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Editorial . . .

CAN WE EXPAND OUR OUTREACH?

From time to time, the "Zion's Advocate" has been referred to as a "missionary arm of the church." Just how missionary this paper is might be questioned by some, but it is our hope that the efforts and good intentions that keep it going are worth while.

Reflecting upon the missionary work of the Church of Christ today, we are caused to feel concern over our lack of success. In a competitive sense, we are not even in the same race with other Christian churches at least as far as gaining members is concerned. Moreover our ability to present the gospel of Christ as we know it is poor even at our best. We need more missionary spirit and dedication not patterned after other churches of today but more like the missionaries of old.

The purpose of the church as given in the scriptures and throughout the early revelations, is to preach the gospel to the world. What we have, or rather what we know, is not to be kept within a select few people - - it is a message of truth that would correct and heal a sin sick world. The real sense of purpose and strength of will among this people seems to have diminished to a dangerous low in recent years.

During the past two decades when the free world needed repentance taught the most, we were the least prepared to do it. Satan seemed to draw our attention away from the great increase of immorality and helplessness of the multitudes of the earth by the internal conflicts in the church itself. By the time we were able to see what was happening, the opportunity to warn the various peoples, whom we might have effected through our ministry, was past.

Now, as in the mists of confusion and ill wills begin to dissipate in the church we find a new strength within our ranks. We have begun to reacquaint ourselves with our original mission, to muster courage in rededicating ourselves and to move forward with a determination not to lose sight of our goal.

"Wake up!" is the cry. Shake off the chains that have bound us to foolish reasoning and preoccupying situations. See ourselves in the light of the Lord's call and commission. His work must come first in our lives or we will not be a part of it.

We have, by the will and advice of some, maintained a low profile. This has been done to keep from attracting the attention of the opposition, whether it be other churches or various world powers. We have been told that their possible attacks upon such a weak organization as this church could be disastrous. The pros and cons of such reasoning can be debated - - and has been debated - - at length, but while we are so engaged, the enemy keeps on ensnaring the unwarned and unprepared souls of the world in great numbers. Our hesitance adds to his success.

A major part of our problem is that we don't understand our real commission. We don't have enough faith in what we are doing, and we minimize the importance of this work and the potential it can effect upon the lives of mankind.

We don't have to attract the attention of the various powers that be, if we will only let the gospel show its own merit without trying to defend its worthiness and prove its truthfulness by the strengh of argument. Too often we are motivated by the wrongs of other religions rather than the truth of the gospel as we know it (or should know it). We cannot build our righteousness upon another's wrongs, neither are we right because somebody else is wrong. We are right only because we are righteous. Unless we are righteous, we have no way of projecting right. No matter how many wrongs we see in others, we cannot effectively expose those wrongs unless we are right. Right, of course, means that we are living righteously.

How about it? Are you right? Do you have something to tell to the world? Do you have the answers to their problems? Does your life project a righteousness that is Christlike? If your answer to any one of these questions is no, then you had better get to studying the gospel because you haven't learned it yet.

"But", you say, "they won't pay any attention to me. They refuse to hear my testimony." Is that any reason not to give it? Are we responsible for only those who will hear us? Read chapters 33 and 34 of Ezekiel and find out when we are to warn the people and to whom we are responsible.

We often fail to realize the real value and power of Christ's commission here on earth. If we are truly on the side of right, right will prevail. God is more powerful than Satan; good will overcomes evil. We must put full trust in God's word if we are to prove it to be true. We are the bearers of His infallable truth - we are the vessels by which His love is exemplified in the world.

Can you be comfortable and conscience free while thousands of souls are being intercepted through false precepts and doctrines? Don't sell God short. Whole nations of people have been warned by a few prophets chosen of God. A single person can effect the lives of many when he is guided by the Spirit of God. Though we be few, God's purpose in us can be efulfilled if we are willing to let Him do the directing.

For far too long, we have been church oriented; everything is done for the sake of the church. The purpose of the church - - preaching the gospel to the world - - has come last. Our thoughts and motives have turned selfishly inward to our own causes and campaigns.

The race to try to establish and control doctrine has been a major cause of confusion and conflict in years past. That, as well as many other similar diversions, has monopolized the work and the attention of the ministry to the extent of almost totally curtailing the few efforts of missionary activities that have been made. Consequently, the ministerial outreach of this church has been extremely limited.

It is time we expand our outreach. It is time we cleanse our minds of prejudices and defensive reasoning. It is time to school ourselves in the fundamentals of the gospel in a positive presentation. Although our ills are many, we will never heal ourself as a church if we continue the route we have been following in the recent past. We can only correct the problems within the church by yielding ourselves to the Lord's expressed will, and His will is that we preach repentance to the world.

Which is more important, gaining members for the church, or converting souls to Christ? Maybe our motives are tainted somewhat with the influence of modern evangelism. Maybe our sense of purpose and priorities need some correcting.

Church organization is important, but it is not number one. Bringing souls into the Kingdom of Heaven is number one, and this is proven by Christ's own words throughout the New Testament and in the Book of Mormon. If we would fulfill this part of the work, not only bringing souls into the kingdom but also feeding them through the word of God and keeping them steadfast in the faith, then all the other work of the church would surely be accomplished successfully.

Let's get first things first. Whether or not we gain many members, the cry of repentance must be made to the peoples of the world. We know that we can't do it on our own; we can't effectively program such a campaign. But we can make ourselves available. We can pray and fast for guidance of the Holy Spirit.

If we are aware of the various evils of the world, we can sense the needs of the many lost souls therein. This alone should motivate us to desire to counter the progress of the evil one. There are many who have less knowledge of the gospel than we do who are doing great things in teaching what they know. Their efforts put us to shame. Therefore let us rededicate ourselves to this work. Let us take the initiative to affirmatively declare WHAT WE KNOW! We have no reason to be timid or ashamed of the truth. The truth will stand when all else fails.

The Doctrine of Christ

The teachings of Jesus Christ are the gospel of the Kingdom of God, and therefore, that which is taught as gospel must conform to those teachings. Jesus spoke of a broad way, leading to destruction, and said: "Many there be which go in thereat" (Mt. 7:13). Then, He said:

"... Strait is the gate and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." Ibid. 14.

The word, "strait" as used above, means small, or narrow. Both the door (gate) and the path (way) are designed of God so that only a few will find it: the few who are really seeking the Kingdom. Those who enter as little children, in complete trust and willingness to do their Father's will, find no difficulty. It is not hidden, except to those whose eyes are fastened upon the fantasies of men, and with ears listening to the musical tinkling of their doctrine. Jesus said:

"This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth and honoreth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me. But in vain they do worship me teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." Mt. 15:8,9.

And further:

"Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up." ibid. 13.

Therefore, how important it is that we receive the doctrine of Christ, lest it be found necessary that He uproot the evil and perhaps in great sorrow to those thus torn, and this because many choose darkness rather than light.

"Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock: and the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock. And every one that heareth these sayings of mine and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man which built his house upon the sand: and the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew: and great was the fall of it." Mt. 7:24-27.

"And again I say unto you, Ye must repent, and be baptized in my name, and become as a little child, or ye can in nowise inherit the kingdom of God. Verily, verily I say unto you, that this is my doctrine; and whoso buildeth upon this, buildeth upon my rock; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against them. And whoso shall declare more or less than this, and establish it for my doctrine, the same cometh of evil, and is not built upon my rock, but he buildeth upon a sandy foundation, and the gates of hell standeth open to receive such, when the floods come, and the winds beat upon them." 3 Ne. 5:40-42.

In the above, we are plainly told by Christ what we must do to inherit the Kingdom of God: repent and be baptized in His name. This is fully supported by the Bible, as we expect to show later. Yet some will have the audacity to discredit the principle of baptism as a saving ordinance. Even repentance is scarcely touched. They say: "Just believe; accept Christ and turn your life to Him to take charge." Obedience is a forgotten term, because we are told that works have nothing to do with salvation; that we are saved simply by the grace of God. Yet, this is fully repudiated by the teachings of Jesus.

Many of the churches of men declare less than the doctrine of Christ, as noted: and some of "latter day saint" persuasion teach more than His doctrine. "The same cometh of evil", and "the gates of hell standeth open to receive them."

Consider the doctrine of baptism for the dead; a proxy baptism. Can the baptism (yes, without repentance) of a living person suffice for one who has died? Christ said: "YE must repent, and be baptized." Who? Why, the one who hears the gospel proclamation, of course. And ye must "become as a little child"; the same one who hears, repents and is baptized. Again, we are informed by the Master:

"But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved." Mt. 24:13.

Endure what? Endure means, to hold out against something. In this case, it signifies perseverance; to continue faithful to one's commitment to Christ, in opposition to a carnal or evil life until the end of hs earthly existence: to hold firmly to the rod of iron, which is the word of God.

"Wherefore, if ye shall press forward, feasting upon the word of Christ, and endure to the end, behold, thus saith the Father: Ye shall have eternal life. And now behold, my beloved brethren, this is the way; and there is none other way nor name given under heaven, whereby man can be saved in the kingdom of God. And now behold, this is the doctrine of Christ, and the only and true doctrine of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, which is one God, without end. Amen." 2 Ne. 13:30-32, Will any deny this as the true doctrine of Christ? If so, he is ready to fall, or has fallen. Then, how can a departed soul fulfill this, the law of God, being now in the world of spirits? Neither is there provision in the whole economy of God for a proxy or substitutionary obedience to the divine requirements, save that accomplished by His Son, the Lamb of God!

TO OUR SCATTERED MEMBERS AND FRIENDS

In the minds of those who cherish the scriptures, the name Zion immediately gives rise to thoughts of a place of peace and security. That we should be concerned is most understandable in this dayof nuclear weaponery in the hands of the great military powers of the world.

Mankind has now learned to fashion the weapons of utter and total destruction from the elements of the earth created by God. The marvels of chemistry and military science are bringing terror and fear to the hearts of men throughout the world in every nation under the sun.

The promise and hope of Zion is the bright star to mankind in these latter days. When will it become a reality? Who will qualify for the blessing of safety in Zion? These are questions that turn us to the words of the prophets in an anxious desire to know the truth.

Christ spoke to the people of this continent about Zion. "And verily, I say unto you, I give you a sign, that ye may know the times these things shall be about to take place, that I shall gather in from their long dispersion my people, O house of Israel, and shall establish again among them my Zion." (3rd Nephi 9:86)

Note the time is spoken as "about to take place" following a time of gathering. The establishment of Zion is to be understood as following the completed gathering for all the house of Israel. Nephi, quoting **the prophet Isaiah**, wrote, "What shall one then answer the messengers of the nation? That the Lord hath founded Zion, and the poor of his people shall trust in it." (Isaiah 14:32 and 2nd Nephi 10:54).

Who is to qualify for participation in Zion? It might be simply stated that the love of God and our fellow beings will be the measurement applied to every one counted to be worthy. To love is to serve. In consideration of the righteousness that must prevail in Zion, the law of Love must be supreme. Labor will be required and the product of our labors will provide the means that love can be expressed.

"Behold, the Lord hath forbidden this thing (priestcrafts A. G. S.), wherefore, the Lord God hath given a commandment that all men should have charity, which is love. and except they should have charity, they were nothing; wherefore if they should have charity, they would not suffer the laborer in Zion to perish, but the laborer in Zion shall labor for Zion; for if they labor for money they shall perish." (2nd Nephi 11:107-109)

It is erroneous to think of Zion as a "super social security system" that requires no effort or contribution of labor on our part. To have all things common among a people is a very different thing than having all things in common. The equal sharing of all wealth is not equal to the provision for the needy and poor by those who labor to produce goods and services. Selfish desires and covetousness will not be rewarded or served by the abundance in Zion. A young man once told me he was poor, had nothing, and this made him humble. This will not justify anyone; it takes more than kind words and sympathy to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

Zion is first of all a spiritual state of the heart of man before it becomes a place of peace and plenty. No force or coercion is used in the application of the gospel of Jesus Christ. The will of God compels no one to be righteous or holy, but invites all to partake of the gentle spirit of love.

"Hath he commanded any that they should not partake of his salvation? BeBhold, I say unto you, Nay; commanded his people that they should persuade all commanded his people that they should persuade all but he hath given it free for all men: and he hath men to repentance." (2nd Nephi 11:102-103)

I recently met a dear lovely lady who told me she had been invited to write about Zion. In considering the subject she discovered that she was unable to write without much study and research. Like many of us she had heard much preaching about Zion yet was unable to put her thoughts on paper. So we find many different views expressed as to how and when Zion will become known to us and what we can expect our part to be.

Since it is a promised future development under the direction of the Holy Ghost, we are truly unprepared to give specific details of all the spiritual and material benefits to come. Like Paul, by faith we can accept the promise of Zion though "for now we see through a glass darkly". Apostle Paul also wrote, "eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man the things which God hath prepared for them who love him." (1 Cor. 2:9)

Zion is to be sought for and hoped for with faith in God. The labors of love will bring the blessings of God as promised.

"And blessed are they who shall seek to bring forth Zion in that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost." (1st Nephi 3:187)

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DOUBTERS: WITHIN AND WITHOUT

DOUBT: Hesitate to accept; hold as uncertain; distrust (Funk and Wagnall Dictionary)

Woe be unto me, my heart is overcome with sorhow, for I am compassed about with doubters. To which heart can I turn and find no doubt? On the street I find those who doubt the very existence of God, who doubt the reality of God. In most churches, while they practice a form of religion, yet they doubt the power of God. In our own church, the Church of Christ, I find doubt. There are those who doubt the work of establishing Zion, doubt the work done by those early Saints, doubt the prophecies God gave in these last days. Doubt, Doubt.

I hear from the churches of the world a multitude of theories about what will happen in these last days. Each prominent leader having his own version of what will transpire and when. There is no wonder there is so much confusion, with so many "wise" men having interpreted the scriptures "correctly", having the ultimate answer. According to their claims, each can guarantee your salvation. If the churches of the world had the answers, then the Lord would not have need for the following.

"Wherefore the Lord said, for as much as this people draw near me with their mouth, and with their lips do honor me, but have removed their hearts far from me, and their fear toward me is taught by the precepts of men: Therefore, behold I will proceed to do a marvellous work among this people, even a marvellous work and a wonder: For the wisdom of their wise men shall perish and the understanding of their prudent men shall be hid." Isaiah 29:13 and 14.

By referring back to the 10th verse of this same chapter, we see that the prophet was speaking about a people who were to be in spiritual darkness. A people who would have no prophets or seers, for their eyes had been closed. They would have no access to divine light, other than the written word which they had among them. To many today the Bible is thought to be enough, but history has proven that without men inspired of God to teach them, such as Prophets, Apostles, Elders, etc., they were blind to the full contents of the scriptures. Therefore their "fear toward me is taught by the precepts of man." (See Romans 10:14 and 15)

It was amongst a people such as this that God proceeded to do a "Marvellous work", yes "a marvellous work and a wonder". It was the mass of confusion that existed in the churches of his time that caused Joseph Smith to seek the truth by asking directly of God for enlightenment. Those of us who are acquainted with the restoration movement know well the story of what followed Joseph's plea to God for that enlightenment. Out of that simple country boy's prayer of faith grew that "marvellous work and a wonder". That work brought to the world, not only the Book of Mormon, but also the restored Church of Christ. Along with them came also many revelations, which were to be used to direct the followers of Christ in these last days.

It must not be supposed that during this time in which the Lord was proceeding to perform his work, that Satan was asleep or that he was sitting idle. On the contrary, he was wide awake and very busy. He tried to interfere with the bringing forth of the Book of Mormon, to discredit it if possible, by distorting the message contained in the pages of manuscript Martin Harris lost. God foresaw his plan and foiled it. Satan then set about to destroy not only the Book of Mormon but also the restored Church. The history of the Church since 1830 shows that Satan has won many battles, but he has not won the war. His future success depends upon our actions during these last few years remaining in the dispensation known as the "last days"

In a discussion recently with a Non-Restorationist, I thought I could pinpoint the time and incident where the Church first began to go astray, but I found it very hard to do. Was their first big mistake not calling the twelve apostles when they were told to?, or was it in calling the Elders to the unscriptural office of high priests? Perhaps it was their faith in the arm of flesh that first caused their trouble, or even their election of Joseph to the again unscriptural office of President, thus escalating his pride. While all of these things were contributing factors to the fall of the Restoration, I cannot pinpoint any one thing as being the beginning of the trouble the Church was so quickly plunged into, unless it was their failure to follow the directions received in the early revelations.

As we step into the function of the Church today we are beset with many problems which had their beginning in those early days. We must pit ourselves against the fortifications Satan has established within the organization, if we desire to fight in the army of the Lord, and if we tender a hope of victory. Some may be content to shout about the victories already won, but the war is not over. There are battles to be fought, for Satan must not be allowed to continue to hold territory belonging to God's people, nor can his fortifications be allowed to stand between God and his children.

There is little disagreement between our brothers and sisters as to the authenticity of the Book of Mormon, or the Church of Christ; however when we get into the revelations given by Joseph Smith we run into much doubt. I am not surprised, as from some of those revelations have come damnable doctrines that have brought condemnation on the Church. The teaching of those false doctrines have so contaminated the minds of the people of this nation that they won't even read the Book of Mormon. This is one of the victories Satan has won, for the time being.

Perhaps herein lies our problem, the revelations! Are they all wrong? They are definitely not all right. Some are clean and pure from error, others are totally false, while some are a mixture of truth and error. Who is the author of the false revelations? "Well," you say, "Satan, of course." Who is the author of the true revelations? "God is the author," you reply. What happened to those revelations that contain both truth and error? Perhaps that can best be explained in this manner: God gave a revelation of truth into which Satan inserted some false information.

What then can we do about these revelations? Some have refused all of the revelations. This would tend to give Satan his victory, for this is exactly what he purposed. By inserting false information into the revelations, he could not only lead many astray which he was successful in doing, but he would also cause many a true and honest heart to reject the word of God along with the false information. Some have accepted all the revelations, which has led them into false doctrines and an outright rebellion against God. This too gives Satan his victory.

We are at WAR with Satan. He is our adversary, he desires our soul. Are we willing to surrender to his desires? "No, you cry, yet you hesitate when faced with his strategy. "Well," some might say, "Christ will set things in order when he comes." Well He may! But we are called to service in these last days. Shall the private leave the battle to be fought by the General??? Can we sit back and wait for Christ to do the work he has called us to do, and which calling we have accepted when we entered the waters of baptism?

We are not left defenseless; we have all the necessary weapons to defeat Satan in this strategem. "For to one is given by the Spirit the word of WISDOM; to another the word of KNOWLEDGE by the same Spirit; to another FAITH by the same Spirit . . . to another PROPHECY; to another DISCERNING of spirits . . . etc." (emphasis mine JFS) 1st Cor. 12:8 through 10 I have heard these things preached many times over the past years. DO YOU BELIEVE THEM??? I do. I believe if we put our faith in that Spirit, with our eyes single to the Glory of God and not our own pet theory, he will give us the necessary WISDOM, KNOWLEDGE, AND DISCERNMENT, to extract from the muddle of truth and error in the commandments, the true will of God for us in these last days.

In the 29th Chapter of Isaiah quoted earlier note well what the prophet is saying. Because this people of whom the prophet was speaking, knew not God except by the teachings of man, because they came to know about God only what blind teachers could teach them, because their hearts were far removed from God because of a lack of understanding Him, because they were lost on a sea of confusion, He would proceed to do a marvelous work in their midst. And what about that work? Is it also destined to end in a mass of confusion?? We have perhaps 18 years to reclaim that work. Is there any who will take up the sword of truth and fight?

Christ said to his disciples in Matt. 5:13 and 14, "Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savor, wherewith shall it be salted? . . . ye are the light of the world." Here then is the calling of any who become His disciples, to be an example unto the world, that the world might see and learn. Is our example forever to be division and confusion? Take notice in this same chapter and verse what is to be done with the salt that has lost its savor, "it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of man." This is a tremendous warning to us today, a warning we dare not ignore.

Directed more pointedly at us is the following from the Book of Mormon, page 647, verses 38 through 41: "But if the Gentiles will repent and return unto me, saith the Father, behold, they shall be numbered among my people, O house of Israel; and I will not suffer my people, who are of the house of Israel, to go through among them, and tread them down, saith the Father. But if they will not turn unto me and HEARK-EN UNTO MY VOICE, (emphasis mine JFS) I will suffer them, yea I will suffer my people, O house of Israel, that they shall go through among them and shall tread them down. And they shall be as salt that hath lost its savor, which is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of my people, O house of Israel."

Can you turn from this warning? God is speaking to us; these scrptiures found in the Book of Mormon are a direct revelation pertaining to us today. Read through your book of Commandments and notice how often you find the same words that I have emphasized above. "HEARKEN UNTO MY VOICE," or "HEARKEN, O YE PEOPLE OF MY CHURCH." God is pleading for you to listen to his voice.

I would like to insert here an interpretation of tongues given through Apostle T. E. Barton, Sr. at the Colorado Reunion, August 7, 1964, in Grand Junction, "Open your eyes that you may see. Unstop your ears that you may hear, for thus saith the spirit. I have already begun to bring to pass a fulfillment of prophecy already given showing forth my power in the disasters that are coming upon the peoples of the earth. They shall come from the heavens above and the earth beneath. The elements will be loosed, even all the elements that I have created. Come ye out of Babylon that ye be not a partaker of her plagues."

Notice he says "a fullfillment of prophecy ALREADY

given. (Emphasis mine) In my next article I want to bring to light some of the prophecies already given; prophecies which pertain to the disasters that are coming upon us. These are prophecies which came through Joseph Smith, and I'm sure they will be of interest to us all. (To be continued.)

LUCY SMITH MILLIKIN

LUCY SMITH MILLIKIN

Lucy Smith was born July 18, 1821 and was the last of the Smith children. She was born in a log cabin on the Smith family farm near Manchester, New York. Lucy was only nine years old when the church was organized April 6, 1830. In 1840 she married Arthur Millikin in Nauvoo, the ceremony being performed by her brother, Joseph Smith. Soon after Lucy and her husband went to Maine. Their first child was born in Maine. Lucy and her husband then returned to Colchester, Illinois where her sister Sophronia and her husband lived.

Over the years four sons and five daughters were born to Lucy and Arthur, all of them growing to maturity except a son who died when two years old.

The first son, Don Carlos, died in 1932 at the age of 89. A daughter died in 1934 also at the age of 89. Eight of the Millikin children married and left numerous posterity. Arthur Millikin died, April 23, 1882 and Lucy died eight months later.


Lucy Smith Millikin and her husband are buried in the WIDOWMORE CEMETERY which is located about one tenth of a mile north and west of Colchester, Illinois. This cemetery is in very poor condition (weeds, briars, etc.) and it was only by "sheer luck" and the help of Mr. John D. Myers, who has the Mount Auburn Cemetery records that I was able to locate the graves. The Millikin stone is quite prominent and is located in the approximate center of the cemetery.

NOTE: A careful check of the courthouse records in Carthage (county seat of Hancock county) and McComb (county seat of McDonough county) failed to locate a death record for Catherine, Sophronia or Lucy Smith.

GOLGOTHA

There is a hymn, "There is a Green Hill Far Away," which portrays the memorable site of the crucifixion of Jesus. The hymn starts like this: "There is a green hill far away, without a city wall; where the dear Lord was cru-cified, who died to save us all, O dear-ly dear-ly has he loved, and we must love Him too; and trust in His redeeming blood, and try His works to do."

John 19:17-20 records the historic event in these words: "And He bearing His cross went forth into a place called the skull, which is called in Hebrew Golgotha: where they crucified Him, and two others with Him, on either side one, and Jesus in the midst. And Pilate wrote a title, and put it on the cross, and the writing was, JESUS OF NAZARETH THE KING OF THE JEWS. This title then read many of the Jews: for the place where Jesus was crucified was nigh to the city; and it was written in Hebrew, and Greek, and Latin."

Like so many things, time changes some things. Other things, time or nothing can change. The hymn pictures a green hill; it's not green anymore. Today and for centuries there is a Muslem cemetery on top of Golgotha. Yet the form of a skull where the hill gets its name is evident to this day.

This sacred place is a prominent mound outside the old city wall of Jerusalem. If you would like to pass by it, come with me. I lived in Jerusalem and visited the site many times. It is near the Damascus Gate; the road that takes you by the site if we continued on it would take us down past the place where Stephen was stoned, the Church of St. Stephen, the Garden of Gethsemane, Bethany, Jericho and the Dead Sea. Below the hill or mound is situated what is called "the Garden Tomb." It is a tomb hewn out of the rock. This site was not known for many centuries.

Queen Helena, the mother of Constantine, is said to have discovered a cross inside the old city walls; she biult a church on that site about 300 A. D. and since it has been demolished and rebuilt many times. It is called the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. The iron dome was restored by Catholics, Greeks and Turks in 1868 and since has had extensive remodeling down to the present time. So most Catholics, Roman and Greek, look upon the Church of the Holy Sepulchre as the place of Christ's crucifixion and burial, while Protestants favor the Garden Tomb at the foot of the hill of the skull outside the city walls.

My grandfather, Rolla Floyd, was a guide; he took parties through the Holy Land during the late 1800s. He was a guide for such noted figures as the Emperor of Austria and President Ulysses S. Grant. He also was a guide for the famous General "Chinese" Gordon, a British general. After retiring, General Gordon came to Jerusalem. He was convinced that the Church of the Holy Sepulchre was not the site of Golgotha, so he excavated and found the tomb hewn out of the solid rock at the base of Golgotha. If you can't accept this discovery about a hundred years ago then visit both locations for yourself; let the Word and the Spirit be your guides. Let the words of the Angels ring in your heart. "Why seek ye the living among the dead?"

HE IS RISEN: HE IS NOT HERE. Those words were the words of the Angel to Mary Magdalene and Mary the Mother of James, and Salome. What a message to the children of men! First of all, the followers of Jesus cannot find their risen, resurrected Lord among the dead. Many great world religions so-called look to dead leaders, some look to leaders ascended to Heaven, (so they teach) but none, not a one, can point to their God as one that so loved the world that he gave His only begotten son to die for the sins of the world, to rise again and say, "Because I live ye shall live also."

No other world leader has ever been resurrected and after his resurrection be seen of over 500 men, women and children. Jesus has given the world many infallible proofs that He is the resurrection and the life. Long centuries before His birth, death and resurrection he was seen of Job, 'For I know that my Redeemer liveth, and that He shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: and though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God. Whom I shall see for myself and not another; though my veins be consumed within me." Job 19:25-27. David said, "As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness." Ps. 17:15.

After His resurrection, Jesus appeared to His disciples many times; it is recorded in Luke 24:36-53: "And as they thus spake, Jesus himself stood in the midst of them, and said unto them, 'Peace be unto you.' But they were terrified and affrighted, and supposed that they had seen a spirit. And He said unto them, 'Why are ye troubled? and why do thoughts arise in your hearts? Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself: handle me and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see me have.' And when He had thus spoken, He shewed them His hands and His feet. And while they yet believed not for joy, and wondered He said unto them, 'Have ye here any meat?' And they gave him a piece of broiled fish, and an honeycomb. And he took it and did eat before them."

To John, the beloved Apostle, Jesus showed himself some 90 years A. D. He said on that occasion, "I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which was, and which is to come, the A^{I-} mighty."

Christ asked Peter, "Whom say ye that I am?" Peter answered, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God." God had revealed that fact to Peter. Christ told him that "... upon this rock (revelation) will I build my church."
