he Committee to Study Zion has once again been asked to coordinate the submission of written material to Zion's Advocate for the express purpose of publishing articles from various Church members on the subject of Zion.

The following articles present various perspectives which include the historical commandments on establishing Zion and how we should prepare ourselves to help bring these commandments to fruition.

We are surely in the last days of time as we now know it. It is only prudent that we search our souls, read the commandments and begin to assist in the formative process of building this most special community.

Only with a concerted effort can all of this come about! Please consider the following commandments while preparing yourselves for Zion:

Book of Commandments, Chapter 10: vs. 1-5:

A great and marvelous work is about to come forth among the children of men: behold I am God and give heed to my word, which is quick and powerful, sharper than a two-edged sword, to the dividing asunder of both joints and marrow: therefore, give heed unto my word.

Behold the field is white already to harvest, therefore, whoso desireth to reap, let him thrust his sickle with his might, and reap while the day lasts, that he may treasure up for his soul everlasting salvation in the kingdom of God; yea whosoever will thrust in his sickle and reap, the same is called of God: therefore, if you will ask of me, you shall receive; if you will knock, it shall be opened unto you.

Now as you have been asked, behold I say unto you, keep my commandments, and seek to bring forth and establish the cause of Zion. Seek not for riches but for wisdom, and behold the mysteries of God shall be unfolded unto you, and than shall you be made rich; behold he that hath eternal life is rich.

Verily, verily I say unto you, even as you desire of me, so shall it be done unto you, and, if you desire you shall be the means of doing much good in this generation. Say nothing but repentance unto this generation. Keep my commandments, and assist to bring forth my work according to my commandments, and you shall be blessed.

Behold thou hast a gift, or thou shalt have a gift, if thou wilt desire of me in faith, with an honest heart, believing in the power of Jesus Christ, or in my power which speaketh unto thee: for behold it is I that speaketh: behold I am the light which shineth darkness, and by my power I give these words unto thee.

As is evidenced in this commandment, halfway measures or halfheartedness on the subject of Zion will not be enough. We must direct ourselves totally to accomplish what is commanded of us.

What is Zion?

erhaps the simplest, shortest yet most definitive statement concerning Zion is "...for this is Zion, the pure in heart;" No truer statement was ever made. To be in Zion one must become pure in heart; yet I challenge all who quote that, to determine what scripture they are quoting.

Zion is both a condition and a place. Only those who meet the condition can abide the place. We pray, "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven", that is the condition, a people subject and obedient to His will, whether on earth or in heaven. Some forty odd years ago I approached the Lord to know if Zion would become a reality in my life time that I might know how to direct the focus of my life. /the answer when it came surprized me. It was that I didn't need to know that. Whatever is required to be of the Kingdom of Heaven is the same whether on earth or in heaven. I should direct my life to that.

The Book of Mormon tells us that in our day, when the gospel is - has been - restored, there will be a people who will build a city called the New Jerusalem. 3 Nephi 10: 1-2, "But if they will repent, (having been speaking of the gentiles) and hearken unto my words, and harden not their hearts, I will establish my church among them, (has he?) and they shall come in unto the covenant, and be numbered among this the remnant of Jacob, unto whom I have given this land for their inheritance, (Joseph's land, Ephriam

and Manasseh), and they shall assist my people, the remnant of Jacob; And also, as many of the house of Israel as shall come, that they may build a city, which shall be called the New Jerusalem;" The gentile, the remnant of Jacob, and as many of the house of Israel as will come, these three as a group is the antecedent of the 'they' of the second verse. We, if we will, may be of that group.

The Book of Commandments chapter 48: 59-67, identifies the New Jerusalem and Zion as being the same.

Go ve forth into the western countries, call upon the inhabitants to repent, and inasmuch as they do repent, build up churches unto me; and with one heart and with one mind, gather up your riches that ye may purchase in inheritance which shall hereafter be appointed unto you, and it shall be called the New Jerusalem, a land of peace, a city of refuge, a place of safety for the saints of the most high God. And the glory of the Lord shall be there, and the terror of the Lord also shall be there, insomuch that the wicked will not come unto it: And it shall be called Zion: And it shall come to pass, among the wicked, that every man that will not take up his sword against his neighbor, must needs flee unto Zion for safety. And there shall be gathered unto it out of every nation under heaven: And it shall be the only people that shall not be at war one with another. And it shall be said among the

wicked, let us not go up to battle against Zion, for the inhabitants of Zion are terrible: wherefore we cannot stand. And it shall come to pass that the righteous shall be gathered out from among all nations, and shall come to Zion singing, with songs of everlasting joy.

That last statement iterates who will be acceptable in Zion - the right-

The Lord began as early as April 1829 instructing the establishingt of the 'cause' of Zion and in June of that same year, the seeking to bring forth the establishing of Zion, making the two commandments synonymous. Cause, as a noun is, "that form which anything proceeds, and without which it would not exist." (Webster) As a verb, it is, "to bring about, make happen, effect, induce, produce." (Webster) The cause of Zion? That which will produce Zion. Can it be other than that obedience to the will and commandments of God without which it cannot exist; that Zionic condition met in each and every personal life of all who aspire to become part of it?

The Book of Mormon leaves a promise for those who seek to bring forth Zion. A specific promise to a specific act of obedience. I Nephi 3: 187-188:

And blessed are they which shall seek to bring forth my Zion at that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost; And if they endure unto the end, they shall be lifted up at the last day, and shall be saved in the everlasting kingdom of the Lamb."

All of God's promises are on condition of obedience. "I, the Lord, am bound when ye do what I say, but when ye do not what I say, ye have no promise. (Revelation given April 1832, at Independence, Missouri)

Only to that extent that the gift and power is manifest among us can we suppose that we have been seeking to bring forth Zion. Where or when it is lacking we must confess efforts have been otherwise or elsewhere.

We find in both the Bible and Book of Mormon the record that after Christ's teaching, the church brought about a condition among themselves called 'All things common'. Acts 2: 44-45, 4: 32, 3 Nephi 12: 11, 4 Nephi 1: 4, surely we all know the references, or can check them, so I will not quote here in the interest of brevity. What is the meaning of this clause? God has said, Psalms 50: 10-12, "For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills. I know all the fowls of the mountains: and the wild beast of the fields are mine. If I were hungry, I would not tell thee: for the world is mine, and the fulness thereof." and Haggai 2: 8, "The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, saith the Lord of hosts." Strange that we claim them ours!

In the Book of Commandments we find. Oh. 52: 19-20, "For behold the beasts of the field, and the fowls of the air, and that which cometh of the earth, is ordained for the use of man, for food, and for raiment, and that he might have in abundance, but it is not given that one man should possess that which is above another; Wherefore the world lieth in sin;...." If inequality puts the world in sin, what about the Church? God is not a respecter of persons, Acts 10:34, so if the fulness of the earth is his, how could he then sanction inequality among them? Is not this then the meaning of the clause, All things common, that is, All things equal?

Every kingdom is governed by law. Surely the Lord's commandments are the laws that will govern His kingdom on the earth. In fact the so states. In February of 1831 he told them to assemble

to receive his law, Book of Commandments 43: 4. In the same month when they were assembled he says, "Again I say unto you, hearken and hear and obey the law which I shall give unto you;" Book of Commandments 44: 4. And he proceeded to tell them how our affairs both spiritual and material should be governed. The condition, "If thou lovest me thou shalt serve me and keep all my commandments; and behold, thou shalt consecrate all thy properties unto me, with a covenant and a deed which can not be broken; etc..." We have just rehearsed that all the fulness of the earth is his; should we demur to acknowledge his claim to it in the manner that he directs? King Benjamin said,"...ye are eternally indebted to your heavenly Father. To render to him all that ye have, and are,..." Mosiah 1:76-77, I submit that one can not do either except they do both. And must it not be in the manner that the Lord has commanded?

Jesus gave two great commandments, Matthew 22: 37-40, to love the Lord with all our heart, mind and soul, and to love our neighbor as ourself. On these two hang all the law. To suppose that we do so love the Lord and yet feel these commandments are grievous; or that we so love our neighbor and yet want more for ourself than all are able to have, is to deceive ourselves about ourselves.

But the Lord has said that Zion will be whether we avail ourselves of the privilege to help bring it into being or not. Book of Commandments 52: 25-26, "But before the great day of the Lord shall come, (the day of his coming) Jacob shall flourish in the wilderness; the Lamanites shall blossom as the rose; Zion shall flourish on the hills, and rejoice upon the mountains, and shall be assembled together unto the place which I have appointed." And in the Book of Commandments 65: 39-40:

Wherefore as ye are agents, and ye are on the Lord's errand, and whatever ye do according to the will of the Lord, is the Lord's business,



and it is the Lord's business to provide for his saints in these last days, that they may obtain an inheritance in the land of Zion; And behold I the Lord declare unto you, and my words are sure and shall not fail, that they shall obtain it:

And where is the place appointed? Let the Lord speak, "Hearken O ye elders of my church, saith the Lord your God, who have assembled yourselves together, according to my commandments, in this land which is the land of Missouri, which is the land which I have appointed and consecrated for the gathering of the saints; Wherefore this is the land of promise, and the place for the city of Zion." from a revelation given July 1831 in Independence, Jackson County, Missouri.

This, then, is Zion; a people gathered together in the pure love of Christ called Charity (Moroni 7: 50-53), blessed with that abundance (Malachi 3: 10, "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.") of the fulness of the earth which is the Lord's, created for the use of man, after the manner of his commandments wherein there are no rich nor poor but all are equal; over whom he will reign as King of kings, and Lord of lords when he comes.

But, who will give themselves; all they have and all they are to its accomplishment? The vaults of the heavens, the valleys of the mountains, the reaches of the seas and the empty chambers of the ages all echo, "Who?"

Zion in the "Tatter Days"

study of the Restoration movement reveals early and pervasive teachings of Zion as a definite place. Even before the formal organization of the Church on April 6, 1830, mention was made of Zion in a number of early revelations.

In a revelation to Oliver Cowdrey in April 1829 we read: "Now as you have asked, behold I say unto you, keep my commandments, and seek to bring forth and establish the cause of Zion." Book of Commandments 5: 3.

A revelation to Joseph Knight, May, 1829 states: "Now as ye have asked, behold I say unto you, keep my commandments and seek to bring forth and establish the cause of Zion." B. of C. 11:3

A revelation to the Church of Christ, given in the presence of six elders, in Fayette, N.Y., September, 1830 says:

And ye are called to bring to pass the gathering of mine elect, for mine elect hear my voice and harden not their hearts. Wherefore, the decree hath gone forth from the Father, that they shall be gathered in unto one place, upon the face of this land, to prepare their hearts, and be prepared in all things, against the day when tribulation and desolation are sent forth upon the wicked. (B. of C. 29: 8-10)

These revelations are in accord with the Book of Ether 5:1-8 (Book of Mormon – emphasis here and throughout by H.J.D.):

And now I, Moroni, proceed to finish my record concerning the destruction of the people of which I have been writing. For behold, they rejected all the words of Ether; for he truly told them of all things, from the beginning of man; and how that after the waters had receded from off the face of this land, it became a choice land above all over lands, a chosen land of the Lord: Wherefore the Lord would have that all men should serve him, which dwelt upon the face thereof; and that it was the place of the New Jerusalem which should come down out of heaven, and the holy sanctuary of the Lord. Behold, Ether saw the days of Christ, and he spoke concerning a New Jerusalem upon this land and he spoke also concerning the house of Israel, and the Jerusalem from whence Lehi should come; after that it should be destroyed, it should be built up again a holy city unto the Lord; Wherefore it could not be a New Jerusalem, for it had been in times of old, but it should be built up again, and become a holy city of the Lord; and it should be built up unto the house of Israel; and that a New Jerusalem should be built up upon this land, unto the remnant of the seed of Joseph, for the which thing there has been a type; for as Joseph brought his father down into the land of Egypt, even so he died there: Wherefore the Lord brought a remnant of the seed of Joseph out of the land of

Jerusalem that he might be merciful unto the seed of Joseph, that they should perish not, even as he was merciful unto the father of Joseph, that he should perish not; Wherefore the remnant of the house of Joseph shall be built upon this land; and it shall be a land of their inheritance; and they shall build up a holy city unto the Lord, like unto the Jerusalem of old: and they shall no more be confounded, until the end come, and the earth shall pass away."

In 4th Nephi 1:3-4, an account is also given of a zionic condition of the Church of Christ following his appearance on this continent. "... and there were no contentions and disputations among them, and every man did deal justly one with another; and they had all things common among them, therefore there were not rich and poor, bond and free, but they were all made free and partakers of the heavenly gift."

There was intense interest in the restored church regarding the exact location of Zion in the latter days. Book of Commandments 59:48, 49,69 gives Missouri as its location. A revelation in B. of C. 54:1-4 told the elders to go to Missouri where the land of their inheritance should be made known to them. On June 19, 1831, Joseph Smith and several others left Kirtland, Ohio, arriving in Missouri in mid-July. In addition thirteen pairs of missionaries were called to travel to Missouri, each pair taking a different route and preaching on the way.

On August 2, Joseph Smith aided some who had come from Colesville, N.Y., in laying a foundation log twelve miles west of Independence in Kaw Township. The next day eight elders met where the temple is to be built. Sidney Rigdon dedicated the land, and Joseph Smith, Jr., laid the Northeast cornerstone of the temple. While an attempt to buy just the lot was unsuccessful, on December 19, 1831, a tract of 63 and a fraction acres was purchased which included the present day Temple Lot.

I will not attempt here to follow the fortunes of the early church as problems in Missouri ultimately led to its expulsion from that state, nor of a period of relatives peace and prosperity in Illinois which ended with the assassination of Joseph and Hirum Smith in 1844.

In accordance with a revelation given to Granville Hedrick, the Illinois saints began returning to Missouri in 1867. By November of that year, they were able to buy again the piece of ground known as the Temple Lot.

As years have passed, and the "latter days" have edged ever nearer to the "last days," we have total assurance the Lord's will regarding the

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redemption of Zion and the building of His Temple will be accomplished. The only question is what part we as individuals and the Church of Christ as a whole will play in this all-important work.

The choice is ours!

When the Jord Shall Bring Again Zion

When the Lord again brings Zion - Mosiah 7:77-78, Isaiah 52:8
For the Lord hath chosen Zion; He hath desired it for His habitation - Psalms 132:13

his statement drawn from Mosiah 7:78 and Isaiah 52:8 leads us to know Zion was in times past and that it will be again, for the Lord has said He will bring it AGAIN. What a marvelous promise to us in these the latter days. This promise does carry with it requirements and labor to be accomplished on our part.

All must understand Zion starts in the heart, with the all-consuming desire to dwell in a physical Zion with those of like faith. Zion shall not be for those persons who think any less of it. It will require faith, commitment and sacrifice. The Lord will bring Zion again by His faithful disciples who seek to bring it forth with a humble desire to follow His commandments. Let me here quote 1 Nephi 3:184-187:

For behold, saith the Lamb, I will manifest myself unto thy seed, that they shall write many things which I shall minister unto them which shall be plain and precious; And after thy seed shall be destroyed and dwindle in unbelief, and also the seed of thy brethren; behold, these things shall be hid up, to come forth unto the Gentiles by the gift and power of the Lamb; And in them shall be written my gospel, saith the Lamb, and my rock and my salvation; And blessed are thy who shall seek to

bring forth my Zion at that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost;

"That day" in verse 187 is referring to "to come forth unto the Gentiles" in verse 185 and is talking of the coming forth of the Book of Mormon and from that time there is a promise of a blessing for those who seek to bring forth His Zion. This scripture does not say, "Bring Zion forth," but to "Seek to bring forth." Some say Zion will come forth in the Lord's time, and I fully agree with this in all things. I also know that we are told that Zion could have been since the early 1830's. Different latter day revelations witness and verify those words and directions given to us in the Bible and Book of Mormon.

In the seventeenth verse of the first chapter of Zechariah we are told that "...Thus saith the Lord of hosts; My cities through prosperity (good) shall yet be spread abroad; and the Lord shall yet comfort Zion, and shall yet choose Jerusalem." A prophecy of the spread of the gospel and that there shall be a Zion and Jerusalem. To go with this revealment we have very important words from Psalms 132:13-16. "For the Lord hath chosen Zion; he hath desired it for his habitation. This is my rest for ever: here will I dwell; for I have desired it. I will abundantly bless her provision: I will satisfy her poor with bread. I will also clothe her priests

with salvation: and her saints shall shout aloud for joy." Of all things voiced in this passage of scripture the fact that our Lord desires it for his habitation (seat of government) is most important for us to remember. Would any say "I don't care to have any part in bringing forth the place of the Lord's domain? I think and pray not.

I would like to present some more thoughts to sum up this writing about the gathering, and the Lord's Zion, keeping in mind that no body of people have held title to this spot of ground called the Temple Lot except those called the Church of Christ.

In September 1832 there was a revelation given to this church, found in An Outline History of the Church of Christ (Temple Lot) on page 46 (bottom of page) listed as Sec. 83:1-2b, (emphasis throughout by C.W. B.) "... The word of the Lord concerning His church, established in the last days for the restoration of His people, as He has spoken by the mouth of His prophets, and for the gathering of His saints to stand upon Mount Zion, which shall be the city New Jerusalem; which city shall be built, beginning at the Temple Lot, which is appointed by the finger of the Lord, in the western boundaries of the State of Missouri, and dedicated by the hand of Joseph Smith, jr., and others, with whom the Lord was well pleased. Verily, this is the word of the Lord, that the city New

Jerusalem shall be built by the gathering of the Saints, beginning at this place, even the place of the temple, which temple shall be reared in this generation; for verily, this generation shall not all pass away until an house shall be built unto the Lord, and a cloud shall rest upon it, which cloud shall be even the glory of the Lord, which shall fill the house"

The instruction given here is very plain that Zion is to have its beginning at the Temple Lot and nothing

is to be on that lot except the Temple. Is it not reasonable then, that the Temple is to be the starting of Zion?

If Zion is to be the habitation of the Lord and the Temple is the House of the Lord, then it has to be considered Holy Ground, for where He is or will be is Holy Ground.

Would any desire less than to endeavor to bring forth that glorious time when we might be taught from on High. That we might live within the protective boundaries of Zion,



for the day is soon to come when the Saints must gather for their well-being. Let us fast and pray for direction in this matter.

n view of the aspect of present conditions, it is proper and logical to consider the plan we know as "All Things Common."

The world wide situation cries unheeded for a remedy. Remedies in connection with, or a part of the present economic system and the business ethics and policies, extant, are impossible. That is, remedies which will do any amount of enduring good. We are now embarked, unmistakably, in that time of great stress and trouble that Holy writ speaks of. Unrest, mistrust, are on every hand. Dishonesty has its place in the world of businessmindedness. It is creeping indelibly into our every day existence; becoming a part of us. This, coupled with the ever loosening moral bands, is too great for people in the "Church of Christ" to endure and expect to rear their children under.

To us it is given the grasp upon'a

salvation from such an overwhelmingly adverse situation. The Gospel plan provides this salvation. It is no more nor no less than the plan of "All Things Common."

We may be extremely commercialized about it and call it "mass living", and that with all it implies. As mass production means cheaper manufacture with no harm to quality, this plan means cheaper living and greater quantity with no harm to quality. In fact, it means better quality, for the plan which brings it, necessitates it. This All Things Common, means the elimination from our lives of those things which are extraneous and superficial. In other words it replaces the worldliness of us with Godliness and Godlike things. The very structure of the plan, permits us to have, as a group, the full proceeds of our labors rather than some individual enterprises assimilating their fraction, and delivering to us the remains according to the varied rules of the labor market. Further, it provides an insurance very sure and unique. Old age, death, your wife, your children, are all taken care of. They are provided for in turn if they see fit to follow the plan. Education will be theirs, and there is no reason why a group

of people under-such a system can not build an educational institution such as has never been found before in the world. As well as doing all the above mentioned things, it provides for members from outside in spite of their financial condition, and also provides funds for worthy causes, missionary work, charity, group publications. Under such a system there should be no such thing as discontinuance of a worthy cause because of lack of funds.

We have life and happiness promised us by such a system, and only grief and hardship otherwise. Is the effort worth the pay? It surely seems so. If such is the case, then it is ours to educate "ourselves daily to be useful under such a plan and prepare to take advantage of such a scheme as soon as God permits. It can not be done in a second's time. There is room for men of every vocation. It must needs have thought and preparation, for when we establish such a system, it calls for a segregation very independence in its nature.

We are told in prophecy the exact culmination of earthly things, therefore let us prepare diligently before God that we may be able to take part in this great thing which must surely come.

Opinion of the Council of Apostles Concerning the Sacramental Wine

Inasmuch as there are those who have had, and may yet have, a weakness in the use of alcoholic beverages, and also because we anticipate an influx of new members in the future from those we call Indians; and because there appears to be an inherent weakness within many of that race in the use of alcohol,

We your brethren of the apostles, declare that it is not wisdom to place a stumbling stone in the way of any who have such a weakness, who are members of the body of Christ, lest they should be overcome and fall once again into the physical and spiritual entrapment of the effects of alcohol because of our use of wine in our Sacrament services which contains this element. Neither is it wise to introduce our member children to the use of alcoholic beverage in an age when such is a greatly increased temptation in our society.

"It is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor anything whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak." Romans 14:21

Therefore, we recommend the use of unfermented, or non-alcoholic wine as the most desirable beverage in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, and urge that this become common usage in the Church.

What would bring us closer to Christ, one step closer to eternal life?

PHILIPPIANS 3: 14: I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

PSALM 92: 1: It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High.

At Sacrament Service, I thought, "Do I have anything to offer?" I sat there. . and sat there. . .the service closed, and I sat there. "Why?" I've come to expect blessings as commonplace. If it's not spectacular, I have nothing to say. I heard little things God had blessed people in, and thought, "Me too always." Remember the watchcare times, small blessings, not high on a "one-to-ten." Remember to praise God. I failed to do that maybe you've failed, too. "What big thing happened I can stand and praise God for?" There were probably a hundred! If we weren't accustomed to daily blessings, we'd think were miracles?

PSALM 96:

O sing unto the LORD a new song: sing unto the Lord, all the earth. Sing unto the LORD, bless his name; shew forth his salvation from day to day.

Declare his glory among the heathen, his wonders among all people. For the LORD is great, and greatly to be praised: he is to be feared above all gods. For all the gods of the nations are idols: but the LORD made the heavens.

Honor and majesty are before him: strength and beauty are in his sanctuary. Give unto the LORD, O ye kindred of the people, give unto the LORD glory and strength. Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name: bring an offering, and come into his courts.

O worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness: fear before him, all the earth. Say among the heathen that the LORD reigneth: the world also shall be established that it shall not be moved: he shall judge the people righteously.

Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; let the sea roar, and the fullness thereof. Let the field be joyful, and all that is therein: then shall all the trees of the wood rejoice before the LORD: for he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth: he shall judge the world with righteousness, and the people with his truth.

There is one God in Heaven. All we are, or have, or ever hope to be, we owe that being, God.

PSALM 47:2: ... the Lord . . is a great King.

TITUS 2:11-14: For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.

Are we peculiar, zealous people, of good works? God gave a way to attain salvation. He gave his son, to die on the cross, for you and I. He is concerned about our daily lives: he answers prayer. We know the world we live in; of sin, degradation, and unholiness; yet God, in his goodness, gave us opportunity to live here righteously, if we follow the commandments of Jesus Christ.

I NEPHI 3:43: . . . for he is God over all the earth, yea, even above all.

GENESIS 1:1: In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.

Look out the window. See green grass, trees, flowers, and birds: he created them. Does he deserve praise for giving the life around us? Does he desire praise? He tells us, all through the Bible and Book of Mormon, to praise him.

GENESIS 1: 26-30: God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth. So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

We've done that, yet do we praise him, give him the honor and glory, he so richly deserves?

And God said, behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat.

And it was so. We need to get down our knees, daily, and thank God for things we have.

JEREMIAH 9: 23-24: ... Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches:

We know people, who glory in their own might, minds, and riches. Don't be taken in by that.

But let him that glorieth, glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me, that I am the LORD which exercises lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness, in the earth: for in these things I delight, saith the LORD.

Can those who glory in their own minds, strengths, and might do us any good? Should we sit in awe of them? Or, should we sit in awe, glory, and praise of our Heavenly Father, who has given us lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness?

PSALM 100: Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands. Serve the LORD with gladness; come before his presence with singing. Know ye that the LORD he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thank-

ful unto him, and bless his name. For the LORD is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations.

Know the LORD is truly a being, mindful of our daily lives. We are his people, the sheep of his pasture. What does a shepherd do? Tends his sheep: they rely on him 100 percent for safety, protection, and being fed out of the best pasture; just as we rely on our Heavenly Father for food, protection, and all good things.

ALMA 16: 177 - 184: Do ye remember to have read what Zenos, the prophet of old, hath said concerning prayer or worship? For he saith, Thou art merciful O God, for thou hast heard my prayer, even when I was in the wilderness: yea, thou was merciful when I prayed concerning those which were mine enemies, and thou didst turn them to me: Yea, O God, and thou was merciful unto me when I did cry unto thee in my field: when I did cry unto thee in my prayer, and thou didst hear me. And again, O God, when I did turn to my house thou didst hear me in my prayer. And when I did turn unto my closet, O Lord, and prayed unto thee, thou didst hear me; yea, thou art merciful unto thy children when they cry unto thee to be heard of thee, and not of men, and thou wilt hear them; Yea, O God, thou hast been merciful unto me and heard my cries in the midst of thy congregations; yea, and thou hast also heard me when I have been cast out, and have been despised by mine enemies; Yea, thou didst hear my cries, and was angry with mine enemies, and thou didst visit them in thine anger, with speedy destruction: and thou didst hear me because of mine afflictions and my sincerity; And it is because of thy Son that thou has been thus merciful unto me; therefore I will cry unto thee in all mine afflictions; for in thee is my joy; for thou hast turned thy judgments away from me, because of thy Son.

Praise him for answered prayer. Everyone has had answered prayer, in our job or our home. Did we remember to praise his holy name?

At work, we were repairing a piece of equipment - a very, large bearing (costing about \$45,000) that we had to heat and put on a shaft. We only had one chance. I had a colored fellow working for me, not the best repairman I ever saw in my life, but willing. I directed him, explaining a half-dozen times how to go about this, so we didn't ruin this \$45,000 bearing. Finally, he said, "Mista Fann, would it be alright to pray?" You bet - we did, and it went alright - you knew it would. This fellow wasn't relying on my knowledge, or his skill: he relied on our Heavenly Father's skill, who knows and does all. You know what he said, after that bearing slipped on? "PRAISE THE LORD!" And he meant it. We've all had prayer answered. "PRAISE THE LORD!"

Zenos talked about "God being merciful unto me." Do we need mercy? Do we sin? You bet! Do we live up to God's command? No. Do we fall short? Yes, we do. Do we live in harmony? Do we have contentions us? A few. Praise our Heavenly Father and ask for mercy.

TITUS 3: 8-9: This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men. BUT, avoid foolish questions, and genealogies, and contentions, and striving about the law; for they are unprofitable and vain.

We have time on our hands: to contend, to argue. What can we put in it's place? Praise. Prayer. Thanksgiving. Take up that time. Unfortunately, we do have contentions. Test me on this: Fill your mind with praise, there will be no room for contention. See if I'm not telling you the truth. Fill your mind

with thanksgiving - for things God has given us, individually and as a Church. Contentions will disappear. They'll fly away. Our minds will be centered on Christ.

II NEPHI 5:29 - 30 . .there shall be no disputations among you concerning points of my doctrine . . he that hath the spirit of contention, is not of me.

Verse 31: Behold, this is not my doctrine, to stir up the hearts of men with anger one against another; but this is my doctrine, that such things should be done away.

This is repeated two or three times - it's important - God wants us to do it, "Ye must repent and become as a little child." Trust in our Heavenly Father. Do away with our strengths, prejudices, thoughts, and wills. Give ourselves completely to Jesus Christ. My grandson is wholly dependent on his mother. If she left him alone, he'd die: he could not fend for himself. If we leave our Heavenly parent, we die, spiritually, don't we?

PSALM 100: We are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

We should understand the Bible and Book of Mormon, and have a oneness with Jesus Christ.

JAMES 1: 5 - 6: If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, who giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea, driven with the wind and tossed.

We have this special privilege. Do it in praise!

JAMES 1: 27: Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

We need mercy. If we get down on our knees, thank and praise our Heavenly Father, we have a chance for mercy.

JAMES 5:8: Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman

waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, until he receive the early and latter rain. Be ye also patient; stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

If it was "drawing nigh" then, how much closer is it, now? How much time to praise our Heavenly Father and be thankful? We don't know. Let's live our lives, so that, if he came tonight, we'd be ready, not ashamed. We could say, "We have glorified your holy being."

James 5:9 - 11: Grudge not one against another brethren, lest ye be condemned: behold, the judge standeth before the door. Take, my brethren, the prophets, who have spoken in the name of the Lord, for an example of suffering affliction and of patience. Behold, we count them happy which endure. Ye have heard of the patience of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy.

The advise Paul wrote Timothy is good advise to us:

I TIMOTHY 4: 11 These things command and teach. Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity. Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery. Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all. Take head unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

Praise the Lord for his well doing, for the words in these two books, words he had written: How to live, to conduct business, to have relationship with our Heavenly Father. Praise him.

PSALM 113: Praise ye the LORD. Praise, O ye servants of the LORD, praise the name of the

LORD. Blessed by the name of the Lord from this time forth and for evermore. From the rising of the sun unto the going down of the same, the LORD's name is to be praised. The LORD is high above all nations, and his glory above the heavens.

MATTHEW 18: Verily I say unto you, Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven.

Nephi said, "I glory in plainness, I glory in truth, I glory in my Jesus, for he hath redeemed my soul." So should we. He has, through our obedience to him, redeemed our soul from Hell. That's the reason we have taken upon us the name of Jesus Christ, to redeem our soul, to have Eternal life. Praise be the name of my LORD, Jesus Christ.

When They Shall Say "Peace, Peace"

President Bush ... announced ... that the United States would eliminate land based tactical nuclear weapons and remove all short-range atomic arms from U. S. submarines and ships...

The proposals outlined by Bush would ... dismantle about half the U. S. nuclear arsenal, including all longrange bombers, the entire naval stockpile and the tactical weapons designed to defend against a Soviet invasion of Europe (The Cincinnati Enquirer, September 28, 1991).

The first is found in 1 Thessalonians 5:3, "For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child and they shall not escape." The second, from the Book of Mormon, is a promise to the righteous in that evil

time. "For he will not suffer that the wicked shall destroy the righteous. Wherefore, he will preserve the righteous by his power, even if it so be that the fullness of his wrath must come, and the righteous be preserved, even unto the destruction of their enemies by fire" (1 Nephi 7:35-36).

Nevertheless the surprising events of the past two years, namely, the fall of the iron curtain, the removal of the Berlin Wall and German reunification. and the fall of so many so-called hardline regimes in eastern Europe was all accomplished according to a blueprint published in 1984 by Major Anatoly Goletzin in his book, 'New Lies For Old', a former agent of the Soviet KGB. 
