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

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Editorial From the Past . . .

The Testimony Of Jesus

God calls all the world to repent of their sins. In this God speaks to all of the human family alike, to saint and sinner. This call is to be known from heaven, for it is written: "Surely the Lord GOD will do nothing, but he revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets." Amos 3:7.

The plan of salvation is a secret which is hidden from the world. No man can reveal it to another only as the Holy Spirit reveals it to him. The spirit of truth is to reveal God's message to the world. As it is written, "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come." John 16:13.

The spirit of truth is for the purpose of inspiring God's servants to tell things to come. That is, the spirit will guide and inspire God's people how to live in daily life and tell things yet to come. The testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.

"But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy." James 3:17. The wisdom of the worldwise is destroyed when God reveals this wisdom from above. As it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent." I Corinthians 1:19.

Man's wisdom must work in harmony with the wisdom from above in order to please God. God's wisdom comes from above and we get the gift of wisdom when we yield obedience to the command that is given. "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him." James 1:5. Verse 17 says, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning." Now if there is no shadow of turning in God's divine law, there must be present-day prophets, for God would act like Himself in every age of sinful man. God's will always was to reveal His will to and through His prophets.

We only know and prophesy in part while in this

sinful world, but when the wicked are destroyed and the righteous inherit the earth (Psalms 37:9) then we shall need no prophets, for all, from the least to the greatest, shall know Him. (Jeremiah 31:34.)

We need the spirit of truth now to guide us into all truth and tell us things to come just as much as the holy men of God of old did, when they were moved by the Holy Ghost to speak and warn the people. As it is written: "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost." II Peter 2:21. And this same Holy Ghost was promised "to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." Acts 2:39.

Some will tell us the Bible is for the purpose of telling us things to come, but I say the Bible contains the written law, and is only a blank if read without the Spirit. It says "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."—II Timothy 2:15. When we read the written word of truth, the Bible, we must have the same spirit of truth to understand and rightly divide the written word. The Spirit of Truth is the author, who inspired the men who wrote the Bible. Of course the Author should be present to inspire the reader how to rightly divide his own written word. For this reason Paul, with all his wisdom, didn't try to divide God's written word. He says, "And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.—I Corinthians 2:4 and 5.

Now has God changed His first law of revealing His will to man? Has He permitted man to rightly divide His written divine law by his (man's) own wisdom? The colleges answer that question. They are sending out preachers all over the world without even claiming a divine call as Aaron was called. Aaron was called by revelation direct from Heaven.—(Exodus 4:27.)

Paul, speaking of the spiritual sacrifice says, "For every high priest taken from among men is ordained for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins: Who can have compassion on the ignorant, and on them that are out of the way; for that he himself also is compassed with infirmity. And by reason hereof he ought, as for the people, so also for himself, to offer for sins. And no man taketh this honour unto himself, but he that is called of God, as was Aaron."—Hebrews 5:1-4.

Aaron was called of God. God called all of His ministers. Abel was called, and Cain also. They understood God's voice; both offered sacrifice. But Cain, like many people in our day, just offered such as pleased himself. Abel offered the lamb as God had commanded, and Cain got angry, and slew Abel.

(Genesis 4:8). Men of every age have been angry and have slain the prophets that God sent with a message for their own good. Also they will slay the two last prophets that are yet to come to warn the people to prepare for the coming of our Lord. Shortly afterwards the seventh angel sounds, "and there were great voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign forever and ever."—Revelation 11:15.

If people think that those who serve God as God has commanded are going along without being evil spoken of by the churches of men, they are sadly mistaken. Apostle Paul was brought before the council and they desired to "hear of thee what thou thinkest: for as concerning this sect, we know that every where it is spoken against." Acts 28:22. We of the Church of Christ, are also spoken against in the same manner in these days, but the promise of salvation is to those who endure persecutions and all things, unto the end. This is in accord with the testimony of Jesus.

Are You Satisfied?

(Transcribed and prepared for The Advocate by Amy Schrader)

"Are you satisfied?" was the title of a brochure announcing a three meeting series held at the East Local, Church of Christ on Holke Road in Independence, Missouri, on March 8, 9, 10, 1985, with the thought and desire of introducing our beliefs in the gospel of Jesus Christ to those of our community. The following is a condensation and integration of those three sermons with my own brief comments. Elder Gary Housknecht was the first evening's speaker followed by Elder Smith Brickhouse with Elder Robert Oldham concluding the series.

PART THREE (Conclusion)



Brother Oldham:

Why in the name of goodness would God in his great wisdom offer you and I this plan of salvation? Why is it to your benefit and mine to qualify ourselves recipients of such a covenant? Through the scripture I found that basically the answer to the first question—why would God create and offer us; overlook our wrongs, our weaknesses, our inadequacies time after time, very simply is because he loves every one of us. He desires that we put aside our petty differences, our misunderstandings, put aside our complexities of humanness and sociality and just come to him as little children and accept his love and bask in it.

Deuteronomy 7:7-14, declares this point much better than I, "The Lord did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye were the fewest of all people: But because the Lord loved you, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your fathers, hath the Lord brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you out of the house of bondmen, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt. Know therefore that the Lord thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thou-

sand generations; And repayeth them that hate him to their face, to destroy them: he will not be slack to him that hateth him, he will repay him to his face. Thou shalt therefore keep the commandments, and the statutes, and the judgments, which I command thee this day, to do them. Wherefore it shall come to pass, if ye hearken to these judgments, and keep, and do them, that the Lord thy God shall keep unto thee the covenant and the mercy which he sware unto the fathers: And he will love thee, and bless thee, and multiply thee: he will also bless the fruit of thy womb, and the fruit of thy land, thy corn, and thy wine, and thine oil, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep, in the land which he sware unto thy fathers to give thee. Thou shalt be blessed above all people: there shall not be male or female barren among you, or among thy cattle." Why would God bother with you and 1? Note in this scripture a commitment of love. He says to everybody, if you will accept my plan of salvation, if you will take into your heart the love that I will promise you, the gifts, the blessings, the rewards, the future is yours.

Jeremiah 31:1-4, "At the same time, saith the Lord, will I be the God of all the families of Israel, and they shall be my people. Thus saith the Lord, The people which were left of the sword found grace in the wilderness: even Israel, when I went to cause him to rest. The Lord hath appeared of old unto me, saying, Yea, I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with loving kindness have I drawn thee. Again I will build thee, and thou shalt be built, O virgin of Israel: thou shalt again be adorned with thy tabrets, and go forth in the dances of them that make merry.' A love of forgiveness; a covenant to love, to protect, to keep, a covenant to restore a fallen people. A covenant to offer hope, to offer joy, to offer fulfillment by and because of one reason, He is God. What have you got that God wants but your heart? No more, no less.

We've been instructed the last two evenings that God is the same yesterday, today and forever, that he changes not. If that is correct we should be able to look to the New Testament and see the very same promises that he offered back in the Old Testament, and I think we can. We can take a scripture Brother Gary used, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life, For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved." He sent his Son knowing his Son would die for you and me. We have two sons and a daughter and I'm not going to pretend that I could send them to die for you. God did send his Son for us. Christ did die for us. Note how the scripture confirms without question the commitment the Father made by sending his only begotten Son knowing that his Son would suffer and experience the pain of Gethsemane; the pain that Christ went through when he knew that he had to leave those that he loved, those that he wanted to teach, those he wanted to serve. But he knew it was his Father's plan that he would knowingly go to the cross; and experience the pain of the cross. We're told in Mark 14 that Christ agonized in Gethsemane. He was arrested and shamed, but as one of his disciples cut off the ear of one of the soldiers, with love he picked it up and placed it back.

The plan of God above; the plan of salvation had to be fulfilled. Christ also knew that by experiencing the pain of Gethsemane, that by going to the cross, he would pay the price that you and I can have eternal life if we will but submit ourselves to him. He knew that no circumstances or conditions that satan or his angels can afflict upon mankind could hold or keep us from the plan of love.

Now you and I have to make a commitment equal to that love. If we have not made our commitment, why haven't we? Well maybe we have. There are about three quick scriptures that can show us if we have made that commitment. Let's look at Mark 12:30 and 31, first, there was a question posed to Jesus, "And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these." That's the criteria.

Last night Buzz read, "If you love me keep my commandments," plural form, all of them. In James we're told to "Be not a hearer but a doer also." Of what? Of his word, his whole word. Am I living up to my part of the bargain? Look at John 13:34 and 35, Christ speaking, "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another, as I have loved you, that ye also loved one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to

another." Matthew 5:16 says, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." Revelation 22:12 says, "And behold I come quickly;" Christ speaking, "and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be." No place for many bystanders in this business of salvation, is there? Did you notice in those scriptures I read, the promises we will be recipients of, if we will incorporate these teachings into our daily lives?

I'd like anybody to stand up and tell me what sin you can commit if you obey all three of those commandments. What sin can you commit if you love the Lord your God with all your heart, might, mind, soul, and strength, and love your neighbors as yourself? What sin? If ye love me keep my commandments; what sin? If you love one another; what sin? None. There is none.

Is there anybody here that doesn't love God? But God said, "If ye love me keep my commandments," plural form. Let's look at I John 4:20 and 21, we're going to determine here if we're living according to the teachings and doctrine of the plan of salvation. "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not see? And this commandment have we from him. That he who loveth God love his brother also." Surely none of us is guilty of hating our brother. None of us would be guilty of talking about our brother, of laying him low because of his inadequacies, would we? Now I know there's a difference between constructively talking about (criticizing) someone and viciously gossiping about someone. What's the diffference?

As we find the commitment God has made to each of us, and as we understand the commitment that God expects of each of us, we find that there is no half-way measure in the life of service. We must obey the whole law of God, or we are subject to the law of God.

In John 15: 1-17, this is Christ talking, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman. Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away: and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit." That's saying that if you will be obedient to the words and teachings of Jesus Christ you will be grafted into the body of Christ. "Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing." Without Jesus Christ we are incapable, "If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned.

If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." Last night we were told about the blessings, the miracles, the healings, the gifts that are available. "Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples. As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love. If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love. These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full. This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you. Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you. Henceforth I call you not servants; for the servant knoweth not what his lord doeth: but I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you. Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you. These things I command you, that ye love one another." Has anybody here got a friend that laid down his life for them, say about 2,000 years ago?

Look with me at page 163 in the Book of Mormon. In my book I've got this marked in brackets, I think it's because I heard someone else say it, and it says, "the whole plan of God". Verses 29 through 32, "Wherefore, ye must press forward with a steadfastness in Christ, having a perfect brightness of hope, and a love of God and of all men. Wherefore, if ye shall press forward, feasting upon the word of Christ, and endure to the end, behold, thus saith the Father: Ye shall have-" What? "eternal life. And now behold, my beloved brethren, this is the way; and there is none other way nor name given under heaven, whereby man can be saved in the kingdom of God." Let me read that again, "And now behold, my beloved brethren, this is the way; and there is none other way nor name given under heaven, whereby man can be saved in the kingdom of God." None. No other. "And now behold, this is the doctrine of Christ, and the only and true doctrine of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, which is one God, without end. Amen."

We believe that through the teachings of the scripture we can show that the Church of Christ more nearly teaches the true and living gospel of Jesus Christ. It's your job and mine to carry that message out, because they (others) can't know of it until we who have the fulness of the gospel share it. Are you willing to accept your burden of responsibility and go out and serve God's other children? Are you willing to put those teachings into your daily lives? Are you willing to put aside those petty, small, incidental sins that we all commit and make a concerted effort not to

commit them again? Are you willing to turn from sin and be a constructive builder of Zion, that which you've been called and set apart to do?

We're told to endure to the end. Who knows when the end will be? Can you afford to postpone your day of repentance?

Is there any one here that in some way or another has been touched by God? Have you, or have you in your family, anybody that's been healed by God's intervening power? Has anybody here ever been protected from danger? Been given the necessary insight to protect them from making the wrong decision? If anybody can answer yes to those questions, then what are we doing — not serving God? If he has fulfilled his commitment to us, are we not responsible to serve Him?

What is the plan of redemption, of salvation? What is grace? What is love? What is obedience? Look with me on page 220 of the Book of Mormon, 12 through the 17th verse, "And there is none other salvation, save this which hath been spoken of; neither are there any conditions whereby man can be saved, except the conditions which I have told you." Take these following as questions, "Do you believe in God? Do you believe that he is, and that he created all things, both in heaven and in earth? Do you believe that he has all wisdom, and all power, both in heaven and in earth? Do you believe that man doth not comprehend all things which the Lord can comprehend? And again, do you believe that ye must repent of your sins and forsake them, and humble yourselves before God; and ask in the sincerity of heart that he would forgive you?" Do you believe that? "If you believe all these things, see that ye do them." You can read that whole chapter and it's good counsel to live by daily.

Question: Are you satisfied? Probably not. Can you be satisfied? If you're willing to submit yourselves to the teachings and counsel of Jesus Christ, yes you can be, but only if you're willing to submit yourself totally. Hear me well, Brothers and Sisters, if Jesus Christ has touched your heart, if you feel in any way you are not living up to the expectations that God the Father and Christ the Son have of you, correct it.

My prayer is that God has been glorified and that we all may be strengthened because of it. May God bless you.

In looking back over the series, we've been admonished to love God, and to love one another. To keep his commandments and to do those things that Christ himself has shown us to do. So I hope that each of us will take these thoughts home with us and ponder them in our hearts. Study the scriptures and ask God for that understanding and discernment and wisdom that we all need for the strength to take those things out of our lives that aren't pleasing to him; and that we might make a recommitment to serve the Lord with gladness.

I enjoy reading them so much. This pricked my heart and I thought God has given me so much, I should take the time to send in a part of my life experiences and tell how God, in his wisdom, has always been there. My life has been a beautiful testimony of God's directing it, when I would let Him

At birth I was fortunate to be born into a loving family, who had searched sincerely for Christ's true church on this Earth. With God's guidance, they found it before I was born. All my life I have been blessed with the gifts of the Church of Christ, being raised with the knowledge of trusting in Jesus. My mother had such a great gift of faith in God and His blessings, that it enlightened her family also in what God has to offer, through faith in Him. At the age of thirteen, I was baptized into the Church of Christ and had hands laid on for the gift of the Holy Ghost.

It would take a book to tell you of all the healings that God has given to me and my loved ones, through the gift of healing through His Elders and also through prayer. Another experience in my life was in 1964, when my mother, who was only 50 years old, was very ill and in the hospital. Our son Dennis was a normal boy, he was busy in the things of the world. His dad and I spent many hours in prayer to God in his behalf. God has a beautiful plan for Dennis, He has given him the thirst for knowledge. Dennis spends many, many hours studying and learning. He has almost worn out many of the brothers of the church with questions. I can recall the times he spent talking to Brother Archie Bell and Brother Maynard Case. Dennis and his wife Betsy are now in England and they spend much of their time, in old book stores, in search of God's mysteries. God guided him to his lovely wife Betsy, who was baptized into the Church of Christ last summer. Norman and I and my sister Joyce Lussenden and her husband La Verne Lussenden took a motorcycle trip to Washington D.C. where Dennis and Betsy were living, at that time. Betsy asked La Verne to baptize her. God in His magnificent greatness, in the busy place of Washington, D.C. area, provided us with a private and beautiful lake for this special oridance. A few months later Dennis and Betsy left for England (his job has taken him there). However, I know

God is with them both, as they have taken God with them. So many times, we go places but we forget to ask God to please come with us. I guess it is like the poem "Footprints In the Sand," He is there with us even when we don't know it. I know He would rather we would invite Him.

God has always provided us with a lovely, loving Church family. Having previously discussed the ministry of a "marred" servant in connection with an endowed ministry of others to the nations, preliminary to the great "day of the Lord," we wish to also discuss a vital, fulfilling ministry to the Lamanites (Indians), which will be contemporaneous to it, or practically so

Almost from the inception of this latter day restoration of the fulness of the gospel, efforts have been made to reach out to the Indians in our enthusiasm to bring them into the "light" in fulfillment of the numerous Book of Mormon prophecies which clearly reveal God's intentions to recover these people of Israel unto himself. These efforts have only succeeded to a limited degree, and the primary

reason for this is because it really was not in accord with the Lord's time table.

He has said (I Nephi 3:199-200) that:

After he has manifested himself unto the Jews and also unto the Gentiles; then he shall manifest himself unto the Gentiles, and also unto the Jews. And the last shall be first, and the first shall be last.

The Indians (Nephites, Lamanites, etc.) originated in the land of Jerusalem, living among those of Judah, though descended from Mannasseh, the son of Joseph. They were of the kingdom of Judah, and, generally speaking, were termed as Jews. Now, in a very real sense, the gospel of salvation (Christ) was offered first to the Jews and then to the gentiles. Again, in latter days, those who had formerly been the last to receive it, that is, the gentiles, were to receive it first. With a general rejection by the gentiles in the latter days, then it is to be taken from them (as nations) and offered again to the Jews, and to all of Israel.

As is often the case, we of gentile derivation have tried to run before the Lord, and our efforts to

convert the Indians have been substantially ineffective. The Lord's timetable sets the period of Indian conversion to follow the gentile rejection of the fulness of the gospel, and when these gentiles (notably the U.S.A.) would be lifted up in pride above all nations and be filled with all manner of lying, mischief, hypocrisy, murders, priestcraft, whoredoms and secret abominations (including the prevalence of secret societies). See III Nephi 7:34,35. Surely the cup of iniquity is nearly filled to the brim!

Because of these things, the Lord will bring the remnant of Jacob among the gentiles as a young lion to tread down and tear in pieces, with none to deliver. This matter has been discussed previously.

Surely, then, there is also to be a preparation among the Indians in order that they may come to the light of the true gospel restored! The Book of Mormon is clear that it is to come unto them by way of the gentiles. Please read from III Nephi 9:86-93, but we quote here verses 92,93:

For thus it behooveth the Father that it should come forth from the Gentiles, that he may shew forth his power unto the Gentiles, for this cause, that the Gentiles, if they will not harden their hearts, that they may repent and come unto me, and be baptized in my name, and know of the true points of my doctrine, that they may be numbered among my people, O house of Israel: And when these things come to pass, that thy seed shall begin to know these things, it shall be a sign unto them, that they may know that the work of the Father hath already commenced unto the fulfilling of the covenant which he hath made unto the people who are of the house of Israel.

Now, we wish to emphasize that those of the gentiles who do repent shall be numbered with the Indians, and with all of Israel; and Christ will not suffer the remnant of Jacob (Indians) to go through among *them* to tread them down. See III Nephi 7:38,39.

The Indians, as a people, are yet to receive the fullness of the gospel. It will be done through a ministry of those of the gentiles, and we are persuaded, largely through efforts of the Church of Christ. Incidentally, a preparatory work of exposing Indians to the Book of Mormon is being done with some success by factions from this Church.

We expect that the greater work will be done by Indians who have been converted into this gospel and into this Church; there is one to be raised up from that people who will do a mighty work among them; this is clear, from the Book of Mormon. Could it be that our present work in Mexico will prove fruitful to that end? Perhaps this notable "Indian"

servant is yet to be converted and united to the Church of Christ here in the U.S.

This matter of a future appearance of one who will be descended from Joseph, the son of Lehi (and a descendant from Joseph of old who had been sold into Egypt) has been "hashed" and "rehashed" many times, so we will not enter into a discourse from II Nephi, chapter two at this time, which covers it

He has been mistakenly referred to as a "choice seer" because this chapter has much to say about such a seer. It is the author's firm conviction that the "Indian" prophet who will do this mighty work (see verses 46,47) will *not* be a seer at all.

We are plainly informed in the Book of Mormon that a seer is one who has in his possession a divine instrument, called interpreters (or as the Bible gives it, Urim and Thummim), and is commanded of God in its use. Refer to Mosiah 5:72-78 and 12:14-21. Joseph Smith was a seer, and this author firmly believes he is the one referred to in II Nephi, chapter two, as a "choice seer." Incidentally, Joseph Smith is the only seer who has been revealed to date since the inception of this latter day work, by the above definition. What does this say, then, as to the successive ordinations within the factions of the restored Church to the office of "prophet, seer and revelator?"

Now, why do we say that this future, mighty "Indian" servant will not be a seer? It is because that the work of a seer, who is yet to be revealed, and who will translate the "sealed" plates which Joseph Smith was not permitted to translate, shall also be a gentile. This we shall endeavor to prove in the proper time frame of this treatise.

Following, is the prophecy (II Nephi 2:44-47) relative to the powerful work to be done among the Lamanites/Nephites by this man whom some refer to as the "Indian Moses":

And now, behold, my son Joseph, after this manner did my father of old prophecy. Wherefore, because of this covenant thou art blessed: for thy seed shall not be destroyed (the seed of Joseph, son of Lehi, is mingled with those of Laman, W.A.S.), for they shall hearken unto the words of the book (Book of Mormon, W.A.S.) And there shall raise up one mighty among them, who shall do much good, both in word and in deed, being an instrument in the hands of God, with exceeding faith. To work mighty wonders, and do that thing which is great in the sight of God, unto the bringing to pass much restoration unto the house of Israel, and unto the seed of thy brethren.

The True Church of Christ

Where is this one true church? What is this one Church like? By what is this one true church known? You may well ask such questions. This one true church is composed of all pure in heart and mind, and true believers in Christ Jesus. It is made up of all Christ's Elect — of all converted men and women —of all creed.

They are born again of the spirit. They all possess repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Christ Jesus; and holiness of life and conversation. They hate sin, and they love the Christ; they worship alike in various places, in prayer and fasting. Some worship kneeling while others cannot kneel anymore but they all worship with one heart.

They are all led by one spirit; they all build upon one foundation; they all draw their faith from the scriptures of the restoration: The Bible (K.J.V.), and the Book of Mormon; they are all joined to one great center — that is Christ the Savior. They all, even now, can say with one heart, "hallelujah;" and they can all respond with one heart and voice: "Amen and Amen."

It is a church which is dependent upon no ministry upon earth, however it values those of the priesthood who are called to preach the gospel of Christ to the membership.

It has but one great head — one Shepherd, one chief bishop — and that is Christ Jesus.

He alone, by his spirit and through his appointed Ministry, has shown the members the door to eternity.

Until He opens the door, no man on earth can open it — not any priesthood or whomever it may be.

Once a man repents and believes the gospel, he may become a member of His church through the administration of the ordinances.

The Church existence depends on nothing but the presence of Christ and His Spirit; and they being ever with it, the Church cannot die.

This is the Church to which the scriptural titles of present honour and privilege, and the promises of future glory, especially belong; this is the body of Christ; this is the Bride; this is the Lamb's Wife; this is the Flock of Christ; this is the Household of Faith and the Family of God; this is God's Building; God's chosen temple site and foundation and the temple of Christ and the Holy Spirit.

This is the Church of the First Born, who's names are written in Heaven; this is the Royal Priesthood, the chosen generation; the chosen people, the purchased possession, the hesitation of God, the light of the world, the salt and the wheat of the

earth. This is the Church about which the Lord Christ Jesus promised: "The gates of Hell shall not prevail against it." And to which He says: "I am with you always, even unto the end of the world."

This is the only church which possesses true unity. Its members are entirely agreed on all the weightier matters for they are all taught by one Spirit: About God, and Christ, and the Spirit, and Son, and their own hearts, and faith, repentance, and the necessity of holiness, and the value of the Bible and the Book of Mormon, the importance of prayer and fasting, and judgment to come — about these points they are of one mind.

Take a few from them, strangers to one another, from all parts of the Globe, and examine them separately. You will find them all to be of one mind and have a brotherhood which is stronger than you will imagine.

This is the Church which possesses true Sainthood; it's members are called Saints. They are not merely Saints by profession, or in name, they are saints in act, deed, reality, life, and truth. They are all more or less conformed to the image of Christ Jesus.

No unsaintly man wants to belong to this Church. This is the only Church which is truly Christ's Church. It is not the Church of any one nation or people; its members shall be counted and found by every human who receives and believes the Gospel of Christ. It is not confined within the limits of any one county or country, or pent up within the pale of any particular form of outward government.

Its members will be gathered from North, and South, and East and West in the latter day; and will be of every name and tongue — but all "one" in Christ Jesus.

This is the only Church which is truly apostolic. It is built on the foundation laid down by the Apostles, and holds the doctrines which they preached, and still preach. This is the only Church which is certain to endure unto the end.

Nothing can altogether overthrow and destroy it. Its members may be persecuted, oppressed, beaten, etc., but the true Church is never altogether extinguished; it always rises again from its afflictions; it lives through fire, and when crushed in one land, it springs up in another.

This is the Church which does the work of Christ upon earth. Its members are a little flock, and few in number compared with the peoples of the world; one here, two there, and two or three there — a few

in this local and a few in that.

But these are they who shake the numbers of others; these are they who are active workers for spreading the knowledge of Christ's Church, and undefiled.

This is the Church which shall be truly glorious at the end. When all earthly glory is passed away, then shall this Church be presented without spot before the Father's throne.

Thrones, principalities and powers upon earth shall come to nothing; dignities and offices and

Persons needing a place to stay should contact a Conference Coordinator. Those wishing to donate food or money to the conference, should contact the Dining Hall Committee.

In accordance with action of the 1985 Conference, all requests for funds should be submitted to the General Bishopric one month prior to the conference convening.

Temple May Become Reality Within 5 Years

(Editor's Note: This, and previous similar reports from The Examiner, Independence's local newspaper, are direct quotations and are given strictly as news items, especially for those not from the Independence area and interested in events and news within other groups having historical ties to the Restoration. It should be noted here that the Church of Christ owns the parcel of land upon which the Temple of the Lord shall be built when He so instructs, and any structures built by anyone on any other parcel of land cannot be God's Holy Temple. The "Temple Lot" was dedicated by Joseph Smith, the Prophet, according to the instructions of God—and the Church of Christ still maintains that lot as a sacred trust for God Almighty.—G.H.)

The Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints will probably be building a temple near its auditorium within the next five years, said Wallace B. Smith.

Smith, president/prophet of the RLDS church, spoke at a Thursday luncheon of the Independence Ministerial Alliance.

(An) issue that has caused controversy for the church in recent times concerns the Book of Mor-

mon. Smith said. Traditionally, church members believe Joseph Smith received plates from the hands of an angel which he was later able to translate into the Book of Mormon.

But some members of the church and those outside of the church have criticized this belief.

"We have never taken the position that our belief in the Book of Mormon was contingent on it being received by Joseph from the hands of an angel," Smith said.

"Nevertheless, we feel it is valuable scripture. It's another witness of Jesus Christ; but it does not replace the primary witness of the Old and New Testaments of God."

Another controversy yet to be dealt with by the church concerns whether the church should practice open communion — allowing non-members to participate.

"There are those within the church that feel this would be a meaningful step," Smith said. "It turns on the issue of authority."
