

The Pit of Destruction

hen the article entitled, "The Fall of Babylon" was written and published in the Zion's Advocate in 1988-89, there was presented an overview relative to the "mark of the beast", his name and his number, as found in Rev. 13:17. Also, reference was made to Rev. 14:9-11, which reveals the damnation of those who "worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand".

At the time, the author's

thinking was inconclusive as to the total ramification of what might be involved, or by what means the mark of that "beast" should be revealed. Anciently, and down through the centuries to the present, it has been revealed in the display of a cross, ostensibly, and in most cases, innocently, in reverence to the cross by which Christ was crucified. Without repeating why the cross is felt to signify that "mark of the beast", at least as the most conspicuous evidence of it, from a religious standpoint, it is our intent to offer here an apparent but insidious means by which that "beast" is seeking to mark the nations of men for destruction: the digging of a "pit" for such purpose.

The cross is an obvious sign or mark with religious significance, and the beast, which is the devil, is the foundation of a great and abominable church (a church in his service, and which thus qualifies it also as "the beast" through a sa-

tanic system of church government—the papacy)—the devil uses that sign to entrap innocent souls, and if possible to lead them carefully down to hell. Satan has other agencies which require no specific religious connection, but which may have a spiritual connection in their wickedness. That "great church...is the mother of abominations" 1 Ne. 3:222.

"And that great pit which hath been digged for them by that great and abominable church, which was founded by the devil and his children, that he might lead away the souls of men down to hell; yea, that great pit which hath been digged for the destruction of men, shall be filled by those who digged it unto their utter destruction, saith the Lamb of God" 1 Ne. 3:206-207.

The question arises: What is this pit? Surely it will be revealed lest the sons

of God, being unaware, should fall therein unto destruction with those who know Him not! We need not suppose that only the saints of the Church of the Lamb of God are to escape, but there are those who will ultimately be so identified, who are pure in heart, though presently confused by doctrines and ideologies of men. or are simply ignorant of God and His laws. should we assume that the saints have a corner on all knowledge relative to understanding the prophecies of God.

A "worship of the beast" implies a knowing consent of evil, even of delight in the performance of rebellion against God, and of violence and injustice to mankind.

What is the pit? It is that which is deliberately digged to ensnare or to enslave men unto a temporal and/or spiritual destruction.

The following comes from a taped interview with Dr. Carl Sanders, who is a doctor of philosophy and an electronic engineer of note among his peers in the design of micro-chips, which are being developed and used extensively in communications, medicine, and all other areas of scientific endeavor. As an evidence of

the rapid strides having been made in the development of micro-chips, and which is far surpassed to the present, he has a tie-clasp

which includes a multi-layered micro-chip, about 1/8" x 1/8" in size. This tiny chip is capable of storing 3 gigabytes (3 billion bytes, or "bits" of information).

Development of microchips, which includes microminiaturization (making very small) is to the point where they can be inserted into a human body by a hypodermic needle! Larger chips have been surgically implanted for medical purposes, and can be used to affect the adrenalin flow through the body—a "shot" for added strength. The pituitary gland may likewise be affected in the flow of es-

trogen; this affects conception, and would thus be useful for birth control.

However, the purpose for the micro-chip which appears most serious is its use for identification. Already there are Montessori schools (for care of children) in Florida which are being used in test projects to identify children in case they become lost from school or are kidnapped.

Identification of people is a laudable and important project, but like other human endeavors, may be abused and used for wicked purposes. It could be used for the purpose of control, and thus be an infringement upon human liberty.

Thus we come to the very great danger we are facing: a "mark of the beast" imposed, a "great pit" being digged for destruction of nations of men, the means of which do already exist. Preliminary steps are being made which will lead people into acceptance of identification micro-chips.

We are accustomed to credit cards, and debit cards for electronic transfer of funds (no direct money transfer) are gaining acceptance. Now we hear also of smart cards which includes a record of personal income,

tax records and any criminal record. Some stores in Canada will automatically discount prices by 10% for those using a debit card, while those using cash may need to wait in longer lines. But then—an implanted micro-chip containing all information to identify the person, giving his name, social security number (including added international digits), finger print, physical description, family history, address, occupation, bank account, income taxes paid or owed, and criminal recordthis would fully identify a person and secure his funds from robbery! Wouldn't that be wonderful (so thinks average John Smith, or whoever might not have run afoul of the law)!

We are really talking about preparation for a one-world government. Who hasn't heard of the "new world order" by those of recent and present administrations of the U.S.A.? President Clinton was asked of his feelings for use of the micro-chip in identification, and he said: "Of course, of course!"

Dr. Sanders said that the larger denominations of money of the U.S. as well as all the European nations, are already marked in a way to more easily facilitate international exchange.

Now—what about the reception of a mark in the right hand or the forehead,

without which no man may buy nor sell, as we are informed in Rev. 13:16,17? One must receive that mark. "or the name of the beast, or the number of his name", and v. 18 says that the number of the beast is the "number of a man", and that his number is 666. As previously mentioned, we have identified the "man" as the papacy—a system of church government by a succession of popes; not a single person, but an ecclesiastical system in which proclamations have been made which are blasphemous in nature, and whose power "leadeth into captivity" (see Rev. 13:4-10). The pope has been designated by the authority of that great, abominable

church as "vicarius filii dei" (vicar of God), and the Roman numeral equivalent is 666.

How might one receive that mark representing 666, "the number of a man"? We have mentioned that, according to the prophecy of John in Revelation (sometimes called The Apocalypse), the mark is to be in the right hand or in the forehead. Dr. Sanders suggests as plausible reasoning for this the following:

The micro-chip will require a source of energy, which may be obtained through a variation of heat levels, or differences in temperature within the human body.

2 Immediately below the hairline on the forehead is where may be found most easily an elevation of temperature, or a change in temperature.

The back of the hand also reveals such temperature change.

Therefore, these areas of the body are most likely to be used for the implanting of micro-chips for purposes of identification.

A suggested source of energy for the micro-chip has been lithium. However, Sanders feared that it could prove harmful to the body, so he went to a scientist who he felt would be knowledgeable, even though being irreligious, and asked him about it. He said it would produce a great sore, a grievous sore, if injected into the body. This caused Sanders to remember the prophetic statement in Rev 16:2:

"And the first (angel) went, and poured out his vial upon the earth; and there fell a noisome and grievous sore upon the men which had the mark of the beast, and upon them which worshipped his image."

Regarding the present ability to inject a micro-chip into the skin of a person by use of a hypodermic needle. Dr. Sanders felt directed of God to research into the number 666. There is a Greek term for this number as found in Strong's Exhaustive Concordance, which is: chi xi stigma. A further break-down of this term defines it: to scratch or stick into (for recognition of ownership). In this we may readily see the possible use of a hypodermic needle to inject a micro-chip into the forehead or the hand for the purpose of identification.

The already existing sci-

entific and practical ability to implement programs of universal identification has set the stage for:

A greater trend for a universal church, identified in 1 Ne 3:221-222 as the "church of the devil...which is the mother of abominations", though it need not be considered exclusively as pertaining to a church with a specific name:

"Wherefore, he that fighteth against Zion, both Jew and Gentile, both bond and free, both male and female, shall perish: for they are they which are the whore of all the earth; for they which are not for me, are against me, saith our God" 2 Ne. 7:23-25.

2A one-world government, including monetary systems more closely inter-related, and with armies subject to a universal control, such as is even now being implemented to a degree with a United Nations command.

All of this should cause us to realize that the devil is using these means to bring about the subjection of nations, and to gather them into a pit of destruction, as it were, and is his attempt to war against Zion, or to overthrow the work of God in these last days.

The prospects are too attractive for the average carnally-minded man to be able to resist, for he will not be able to buy nor sell without the "mark of the beast", and it will seem so easy! He must conform to the system or perish.

But there is a way of escape as delineated more fully in the aforementioned article relative to the "fall of Babylon". In a few words it is: Come to know your Savior by trusting Him, by obedience to His word, by unfeigned love toward God and your fellowman, and by rejection of this "world", walking, talking, thinking of true spiritual values to the exclusion of any evidence or trend toward violence, the abuse of rights of others, or of any immorality.

The Lord will spare his saints even if He must destroy their enemies by fire (see 1 Ne. 7:35-37 and 2 Ne. 5:30-38). Can we not see the increasing importance of the gathering of the saints, those who are Zionic-minded, even to the designated center place of Zion?

What Really Ails America

Condensed from a speech by William J. Bennett, Former Secretary of Education and editor of The Book of Virtues: A Treasury of Great Moral Stories (Simon & Schuster)

few months ago I lunched with a friend who now lives in Asia. During our conversation the topic turned to America as seen through the eyes of foreigners. My friend had observed that, while the world still regards the United States as the leading economic and military power on earth, this same world no longer beholds us with the moral respect it once did, as a "shining city on a hill." Instead, it sees a society in decline.

Recently, a Washington, D. C. cabdriver—a graduate student from Africa—told me that, when he receives his degree, he is returning to his homeland. His reason? He doesn't want his children to grow up in a country

where his daughter will be an "easy target" for young men and where his son might also be a target for violence at the hands of other young males. "It is more civilized where I come from," he said.

Last year an article in the Washington Post described how exchange students adopt the lifestyle of American teens. Paulina, a Polish high school student studying in the United States, said that when she first came here she was amazed at the way teenagers spent their time. "In Warsaw, we would come home after school, eat with our parents, and then do four or five hours of homework. Now, I go to Pizza Hut and watch TV and do less work in school. I can tell it is not a good thing to get used to." I have an instinctive aversion to foreigners harshly judging my nation; yet, I must concede that much of what they say is true. Something has gone wrong with us.

Last year I compiled The Index of Leading Cultural

Indicators, a statistical portrait of American behavioral trends of the past three decades. Among the findings: Since 1960, while the gross domestic product has nearly tripled, violent crime has increased at least 560 percent. Divorces have more than doubled. The percentage of children in single-parent homes has tripled. And by the end of the decade 40 percent of all American births and 80 percent of minority births will occur out of wedlock.

These are not good things to get used to.

The United States leads the industrialized world in

murder, rape and violent crime. At the same time, our elementary-school students rank at or near the bottom in tests of math and

science skills. Since 1960, average SAT scores in our high schools have dropped 75 points.

In 1940, teachers identified the top problems in America's schools as: talking out of turn, chewing gum, making noise and running in the hall. In 1990, teachers listed drugs, alcohol, pregnancy, suicide, rape and assault.

These are not good things to get used to, either.

There is a coarseness, a

callousness and a cynicism to our era. The worst of it has to do with our children. Our culture seems almost dedicated to the corruption of the young.

Last year, Snoop Doggy Dogg, indicted for murder, saw his rap album "Doggystyle," which celebrates marijuana use and the degradation of women, debut at No. 1 on the pop chart. What will happen when young boys who grow up on mean streets, without fathers in their lives, are constantly exposed to such music?

On television, indecent exposure is celebrated by all ages as a virtue. There was a time when personal failures, subliminal desires and perverse tastes were accompanied by guilt, or at least silence. Today they are tickets to appear as guests on talk shows. In one recent two-week period, these shows featured cross-dressing couples, a three-way love affair, a man who fools women into thinking he is using a condom during sex, and prostitutes who love their jobs. These shows present a two-edged problem: people want to expose themselves, and other people who want to watch.

We have become inured

to the cultural rot that is setting in. People are losing their capacity for shock, disgust and outrage. During the 1992 Los Angeles riots,

Damian Williams was filmed crushing an innocent man's skull with a brick, while Henry Watson held the victim down. When Williams was finished, he did a victory Watson and Wildance. liam's lawyers then built a legal defense on the premise that people cannot be held accountable for getting caught up in mob violence. ("I guess maybe they were in the wrong place at the wrong time," one juror told the New York Times.) When these men were acquitted on most counts, the sound you heard throughout the land was not outrage, but relief.

This is not a good thing to get used to.

What's to blame for this change? The hard fact is that it was not something done to us; it is something we have done to our-

selves. Thoughtful people have pointed to materialism, an overly permissive society, or the legacy of the 1960's. There is truth in almost all these accounts. But in my view our real crisis is spiritual, a corruption of the heart.

The ancients called our problem acedia, an aversion to spiritual things and an undue concern for the external and the worldly. Acedia also is the seventh capital sin—sloth—but it does not mean mere laziness. The slothful heart is steeped in the worldly and carnal, hates the spiritual and wants to be free of its demands.

When the novelist,

Walker Percy, was asked what concerned him most about America's future, he answered, "Probably the fear of seeing America, with all its great strength and beauty and freedom...gradually subside into decay through default and be defeated, not by the communist movement, but from within, from weariness, boredom, cynicism, greed and in the end helplessness before its great problems."

I realize this is a tough indictment. If my diagnosis is wrong, then why, amid our economic prosperity and military security, do almost 70 percent of the public say we are off track? I submit that only when we turn to the right things—enduring, noble spiritual things—will life get better.

During the last decade of the 20th century, there is a disturbing reluctance to talk seriously about matters spiritual and religious. We have become used to not talking about the things that matter most. One will often hear that religious faith is a private matter. But whatever your faith—or even if you have none at all—it is a fact that, when millions of people stop believing in God, enormous public conse-

quences follow. Dostoyevsky reminded us in *The Brothers Karamazov* that, "if God does not exist, everything is permissi-

ble." We are now seeing "everything."

What can be done? For one, we must once again connect public policies to our deepest beliefs. Right now we say one thing and do another.

- We say we want law and order, but we allow violent criminals to return to the streets.
- We say we want to stop illegitimacy, but we subsidize behavior that leads to it.
- We say we want to discourage teen-age sex, but educators across America treat teenagers as if they were young animals in heat, and are more eager to dispense condoms than moral guidance.
- We say we want more families to stay together, but we make divorce eas-

ier to attain.

- We say we want a colorblind society, but we continue to count people by race and skin pigment.
- ...America desperately needs to recover the purpose of education, which is to provide for the intellectual and moral education of the young.

Furthermore, America desperately needs to recover the purpose of education, which is to provide for the intellectual and moral education of the young. Plato made the point that good education makes good men, and good men act nobly.

Until a quarter-century or so ago, this time-honored belief virtually went unchallenged. But having departed from it, we are now reaping the whirlwind. We say we desire more civility and responsibility from our children, but many schools refuse to teach right and wrong. And so we talk about "skills facilitation," "self-esteem" and being "comfortable with ourselves."

Most important, we must return religion to

its proper place. Religion provides us with moral bearings, and the solution to our chief problem of spiritual impoverishment depends on spiritual renewal. The surrendering of strong beliefs in our private and public lives has demoralized society.

Today, much of society ridicules and mocks those who are serious about their faith. America's only respectable form of bigotry is bigotry against religious people. And the only reason for hatred of religion is that it forces us to confront matters many would prefer to ignore.

Nobel Prize-winning author William Faulkner once declared, "I decline to accept the end of man." Man will prevail because, as Faulkner said, man alone among creatures "has a soul, a spirit, capable of compassion and sacrifice and endurance."

In our time, we have seen America make enormous gains—a standard of living unimagined 50 years ago, with extraordinary advances in medicine, science and technology. Life expectancy has increased by more than 20 years in the past seven decades. Opportunity has been extended to those who were once denied it.

And, of course, America prevailed in our "long, twilight struggle" against communism.

Today, we must carry on

a new struggle for the country we love. We must push hard against an age that is pushing hard against us. If we have full employment and greater economic growth—if we have cities of gold and alabaster—but our children have not learned how to walk in goodness, justice and mercy, then the American experiment, no matter how gilded, will have failed.

Do not surrender. Get mad. Get in the fight.

So the child was taken to the hospital. night before the operation the child's mother was sleeping on a cot in his room. A heavenly visitor entered the room, and speaking to the mother told her that the child had cancer of the liver, which the doctors could neither cure nor help; he also told her what ways she was not living right herself, which included not observing the Sabbath day, or Sunday, having beer in her icebox, and especially not taking the two children God had given into her care to church services and for this cause had the child been afflicted. Then the messenger told her that if she would repent and change her ways, and do right, that God would heal the boy.

"She promised to make the changes. The next day the doctor operated, and found the boy so bad with cancer of the liver that he gave him up. He told his folks he might not live two hours, and not more than two days. Steadfastly the

mother maintained he would get well. Her friends and relatives tried to tell her she was building false hopes, but they couldn't shake her faith. The child grew better and was taken home. 
ear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

clined to do so. Then he asked my wife if he could hold services in our home and she was willing to do so. He held services there and later Brother Placido Koyoc was

responsible for the services. I did not enjoy the services and on those days when there were services I did not come home early; I preferred to go to a movie because I did not want to hear the preaching. At times, I would arrive home in the middle of the service.

The brethren counseled me to leave behind the things of the world, and I did begin to attend services once in a while. One day, I returned to our home town of Uavalceh with my wife for a celebration and a dance. I dreamed that I went to the dance and in the dance hall I saw fire falling from the ceiling. My wife told me not to go to the dance because God was calling to me, but I didn't pay any attention to her. I went to the dance and I got drunk. I spent all my money and was robbed of my ring. With this, my wife had enough and told me she was going to leave

I promised her that I would change; that I would serve God, and I did begin to

attend the services. However. I felt that I would never be able to quit drinking. One night as I listened to the words of a hymn in our hymnal, "My Redeemer", I felt the power of the Spirit of God. I began to cry and then understood that I must serve God. Then I heard a sermon which explained how with men, many things are impossible, but with God, all things are possible. I began to plead for the help of God, and the Lord granted me that which I asked. I was able to worship God with all my heart and I

made a covenant with Him. Today, I am very happy serving my God. I enjoy participating in the reunions, the studies, etc. Now I never feel alone—whatever sickness or problem we may have, God is present to help us. We have received many blessings while in the hands of our God.

The Four Corners of the Earth

In an Associated Press report of June '65, an interesting item from a scientific source shows that the earth really has corners. The Bible mentions the four corners of the earth in Isaiah 11:12, "And he shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel, and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth".

The report says: "Satellite


Yobain, Yucatan


and so bless others in great need." This is our prayer. Above all, again we greatly appreciate the unforgettable love you have for us.
