

KIDLE GLOCEGED TO LOCE

One hundred twenty-five years ago this month, twelve families living in eastern Illinois and western Indiana were in the process of selling their homes, farms and businesses in preparation to remove to a small frontier town of western Missouri known as Independence, from which former brothers and sisters had been driven out at gunpoint thirty-four years earlier. This move was to be done in hope of establishing a long looked-for place of peace, harmony, congeniality and safety, called Zion. Today, after those one hundred twenty-five years, Zion is still a hoped-for dream.

It can become a reality instead of just a dream if those who really want it and truly desire it are willing to prove their desire by coming to God with real intent and lay their all on the altar of service with full purpose of heart and keep the commandments of the Lord in all things. In 3 Nephi 10, we find Jesus promising His people:

But if they (Gentiles) will repent, and hearken unto my words, and harden not their hearts, I will establish my church among them, and they shall come in unto the covenant, and be numbered among this the remnant of Jacob, unto whom I have given this land for their inheritance, and they shall assist my people, the remnant of Jacob; ... that they may build a city, which shall be called the New Jerusalem.

That city is the hoped-for Zion in the western hemisphere, or Joseph's land.

Upon an occasion of visiting a branch of one of the restoration groups in Florida during World War II, the writer was asked where he was from. When he answered that his home was Independence, Missouri, several members gasped, "You are from Zion!" He sadly thought, "Oh! You poor misinformed people.! How far we are from having Zion!"

In an issue of the Reader's Digest in mid 1956 there appeared an article about a group of natives living on one of the Pacific Islands which was taken over by the American forces during WWII. These natives were Christian and were living the gospel so perfectly that they made a strong impression upon one of the military personnel. After the war he decided to return to the island to see how his native friends were faring in the midst of the corruption which had grown up around them. He was amazed to find that in spite of the corruption around them, they had held on to their faith and were a thriving Christian community after a period of several years. The editor of Zion's Advocate was so impressed with the article that, with permission, he printed it in a following number. If by their faith in God, repenting of their sins, and studying the word of God as given in the Bible which had been left with them, and humbling themselves, could bring them such wonderful protection from the wickedness which developed around them, how much more should we be able to enjoy the promises of God with the fulness of the gospel having been restored to us.

Like conditions bring like results. We do what we want to do! We obey or we rebel!

If we love God with all our heart; If we put Him first in everything we do, not letting idols, whatever they may be, crowd out our concern for God's will and our obedience to Him;

If we seek to know His will

October 1991 143 through study of His word and by prayer to be led of His spirit, and harden not our hearts toward His will or toward our fellow men, His children;

Then shall we begin to see the great promises of God develop before our eyes and Zion will begin to shine as a light in a dark place and our joy shall be full.

Notice to Local Sunday Schools: At the convention of the General Sunday School Association in Independence, April 1941, a resolution was passed asking all Sunday Schools to contribute to the General Sunday School Association 10% of their collections.

Young People's Department:

Is it up to us? Dear Young People: "It is up to the young people now." How often have you heard this statement, or one similar in the last year? I believe I have heard it a dozen and one times every place I have been. And always when I hear it repeated, my mind echoes the question, "Why?"

Why is the responsibility of bearing the Church of Christ through "Gethsemane," and past "the anguish of the cross," on the final victory, laid on our young and inexperienced shoulders?

It is true, of course, that we cannot depend on our elders forever to do our battling against the forces of evil that seek to destroy the work of God, to keep the Church in a peaceful condition for us to enjoy, to do our thinking and our praying. Life comes and goes like the wafting of the breeze. As they watched their elders, so must we watch ours prepare for eternity, and yet try to leave as much of their knowledge and experience as possible for us to profit by. Then we must take their places and carry on the work that has not yet been accomplished.

These facts alone do not satisfy my mind as being the only reasons why it is now up to the young people. Other possible reasons seek consideration.

One is the bit of scripture found in I Corinthians 1:27: "But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty;"

I am sure I feel both foolish and weak, even attempting to add my bit to our paper, nor do I have any presumption that my effort will do more than perhaps encourage another who may feel as weak and shy as I, to do their bit in another issue. Yet, undoubtedly, God works in mysterious paths and ways, and he may have some special work for even the shyest of us to do, that the best and most efficient person in his church could not perform as well.

It will be well for all of us to consider what kind of a victory we are helping each other win for the church. Are we preparing ourselves to do the part that God is holding for each of us? Can we, as the young people, be depended on to take over the work of the kingdom, when the time comes that it is necessary for us to do so? What kind of a record will we make for it?

Edward H. Podhola

Brother Edward Podhola, age 75, resided at 3021 Chandler Street, Lincoln Park, Michigan, until ill health forced his admittance to the Allen Park Convalescent Home in Allen Park, Michigan. He passed from this life on August 29, 1991, while still a resident of the Allen Park Home.

Brother Ed was born August 27, 1916, in Cadott, Wisconsin, of the union of Edward John and Vila Mae Podhola. He was baptized May 10, 1942, and first entered the Ministry of Jesus Christ when ordained as a Priest on November 1, 1942. He was later ordained to be an Elder on October 22, 1944, and accepted the office of Bishop in the Church of Christ, on April 12, 1947.

Brother Ed was preceded in death by his wife, Helen Gertrude and his son Dale. With his passing, he leaves two sons, Phillip and Michael, and two daughters, Mrs. Susan Deters and Mrs. Maryse Kocsis. He is also survived by 12 grand-children and five great grand-children.

The funeral services for Brother Ed were conducted by Elder Edward Toulouse of the Church of Christ, Flint, Michigan, at the Peters Funeral Home in Lincoln Park, Michigan. The place of interment was Parkview Memorial Cemetery, Livonia, Michigan.

In a recent letter from one of Brother Podhola's daughters, Mrs. Susan Deters, she speaks of the period just prior to his death and we quote: "Many days were spent reading his favorite passages of scripture and singing familiar hymns, both with tape and a capella. My father's greatest gift to me was the time we shared discussing the importance of our love of Jesus in our lives."

Defining The Day In Which We Live

The early church fathers, those yet living in the days of John the Beloved wrote plainly that the Lord Jesus would not return again to this earth until the 6000 years were ended. Based on Biblical and astronomical chronologies, I believe that day is now only 10 years away. Yet the Lord was explicit that no man knew the day nor the hour. He also told us that except those days be shortened no flesh would be saved but for the elect sake those days would be shortened. One study based on Daniel's 1335 day prophecy gives the final date as 2005. There it says "Blessed is he that waiteth, and cometh to the thousand three hundred and five and thirty days." According to the book, "He Walked The Americas" the final date given in the Indian prophecies is 2012 which is the end of the fifth cycle of the white man in Americas since the discovery in 1492.

So what is the bottom line and where do we now stand in the scheme of history? In 1957 Apostle E. Leon Yates had a dream that warned us that it was even then 5 minutes minutes to midnight. Thirtyfour years have since passed. Matthew 24 speaks of a great tribulation which is to be followed by tremendous heavenly signs and the appearance of our Lord in the heavens. This appearance of Christ is referred to as the day of the Lord in the prophecies. 2 Thessalonians 5:2 tells us that the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night and we who are of the day are warned not to

sleep as do others. For when they shall say peace and safety then comes sudden destruction. Ezekiel 30:3 tells us that when the day of the Lord is near it will be the time of the heathen. 1 Peter 3:10 also tells us that the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night in which the heaven will pass away with a great

noise. Revelation 6:12-17 says that when that day comes the wicked will cry for the rocks and mountains to fall upon them, because with the appearance of Christ in the heavens the great day of his wrath is come. The second chapter of Joel says that those who will in that day call upon the Lord will find deliverance in Zion and in Jerusalem (verse 32). Joel also says that those same heavenly signs that Matthew told us would terminate the great tribulation would also usher in the day of the Lord (our Lord's advent as given in Matthew 24 and the day of wrath as given in Revelation 6).

In point of time we are now in the latter end of the 5th Seal just preceding the opening of the 6th Seal which is the seal ending the tribulation and commencing the day of the Lord. This means that we are already passing through the Great Tribulation. This tribulation began in 1917 with the rise of the heathen to power - atheistic communism - a power which has since extinguished the lives of close to 100 million people. The climax of this tribulation will be achieved when the image to the beast stands complete and the worldwide economic bondage is fully in place. Then will the end come.

Missouri Reunion - 1991

The 1991 Missouri Reunion officially began at nine o'clock on Friday, August 9. But a Reunion isn't just the being there, it's also the getting there. This one really began in the middle of the 1990 Reunion when the Committee met together to ask themselves, what have we done right, What have we done wrong, What can we do better? Before the day was done, those responsible had begun the countdown for Reunion 1991. Then it began for each individual sometime during the year when each made his own decision to attend. The planning and preparation are part of the enjoyment of the Reunion.

The first meeting of this Reunion was a prayer meeting. Those from the farthest away are usually there, others are arriving. The trip to the Reunion is an enjoyable one. You know that somewhere someone is praying for your safe arrival. So, as your vehicle covers the miles, your thoughts fly faster and already you are coming together, reuniting.

Evangelist Hubert Yates gave the first sermon. (It is the only one not available on tapes.) Brother Hube said, Before we have a Zion, we have to have a special spiritual condition. He quoted from King Benjamin's speech at that second Zarahemla Reunion, saying that we are nothing until we take upon us the name of Christ. He asked, "What do you think Zion is? Is it a gathering of those who haggle and backbite, who can't get along?" The things we find in Zion are peace, forgiveness, love, unity and compassion. Is the body of Christ preparing itself? Zion is a spiritual plane that we must achieve. The first thing in our life must be Christ. If he came into this room now, we'd think, "Oh, goodness! I shouldn't think that. I should have" If we say Zion, let's live it. It's a fortress prepared in an individual by the power of his Holy Spirit.

It seems like the way we sing

tells a lot about us. The first song services at a Reunion seem a little ragged around the edges. We're used to singing with a different piano. We're used to harmonizing with different voices. Here and there we are little pockets of different congregations. Gradually, following the song leaders (this year it was Nicholas Denham and Margret Gill) we draw together and learn harmony. We become one congregation.

In his sermon Apostle William Sheldon spoke of a desire to kindle afresh the idea of a literal place of Zion. He asked, Don't we want to be a part of the building of New Jerusalem? The gospel of Christ has to be demonstrated. We can not develop the spirit of Zion within us unless we have communion one with another. How do we develop that pure desire to become indeed the people of God? And he read in answer the first few verses of Isaiah 26. The last part of his sermon has to do with the instructions for the gathering of saints.

Friday evening and Saturday are always special times at the Reunion as we watch for the arrival of friends and family. Elder Frank Fann was the preacher Friday night. His sermon was on the Complete Life. Not the complete life you expect from owning your first car, or marrying the girl of your dreams, not the complete life of a family and your own home, or even becoming a grandparent. "Believe in God," he said, "and believe that He is." Repent. Be like Him. Have a complete love for Christ and our fellow man.

An interesting thing happened with the singing of the closing song that night. "The Old, Old Path" had been chosen and enough of the crowd knew the words that they did not need to keep their eyes on the song book. They began to look around and to see those who were sharing the path with them. It was nice to see friends as the people of the third verse.

There is a curious blend of the past and future at a Reunion. Little

kids running around looking so much like their parents at the same age that you wonder which generation it is that you almost don't remember. One year two little boys, hardly more than toddlers, were very impressed with Kenneth Smith's wheelchair. With a smile as big as theirs he let them hitch a ride. The boys were at the Reunion again this year and one of them offered a prayer in behalf of Brother Jensen after he became ill during prayer meeting.

The sadness of the people is heard in their singing at the prayer services. In the past prayers have been asked for the sick and hurting bodies of our loved ones. Now we are hearing of the sick and wounded souls. Often these are in our own families, so we come together burdened with caring.

Elder Joel Yates, in his sermon, emphasized local congregations as the most effective missionary effort. He reminded us that where two or three are gathered together the Lord has promised to be with them. But what good is that to us if we aren't there too. We need to be willing to bear one another's burdens. These tough times are to make us come closer together. There's a work for all of us.

Elder Joseph Smith took it one step further. He preached the responsibility of the individual. "Ye are the children of light," walk ye in it. God is doing what He said He was going to do, and you can be a part of it. Zion will be built, with or without us. We have developed a peculiar philosophy, "Let the missionaries do it." If you've got the love of God in you, it will shine out all over the earth. You are the light that is to shine to lead these people that won't even listen to us. "How long, children of light, will we stand idly by?"

Elder Alvin Harris emphasized that no matter what we believe about Zion, our real goal is to be ready for it. There were ten virgins; all were righteous but only five were ready. Like several before him, he read from King Benjamin's address and I Thessalonians chapter 5. Believe that man doth not comprehend all that the Lord doth comprehend. Abstain from all appearance of evil, we're not dealing with some little thing, we're dealing with real evil. We have the greatest hope in the world, Jesus Christ. We need to strap Him on like a life preserve. Get your priorities in order and let's get to work.

It seems impossible to report on a prayer or sacrament service. If you are not there to hear with your heart you may not understand the worlds. One testimony, though, was important to this year. Loren Bryant said, "A healing cannot always accomplish what is most important. Nothing is so important as presenting a soul ready to stand in the presence of God." And there was one little picture that was a testimony in itself. During prayer, one little girl, sucking her thumb, snuggled against her father as he knelt there, a familiar place in a strange land.

The talent service is another thing it seems we must be selfish with. There's no way we can share on paper the sound of singing or the poetry, or Georgia Tate's quilt. There were a few neat little "snapshots" of what made it enjoyable. One was four year old Cody Fann singing, lightly accompanied by his Bruner grandparents. Another - the touch of the piano keys was a little different. When Martha made a mistake during the congregation's singing, her head rose from behind the piano to look at her sister in apology, with a smile like the sun coming up. Another -Eleven youth camp girls silently signing while Kim Yates led them and softly sang the song as if interpreting it.

Apostle Smith Brickhouse had the last sermon of the weekend. He

said, "The Reunion isn't worth much unless you take it back home with you." He spoke of 100% responsibility, which means 'everything in my power'. Let us follow after the things of peace...that edify, having our hearts knit together in unity and love. Be steadfast, abounding in good works. Leave here with a commitment.

There was a little child. Joel and Jennifer Yates' tiny girl, not yet a year old, was tired of being held, tired of being confined, and maybe just plain tired. Joel had allowed her to crawl around under his chair and the one next to him. As she played there she saw his Books stacked near at hand. She crawled to them and laid her little cheek upon them. It seemed the most loving gesture, a sign of complete trust and security.


