay was driving the truck; he was keeping the tension steady. I was standing by the trees over the bank, completely out of his sight, sawing with a chain saw. I cut one tree and it fell down the bank, part of it in the water. Jay couldn't see this and was busy trying to pull the tree straight up. Well, it was hung, that tree was hung! All the tension of the truck couldn't seem to budge it. I set down the chain saw and started up the bank to stop him so we could try it another way. All of a sudden the tree jumped loose! This tree was about as long as from the end of this room to the end of that room; the diameter of the trunk was almost the size of this pulpit. All of a sudden it came loose. All the tension of the truck, the full force of it, caused the tree to leap into the air. It fell on top of my leg, smashing me against a stump I had left earlier. All the force of the truck was pulling the tree against my leg and the stump. It pulled so hard that, although the rope was tied to the very end, the entire tree moved completely around; that put a lot of pressure on my leg. I thought sure it had snapped the bone between my knee and lower leg but I only had a bad bruise. I was able to work the rest of the day and the next day too. Again, God was very watchful over me and preserved my leg.

When I was in National Guard camp one summer we had a group of men who didn't understand English too well. They were working on a type gun that is now obsolete. When they fired the gun they forgot to lock the firing pin. I was standing back of them and a piece of steel, probably weighing a pound, flew right by my ears. It left me feeling kind of weak. I remembered all those people back home that I was sure my Mom and Dad had asked to remember me, and I never doubted that God had answered those prayers for me.

To bring you more up to date, just the other day on Christmas Eve I was driving my milk truck. I don't know whether or not you remember the ice we had in patches here and there that day, but I was anxious to get home for Christmas, so I came down the road real fast. There was a nice sheet of ice on the road I never have really worried too much. I had good tires and have always had pretty good traction. So, I really wasn't enough concerned to watch like I should. When

I topped the hill to make a curve, my truck just kept right on rolling, sliding. I tried to back off and try it again, but I just kept right on sliding, just as if I were on a pair of ice skates. I was heading towards a drop off that went straight down 12 feet. When I hit the edge I was just gliding along. I didn't have time to say a prayer, but I always say my prayers when I start out in the truck mornings, that it won't have a breakdown and I won't either. Sure enough, I got right to the edge, dropped one wheel over and stuck. My old heart was just skipping along; again I took time out to say "thanks" that it was not more serious. Besides the danger of the drop off, I thought of all the milkmen's stories of being in a wreck and having the bulk of the milk slip through, break the doors and pile on top the driver. It could be pretty dangerous to be in an accident with a milk truck.

I am now a quarter of a century old; that sounds pretty old to some and pretty young to others. I feel old sometimes. When I have to get up at 3:30 in the morning I feel real old. But I am in extremely good physical health as far as I know. I've only got one broken bone that I know of; my cousin threw a railroad iron that landed on my bare foot and smashed my second toe. It grew crooked; as far as I know that is my only broken bone. I have been extremely lucky; God's blessings have been abundant in my life. I know that anybody in this room could do what I am doing; perhaps your minds are better at remembering and you could tell more testimonies, and more outstanding ones, of how God has blessed you. But, it's sad that when we sit down and think about it, we can name 2 to 1 or maybe even 4 to 1 our sins, compared to our blessings. It's not something I'm going to spend the rest of my time up here going through. But we can't deny how merciful He is to us to allow us all the blessings He has given us in this life, when we have done so many things that we are aware of that have been displeasing to Him. So many times blessings have been denied because of our spiritual condition; so many of our sins are of omission. That seems to be a habit with us. It becomes more of a habit as the days go by. These are the sins that are most frequent in our lives. Things that have been since childhood, the same mistakes we seem to make, the same temper, the same lack of control, lack of wisdom, we seem to display. These habits we carry with us constantly wherever we go. The sins keep us from enjoying greater blessings than we have already received.

In addition, there are habits both good and bad. I know some people who make it a point to do one good thing each day, something they would not normally do as part of their daily lives. They take each day and try to add on one good deed, much as a Cub Scout does to become a "Bobcat" and turn his pin right side up. One good deed. And there are bad habits that are just as easy. I remember reading an example one time. Habits are kind of like plaster of paris; they start out soft and easy to work with, but as they set up they become hard and immovable.

It's hard, very, very hard, to break a habit. My wife told a story she heard on a TV program, a true story, an example of how bad some habits are to get into. This was on the subject of judging. We are so good at judging others; we have it down to a fine art. This was a case where the pastor of a church went down the registry of membership, with some fine people helping him. They came to a woman's name and one said, "Such a shame, she used to be such a good Christian. Now when you are around her she smells strong of perfume or alcohol. She wears fancy, frilly, silky things. She never goes out, never comes to church any more. And every once in awhile her husband is out of town and a strange man comes to visit her. She used to be so good and it's a shame how she has gone downhill." The pastor let that information sink in. Then one day, word of the woman's death came to him. Her husband came to him to ask him to perform the funeral service. The pastor thought about all the things people had told him about this woman and said, "Well, she was a member, but I understand taht she no longer cared to be counted among the membership. The husband said, "No! That's There never was a stronger member of not true! your church than she was. She believed in God right up to the end. She was the most gentle and Christian woman I ever knew." The pastor told him the things he had been told and was shocked to see how misconceived people's ideas can be. The woman had been dying of an incurable disease, one with an awful aroma. So she wore lots of perfume and used alcohol to sterilize. Also, the disease caused extreme skin irritation from clothing! all she could wear were nightgowns of silk and other things that were smooth on her skin. The man seen visiting when her husband was out of town was a doctor coming in to check on her. So, you see, our habits can sometimes catch us completely off guard. Judging people could be a bad habit to get into. We can be thrown for a loop, judging things that seem airtight; our judgment, which we thought was so exact, will catch us as it did the people of this story.

Habits aren't only those of individuals, but of groups and organizations. Habits can be in something like a religion, or like a government, or an ethnic group, and can turn into traditions. These stay with us. Sometimes we don't stop and look at our own traditions; we don't stop and say, "Why are we doing this?" We just do it; we always have.

The world very seldom questions Santa Claus. Now, I am not preaching, after Christmas, a sermon on Chris'tmas. I don't think we are this way; I think we bring God into our Christmas, very much. But so many sing a song, "You better watch out, you better not cry... he sees you when you're sleeping." It is not Christ or God they say is watching us all the time, it is Santa Claus who is taking that place. This is what is sung to children; this is what stays in people's minds. The presents? They are not really brought back and tied in with the very beginning, the gifts

given to Christ. The Christmas feeling, the Spirit, sometimes these are not the theme that moves the family. It is the tradition, built up and just kind of reacted upon. We just don't stop to think why we do these things. We have good thoughts, if we can keep right principles that go with them.

To break any type of habit we have to be sincere, with ourselves primarily. I can say, "Well, I want to stop dong this, but I am the only one who will know whether I am doing it or not." No, not only do I know, but God knows. If I should pretend to be something I am not, I may fool other people, but not myself nor my Heavenly Father. Some people make their lives out of insincerity.

The other day the police arrested a man on my milk route for counterfeiting. He paid his milk bill pretty well. But the main thing was that he made his life out of insincerity. He is a "con" man; it is his profession. He had fooled me; I thought he was one of the nicest fellows on my route; anyone who takes 10 gallons of milk a week has got to be alright; But this was his profession, and it is not a Christian profession. He built his lifestyle around insincerity. We can do the same thing in a sense. We can fool people and, on certain occasions put on a certain face, while on other occasions we let our hair down and be ourselves. We might be able to fool people, but if we only knew what people thought about us it might make a difference, a realization.

Here is an example of sincerity. The other day I was delivering to a house where it is my habit to knock on the door. The lady of the house will call out to come in. This time she didn't answer right away so I knocked again and opened the door just a bit, calling out, "Milkman!" She was in the kitchen. She looked like she must have a cold; she had a handkerchief at her face and I thought nothing of it. I set the milk down; she paid for it, then asked me to sit down. She could hardly fight back the tears. She said she had heard on the radio a sermon and had come to understand that her mother and dad weren't going to be saved. Her sincerity was so great, she was sitting there crying. That doesn't sound like a whole lot, but most of us are more concerned about "number 1". Am I going to have salvation? The type of person who genuinely feels for others and feels it a great loss that they don't see things they are doing wrong, is rare. We may not agree with this woman's ideas. Even so, to her best understanding, she was sincere in her behavior, so much so that she was crying over the loss, as she saw it, of her parents' salvation. This is a great degree of sincerity.

We, here in the Books, are asked to pray for people who despise us; we are asked to smile and be nice to people we don't like. We find that hard to do. But to go beyond that and grieve over their loss of what we are hoping to obtain for ourselves — salvation — this is the type of sincerity that we must have in order to make any kind of a change in our habits.

What I am saying today won't change anyone's

mind; I know it won't. I was told so by a lady at the Nature Center the other day. Some of the people who worked there when I did are still there. I called up to ask if I could borrow a couple of snakes. I wanted them for a special first aid class I was to give in National Guard training. She refused to let me borrow them, saying, "My experience is that you can't change people. After years and years of telling people the difference in snakes, they still won't change their opinion about snakes." (Is this true? Are we wasting our time standing up here repeating things that are in the Scriptures? Will we change? I told her that my belief has been that you never know at what point someone is ready to change. You never know at what degree that individual is. The particular words that are brought out at a particular time about the difference in snakes, the harmlessness of some benefical ones, these may be the one thing that could be said to persuade that individual to respect God's creatures in their proper places. The same thing can be true in the Gospel. For this reason, ministers are continuously endeavoring to repeat the Scriptures; the Scriptures and the Gospel bear repetition and they stand. What they have to say is timeless.

I am out of time and I didn't even begin. I really wanted to go into much deeper matters, but I don't think that will be necessary this morning.

My challenge to each of us is to study our Gospel and the way it is practiced in our Church. Study the ways and means and our traditions. Not that we will revolutionize, nor that we will change the Church, but so that when others come and visit us they will recognize the change in us, in a spiritual sense. So many of the practices we have, I have felt to bring you this morning in relation to the Scriptures. I know very few of us, probably, practice making New Year's resolutions. But there should surely be one. I wish we would examine ourselves (not my viewpoint of you or yours at me) but look and see ourselves. Are we really happy with the way we are? An inward change will bring about an outward change and people will see this and it would be a great benefit to us. This would also include a change in some of our traditions.

I'll just touch on one tradition. My main subject at the beginning was prayer and how many ways it can be used. This is what I was showing by the many examples of prayer in my own life. I feel sometimes that we don't use it as effectively, perhaps, in our lives as we should. The habit that Christ gave to us, that of prayer, was given as an example to follow. The way the multitude prayed together with Him was an example. There are so many examples; we might try to find out if we are not quite right in all of our practices. They are just practices, not laws. They are habits we have gotten used to and we will get greater blessings and greater joy if we improve our habits.

I remember, one time, on National Guard duty, in the middle of a poker game one may yelled out, "You let me down, God!" I was sitting there and I thought that was a strange thing to say. I asked him what he meant. "I was praying for a good poker hand and I lost." This is an example of a need for better understanding of what our prayers have got to be. We can't ask for the wrong things and expect results. God isn't going to change His laws to answer our prayers.

People take the Scripture in Matthew which says that anything we pray for we will receive, or words to that effect. This does not mean that anything evil we pray for will bring good results! God can't change His own laws; He can't change them to make us happy, if we're not right.. Also, the manner in which we pray is important. I don't know if you remember, a few years back, something that has stayed in my mind. Bro. Glen Gill gave a sermon on prayer and how we should pray. Is it our habit at bed? Is it our habit when we get up? What kind of habit do we have in prayer. Prayer is such a basic thing in all the fundamental practices of our Church; it brings you and God together, and that's the only way it can be done. If I should ask a show of hands on how many prayers have been answered that you were aware of, I'd probably get every hand in the audience. Practically everyone has experienced this. If I should ask how many God spoke directly to, by voice, I'd get fewer hands. This is not saying that we are not spiritually acceptable before God, though many times that is God's way of answering. We sometimes speak of prayer as the opening and closing of doors. This is part of His way of working with us. He answered me by letting a little girl open her eyes and smile — just like that. He didn't have to say, "I'm going to make her alright." Although some of us wish we had greater indications, we still have such indications from God. This is very basic to our religion. All by ourselves, we have one thing to rely on, count on; that is our speaking straight to God.

I told you in the beginning that I could name, maybe 4 to 1, my sins compared to my blessings. I am hoping that our prayers of repentance for the mistakes we all make will change the score.

Try to think that this new year holds great challenges for each of us, to see what changes we can make in our own lives, so that people can't make the statement I made in the beginning — you can be away from Independence for a year and come back and find nothing changed; it's still the same local with no greater desire to change, a spiritual change.

I don't think we deserve this; I think we are deeply striving, each of us, to overcome this. This new year brings great promise to each of us. I pray that each of us will receive greater blessings; I ask that you will each pray for me too. .

REMARKABLE

Extract from an old manuscript

On the 26th day of March I was on my journey with my team, from Woodstock (the place of my nativity) to Burlington, New York. On the evening of the 27th, I put up at the house of Captain J. Bissel, Iron holder in Chilsea. I retired to my lodgings at an early hour. A few minutes before the clock struck one, as I conceived, I awoke, and turning my eyes toward the window, beheld an uncommon gleam of light, which induced me to leap from my bed. I looked out, but nothing uncommon appeared. I again got into bed, when, after some time, I was surprised at something resembling a field piece, and the clashing of swords, as I conceived, which I saw through the window. At the same instant a bright light appeared in the room, as though the moon in the height of its luster had shown directly upon me. I then raised myself in bed, immediately sank back with terror and surprise and lay some minutes motionless. At length me thought I heard an audible voice, which I conceived not human, call me by name, and said, "Arise and give ear to the message of heaven for you shall be a witness of the signs which shall be given of the perilous days which are coming upon the world, by reason of the innumerable sins and dissensions so prevalent among mankind, especially in this favored land: for saith the Lord, I have delivered this people like the children of Israel from the tyranny of a powerful nation and would have gathered them as a hen gathered her chickens under her wings, but they would not hearken to the voice of wisdom: they have become a rebellious and disobedient people, lusting as it were, after luxuries of Egypt: boasting in their strength; pregnant with evils innumerable; but their peace is destroyed. In wars and rumors of wars shall they abound, both national and civil. The father shall raise against the son and the son against the father, for a great and powerful nation have I chosen to be a scourge unto all other nations of the earth; even the most haughty shall bow to them for the race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong. By an AL-MIGHTY arm all Nations of the earth shall be made to know the Most High reigneth. This great nation shall lay waste your sea ports and utterly destroy your navigation. She shall infest your sea coasts with the fleets of all the conquered nations, and her armies shall swarm you like the flies and gnats of Egypt, for a season, until they (ye) know the Lord giveth and He taketh at His pleasure. And for a sign of these times you shall be a witness of the angel's descending with a long flaming sword in his hand which shall turn to every point to prepare the way for ushering in the glorious day. Then shall the sword be transformed into an olive branch, which shall arise and overspread the horizon and appear as emblamatical of the harmonious day in which all nations and languages shall

be gathered into one family, and all become of one heart and mind, to serve under the peaceable government of Him whose scepter sways all worlds."

After such a discourse, which I conceive more than human, neither pen nor tongue can describe the agitation of my mind, though I could not consider myself as highly favored in being a hearer of the divine message. As the clock struck three I arose from my bed and proceeded on my journey. I had not got on my way more than a mile and a half before my team was instantly stopped as though pushed by a mighty hand. I unthinkly bade them go on, but without effect. For that instant a bright light appeared to overspread the horizon and an angel descended and stood erect in the air but a little distance from me dressed in a long, unsullied robe, with a flaming sword in his hand. I can say with Daniel, "I was alone and without thought".

He said unto me, "Stand on thy feet and give ear unto the words which I shall speak," and as I stood trembling and recollecting the vision which I saw a few hours before, I lifted up my eyes and beheld his face which had the appearance of lightning, and his eyes were as lamps of fire. The sword, which he held, to appearance was about thirty feet long, the hilt of which was variously set or ornamented appeared of pure gold, set with stones of various hues, the blade resembled flaming fire, and I cast up my eyes and beheld a bow in the clouds beautifully varigated much resembling a rainbow encircling sixteen stars, though differently diversified, there being nine to the southern part of the bow of a most beautiful azure, in the center of which bow I suppose appeared an olive branch richly decorated with golden buds. The stars to the north were of a deep crimson and all very transparent and brillant which afterwards, separated; the nine of the azure fell to the south and the seven of the crimson to the north, attended with a heavy rumbling noise in the air, like the rushing of many armies to battle, at which I fell with my face to the ground.

At length me thought I heard an audible voice articulate and say, "All these are signs by which you shall know what is to befall the nation now in the latter days. Woe unto the inhabitants of the land, for their sins and ingratitude. Wars and rumors of wars shall then abound; their fields shall be crimsoned with the blood of their own citizens and nothing but lamentations and mourning shall be heard to echo through the lonely vale, until all the tares and brambles of the earth shall be plucked up and demolished from the face thereof, by the pestilence which walks in darkness, and by the sword which lays waste at noonday, for there shall be such a destruction as shall greatly thin the inhabitants of the earth, both

by war, pestilence, and famine, until after there shall arise a branch from the root of Jesse, who shall perform such remarkable things through the power of Almighty God, as shall effectually convince the world of His Divine Authority, and shall cause eventually, the remnant of all nations to be of one heart and mind in religion, when there shall be no more wars among mankind, who will ever after live in the strictest bonds of mutual friendship, possessing unfeigned love to God and one another. Then Jew and Gentile shall coincide in sentiment and become one and indivisible; declaring Jesus Christ to be their only King and soverign;" and, as he ended proclaimed, "Father, thy will be done on earth as in Heaven, and may all the people say Amen."

As he spoke these words I looked up and beheld the sword which he held transformed into an olive branch which grew and overspread the horizon under which reflection of a light presented to my view a large and spacious landscape with an unnumerable host of beings like unto the stars of heaven for a number, worshipping and praising Him who is King over all. There the lion lay down with the lamb and the beasts of the earth, and the fowls of the air were mingled together in concert, and nothing but love unutterable appeared among them, and as from the landscape ascended a voice, proclaiming, "Glory To God In The Highest; peace on earth and good will towards men;" at the echo of which, I fell on my face in amazement and terror.

He has proved this in times past, when He spoke wonderful things to the child, Samuel, in the temple, and through him continued to speak to Israel. .

David was but a boy when the Lord sent Samuel

to anoint him king of Israel, and, because God looks at the heart instead of outward appearances, David stood in preference of his brothers.

Daniel, when a young man, was wonderfully blessed of God and given to understand many things that the wise and learned men could not fathom.

Yes, God has called us to remember Him in the days of our youth. Jesus has called even little children to come unto Him and there abide forever safe from the darkness and storm that rages without.

O, that all the little ones would come to Jesus and repose in His arms, live in His strength, and grow from childhood to manhood or womanhood, without ever knowing what it is to be one minute without His gentle and loving guidance!

RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

The Relations Committee was established several decades ago to serve as a liaison body for the initial point of contact by other Churches desiring inquiry or other communication with the Church of Christ, and to make such contact with other Churches as directed or deemed appropriate. Past activities of this committee have been recorded in Church records.

Beginning in 1970, this committee has met on an average frequency of twice a year with a similar committee from the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (RLDS), now frequently referred to as the "Saints Church." These meeting have followed previous regular meetings after a lapse of approximately fifty years.

The current series of meetings was initiated in response to a request by President W. Wallace Smith of the Saints Church to explore ways for a "renewal of former conversations having to do with an effort toward closer understanding and associations between our two branches of the Restored Church." The committees act as liaison bodies, not as negotiating authorities.

Discussions have been held in the meetings on many subjects of organizational structure and operation, and basic doctrinal points held by the two Churches. The main endeavors have been to develop an accurate understanding of the origin and development of each Church's organizational structure and methods of operation, identify points of doc-

trinal agreement, and encourage association between the memberships.

Other subjects which have been discussed in a similar manner are:

- 1. Organizational structure of the two Churches.
- 2. Religious services and social activities of the respective congregations.
- 3. Rules or procedure for considering reported latter-day divine revelations.
- 4. Method of placing men in the various priesthood offices, and each Church's considered element of divinity in its priesthood authorization and function.
- 5. The stand taken by each Church in relation to the priesthood authority of the other.

- 6. Zion and the New Jerusalem.
- 7. Teaching methods employed for the membership and ministry.
- 8. Missionary programs.

A mutual exchange in expressions of agreement in principle in shared beliefs on doctrinal points has been sought, without an attempt to minutely examine the total underlying detail or make voluminous analyses. An effort has been made to avoid the mistakes of previous discussion groups from the two Churches. A spirit of good fellowship and Christian brotherhood has been experienced in all of the the meetings.
