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Editorial . . .

THE OVERRIPENED FRUIT

The destiny of this nation was predicted in a statement of threat by Lenin, the leader of the Communist movement in Russia, when he said that they would encircle the United States and it would fall into the hands of the Communists like an overripened fruit. "FOR UNTO YOU IS BORN . . . "

"And it came to pass in those days that, there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed. (And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria). And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city.

"And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) to be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child.

"And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her first-born son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the Inn.

"And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flocks by night. And lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord.

"And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men. And it came to pass, as the angels were gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said one to another, Let us go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord has made known unto us.

"And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger. And when they had seen it, they made known, abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child. And all they that heard it wondered at those things which were told them by the shepherds. But Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart. And the shepherds returned glorifying and praising God for all the things, that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them." (Luke 2:1-20).

Such is the enchanting revelation of the Saviour's birth we observe at this time. Christmas: the stirring carols sound the glad tidings of great joy; friendly voices cheer us with warm greetings; cherished hours of reunion with loved ones; refreshment, fellowship, relaxation, spiritual enrichment.

A time of reflection, reminiscences of days that are gone — other Christmases with dear ones who have left us. A time to gain perspective, to re-evaluate our lives and stewardship.

Christmas again. A reminder of the great hope for the future. As in Bethlehem, souls in despair are quickened, transformed and enraptured by hope. In Christ is the secret of life, joy, victory, peace. Only with Christ can man face his future.

Consider the miracles of time and place relating to the birth of Christ at Bethlehem.

At the time when the angel announced the birth of Christ, it was humanly inconceivable that He would be born at Bethlehem of Judea.

Mary lived far to the north at Nazareth, in Galilee. It was particularly unusual for a woman to travel near the time of childbirth. And yet it was at that time that Mary made the difficult trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

God had decreed that Mary should marry Joseph, and that Joseph was to be the foster parent and the custodian of a sacred trust, the Child Jesus. And it was because of her marriage to Joseph that it became necessary for Mary to make the journey at that particular time to Bethlehem. Joseph was compelled under the stern decree of Augustus Caesar to go to Bethlehem, the city of his birth, to register as a subject of Caesar.

What if Joseph had not been a native of Bethle? hem?

What if the strange decree by Caesar, that each citizen of the Roman world should be taxed in the city of his birth, had not been made? Such a decree was unprecedented.

What if the time element with reference to that decree had been shifted one way or the other? If the time for the registration had been later, Mary would not have been in Bethlehem.

What if either Joseph or Mary had been in such condition of health that they could not have made the trip to Bethlehem? What if? What if? What if?

But there are no "what ifs" in God's plan and timetable. That which seemed impossible occurred through divine appointment to become a reality, an incontestable, historical fact.

God had said through His prophet Micah 700 years before the blessed event occurred, that Christ should be born in Bethlehem:

"But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of these shall He come forth unto Me that is to be the ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from old, from everlasting." (Micah 5:2).

One remembers that when King Herod inquired of the Scribes of Israel concerning the place where their promised Messiah should be born, they replied without hesitation, that He would be born in Bethlehem. On the strength of that information, King Herod issued that black, inhumane decree that every male child under two years of age should be killed. Except by the warning of the angel, Joseph and Mary would have been in Bethlehem when that ghastly slaughter of infants took place.

That which was most unlikely from every human standpoint became a glorious fact; Christ was born at Bethlehem, as the prophet had foretold. "With God all things are possible."

It is wonderful to observe that God has a timetable. He causes men and nations, emperors and peasants to move and act in accordance with His sovereign will. Before the emperor at Rome even dreamed of taxing the world, God had sent His angel to Mary with the blessed announcement that she was to become the mother of the Son of God. He gave Joseph faith and the grace to know that the Child was One begotten of the Holy Ghost. Many many years before the time that Joseph had established residence at Nazareth, God had directed that his parents should live at Bethlehem where Joseph was born; otherwise he would not have returned there to pay taxes.

How wonderful that all these events, conditions and circumstances coincided when the hour hand of God's clock struck the appointed hour.

Our redeemer came into this world at God's appointed time. He fulfilled God's appointments during His short sojourn on this earth. He lived in poverty and was raised in obscurity.

He did not travel extensively. Only once did He cross the boundary of the country in which He lived; during His exile in childhood. He possessed neither wealth nor influence.

His relatives were inconspicuous, uninfluential, and

had neither training nor education.

In infancy He startled a King. In childhood He puzzled the doctors. In manhood He ruled the course of nature, walking upon the billows as if pavements, and hushed the seas to sleep. He healed multitudes without medicine and made no charge for His service.

He never wrote a book and yet no library could hold the book that have been written about or which mentioned Him.

He never wrote a song, and yet He furnished the theme for thousands of songs. He never founded a college, but all the schools together cannot boast as having as many students. He never practiced medicine, yet He has healed more broken hearts than all the doctors, far and near.

He never marshaled an army, nor drafted a soldier, nor fired a gun, and yet no leader ever had more volunteers. Every seventh day the wheels of commerce cease their turning and multitudes wend their way to worship Him.

The names of the past proud statesmen of Greece and Rome have come and gone, but the name of this man abounds more and more. Though time has spread almost 2000 years between the people of this generation and those who watched His crucifixion, He still lives. Herod could not kill Him, Satan could not seduce Him, death could not destroy Him, and the grave could not hold Him.

He stands forth upon the highest pinnacle of heavenly glory, proclaimed of God, acknowledged by angels, adored by saints, and feared by devils, as the living personal Christ, our Lord and Saviour.

We must avail ourselves of this peace which surpasseth all understanding. Definition of peace: freedom from war; freedom from fear; harmony in personal relations.

Isaiah 59:7 and 8: "Their feet run to evil, and they make haste to shed innocent blood; their thoughts are thoughts of iniquity; wasting and destruction are in their paths. The way of peace they know not; and there is no judgment in their goings; they have made crooked paths; whosoever goeth therein shall not know peace."

John 14:27: Jesus speaking says, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." Let us unite our efforts to seek this peace in our troubled world.

In the evening Brother Ely spoke to us about God

providing means to communicate with him through prayer and fasting. (John 14:12-15)

3rd Nephi 8:47: "Ye must watch and pray always, lest you are tempted by the devil, and ye are led away captive by him." Problems of life start here. The devil makes us think little wrong deeds are right. Pray among yourselves. Pray in private. We'll be blessed much by using this important tool in our lives.

We need to let our lights (actions and deeds) shine into the world. Be courteous, do acts of kindness, say "thank you" often, spread a word of cheer, give away some smiles.

Sometimes we need to fast along with our prayers, as to heal the sick. Our faith can move mountains, we're told. It (our faith) is being tried, it needs nurturing to grow.

We are told that when we fast we need to leave off frivolous things, such as radio, T. V., newspapers; leave off strife and debate; do only the necessary things. Study, pray in secret and in your heart as you do your daily tasks. Don't condemn others or point your finger. Pray to loose the bands of wickedness, to break every yoke that binds you.

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Matthew 11:28-30: "Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give thee rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Here are some thoughts resulting from recent sermons, study classes etc.

James 1:26; "If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain."

There is a difference between realizing we have an uncontrolled tongue and suffering much therewith and the unawakened who believe he is highly religious but sees no need to bridle his/her tongue, or is unaware even, that he/she is not controlling it and thus "deceives" their own hearts. This is part of the "pure religion" we are to practice, a Spirit controlled tongue.

The "bridle" or bit in our mouths, or the controlling factor is the Holy Ghost, — let us pray for this bit that that it abide in our mouths ever controlling our wayward tongues.

Eph. 4:22 to 32 explains much of the work this "bit" does, "That ye put off concerning the former

conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; And be renewed in the spirit of your minds; And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness." (verses 22, 23,, & 24). Verses 29 & 30 of 4th. Eph. "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers. And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."

How very much we do "grieve" the Holy Ghost is apparent; let us haste to repentance and heed this "bit" for our mouths God has provided.

The natural man or fallen man does offend often; yet we still must watch continually that we offend not even as we strive to put on the "new man" character, that we be not overbearing, truth breakers, arrogant, or obnoxious in our behavior and words.

We know Truth, the teachings of Christ, often does offend, for His teachings cut like a knife into our guilt, but by committing our lives to Him and asking forgiveness will ease this piercing sting. And we must take the warning we heard, that we dot not "love darkness rather than light" (John 3:19); for then we would be offended at Truth's exposing of our faults, failings, weaknesses, wrong acts, acts we have failed to do that we should have done, etc.

Pure religion is to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep ourselves unspotted from worldliness (James 1:27). And let Christ's Light shine in our daily lives (3rd. Nephi 8:55).

Isaiah 65:22 speaks of the time His elect are to enjoy the works of their hands; we know that even now we may have a foretaste of that "joy" in the "works

of faith" that He guides us in doing, as we submit our wills and tongues to Him that the "waters", i. e. words, flowing from our mouths will be always "sweet", i. e. Truth.

Phil. 2:13: "For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure."

This is wonderful! He not only entices us to good, to His will, but He enables us and strengthens us "to do" His good pleasure; we are not left in just our own puny strength alone to live His Will and to do His Will.

In James 5:7 through 11, we read that the Lord is pitiful and of tender mercy, and patient waiting long for precious "fruits"; He warns us also to have Christlike patience in waiting for precious fruits to develop in lives of His followers, in all those whose welfare rests upon our hearts.

John 13:34: "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another."

Can we do this? Can we so love as Christ did? He who gave His life for us in our sins. Do this and thus keep this new covenant Christ made with His followers.

Reading in Gal. 3:8-9, tells us that in Christ all nations shall be blessed. If nations could only keep this new commandment as well as individuals, what a blessing it would be!

In Gal. 5:13, we are told that we have been "called unto liberty . . . by love serve one another." Here we find this love of God defined as "liberty". O! that His love abide in us by power of the Holy Ghost, by which this love is spread abroad in our hearts.

Then we find in John 4:19 that we love Him because He first loved us; this new commandment of "love" is from God. It is His love and it is this, His love abiding in us, that makes verse 18 true: "There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear."

O! draw near, draw near! It is His love that casteth out fear, may His love dwell in us.

Dan. 2:47: "God is a revealer of secrets." The secrets and mysteries of God are given that man may grow Christlike characters and that mankind may be warned of things to come, etc.

Amos 3:7: "Surely the Lord will do nothing, but he revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets."

Is. 40:5: "And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together:"

Is. 5:9 to 22 was read; verse 14 records that God reveals in the ear. He speaks in the ear as a voice, as we read in 1 Sam. chapter 3 where God spoke and Samuel's ear did hear.

He does speak to the hearing ear and He also speaks in the depths of one's soul, a speaking which is not in words. These are vital dealings of The Spirit; heed them.

Matt. 10:26-27 we are told that there is nothing covered that shall not be revealed, etc. and what He tells us in darkness, "speak ye in light". "What I tell you in darkness, that speak ye in light: and what ye hear in the ear, that preach ye upon the housetops." This is admonition to us that we pay heed to His promptings, that which is impressed upon our souls, i. e. in darkness or in our secret selves, we must speak "in light". This light is His and He will give conviction by The Spirit to the hearers of it's Truth.

And what we hear in the ear is to be preached from the housetops; these are given to be made known. Words given verbatum are to be given verbatum by The Spirit's power.

Matt. 11:25: we discover how thankful Christ was that God has revealed His Truths "unto babes", i. e. unto the unlearned, the innocent, they who are babes in Christ. "Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3). There is a deepened growth of the new man in which the heavenly treasures or kingdom of God become very visible.

Great is the danger, we were warned, of becoming stiff-necked, and resistant to truth, to God, to The Spirit. The natural man, and who of us are struggling with this fallen nature, instantly rises up in rebellion as truths are brought to light that burn our conscience, for we be yet guilty of many faults.

The question was asked, are we a people who have become more dependent on the voice of others, than we are dependent on the voice of God, the voice of the Holy Spirit? In fact, we are so unacquainted with the Spirit's voice or inner workings in our souls, we fail to recognize it.

1 Cor. 2:9-10: "But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God."

We all need to search more diligently and be more exercised in faith, and feast upon the words of Christ; let us read 2 Nephi 14:4 and 13:30.

Eph. 6:6-7: "Notwith eyeservice, as menpleasures; but as the servants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart. With good will doing service, as to the Lord, and not to men."

As disciples this applies to all of us as we strive to follow Christ.

We need to give ourselves to much private fasting and prayer as Alma fasted and prayed that he might "know"; this can be our way, this should be our way as followers of Christ. From this knowing one can verily witness for God's Truth.

Alma 12:5: "But this is not all: they had given

themselves to much prayer and fasting, therefore they had the spirit of prophecy, and the spirit of revelation, and when they taught, they taught with power and authority, even as with power and authority of God."

Jarom 1:9: "And as many as are not stiff-necked, and have faith, have communion with the Holy Spirit, which maketh manifest unto the children of men, according to their faith."

3 Nephi 8:53: "And behold, ye shall meet together oft, and ye shall not forbid any man from coming unto you when ye shall meet together, but suffer them that they may come unto you, and forbid them not; But ye shall pray for them."

O! yes, meet together oft in the "unity of the Spirit" as recorded in Ept. 4:3: "Endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

To meet in this "unity" and in "peace" is the condition we are to "meet oft". These are the conditions that will feed the soul, that will be edifying. Getting together in the warmth of fellowship (if peaceful) is pleasant, yet these verses signify a much deeper and higher quality of meeting together. And this takes preparation in each person, a reaching and yielding committment to The Spirit of Truth. Then when we do meet together we will be ready inwardly to meet Him there, then we may be edified by the Spirit of God.

Ept. 3:16: "That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his spirit in the inner man."

Eph. 4:23 and 30: "And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; Grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."

Something to think about

3rd. Nephi 13:55: "And ye may know that the words of the Lord, which have been spoken by the holy prophets, shall all be fulfilled; and ye need not say that the Lord delays his coming unto the children of Israel." Verse 62 says, "Therefore ye need not suppose that ye can turn the right hand of the Lord unto the left, that he may not execute judgment unto fulfilling on the covenant which he hath made unto the house of Israel."

Can man "delay his coming" or "turn the right hand of the Lord unto the left?" This says we are not even to say that man can thus "delay" Him.

A thought

Christ has the "keys of death and hell." Rev. 1:18: "I am he that liveth, and was dead! and behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death."

And He still has them, as He is the "stronger" One who has overcome "the strong man" and has taken away his armour wherein he trusted, i. e. his "keys". (Luke 11:20 to 23)

He, Christ passed through death to gain the key of death; He entered hell and gained the key of hell. "He seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ, that his soul was not left in hell, neither his flesh did see corruption." (Acts 2:31)

"By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison." ((1 Pet. 3:19)

By His resurrection are the bands of hell broken.

NO FORKED TONGUES

I want to share with the readers of **Zion's Advocate** a speech made by an American Indian, Chief Washakie, in the summer of 1855.

I have heard it said that it never did any good to do missionary work among the Indians for all they ever wanted was material goods. But we never know when some of the seeds we scatter will fall on fertile soil. And if even one person is effected, it is worth the cost.

This Chief of the Shoshones had been visited by Mormon missionaries and when his tribe became hesitant to accept the religious teachings of these men and wanted food, tools and ammunition which could be used immediately, he made the following speech to them.

"You are all fools, you are blind, and cannot see; you have no ears, for you do not hear; you are fools for you do not understand. These men are our friends. The great Mormon captain has talked with our Father above the clouds, and He told the Mormon captain to send these men here to tell us the truth, and not a lie.

"They have not got forked tongues. They talk straight, with one tongue, and tell us that after a few more snows the buffalo will be gone, and if we do not learn some other way to get something to eat, we will starve to death.

"Now, we know that is the truth, for this country was once covered with buffalo, elk, deer and antelope, and we had plenty to eat, and also robes for bedding, and to make lodges. But now, since the white man has made a road across our land, and has killed off our game, we are hungry, and there is nothing for us to eat. Our women and children cry for food and we have no food to give them.

"The time was when our Father, who lives above the clouds, loved our fathers, who lived long ago, and His face was bright, and He talked with our fathers. His face shone upon them, and their skins were white like the white man's. Then they were wise and wrote books, and the Great Father talked good to them; but after a while our people would not hear Him, and they quarreled and stole and fought, until the Great Father got mad, because His children would not hear Him talk.

"Then He turned His face away from them, and

His back to them, and that caused a shade to come over them, and that is why our skin is black and our minds dark. That darkness came because the Great Father's back was toward us, and now we cannot see as the white man sees. We can make a bow and arrow, but the white man's mind is strong and light.

"The white man can make this (picking up a Colt's revolver), and a little thing that he carries in his pocket, so that he can tell where the sun is on a dark day, and when it is night he can tell when it will come daylight. This is because the face of the Father is towards him, and His back is towards us. But after a while the Great Father will quit being mad, and will turn His face towards us. Then our skin will be light." (Virgina Cole Trenhom & Maurine Carley. The Shoshones: Sentinels of the Rockies. University of Oklahoma Press, 1964.)

You readers may be interested in knowing that when Dick and I visited our family living in Ft. Washakie, Wyoming (a town on the Wind River Reservation named in honor of this great chief), we were told that there were some Indians working in their restaurant. When I asked to meet them, I was introduced to a light haired, light skinned and hazeled eyed young man. Later when I commented on how surprised I was that this young man was so light, I was informed that it is quite common among the Shoshones to be light complected and light eyed.

"And then shall the remnant of our seed know concerning us, how that we came out from Jerusalem, and that they are descendants of the Jews.

"And the gospel of Jesus Christ shall be declared among them; wherefore, they shall be restored unto the knowledge of their fathers, and also to the knowledge of Jesus Christ, which was had among their fathers.

"And then shall they rejoice; for they shall know that it is a blessing unto them from the hand of God;

"And their scales of darkness shall begin to fall from their eyes: and many generations shall not pass away among them, save they shall be a white and delightsome people." (2 Nephi 12:81-84)

TESTIMONIES FROM A LETTER

"... I've started a new program suggested at reunion by a Seventy. It's called the 60 day experiment. You make a point of consciously, firmly dedicating the day to the Lord every morning and give Him abundant praise and thanks all day long no matter what happens. Sort of like a positive way of trusting Godjust deciding to and then standing firm as a rock on that trust no matter how satan tries to make us doubt or worry or fear. You also write down what you want the Lord to do for you and others and then let it all happen for 60 days.

So far I've only been doing it for about two weeks but with some highly interesting results already. I write on a memo pad every morning the date and a very positive statement of dedication and trust; then I put prayers for the day down, and pray them. Probably the over-riding effect that I have seen is the abiding good mood and enthusiasm that has grown as I do this. And for someone like me who gets thrown on my ear at the first hint of trouble that's pretty important. I've also seen some interesting attitude changes, witnessing opportunities, and helpful hints at work, come up. What a difference it makes when I can really believe that God has more good planned for me than I can even imagine.

A very interesting thing came up at prayer service a few weeks ago. We were talking about forgiveness and how when we feel secure, it is easy to forgive, but when we feel insecure things that we thought we had forgiven come back with bitterness and resentment. I know that is true for me and on a broader scope my whole ability to reach out to people in any way at all is very dependent on how secure I am feeling. When I am so aware of God's love and goodwill toward me that I know I'm a beautiful person, a person of worth to and beloved of God, I could just take the whole world in my arms I'm so full of love. It's so easy to love then and to reach out. But let me feel the least bit persecuted and I withdraw.

Hopefully the 60 day experiment will help me stay secure. We don't understand everything now, there are questions, there are problems, but so what? Let's just go ahead and do what the Books say and we'll work out the questions as we go. Let's start acting like we believe God is the victor and the victory is already won, and we're just waiting for the final act.

Anyway, I find it helpful to give myself these daily pep talks. I always felt like a hypocrite before, trying to thank God when I didn't really feel like it. Harold Hill (How to Live Like a King's Kid) gave me a loop-hole. Now I just honestly say, "I don't feel like thanking and praising you in the least. This looks awful to me, I don't understand it at all, but I

will thank you and praise you and do my best to rejoice anyway, because you said to do it." (1 Thessalonans 5:16-18)

Things are better and better here, even though circumstances go up and down and get hectic and then relax and then hectic again. There is a sweet and vital spirit through it all. The other day as I gulped some supper before racing off to plan Sunday School I said a hasty prayer, that said more than I realized. As I was ending I said, "Thank you for the joy of living; in Jesus name. amen"; but I was rush-so it came out all one sentence, and I stopped and realized how much more appropriate it was, and repeated it, "Thank you for the joy of living in Jesus name."

I have learned some important things this summer from a bunch of Seventh Day Adventist lectures, . . . mostly from a little book they gave us . . . Too often I get down on myself for all the stupid things I continue to do. As I was reading that book it really dawned on me that I've got to stop trying to change my own heart. I must strive always to obey the commandments and follow God and this opens the door for Him to change my heart. I can't change my innermost attitudes and get reactions by an act of will. I can put myself in obedience to God by an act of will, then He can do the housecleaning. Funny how He can make it easy to repent, easy to apologize, easy to forgive from the inside out.

Satan has been trying to frazzle me this week because I'm trying to prepare for a retreat this weekend. However I have seen his deception and therefore I refuse to be frazzled. TO YOUR KNEES, OH ISRAEL

"I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot. So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spew thee out of my mouth. Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing: and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked: I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, and that thou mayest see. As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent. Behold I stand at the door, and knock; if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me."

(Revelation 3:15-20)

A vision was given to a prominent Elder in the Reorganized Church a number of years ago. A scene was shown him as of a tier of shelves and from the things that were loaded on the lower one the saints seemed to be helping themselves and feeling delighted. The upper shelves seemd to be loaded with richer treasures, increasing in excellence and value to the top one. While dwelling in thought upon this picture his mind was enlightened by what he took to be the Good Spirit and the import of the following language was fed into his soul.

"The treasury of my grace is replete with blessings richer than they have known: provided by me and intended for the enrichment and sanctification of the estate of my people, but they cannot be reached by them from the ground which they now occupy.

"If therefore, ye desire these things that they may make for my glory in the building up and establishing of my Kingdom on earth, and to this end would lengthen the arms of your faith for acquirement, stand ye in high and holy places, remembering that the high places are those unto which I sought to lift you when

ye were chosen out of the world, and they cannot remain holy if invaded by those pleasures which belong to the estate from whence ye were chosen, nor by the indulgence of those things not commended by me and that do not minister to holiness. In the cheerful separation of yourselves from these things, for my sake, and in your obedience to my law is revealed the sincerity and the degree of the love you profess for me, for love hath within itself all the persuasion to obedience and sacrifice.

"It has again and again been declared unto you that the set time to hasten my work is at hand, but my adversary, whose mission is to destroy, hath given greater heed to this than have ye in that he has greatly multiplied his emissaries of service and to the extent of his power had given them angelic habiliments insomuch that my people, by reason of this transformation have been deceived and have invited into their lives and their homes and their assemblies, many things which before they had disallowed and decried. These invoations have rendered less holy the places where it has been my purpose to walk in communion with my disciples,, yea, they have crowded the resorts of my heritage till they have made the places too narrow for my feet and there is small room for me to walk in their midst.

"If ye love these more than me, then be content with the fruit they yield; but if ye will be strong in my strength and share in my triumph, and if ye account my wisdom sufficient unto the mission given me of my Father, which purposes your final redemption, then be advised of me and love as I have loved, and feed ye alone at the table my hand hath spread, and consider it your glory to deny yourselves even to the uttermost, even as I have done that my Father might be glorified and ye might have joy. Remember that with God change is not known and his pleasure is still in those things alone which have given him delight from the beginning."
