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

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Consider the Stone Mason

here are few things that men or women make, construct, or build, that will last a number of years, or that might even span generations. Rain, snow, cold and heat take their toll on anything left exposed to the elements. It is ironic that man, given the ability to create, is also the most destructive, choosing to destroy another's work to make room for his own work, hoping to produce a lasting work.

One of these works that have always impressed me is that of a wall made of natural stone laid in such a manner that a straight line is achieved from slabs of rock with no trueness or straightness of their own! Consider the stone mason picking each rock up and sizing, sorting and selecting just the right one for each section of this magnificent wall—a wall of beauty made up of individual stones with a special beauty all their own and unique to themselves.

As each of you are aware the Zion's Advocate Staff has changed, with some of us assuming new roles, and others so new we are still shaping the role we will assume. As I prayerfully considered my duties, and thought on how best to solicit articles for publication, the Advocate was compared to a stone wall in my mind's eye. We thank Thee dear God for the divine light of Thy Gospel that Thine Only Begotten Son Jesus Christ-even our Lord and Savior—brought to the earth to tell us of Thee, and Thy works, and the way of righteousness to walk in our mortal life, and Thy great Plan of Salvation in Thy Holy Kingdom. We praise Thy most high and holy name for the written record of Thy Words in the books of Scripture written down through the ages and preserved even until our time, and which Thou has expanded even in the time of the Latter-Day Restoration, to again bring the fullness of the Gospel to the earth in this dispensation of time. May we ever learn of Thee and Thy ways, and be aided by Thy Holy Spirit within our desire to remain faithful to Thy commandments and worthy of Thy promised reward, even ultimately unto Eternal Salvation.

A SENSE OF DIRECTION

Church of Christ suffered the loss of our church building by fire on this lot. The momentary shock of this unexpected loss was overcome by a miraculous resilience of will especially noted in some in the desire to reestablish ourselves on this property. As for me, a simple statement by a kind sister in the church on that fateful day gave me an optimism that overcame any doubt that might otherwise been an hindrance. That statement was, "It's in the hands of the Lord."

And surely it was in the hands of the Lord. It seemed that the Lord was at work almost immediately. Even as darkness fell upon that old charred building that New Year's day, plans were being drawn for a new building adequate for our needs.

The many inconveniences were met with few complaints. The Temple Lot Local Church moved into the local Y.M.C.A. and with the East Local Church for their regular scheduled services, and the several general church offices were set up temporarily in various homes in this area. At the same time, the members of the General Bishopric went to work in obtaining information as to our several options and within three weeks were able to make an extensive presentation to the apostles on January 19th. A preliminary decision to build a structure, very much like the one we are sitting in this day, was made unanimously by the apostles and bishops that were present at that meeting. During the April Conference of 1990, the plans were voted on and accepted.

It is impossible at this point to even estimate the number of hours that the members of the General Bishopric spent in meetings and in performing of

the miscellaneous duties that were necessary during the time of planning and building this structure. Our brother, Elder Leslie Case, has spent much of his time in this work since his retirement which was just prior to the fire, and we are grateful for his willingness to make such a sacrifice. We are also very thankful that the Lord was with our brothers in the Bishopric throughout the best and the worst of all the situations that they faced during

Part Three, Conclusion

e have previously referenced the ripening in iniquity of the nations of men in the last days, emphasizing evident facts to point out that it must be very near to a fulness. So many of the prophecies relating to the second advent of Christ have already been fulfilled, with the reminder being evident on an almost daily occurrence.

In the 24th chapter of Matthew, our Lord has given us much understanding of those events, and he follows immediately in chapter 25 with the conditions to occur regarding the kingdom of heaven, just before He shall return in glory.

"Then (at that time, w.a.s.) shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins, which took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom" Matt. 25:1.

There were five wise virgins and five foolish virgins; the wise had oil in their lamps, but the foolish had none. It is interesting to note that at the midnight cry, "Behold the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him", the foolish virgins requested oil of the wise, for their "lamps are gone out" (v.8). But the wise said, No; there would not be enough for both the wise and the foolish. "Go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves" (v.9).

Who are these that "sell" the oil? Who else but the sanctified Ministry of

Christ to whom we have previously referred! Those who have the authority to administer the ordinances of the gospel, who will cry, "Ho, every one that thirsteth, come ye to the waters (of baptism, w.a.s.), and he that hath no money; come ye, buy and eat; yea, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price" (Isa. 55:1).

But these foolish virgins had been those who had known of Christ, had given Him lip service, but would not yield to the obedience of Christ. (part three, page two)

"Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able. When once the master of the house is risen up (He shall arise to establish His kingdom in righteousness, w.a.s.), and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are: Then shall ye begin to say, We have eaten and drunk in thy presence (have taken the Communion of the Lord's Supper, w.a.s.), and thou hast taught in our streets (through an uncalled Ministry, w.a.s.). But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are, depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity" (Luke 13:24-27).

Returning again to Matthew 25, we know then that the five foolish virgins had no part in the kingdom of heaven, of which Christ spoke. What about the five wise virgins? We have been of the mind that these represented those, at least, of the Church of Christ,

who had the oil of righteousness in their lamps, and would thus be privileged to go in to the marriage. This seems to be a correct analysis; but is it? Why should these be informing the foolish virgins to "go ye rather to them that sell", the Ministry of Christ? Those ministers are, of course, a part of the "body of Christ", His Church. Then, are the foolish to go elsewhere seeking oil? Of course not!

Well, let us consider more. The bridegroom is acknowledged as the Christ. Therefore, His bride is the Church of Christ having on her wedding garments, being holy, without spot. But she is "one body", not five virgins; for Christ will not be a spiritual polygamist. These five virgins are symbolic of the great multitude, over and above in number, to the 144,000 of Israel which are all to be gathered upon Mt. Zion (see Rev., chapters 7 and 14). The 144,000 represents all of Israel, ancient and modern, of human lineage and those who are spiritually begotten, which together shall reign with Christ in Zion. The additional great multitude (see Rev. 7:9-17) will be those who were among the nations, to whom the marred servant of 3 Nephi, chapter 9, shall minister, as well as the watchmen of Isa. 52:7,8 (the sanctified, empowered Ministry of Christ). This multitude will have gone through the great tribulation, and washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb. These are they that are the five virgins, with oil in their lamps, and are accounted worthy to enter into the wedding feast prepared by the Bridegroom.

But what about the bride herself? She is they of the Church who have become the true saints of God, who will have been tested, tried in their faith, will have endured whatever chastisement God may have seen fit to impose without murmuring, will have resisted the temptations of their great adversary, and had gained the victory through the grace of Christ, having been diligent in prayer and thankful for all He has granted and laid upon them.

(see Matt. 24:29).

It seems apparent that before this cataclysmic occurrence the Lord shall gather up those who have come unto Zion, to gather them into His bosom, as it were, as He appears in glory with the saints of ages past, and with a multitude of angels. A great trump is to sound, and the bodies of those saints who are with Him shall be united with their spirits: a resurrection of the dead, called the first resurrection.

When would be a more appropri-

"For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God..."

These are they that are "accounted worthy to escape all these things (the terrible tribulation of the nations, w.a.s.) that shall come to pass, and to stand before the son of man." (Luke 21:36). These will have been gathered unto Zion, or Zion in its embryonic state, to be preserved from the wicked nations who will gather together to fight against Zion (see 1 Nephi 7:26-37 and Bk. of Com. 48:59-66). Then shall the Lord arise and make the remnant of Jacob to be as "new sharp threshing instrument having teeth (mouths/marginal reference, w.a.s.): thou shalt thresh the mountains (nations, w.a.s.) and beat them small, and shalt make the hills as chaff" (Isa. 41:15). And then shall the Lord's climactic judgements be poured upon the nations in the form of worldwide earthquakes, with the shaking of all physical elements of the universe, the sun to be darkened, the moon to become as blood, and the stars and planets shaken from their orbits, or to fall from heaven

ate time of fulfillment of Apostle Paul's prophecy declaring that the saints of the last days shall be caught up to meet the Lord in the air than we have here discussed? (See 1 Thess. 4:17, which will be referenced more fully in this treatise).

Returning again to Matt. 25:1 regarding the bride, or the Church: Assuming as we are that the parable of the ten virgins does not refer specifically to the Church of Christ, or if you will, Christ's Church, what are we to make of this seeming deletion? The King James translation of the Bible shows evidence of an error in man's judgement in the translation process, or is another indication of tampering by man with the word of God. In this verse, we are told of the ten virgins going "forth to meet the bridegroom". However, ancient Aramaic, Latin and Syriac translations inform the student that these virgins went forth to meet "the bridegroom and the bride" (emphasis mine, w.a.s.) This language is

also included in Lamsa and Moffet translations. We are to understand by this that the wedding will have already occurred, and that subsequently the bride and groom will meet the five virgins for a wedding feast. Verse 10 says they "went in with him to the marriage, and the door was shut". This is not the time of the wedding, but of the "marriage", when the Groom will complete a union with all who have truly accepted Him.

Luke 12:35-37 speaks of this same circumstance, but please note that verse 36 speaks of it as a time of waiting, "when is (Christ, w.a.s.) will return (my emphasis, w.a.s.) from the wedding", it having already occurred. Then He shall "gird himself, and make them to sit down to meat, and will come forth to serve them" (v. 37). This will then fulfill what Jesus said later: "I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom" Matt. 26:29.

Can we further account for the wedding having transpired before He comes upon Mount Zion, before the wedding feast where He opens the door to those who are worthy?

We are disposed to negate the general concept of a "rapture" as advanced by many Christian fellowships, and rightly so. Of course, this term is not found in the Bible, nor any similar term of which we are aware. However, we have already referred to a scriptural text which is used as a basis for the promotion of this doctrine. The rapture theory affirms that all believers in Christ will be "raptured", or will be caught up into the air to meet Christ while a universal destruction occurs upon the earth; and that the believers would remain in the air with Christ henceforth forever.

This text follows, and is worthy of our consideration in order to seek a proper understanding of this prophecy:

"For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him. For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first; Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord" I Thess. 4:14-17.

Let us enumerate the salient points of this prophecy:

Verse 14:

- (1) Resurrection of Jesus affirmed.
- (2) Saints of God to be resurrected and return to earth with Christ.

 Verse 15:
- (3) Saints which are alive at the time of Christ's coming shall not, in Christ's provision for them, in any way diminish His power to resurrect the righteous dead and to bring them with Him.

Verse 16:

(4) The Lord shall descend from heaven with a loud shout, the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of a trumpet from God; this sound of the trumpet shall call forth the righteous dead, their bodies to arise from the grave and to unite with their spirits which Christ is to bring with Him.

Verse 17:

(5) Saints living upon the earth at this time will also be caught up with the righteous dead, and these all to-

gether shall meet the Lord in the air. Henceforth, these all shall be forever with the Lord.

Contrary to the rapture theory, which says that these living believers shall forever be with the Lord in the air, the context says that He is to "descend from heaven". Obviously then, after this climactic union in the heavens of all saints of all ages with their Lord, they will then descend to the earth to reign in triumph over death, darkness

of God; the inhabitants shall build and inhabit, plant and eat the fruit, with none to deny or destroy. It appears that those who have been translated from mortality to immortality shall have children, and shall yet conceive without trouble; and these children, when coming to 100 years of life, shall die; but this death shall not be as we know it; it shall be a passage from mortality to immortality in a twinkling of an eye, just as was experienced by their fore-

and evil. This will be the Zion of God in ultimate fruition, and will last for 1,000 years. Remember that Jesus said: "Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth" (Matt. 5:5).

These then, the righteous resurrected dead and saints living when Christ shall come, are the 144,000 of all Israel as described in chapters 7 and 14 of the book of Revelation, standing upon Mount Zion in the presence of the Lamb of God. To these will be gathered a great multitude of all nations, having endured the terrible tribulation upon the whole earth, yet through faith toward God in a demonstration of righteous living which would not yield to the tempting power of Satan.

Then shall the Good Shepherd lead them to safe pastures. The sound of weeping and crying shall no more be heard; wild beasts shall dwell in peace with the tame, and shall no longer devour flesh; there shall be no harm in all the holy mountain (Zion)

bears at the coming of Christ (1 Cor. 15:51-55). Please read Isa. 11:6-9 and 65:17-25; 59:21; Ezek. 37:25.

The day must soon come that the midnight cry shall sound as never before; a cry of repentance and by the power of the Holy Ghost - "Behold the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him." (Matt. 25:6). 

LESSON FOUR: The Kingdom is Love THE PARABLES OF JESUS

In Lessons One, Two, and Three, we learned some important things about the Kingdom of Heaven. We learned what it is, how it functions and its value. In Lesson Four we are going to look at three parables. One of them is perhaps the best known of Christ's parables, the Prodigal Son.

READ: Luke 15. Compare and contrast the three parables: The Parable of the Lost Sheep. The Parable of the Lost Coin, and the Parable of the Lost Son. In this chapter, Christ is subtly answering the criticism of the Pharisees and scribes. He was criticized for associating with publicans and sinners.

DISCUSSION: The first two parables are building a concept of love that exists in heaven when one person repents. Also, extra energy is extended toward the lost sheep and the lost coin. Christ uses in the first parable a shepherd and then in the second parable a housewife. He is relating to both men and women. Then Christ moves to a universal theme that all can identify with—the relationship between a parent and a child. This is a relationship we can understand at the literal level. The symbolic or analogous message is one of a loving heavenly father, a father in heaven who doesn't want to lose any of his children to the world or satan. His love is full of mercy and he offers complete forgiveness.



QUESTIONS: 1. Why did the son want his inheritance now? (Son's will vs. Father's will.) 2. What did he do with the 4? 3. What does it mean when it says the son "came to himself?" 4. How do we know that the prodigal son blames no one but himself? 5. Does he expect to be reinstated in his father's household? 6. Why is the father's compassion and the kiss he gives his son important in our symbolic interpretation? 7. How do we know that the son has repented? 8.

How do we know that the son received complete forgiveness? 9. How does the son who remained with the father react to the celebration being prepared for the Prodigal Son? 10. How does the father reason with the son who has remained? 11. Who do you think the son, which remained, represents? 12. How is this son's love different than the father's?

SUMMARY: At the time of Christ, Judahian society had become very legalistic and judgemental. The society was stratified economically and religiously. Christ was criticized for associating with the common man and known sinners. In Luke 15, Christ is revealing what God is like as our creator and our father. He is telling us that we are of worth and God is interested in us—particularly if we are alienated from him. His love is expressed in His compassion, His mercy, and His forgiveness. He gives us hope that even if we have become lost and have lost our relationship with Him because of sin that God the Father, if we repent, will reinstate us back into his Kingdom with all the rights, privileges, and gifts promised to his children. "The Son of Man is come to seek and to save that which was lost" Luke 19:10.
