# The Profitable Servants

Are we spending our time teaching the simple truth of faith, repentance, baptism?

I esus tells us the parable concerning a man traveling to a far country. In the book of Matthew, 25:14-30, delivering to his servants his goods, one received five talents, another two talents, yet another one talent. They each gave an account of their master's goods which they had been entrusted with. The first had gained five, in addition to the original five: the second had gained two in his dealings; but the third servant hid his one talent for fear of losing it and was punished for his laziness. Jesus told us the explanation in the verses following this parable, "For I was an hungered, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in...." You possessed the knowledge of the key to salvation and introduced me to Jesus Christ the Savior (ALP).

As we continue to embrace the simple yet important gospel message, we need to work on being a fit example to portray the teachings which we are in possession of. What Jesus laid out in his explanation we can confine within the term *charity*,

the pure love of Christ. Matthew 25:40, "And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me."

Our commission in the Church of Christ is a simple and direct goal: the spreading of the truth of the gospel story. This is the first and foremost of all our efforts. As Jesus commanded his disciples before departing, so he commands us: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you, and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world" Matthew 28:19-20. Yes, go ye my servants and teach in truth and righteousness (ALP). The Bible and Book of Mormon instruct us to lay down contentions and confound false doctrines. THESE ARE OUR TWO MEASURING STICKS. Let us rely on these two books. In 2nd Nephi, all of Chapter 13, we can find laid out for us how to concentrate our efforts on the only true doctrine of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost: repentance, faith and baptism—and take it to those capable of understanding their need to keep God's commandments. Those that are not capable of understanding, such as little children and those with mental difficulties, should still be taught to live as Jesus tells us: peaceably and in love.

We of the Church of Christ have a burden to bear, or a labor of love, because, "For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more" Luke 12:48. A great task has been laid before us; let us therefore put our hands to our plows and plant seeds of truth, for which we are entrusted and will be held accountable. The reward for those who will labor in love for the Lord is the same for all and equal, yet beyond comprehension and human description (Matthew 20:1-16).


Let us truly pray for a unity in the Church of Christ in all things, for the time is too short, we are too few and the work is too vast.

# BOOK OF MORMON EVIDENCES

# Testify to the Truth of the Book





hen Jesus walked among pre-Columbian Americans shortly after his resurrection, He taught them all the basic fundamentals of His gospel salvation, rehearsed for them words of prophecy they needed but did not have, and gave prophesies that would be applicable to them in the future. One such prophecy concerns His promise to return to this world in power and glory, a concept denied by many contemporary—and skeptical—Bible scholars.

The Book of Mormon simply states, "And he did expound all things, even from the beginning until the time that he should come in his glory..." III Nephi

11:30. Again we propose that all such major teachings found in the Book of Mormon should be represented in the literature and/or traditions of the Indian people. When they are found to exist, they present a strong evidence to the validity of the Book of Mormon. So what do the literature and traditions say about a promised return by the white, bearded God who walked among the ancient Americans? In this article we shall refer to the writing of just one anthropologist and the ramifications of his comment.

The renowned author and anthropologist, Frank Waters<sup>1</sup>, writes of the God known to the Aztec and Toltec peoples as Quetzalcoatl: "...a god who manifested himself as a white, bearded man, taught the people all the arts and sciences of civilization, and then disappeared with the promise to return someday in the year of his birth, Ce Acatl." One of the most interesting aspects of the ancient Indian calendar is that any particular date was repeated in cycles of 52 years, so the Fair God's promise to return on the date of his birth actually suggests an an-

niversary of His birth.

Indian prophets from Peru to Mexico had been warning their leaders of the coming of another people to this land. In Mexico the Emperor Montezuma was so warned: "I have discovered that in a very few years our cities will be ravaged and destroyed. We and our children will be killed. ...Before many days have passed you will see signs in the sky...." It was not long before the Emperor was to see one of the predicted omens—a marvelous comet cleaved the heavens above him

Overcome with fear for his people and his kingdom, Montezuma prayed and did penance to the Morning Star, the symbol of the returning God, Quetzalcoatl. Lest we forget, we read again the revelation of Christ: "I am the root and the offspring of

David, and the bright and morning star" Rev. 22:16.

It is beyond the realm of coincidence that the prophesied coming of foreign invaders fell in the year 1519, one of the anniversaries of Ce Acatl, when the Aztecs would be awaiting the coming of their Fair God. News of the arrival of Cortes caused Emperor Montezuma great anxiety and distress. To the newly arrived bearded, white men he sent his messengers. He told them: "According to the legends, they are to acquire all the wealth that we now possess. If it is really Quetzalcoatl, greet him on behalf and give him these

gifts...I have always considered that my domain was only lent to me. Let him permit me to end my days here. Then let him return to enjoy what is his!"<sup>3</sup>

In this short article we find

the words of both anthropologist and historian lending support to the narrative of the Book of Mormon, verifying that American Indians were, indeed, given a knowledge of the promised return of Jesus Christ to His people.

# **Interview with David Whitmer**

(Deseret News, Friday, August 16, 1878)

We publish the following, the chief portions of a letter received from Dr. Poulson containing particulars of an interview with David Whitmer.

After a self introduction to David Whitmer and some general conversation, I remarked to him:

Question:
You are one of the three witnesses?

A nswer:

I am one of them.

Question:
And you saw the angel, and he showed you the plates?

∧ nswer:

The Book of Mormon is true, as true as any record can be. I saw the angel, and saw the sword of Laban, and the breast-plate, and the Urim and Thummim, and the plates, and the director, and the angel stood before us, and he turned the leaves one by one.

Q uestion:
Did the angel turn all the leaves before you as you looked on it?

Answer:
No, not all, only that part of the book which was not sealed, and

what there was sealed appeared as solid to my view as wood.

Question:
How many of the plates were sealed?

About the half of the book was sealed. Those leaves which were not sealed, about the half of the first part of the book, were numerous, and the angel turned them over before our eyes. There is yet to be given a translation about Jared's people's doings and of Nephi, and many other records and

# The Eleventh Hour

# From the November 1958 Zion's Advocate

"If ye love me, keep my commandments." John 14:15. This statement of Christ was made while He was here in the flesh. He had left His Father's side to come to earth and mingle with men, taking the form of man, that He might make it possible for them to return to the presence of God, or to be redeemed from the fall and be able to enjoy the association of God and Christ.


Following the transgression of Adam and Eve with their subsequent banishment from the Garden of Eden and the presence of God, the Lord sent messengers to the people of the earth to tell them the way they might be able to return to their God. Angels were sent to Adam and we find that he offered sacrifices, and later Cain did likewise. Abel was accepted because he was righteous and believed, but Cain, who believed not, was rejected. Surely it is not unreasonable to suppose that Adam had taught these things to his sons, or else

where did they obtain the idea of making an offering unto the Lord?

Many times through the years following, the Lord sent prophets who sought to direct mankind in the way of salvation whereby men might be able to return and be with God. But the prophets were rejected and killed and only a few of the people heeded, the others following the whisperings of Satan.

If you read Matt. 20:17, you will find a parable that divides the history of the world into periods: early morning hour, the third hour, the sixth hour, the ninth hour and the eleventh hour; each hour represents a period of time during which the Lord would endeavor to hire laborers to work in his vineyard (to call men to return to God).

the early morning was the time of Adam. The Lord called the people to righteousness, but only a few heeded the call, and these were taken out of the world, for we



read that because of the wickedness of the people Enoch was taken from among them (Gen. 5). In the Inspired Translation, in the seventh chapter of Genesis, we find a history of those who were taken away: they were called Zion because they were pure in heart.

he third hour was the time of Noah. God again sent His messenger to call men to repentance and return to Him; but as always the world refused and only Noah and his family be-

lieved God, built the ark, and were saved.

✓ hen comes the sixth hour: the time when Moses led the children of Israel out of the slavery in Egypt to the land of Canaan. For years the Lord plead with them through the prophets. Because of the hardness of their hearts they refused the instructions of the Lord and were taken into captivity and suffering. But God continued to appeal to them through the prophets and the administration of angels. The last of the prophets was Malachi, who warned them that they had robbed Him (Mal. 3).

he ninth hour was ushered in by John the Baptist, who prepared the way for the coming of Christ. Please note that there was not a man living through whom God could speak or make straight the paths; therefore, he caused that a son should be born to an aged couple so that He could raise up one who would tell the people of the coming of Christ.

In the first few chapters of Matthew is recorded the coming of Jesus to the Jews. God had chosen the Jews to be a peculiar people, a Holy nation, but they had long since failed Him, and as a result they became divided and two nations developed. The ten tribes were

taken away and are referred to as the ten lost tribes. The kingdom of Judah remained in Jerusalem, for prophets foretold that Christ was to come by way

of the Jews, who were considered the chosen of God. Yet they rejected the Christ and nailed Him to the cross, and eventually all His followers were destroyed in one way or another. Jesus had said, "And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force" Matt. 11:12. John was the first Christian martyr, and Jesus was next, then followed the destruction of all the Christians, so that the kingdom of heaven was taken by force, and once again Satan prevailed, and the great apostasy was complete.

astly comes the eleventh hour when the Lord would hire laborers and send them forth to gather the people together for the Lord.

In the first chapter of the

book of Revelation we find these words, "The revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him, to show unto His servants things which must shortly come to pass; and He sent and signified it by His angel unto His servant John..." We note that which was shown to John was future from his time, "And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth. and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people" Rev. 14:6. Each time the Lord sent an angel to point the way, and so it was to be at the eleventh hour

While Jesus was with men He taught them the way, and he said, "I come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." John 10:10. Christ did not say, I come to give you life, but that they might have life. He came to tell the people how they might be able to obtain that abundant life.

"...If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him" John 14:23, also Matt. 24:27. Men tell us today that Jesus saves: that is a mistake. Jesus tells us how to be saved. We are saved by following the plan He gave, "If ye love me, keep my com-

mandments." In the keeping of His commandments we are saved. "Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall

be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people..." Ex. 19:5, Deut. 14:2, Ps. 135:5. We gather from these Scriptures that God wanted a holy and a peculiar people above all other people. And, as God is not changeable, He would expect to have a holy and peculiar people now.

Jesus gave us a standard, or measuring rod, by which we may measure our standing with God. He has always wanted a holy and peculiar people, not peculiar in our manner of dress or outward appearance, or even our professions. He wants us to show by our lives in righteousness that we are a peculiar people, a holy people. "Ye are the light of the world. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works. and glorify your Father which is in heaven" Matt. 5:14, 16. "...Except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ve

shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven" Mat. 5:20. Read the entire sermon on the mount; it teaches the way of spiritual life.

Christ asks His people to be a peculiar people, a peculiarly righteous people, a people whose righteousness exceeds the righteousness of all other people, a people whom He can shine for the benefit of the world. Satan has ever sought to keep the people of the Lord from attaining this righteousness, for he convinces us to think it is something which cannot be obtained in this life. Jesus never at any time asked His people to do that which they were not able to do. He talked with the living, not with the dead. He instructed as to this life so that His people might become a great people. In His prayer, the burden of His appeal was for His followers (read John 17). Note that He prayed for those who were with Him. and for those who would believe on Him through their words, that they might all be one in obedience, one in righteousness, that the world might know that He had been sent by the Father. "... Now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation" II Cor. 6:2. It is an individual matter, and each person must develop in his or her life that righteousness which God will accept. No one

can perfect another. It is a task allotted to each person. "If ye love me keep my commandments" is as vital for us as it was for those to whom Jesus spake.

 Read the entire Sermon on the Mount; it teaches the way of spiritual life.

"Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets" Matt. 22:36-40. Let us ask ourselves if we are keeping the first and great commandment. One thing is sure if we do: there is no commandment or instruction which has been given that we will not adhere to, and if we keep that commandment we will keep the others, and we will be righteous individually and as a people. If we love a person we will not do them an injury, for if we injure a person we do not love him.

The Lord spoke to the Jews through Malachi and accused them of neglect. "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse...and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the

windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there will not be room enough to receive it" Mal. 3:10. Jesus approved of that saying, as He gave it to the people on this land when He visited them, and it

was to be preserved for future generations. There were no Jews or Levites here; and besides, the Levites were given a special work, and they were to be provided for from the tithes. Jesus said that the "laborer is worthy of his hire." Tithing has always been a law for the caring for those who give all their time to His work and those who are unable to do for themselves, the poor. We surely can claim to be a future generation from those to whom Jesus spake.

If we love God with all our heart and give Him first place in our lives, there will be no contention among us, and we will not try to figure how little we can give the Lord, but will figure how much we can do.

How would it be to take the Lord at His word, and "prove Him" as He has asked?

Have you, dear reader, taken the Lord at His word and endeavored to prove Him? or have you been hiding behind the excuse that tithing is not for today, or because someone has done that which you consider wrong?

Dear reader, this matter of giving to the Lord His portion is between you and God, not between you and the Bishops or some other person. God has said the tithe was His, and to withhold it places us in the same category as were the Jews to whom God spoke. Do you want to be one who robs God, or do you wish to bear your share of the burden. The offering is what you give out of your nine-tenths. God does not say how much you shall give of that which is yours, but He does ask you to give Him what belongs to Him. You would have nothing if it were not for the mercies

of God that are extended unto you. If men do not handle the funds as they should, make a change or leave them for God to deal with, for they will surely have to give an account for what they do. Women and chil-

dren go hungry when you steal or withhold God's portion.

Let us put God to the test, "Try Him." Our hope of Eternal life depends on our individual righteousness.

# GENERAL SUNDAY SCHOOL ASSOCIATION



### Ages 12-15

The following are ideas I have accumulated over the past fifteen years in teaching ages 10-15. This age is wonderful to teach because they have been in school long enough to read, comprehend, pay attention, and contribute ideas and personal experiences. It is challenging to be interesting enough to keep their attention, yet not feel that we have to "entertain."

- Teaching is a wonderful opportunity to teach of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Pray for guidance weekly. Be flexible in your lessons and allow for the leading of the Spirit through discussions and questions asked by children.
- 2. I have felt continued strong direction to teach testimonies of faith. Research Bible and Book of Mormon testimonies of faith. Invite ministry, members, and class to share a testimony of faith. Use other resources such as

- Guidepost, Reader's Digest, etc., for outstanding testimonies.
- 3. Share personal experiences and testimonies with your class. Ask them to share experiences in their life. Sometimes a class will be really shy, but as they think about their life they will remember either personal experiences or share testimonies they have heard from others.
- 4. Christ's commission to his Apostles was to teach nothing but repentance. Young teens need repentance, and it is important to remind them that they are near or at the age of accountability and need to repent, be baptized, receive the laying on of hands, and endure to the end.
- 5. If they haven't already done so, memorize the books of the Bible and Book of Mormon. Not only is this something they will use all of their lives, it also aids in the class studies and finding references.
- 6. As a class, write cards or

letters to scattered youth of the church, the elderly and shut-ins.

- Study the ordinances of the church and how they are conducted as directed in the scriptures. Also study the structure of the church and verify through the scriptures.
- 8. Memorize scripture references (i.e. one per month).

I feel the most valuable tool in teaching Sunday School is to pray for guidance and the leading of the Spirit. So many times I have felt the Lord's guidance in what direction to follow in the lessons.

Some of the most remarkable experiences have happened when I have allowed myself to be flexible and open for questions. For example: on a Sacrament Sunday, one of the students asked a question out of the blue regarding prophecy, callings, etc. We talked about prophecy and how we can verify it's truth. We talked about callings, how they can come, how they are verified, etc. That very day in the service three men were called. After a season of prayer, witnesses were given. I feel my class had a witness to the truthfulness of that calling and the leading of the Spirit. I could see they were all looking at me and thinking "Did you see and hear that—just like you told us?" They all remember this incident and talk about it from time to time. Numerous times, sermons

have reiterated our Sunday School lesson. This is the greatest benefit of praying for guidance.

I have also taken advantage of really interesting sermons that I have heard preached by obtaining the tape of the message. I listen to the tape, note the references and points made and use this information for a lesson plan covering one to three or four weeks of study.

I have had several young adults come back to me and tell me they really appreciate my making them memorize the books of the Bible and Book of Mormon, as well as passages of scripture. Many have told me that the scriptures would come to mind at important or needful times in their lives. They confide in me that in their humanness they would not discipline themselves to memorize scripture on their own.



I occasionally have felt like my class was ineffective, then unexpectedly a student would relate to me a whole lesson and tell me how it affected their life. Spirit of God move upon me.



We should be baptized and rectify the path. We have to keep our battery charged."

Brother Merlin Eddy followed his counsel and let his light shine for scattered members in Wisconsin when he and his family traveled to Black River Falls to hold church services.

books, which all has to be done, when the time comes.

Question:
How large were the plates?

About eight inches wide and six or seven inches long, as they appeared a little wider than long, and three rings kept the plates together; one above, one in the middle and one below, so the angel could turn every leaf entirely over. The thickness was about of a common sheet of tin used by tinsmiths.

Question:
How did the engravings look?

Answer:
They were characters. We copied some, and if you visit my brother John, one of the eight witnesses, who wrote for Joseph, John can show you some of the old

manuscript which he borrowed from me. I must have it returned to me again, as it belongs to the Church, in connection with other records. \*\*\*

Question:
How did you know Joseph to be at the time?

As a very humble and meek man...He did the will of the Lord, and an arduous task it was to translate the Book of Mormon.

Question:
Did Joseph use the Urim and
Thummim when he translated?

Answer:
The Urim and Thummim were two white stones, each of them cased in as spectacles are, in a kind of silver casing, but the bow between the stones was more heavy, and longer apart between the stones, than we usually find it in spectacles. Martin Harris, Oliver Cowdery, Emma and my brother John each at different times wrote for Joseph as he translated.

Question:
When will the Temple be built in Independence?

Answer:
Right after the great tribulation is over.

Question:
What do you mean by that?

A civil war more bloody and cruel than the rebellion. It will be a smashing up of this nation, about which time the second great work has to be done, a work like Joseph did, and the translation of the sealed plates, and peace all over.

Question:
Will you live and see those things?

Answer:
It was said to us that the second great work should commence when nearly all the witnesses to the first plates had passed away. \*\*\*
