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

THE MESSIAH

The greatest blessings forever possible have been bestowed upon the earthly mortal children of our God -The Gift of Life; The Gift of His Son, Jesus; The Gospel He Brought to the Earth; and The Plan of Eternal Salvation.

It was decreed that as man is, it is so that he might have joy and obtain to eternal salvation. (2 Nephi 1:114-117)

Having received the gift of life from our Heavenly Father, we are totally accountable to Him for the manner in which we conduct our life within the choice of freedom He gave us to either follow His bidding to pursue righteousness, or to follow the carnal and evil desires of a human heart that lists to obey the enticings of the opposing force which has great dominion upon the earth. "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple. The statutes of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes." (Ps 19:7-8)

"Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of the sinner, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in His law doth he meditate day and night. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither, and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." (Ps 1:1-3)

Beginning with Adam and Eve there were many generations who believed in Christ through faith only, before He was born into mortality. Their's was the greater faith. Those who saw and heard and believed the Savior during His earthly ministry were blessed with a particular blessing - being in His very presence and eyewitnessing His teaching and miracles.

Those who lived at the time of the coming of the Lord Jesus as a tiny babe, were eligible to receive such a divine blessing-some did receive it. They were blessed in this life with riches of spiritual gifts beyond measure. Though there were many who turned away and walked wantonly in their own paths of frivolity and ill-doing, they could not deprive the righteous from the joys and blessings received through the promises of God.

Then, many also were the generations following the crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus who began to

The flame of righteousness flickered very dimly over a period of many centuries, until the promised restoring of His gospel and Church upon the earth in these Latter Days. They brought great joy to many who then heard and saw and believed. (Acts 3:19-21) They also experienced in great measure the prophesied opposition in all things. (I Nephi 1:81-97)





TESTIFY TO THE TRUTH OF THE BOOK

The Holy Bible tells us that the Son of God, who came to earth to do His redemptive work among the children of men, was born of a virgin. Today many Bible scholars and theologians ridicule this assertion as nonsense. It is reassuring that believers in the Book of Mormon have an added witness to the divinity of the man, Jesus. In vision Nephi was shown "the virgin which thou seest is the mother of the Son of God, after the manner of the flesh (1 Nephi 3:58)."

Since the ancestors of many Indian peoples were familiar with this record, we should be able to find a similar belief reflected in the traditions of the Indian people. Let us examine the research of people in the field. Honore ¹ describes the legends of the Indian people of Mesoamerica, in which they refer to "...the White God of the Indians said to be born of a virgin by immaculate conception."

Brinton² writes, "Many of the great gods of the race, as Quetzalcoatl, Viracocha, and Ioskeha (tribal names for the same white, bearded God dem), were at times said to have been born of a virgin. Even among the Indian tribes of Paraguay the missionaries were startled to find this tradition of the maiden mother of God."


The anthropologist, L. Taylor Hansen³, tells the story of the traditions of the ancient Puant people of Oklahoma concerning the bearded white God who once came among them: "He told them that He was born across the ocean, in a land where all men were bearded. In this land He was born of a virgin on a night when a bright star came out of the heavens and stood over His city. Here, too, the heavens opened and down came winged beings singing chants of exquisite beauty."

Since the Bible and Book of Mormon refer to a letter day Zion of God, it should not appear strange that the Lord would reveal further light "at evening time," or the latter days, as well.

Very early in the history of this Church, in April of 1829, Joseph Smith was told:

"Now as you have asked, behold I say unto you, keep my commandments, and seek to bring forth and establish the cause of Zion." (Book of Commandments 5:3)

And what is this cause of Zion? We are informed that "Zion shall be redeemed with judgment, and her converts with righteousness" (Isaiah 1:27), so here is the cause-righteousness. The people of Zion are "the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven: the meek: for they shall inherit the earth; the pure in heart: for they shall see God", etc.. (Matthew 5:3-16) The cause of Zion is the pure love of God and of all men.

In the Book of Mormon, 1 Nephi 3:183-189, we are informed of the Lord's efforts in the last days to bring forth His gospel in power, including the coming forth of the Book of Mormon. Concerning His ministry, He said: "And blessed are they who shall seek to bring forth my Zion at that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost." (verse 187)

Joseph Smith, and others in his day, did have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost despite their human frailties, and so also will those who yet seek to bring forth Zion!

In August of 1831, the early elders were told (Book of Commandments 59:7-8):

"...For this cause I have sent you that you might be obedient, and that your hearts might be prepared to bear testimony of the things which are to come;

"And also that you might be honored of laying the foundation, and of bearing record of the land upon which the Zion of God shall stand."

I believe that this was God speaking, and that they did bear record of the land upon which Zion should stand, and did lay the foundation thereof!

Have we built upon this foundation and continued to bear the same record? Or in others words, have we sought to bring forth the Zion of God? Perhaps the answer is found in the magnitude of the gift and power of the Holy Ghost enjoyed, compared to that of Joseph Smith and others of his time. Not only was it confirmed to Joseph that this was the land of Zion or the New Jerusalem, but the very center place was appointed: the city of Zion was to be at Independence, Missouri.

"Hearken, O ye elders of my church saith the Lord your God, who have assembled yourselves together, according to my commandments, in this land which is the land of Missouri, which is the land which I have appointed and consecrated for the gathering of the saints; wherefore this is the land of promise, and the place for the city of Zion.

"And thus saith the Lord your God, If you will receive wisdom here is wisdom. Behold, the place which is now called Independence, is the center place, and the spot for the temple is lying westward upon a lot which is mot far from the courthouse..." (Doctrine and Covenants 57:1)

This is the place of which Isaiah spoke, saying:

"...out of Zion shall go forth the law."

And he described the location in this manner:

"...The mountain of the Lord's house shall be established in the top of the mountains..." (Isaiah 2:2)

The term, mountain, manifestly refers to the place of His government, and being "in the top of the mountains", would be in the midst of other governments, evidently of the world. It is not unreasonable to presume it refers specifically to the place of the central government of all the United States governments the State of Missouri! That it should be within the confines of The United States of America, rather than another of the Americas, may be logically assumed from the fact that the Church of Christ, the nucleus of the kingdom of God, was organized and "established agreeable to the laws of our country, by the will and commandments of God ... " (Book of Commandments 24:2)

Having established Zion's location, let us examine more closely the purpose of her creation.

We have found that her inhabitants must be saints in the true sense of the word, and that "the Lord shall have washed away the filth of the daughters of Zion, and shall have purged the blood of Jerusalem ... by the spirit of burning." (Isaiah 4:4)

Who are the "daughters of Zion" if they do not include the divisions of this great Restoration Movement, at least? Their filth is to be "washed away".

Jesus alluded to this latter day cleansing process saying:

"The Son of man shall send forth His angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity." (Matthew 13:41)

"All things" refers to false doctrines which destroy the faith of the saints.

"And there shall be gathered unto it out of every nation under heaven:"

"And it shall be the only people that shall not be at war one with another." "And it shall be said among the wicked, let us not go up to battle against Zion, for the inhabitants of Zion are terrible:"

"Wherefore we can not stand." (Book of Commandments 48:60-66)

Thus shall the Lord bring again Zion, and be her rock of defense, and the glory and salvation to all who will trust in Him.

Christ is to bring those of Israel, of previous generations, with Him, to stand upon Mount Zion. These will be numbered with faithful Israel of the last days, together with multitudes of the righteous who will have been converted by an endowed ministry. See Revelation, chapter seven, and Rev. 14:1.

For this purpose does the inspired writer of Psalm 80 pray; a prayer yet to be fulfilled, no doubt:

"Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, thou that leadest Joseph like a flock; thou that dwellest between the cherubims, shine forth. Before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh stir up thy strength, and come and save us. Turn us again, O God, and cause thy face to shine; and we shall be saved". Vs. 1-3.

Yes, the Shepherd of Israel (Christ) who will lead Joseph (Ephraim and Manasseh) like a flock, will turn their hearts to himself again and save them. He will speak unto all of Israel, and to the nations which survive His terrible judgments, to gather the righteous in unto Zion, the New Jerusalem (see 3 Nephi 10:1-8), that He may wipe their tears away; to give beauty for ashes, joy for sorrow, peace in place of war, happiness and fulfillment where frustration had been (see Isa. 65: 17-25).

"Thou shalt arise and have

mercy upon Zion: for the time to favor her, yea, the set time is come. For thy servants take pleasure in her stones, and favor the dust thereof. So the heathen shall fear the name of the Lord, and all the Kings of the earth thy glory. When the Lord shall build up Zion, He shall appear in His Glory. He will regard the prayer of the destitute, and not despise their prayer. This shall be written for the generation to come: and the people which shall be created shall praise the Lord". Ps. 102:13-18.

By whom shall He speak to bring a gathering of His saints, and the building of the New Jerusalem? Angels are to signal the gathering by a tremendous blast of a trumpet (Matt. 24:31), but a preparatory work is to be done by the servants of God, endowed with power from on high (see 2 Nephi 10:4); and who will these servants be?

"His glory is like the firstling of his bullock, and his horns are like the horns of unicorns: with them he shall push the people together to the ends of the earth: and they are the ten thousands of Ephraim, and they are the thousands of Manasseh". Deut. 33:17.

Yes, the servants of God, those of the seed of Joseph (Ephraim and Manasseh) are to arise upon this land of the Americas in the power of God, and will push (by an undeniable spirit of truth) the nations to the ends of the earth, to Jerusalem of old and to the New Jerusalem of this continent; they shall be the ten thousands of Ephraim and the thousands of Manasseh, who shall go forth from Zion, the New Jerusalem, to be built by Israel with other repentant gentiles, under command of the great Jehovah in what is presently Independence, Missouri of the U.S.A!

This great gathering of Israel

through the power of God cannot occur until He shall have cleansed the nations, including those of Israel, of moral and spiritual corruption, by a literal destruction of the more wicked elements of human society.

"The earth mourneth and fadeth away, the world languished away, the haughty people of the earth do languish. The earth also is defiled under the inhabitants therof; because they have transgressed the laws, changed the ordinance, broken the everlasting covenant." Isa. 24:5.6.

"And it shall come to pass, them that are left in Zion, and remain in Jerusalem, shall be called holy, every one that is written among the living is Jerusalem: When the Lord shall have washed away the filth of the daughters of Zion, and shall have purged the blood of Jerusalem from the midst thereof by the spirit of judgment, and by the spirit of burning. And the Lord will create upon every dwelling place of Mount Zion, and upon her assemblies, a cloud and smoke by day, and the shining of a flaming fire by night: for upon all the glory of Zion shall be a defense." 2 Ne. 8:67-69.

Please note the distinction made in this last reference between Zion, or mount Zion, and Jerusalem. Now, let us see if we can further identify mount Zion, which is the new Jerusalem of the Americas, with the U.S.A.

"Beautiful for situation, the joy of the whole earth, is mount Zion, on the sides of the north, the city of the great King." Ps. 48:2.

Mount Zion is to be "on the sides of the north." Well, of course a far north would be the north pole of the earth, and therefore, the "sides of the north" would be in the northern hemisphere. This would fix both Jerusalem and the New Jerusalem in the "sides of the north".

Now we shall further establish Ephraim (who is Israel both by birth and by blessing) in the events relative to the building of the New Jerusalem. Let us remember that, anciently, the kingdom of Israel was in Samaria; but let us also remember that Israel was to have a separate inheritance in the last days, from whence they should no more be moved or afflicted (2 Sam. 7:10). It would be that portion of Israel which was appointed by divine blessing to the land of the Americas' it would be those of both Ephraim and Manasseh, the sons of Joseph, for this is "Joseph's land". Therefor, in a symbolic sense, this land may also be termed as "Samaria"; and thus we read in Jer. 31:5:"Thou shalt yet plant vines upon the mountains of Samaria..."

The vines are Ephraim and Manasseh. Continuing:

"For there shall be a day, that the watchmen upon the mount Ephraim shall cry, Arise ye, and let us go up to Zion unto the Lord our God" (v6).

Who are these "watchmen upon the mount Ephraim"? "...They are the ten thousands of Ephraim, and they are the thousands of Manasseh" who "shall push the people together to the ends of the earth," as previously referenced.

To continue further:

"For thus saith the Lord; Sing with gladness for Jacob, and shout among the chief of the nations..."

What or who is the chief of the nations? It is the United States, located in this land of the Americas, the "choice land above all other lands, a chosen land of the Lord" (Eth, 6:2).

"...publish ye, praise ye, and say, O Lord, save thy people the remnant of Israel..." (v.7).

"They shall come with weeping, and with supplications will I lead them: I will cause them to walk by the rivers of waters in a straight way, wherein they shall not stumble: for I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn."


O yes, YES!

"... I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my **FIRSTBORN**"

How is Ephraim the first born of Israel and of God? By his obedience to the gospel of Christ in these latter days; the first among the gentiles in this gentile nation of the U.S.; He was "to walk by the rivers of waters in a straight way, wherein they shall not stumble".

Ephraim was to be revealed upon mount Ephraim, "in the sides of the north", by the appearance of an Ephraimite prophet, Joseph Smith, whose declarations and ministry would come initially to his brethren, also of Ephraim, but ultimately the fullness of the gospel to be declared by a faithful succession of the servants of God to their brethren of Manasseh. Such Ephraimite brethren, known as gentiles (that is, their Israelite connection being hitherto unrecognized in the midst of a gentile nation) will thus "assist my people, the remnant of Jacob (American Indians)... that they may build a city, which shall be called the New Jerusalem" (3 Ne. 10:1,2). And where is this New Jerusalem to be? In mount Ephraim, in the "chief of

the nations"; in the U.S.A! \blacklozenge


