Faith and Trust

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" Hebrews 11:1.

"It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in man" Psalms 118:8.

Faith in God gives us the reason to hope. Faith and hope are the foundations of charity, and charity is the pure love of Christ.

"Wherefore, cleave unto charity, which is the greatest of all, for all things must fail; but charity is the pure love of Christ, and it endureth for ever; and whoso is found possessed of it at the last day, it shall be well with them" Moroni 7:52.

Faith in God is necessarily the first step we learn to take in the gospel of Christ. If we have not faith, nothing else has any reason for we would have nothing to hope for. Repentance would mean nothing if we have no hope in being forgiven. Baptism would be an empty gesture, observed by others but not honored by God. The laying on of hands would not assure us of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Faith

in God is necessary for the salvation of our souls.

Faith is one of the first principles of the gospel according to Paul's message to the Hebrews: read again chapter 6, verses 1 and 2. In the 11th chapter, verse 6, we are told,

"But without faith it is impossible to please him (God. AGS): for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him."

It is also the shield in the armour of God against evil that he admonished the saints at Ephesus to put on. Read Ephesians chapter 6, verses 13 through 18.

There are persons who might say to you that they have no need of faith. They would say that this is religion and want no part of such foolishness. At the same time that person would quickly tell you that they trust their banker and the insurance company that they deal with. In our materialistic world there is a common failure to recognize God, that we were created both spiritually and physically. We are all religious about something, and have gods that may be false gods, even if we deny being "religious." We all put faith and trust into many things in our daily lives, and experience hope, successes, and failures.

In most instances the meanings of the words *faith* and *trust* are quite similar, the usage, of course, may convey a recognition of God as a factor of accountability. The unbeliever in God is the foolish one for he will in time be held accountable long after his money is gone and the insurance policy is a scrap of paper. This is true of all material wealth we hold in this life; we cannot buy eternal life or save our own soul.

Important to all is our daily bread, our clothing, and the shelter we need. Someone needs to plant the seeds, harvest the crops of the fields and trees of the forest, mine the minerals from the earth to make all our needs available. Where did these things that are so important to our daily lives come from? Who made them or brought them into being? Can you name and identify anyone else other than God, the creator of heaven and earth?

When we recognize that it is our Father in heaven, God, who is the creator, we are invited to worship Him and the Son, Jesus Christ—to believe and have faith in God. Paul wrote to the Romans in chapter 1, verses 17-20:

"For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith. For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness; Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them (refused to accept it. AGS); for God hath shewed it unto them (they could see it. AGS.). For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse...."

Faith is the first most important step we take in life and it begins with our relationship with our earthly parents. As a child we grow and learn by trusting and having faith in our parents; it is a natural process. Likewise there is always in this process of learning the values of right and wrong, and associated lessons of rewards and punishments. We soon learn that our faith or trust is rewarded only after a period of time has passed.

Likewise, faith is the first step we must take in being converted to the gospel of Christ. To become a child of God and become part of the kingdom of God we must be as humble as a child and have faith in our

the Bible.


The Book of Mormon is filled with testimonies of faith in God from the first chapter to the last; nothing was accomplished without faith, nothing ever will be accomplished without faith.

THE PLACE OF THE NEW JERUSALEM

—THE CITY OF ZION OF THE LAST DAYS—

"And behold, this people will I establish in this land (America), unto the fulfilling of the covenant which I made with your father Jacob; and it shall be a new Jerusalem. And the powers of heaven shall be in the midst of this people; yea, even I will be in the midst of you" 3 Nephi 9:58-59.

"By faith he (Abraham) sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise: For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God" Hebrews 11:9-10.

"But if they (the Gentiles) will repent, and hearken unto my words, and harden not their hearts, I will establish my church among them, and they shall come in unto the covenant, and be numbered among this the remnant of Jacob, unto whom I have given this land (America) for their inheritance, and they shall assist my people, the remnant of Jacob; And also, as many of the house of Israel as shall come, that they may build a city, which shall be called the New Jerusalem..." 3 Nephi 10:1-2.

While the Book of Mormon positively identifies this land as being the place of the New Jerusalem, we must appeal to other sources to identify the specific country referenced in the above scriptures. Some have felt that the spot for this city could be at some point in Mexico or Central America or perhaps at some location other than that specified in latter-day revelation. Others have questioned whether we can know for a certainty that the place where Independence now stands is that place intended by the Lord for this city.

In the Book of Ether we read the following account:

"For behold, they rejected all the words of Ether; for he truly told them of all things, from the beginning of man; and how that after the waters had receded from off the face of this land, it became a choice land above all other lands, a chosen land of the Lord; Wherefore the Lord would have that all men should serve him, The mountain, or nation, of the Lord's house is this very country, the United States of America...

which dwelt upon the face thereof; and that it was the place of the New Jerusalem, which should come down out of heaven, and the holy sanctuary of the Lord. Behold, Ether saw the days of Christ, and he spake concerning a New Jerusalem upon this land; and he spake also concerning the house of Israel, and the Jerusalem from whence Lehi should come; after that it should be destroyed, it should be built up again a holy city unto the Lord; Wherefore it could not be a New Jerusalem, for it had been in a time of old, but it should be built up again, and become a holy city of the Lord; and it should be built up unto the house of Israel; And that a New Jerusalem should be built up upon this land, unto the remnant of the seed of Joseph...Wherefore the remnant of the house of Joseph shall be built upon this land; and it shall be a land of their inheritance; and they shall build up a holy city unto the Lord, like unto the Jerusalem of old; and they shall no more be confounded, until the end come, when the earth shall pass away" (Ether 6:2-6, 8).

It is obvious that this

prophecy of Joseph and the city New Jerusalem to be built upon this land has not yet seen fulfillment. It is also true that Joseph was promised this land of America in both Genesis and Deuteronomy. (See Genesis 49:22-26 and Deuteronomy 33:13-17). Having identified the land of the western hemisphere as being the location of this holy city, it now remains for us to identify which of the countries in this hemisphere is the specific one referenced in the scriptures.

It is interesting to note, in this regard, that according to the prophecy in Daniel 2, the little stone kingdom was to be cut out of the mountain. That mountain was the nation of the United States, the same land to which Zion in Isaiah 40:9 was commanded to get up into. Even Nephi makes particular reference to our nation when he states that "this land (the U.S.A.) shall be a land of liberty unto the Gentiles: and there shall be no kings upon the land, which shall raise up unto the Gentiles. And I will fortify this land against all other nations; And he that fighteth against Zion (our country), shall perish, saith God; for he that raiseth up a king against me, shall perish" (2 Nephi 7:18-20). It was in this very nation or mountain that the plates of the Book of Mormon were hid up. It was also in this very land that the Church was restored again in the earth. Nephi quoting Isaiah writes,

"And it shall come to pass in the last days, when the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills, and all nations shall flow unto it, And many people shall go and say, Come ye, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem" (2 Nephi 8:18-19).

The mountain, or nation, of the Lord's house is this very country, the United States of America, and all nations have already flowed unto it, and the Lord's house, His church and kingdom, have been set up in this land as prophesied. The greater fulfillment of this prophecy is yet future, and that is when all people will come up to the house of God to learn of His ways. The very next verse of this prophecy states,

"And he shall judge among the nations, and shall rebuke many people; and they shall beat their swords into plow shares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more" (2 Nephi 8:20)

The following quotations show that when the Gentiles are referenced, it is the people of this country in which we now live as opposed to those of the American nations to the north or south. Consider:

"And it came to pass that I, Nephi, beheld that the Gentiles which had gone forth out of captivity did humble themselves before the Lord, and the power of the Lord was with them; And I beheld that their mother Gentiles were gathered together upon the waters, and upon the land also, to battle against them; And I beheld that the power of God was with them; and also that the wrath of God was upon all them that were gathered together against them to battle. And I, Nephi, beheld that the Gentiles which had gone out of captivity were delivered by the power of God out of the hands of all other nations" (1 Nephi 3:152-155).

Again, "Nevertheless, thou beholdest that the Gentiles which have gone forth out of captivity, and have been lifted up by the power of God above all other nations upon the face of the land. which is choice above all other lands, Which is the land which the Lord God hath covenanted with thy father that his seed should have for the land of their inheritance; wherefore, thou seest that the Lord God will not suffer that the Gentiles will utterly destroy the mixture of thy seed, which is among thy brethren; Neither will he suffer that the Gentiles shall destroy the seed of thy brethren..." (1 Nephi 3:176-178).

Which Gentiles? The Gentiles which came from northwestern Europe and settled our land! These Gentiles will not be suffered to utterly destroy the seed of Nephi nor Laman. It is certain that U.S. Gentiles have had little influence in destroying the seed of Nephi or Laman in Mexico, Canada, Central, or South America. Rather, our particular land, the land of freedom is the one here pinpointed.

"Wherefore, after that I have visited them in judgment, and

smitten them by the hand of the Gentiles; And after that the Gentiles do stumble exceedingly because of the most plain and most precious parts of the gospel of the Lamb which have been kept back, by that abominable church...I will be merciful unto the Gentiles in that day, saith the Lamb, insomuch that I will bring forth unto them in mine own power, much of my gospel, which shall be plain and precious, saith the Lamb..." (1 Nephi 3:182-183). Again the scenario centers specifically around the Gentiles and Indians of our own country. "And it meaneth us in the days to come, and also all our brethren which are of the house of Israel. And it meaneth that the time cometh that after all the house of Israel have been scattered and confounded, that the Lord God will raise up a mighty nation among the Gentiles, yea, even upon the face of this land; AND BY THEM SHALL OUR SEED BE SCAT-TERED. And after that our seed is scattered, the Lord God will proceed to do a marvelous work among the Gentiles, which shall be of great worth unto our seed; Wherefore, it is likened unto their being nourished by the Gentiles, and being carried in their arms, and upon their shoulders" (1 Nephi 7:14-18).

It is certain that the Gentiles of our country did not scatter the Indian peoples outside our own borders. Our land, therefore, is specifically identified as the place where the great drama of the last days is to commence. The same is true of the wickedness of those Gentiles described in verses 34 and 35 of 3 Nephi 7:

"And thus commandeth the $Father\,that\,I\,should\,say\,unto\,you,$

At that day when the Gentiles shall sin against my gospel, and shall reject the fullness of my gospel, and shall be lifted up in the pride of their hearts above all nations, and above all the people of the whole earth, and shall be filled with all manner of lyings, and of deceits, and of mischiefs, and all manner of hypocrisy, and murders, and priestcrafts, and whoredoms, and of secret abominations; And if they shall do all these things, and shall reject the fullness of my gospel, behold, saith the Father, I will bring the fullness of my gospel from among them....

Speaking further the Lord says,

"And after that ye (the people of Nephi) were blessed, then fulfilleth the Father the covenant which he made with Abraham, saying, In thy seed shall all the kindreds of the earth be blessed, unto the pouring out of the Holy Ghost through me upon the Gentiles, which blessing upon the Gentiles, shall make them mighty above all, unto the scattering of my people, O house of Israel: and they shall be a scourge unto the people of this land" (3 Nephi 9:65). "Verily, verily, I say unto you, When these things shall be made known unto them of the Father, and shall come forth of the Father, from them unto you, for it is wisdom in the Father that they should be established in this land (the USA), And be set up as **a free people** by the power of the Father, that these things might come forth from them unto a REMNANT of your seed, that the covenant of the Father may be fulfilled which he hath covenanted with his people, Ohouse of Israel..." (3 Nephi 9:89-90).

I believe this pretty well establishes that the drama of the last days is to take place within the borders of the United States, the mountain of the Lord's house, the land of Joseph of which the promised material blessings of Genesis 49 and Deuteronomy 33 are amply fulfilled more so than in any other part of the Americas. This land (America in particular) is truly choice above all other lands. It is also the nation within which the New Jerusalem will be built. But can it be pinpointed even further than this?

On the 24th of April, 1864, a revelation was given to the Church of Christ commanding a return to the land of Missouri. I will quote the part that applies.

"Hear, O Ye people and hearken to the counsel of your Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, who are called by My name, and keep My commandments. You who have sought to know My will concerning My people, who have professed My name, and entered into the new and everlasting covenant, to keep all My counsels and commandments of the only true and living God. Hear then, these things which are revealed unto you by the power of His Holy Spirit. Prepare O Ye people yourselves in all things that you may be ready to gather together upon the consecrated land which I have appointed and dedicated by My servant Joseph Smith and the first Elders of My Church in Jackson County, State of Missouri, for the gathering together of My saints, that they might be assembled in the day of My chastening hand, when your Lord will pour out His wrath and indignation upon the ungodly, and inasmuch as My Church and people have been driven and scattered, therefore take counsel of Me, your Lord and Director, who says unto you, prepare yourselves and be ready against the appointed time which I have set and prepared for you.

"That you may return in the year A.D. 1867, which time the Lord by your prayers and faithfulness in all things will open and prepare a way before you that you may begin to gather at that time" Revelation to Granville Hedrick.

This shows that, despite the confusion that entered into the church in the early day, the land upon which Independence is now situated is the spot for the city of God. It would certainly be strange that the Lord, after having revealed His hand in restoring His church, bringing forth the Book of Mormon, and giving authority to officiate in the ordinances of His gospel, that he would not also reveal the place of the city. Thus in a revelation given in Kirtland, Ohio, June, 1831, we read,

"Behold, thus saith the Lord unto the elders whom he hath called and chosen in these last days, by the voice of his Spirit, saying, I the Lord will make known unto you what I will that ye shall do from this time until the next conference, which shall be held in Missouri, upon the land which I will consecrate unto my people, which are a remnant of Jacob, and them who are heirs according to the covenant" Book of Commandments 54:1.

Again in a revelation given

in Zion, July, 1831, we read,

"Hearken, O ye elders of my church, saith the Lord your God, who have assembled yourselves together, according to my com-

mandments, in this land which is the land of Missouri, which is the land which I have appointed and consecrated for the gathering of the saints: wherefore this is the land of promise, and the place for the city of Zion. And thus saith the Lord your God, if you will receive wisdom here is wisdom. Behold the place which is now called Independence, is the centre place, and the spot for the temple is lying westward upon a lot which is not far from the court house..." Times and Seasons, vol. 5, p. 434.

Another line of evidence is contained in the dream or vision by Elder George D. Cole sometime in 1870. In this experience he found himself upon a rock high above the Temple Lot. Looking down he saw a beautiful stump, out of which grew a small branch with six or seven large, healthy looking buds ready to put forth when the time came. He was told that this was the Church of Christ that was organized on the 6th of April,

1830. Then he was shown the top of the tree which had been cut down, and was told that it was cut off as the church, but not as individuals. This tree extended for miles northward and finally bent to the west. Finally, he saw the elders of Israel going through the dead top and pruning out the green twigs.

It is evident from the foregoing that God is recognizing His church as founded (or rooted) on the Temple Lot, the spot to which He commanded Granville Hedrick and those with him to return just a few short years earlier. If this is not true, then why did not God permit those early saints to remain in Illinois instead of bringing them back to Missouri? That the Lord was with them in their trek here is evidenced by the miraculous way in which they were able to safely cross the Missouri river on the ice. The little Church of Christ was the only people in the restoration who were commanded to return to Jackson County. Is it mere coincidence that neither the LDS nor the RLDS have possession of that lot? Think what might otherwise have been built there had they returned first. Is it also just a coincidence that the world peace society attempted to gain permission from us to allow them to build their world church headquarters on the Temple Lot? It is obvious that Satan understands the true significance of this area and would plant his seat on that spot if he could.

Some years ago I read of an account which told of a number of Indian tribes who were warring among themselves when a personage appeared to them, rebuking them for their warrings and telling them that the ground upon which they fought was sacred ground. He told them that it was the place where the lodge of the Great Spirit would one day stand. The various tribes then ceased their warrings and brought stones to mark the place where this lodge was to be built.

There are some who discount this story, giving reasons for their stand, so necessarily I cannot have as strong a conviction of this matter as I could if I had had firsthand knowledge of it. Consequently all I have to go on are the testimonies of others who do affirm this. Some also discount the temple idea because of the temple building confusion that was created in the early church. I don't know but what this was done by Satan to obscure the truth of a single temple, and thus discrediting it in the process. But to continue:

The following is an excerpt from *Lodge of the Great Spirit*, by Gladys Barr Loyd. I had not, heretofore, read this account, but now give the following quote:

"The first of the many beautiful and individual 'songs' Longfellow wrote concerning Hiawatha is *The Peace Pipe*. This song, more than all others, tells the story of legend related by present-day Indians of the event that took place in ancient

times at the point where the Temple Lot is now located in Independence, Missouri. According to legend it was here, during a time of warfare, that the Great Spirit descended into the midst of His people, persuaded them to cease their fighting, and commanded that they bathe in the river, washing the war paint from their bodies. Afterward He instructed them to go to their homes, and to send back young braves carrying each a stone, native to his own land. stones, we are told, were deposited at the 'hub of the wheel,' the crossroads of all the Indian trails in that area, to mark the spot where, one day, a Lodge would be built in honor of their Great Spirit.

"Longfellow makes no mention of those stones, or of the promise concerning the Lodge or Temple, but he does relate how the Great Spirit, descending, commanded His people to cease their fighting, and to cleanse themselves by bathing in the waters of the nearby river, which event took place at the same time He gave instruction concerning the stones that were to mark the place of His Temple...

"Surely it is not coincidence that the legend related today by the Indians is the very one Longfellow wrote that was told to him by their forefathers; a legend that had come down from very ancient times to them. The only difference is that, whereas Longfellow failed to do so, present-day Indians include the account of that 'significant little pile of stones,' which was to mark the site of the temple...

"When the tribes reached their home lands, each sent a runner, carrying a small stone, back to the place where the Great Spirit had met with them, and there, at the cross-roads of the Indian nations, at the hub of that mighty wheel, they deposited, each one, the stone brought by him from his individual tribe, in testimony of the covenant that had been made, and to mark the spot where the Temple was to be erected in the last days."

Out of all the countries of the western hemisphere the finger of God has pointed out the one country which is named chief of the nations to whom the house of Israel came, the place where many are at ease, the designated place of Zion. It is this great Gentile nation whom the mother gentiles could not overcome, the land of freedom, the place where God has raised up his house, and brought forth his gospel and kingdom once again upon the earth. It is the mountain (nation) of the Lord's house, the place where the Zion of God shall stand. It is the land of Joseph as promised by Jacob and Moses, even to the utmost bound of the everlasting hills. containing the blessings of the heaven above, the earth below, and the deep beneath. It is the promised land, the new Israel, the modern Samaria, the land of Zion, the place of the New Jerusalem. (See. Amos 6:1.). It was to this country that the pilgrim fathers were brought. It is the United States of America, whose beginning, course, and destiny, unlike the nations of the rest of the Americas, was given to the father of our country, in his famous vision given during that terrible winter of (1777-78) at Valley Forge.

That part of the vision applying to us is the final scene, a scene which, if true, must see fulfillment before this century ends.

"Again I heard the mysterious voice saying, 'Son of the Republic, the end of the century cometh, look and learn.' At this the dark, shadowy angel placed a trumpet to his lips and blew three distinct blasts; and taking water from the ocean, he sprinkled it on Europe, Asia and Africa. Then my eyes beheld a fearful scene; from each of these countries arose thick black clouds that were soon joined into one. And throughout this mass there gleamed a dark red light by which I was saw hordes of armed men who, moving with the cloud, marched by land and sailed by sea to America, which country was enveloped in the volume of cloud. And I dimly saw these vast armies devastate the whole country and burn the villages, towns and cities that I beheld springing up.

"As my ears listened to the thundering of the cannon, clashing of swords, and the shouts and cries of millions in mortal combat, I again heard the mysterious voice saying, 'Son of the Republic, look and learn.' When the voice had ceased, the dark, shadowy angel placed his trumpet once more to his mouth, and blew a long and fearful blast.

"Instantly a light as of a thousand suns shown down from above me, and pierced and broke into fragments the dark cloud which enveloped America. At the same moment the angel upon whose head still shown the word 'Union' and who bore our national flag in one hand and a

sword in the other, descended from the heavens attended by legions of bright spirits. These immediately joined the inhabitants of America, whom I perceived were well nigh overcome but who, immediately taking courage again, closed up their broken ranks and renewed the battle. Again, amid the fearful noise of the conflict I heard the mysterious voice saying, 'Son of the Republic, look and learn.' As the voice ceased, the shadowy angel for the last time dipped water from the ocean and sprinkled it upon America. Instantly the dark cloud rolled back, together with the armies it had brought, leaving the inhabitants of the land victorious.

"Then once more, I beheld the villages, towns and cities springing up where I had seen them before, while the bright angel, planting the azure standard he had brought in the midst of them, cried with a loud voice: 'While the stars remain, and the heavens send down dew upon the earth, so long shall the Republic last.' And taking from his brow the crown on which blazoned the word 'Union' he placed it upon the standard while the people, kneeling down, said, 'Amen.'


"The scene instantly began to fade and dissolve, and I, at last, saw nothing but the rising, curling vapor I had first beheld. This also disappearing, I found myself once more gazing on my mysterious visitor who, in the same voice I had heard before said, 'Son of the Republic, what you have seen is thus interpreted. Three great perils will come upon the Republic. The most fearful is the third, passing which, the whole world united shall never be able to prevail against her. Let every child of the Republic learn to live for his God, his land and the Union."

This scene is confirmed in a dream given to General McClelland during the Civil War. On this occasion the solemn voice of Washington spoke these words,

"And now she has been brought to her second great struggle, this, so far the most perilous ordeal she has to endure....But her mission will not then be finished for ere another century shall have gone by, the oppressors of the whole earth, hating and envying her and her exaltation, shall join themselves together and raise up their hands against her. But if she be found worthy of her high calling they shall surely be discomfited, and then will be ended her third and last struggle for existence."

What can 'her last struggle' mean but that the end has come, the Lord returned, and the reign of peace commenced? And what is 'her high calling' but to be the place of Zion, the City of our God? And who is it that 'shall join themselves together' to 'raise up their hands against her' but those who shall fight against this Zion? These shall all be discomfited, however, and then shall Zion be redeemed and peace reign among the children of God for a thousand years.

the Lord to join none of them, for their creeds were an abomination in His sight.

["And thus, if the people of this generation harden not their hearts, I will work a reformation among them, and I will put down all lyings, and deceivings, and priestcrafts, and envyings, and strifes, and idolatries, and sorceries, and all manner of iniquities, and I will establish my church, like unto the church which was taught by my disciples in the days of old" B of C 4:5.

"And verily, verily I say unto you, that this church have I established and called forth out of the wilderness: And even so will I gather mine elect from the four quarters of the earth, even as many as will believe in me, and hearken unto my voice..." B of C 35:4-5.]

Step 2: If the choice is ours, then refuse to break the Christian Sabbath, which is the Lord's day (or Sunday), by indulgence in labors and activities which will not produce rest to the body and mind, nor be acceptable as the worship of God. Do not thine own pleasure on His holy day.

"If thou turn away thy foot from the sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day; and call the sabbath a delight, the holy of the Lord, honorable; and shalt honor him, not doing thine own ways, nor finding thine own pleasure, nor speaking thine own words: Then shalt thou delight thyself in the Lord; and I will cause thee to ride upon the high places of the earth, and feed thee with the heritage of Jacob thy father: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it" Is. 58:13-14.

Step 3: Do not engage in social activities, or pleasures of any sort which, as matters of personal preference and frequent

occurrence, separate us from the body of Christ and breaks the bond of fellowship and service to each other.

["Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching" Heb. 10:23-25.]

Step 4: Shun association on a personal basis with those who have little or no moral direction in their lives, as judged by the gospel of Christ, except as it may assist them to come up higher.

["Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness? And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what

part hath he that believeth with an infidel? And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters. saith the Lord Almighty" 2 Cor. 6:14-18.

"Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world" 1 Jn. 2:15-16.

"But behold, your days of probation are past: ye have procrastinated the day of your salvation, until it is everlastingly too late, and your destruction is made sure; Yea, for ye have sought all the days of your lives for that which ye could not obtain; and ye have sought for happiness in doing iniquity, which thing is contrary to the nature of that righteousness which is in our great and Eternal Head" Hel. 5:51-52.

I will set no wicked thing before mine eyes: I hate the work of them that turn aside; it shall not cleave to me. A froward heart shall depart from me: I will not know a wicked person. Whoso privily slandereth his neighbour, him will I cut off: him that hath an high look and a proud heart will not I suffer. Mine eyes shall be upon the faithful of the land, that they may dwell with me: he that walketh in a perfect way, he shall serve me. He that worketh deceit shall not dwell within my house: he that telleth lies shall not tarry in my sight. I will early destroy all the wicked of the land; that I may cut off all wicked doers from the city of the Lord" Ps. 101.]

Step 6: Restriction in literature or music which is immoral or suggestive toward sex, drugs, or the gratification of other carnal desires.

["Remember, to be carnally minded, is death, and to be spiritually minded, is life eternal" 2 Ne. 6:74.

"Proving what is acceptable unto the Lord. And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret. But all things that are reproved

are made manifest by the light: for whatsoever doth make manifest is light" Eph. 5:10-13.

"Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God: and everyone that loveth him that begat loveth him also that is begotten of him. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God, and keep his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous. whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?" 1 Jn. 5:1-5.]

Step 7: "But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks. For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience" Eph 5:3-6.

["And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit; Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God" Eph. 5:18-21.]

Step 8: Let fighting by physical or mental force, or by the tongue, as a means of conquest,

be put away. Put away a spirit of contention.

"And there shall be no disputations among you, as there hath hitherto been; nether shall there be disputations among you concerning the points of my doctrine, as there hath hitherto been; For verily, verily I say unto you, He that hath the spirit of contention, is not of me, but is of the devil, which is the father of contention, and he stirreth up the hearts of men to contend with anger one with another..." 3 Ne 5:29-30.

["And ye shall grow in the knowledge of the glory of him that created you, or in the knowledge of that which is just and true. And ye will not have a mind to injure one another, but to live peaceably, and to render to every man according to that which is his due. And ye will not suffer your children, that they go hungry, or naked; Neither will ye suffer that they transgress the laws of God, and fight and quarrel one with another, and serve the devil, which is the master of sin, or which is the evil spirit which hath been spoken of by our fathers; he being an enemy to all righteousness; But ye will teach them to walk in the ways of truth and soberness; ye will teach them to love one another, and to serve one another..." Step 9: Narrowing of financial credit obligations to only essential needs, with the purpose of ultimate elimination.

["Behold it is said in my laws, or forbidden to get in debt to thine enemies..." B of C 65:37.

"But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content. But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But thou, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness" 1 Tim. 6:6-11.

"And now my brethren, do ye suppose that God justifieth you in this thing? Behold, I say unto you, Nay. But he condemneth you, and if ye persist in these things, his judgments must speedily come unto you. O that he would shew you that he can pierce you, and with one glance of his eye, he can smite you to the dust. O that he would rid you from this iniquity and abomination. And, O that ye would listen unto the word of his commands, and let not this pride of your hearts destroy your souls. Think of your brethren, like unto yourselves, and be familiar with all, and free with your substance, that they may be rich like unto you. But before ye seek for riches, seek ye for the kingdom of God. And after that we have obtained a hope in Christ, ye shall obtain riches, if ye seek them; and ye will seek them, for the intent to do good; to clothe the naked, and to feed the hungry, and to liberate the captive, and administer relief to the sick, and the afflicted" Jac. 2:17-24.

"And except they should have charity, they were nothing; wherefore, if they should have charity, they would not suffer the laborer in Zion to perish. But the laborer in Zion shall labor for Zion; for if they labor for money,

they shall perish" 2 Ne. 11:108-109.]

Step 10: If possible, do not trust in stocks, bonds, the interest system in any way, or economic means other that that produced through honest labor of the body and mind to sustain your livelihood; and this only with the mental reservation that our real trust must be in God.

["Lord, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill? He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart. He that backbiteth not with his tongue, nor doeth evil to his neighbour, nor taketh up a reproach against his neighbour. In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoureth them that fear the Lord. He that sweareth to his own hurt, and changeth not. He that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. He that doeth these things shall never be moved" Ps. 15.

"And it shall come to pass in that day, that the remnant of Israel, and such as are escaped of the house of Jacob, shall no more again stay upon him that smote them; but shall stay upon the Lord, the Holy One of Israel, in truth. The remnant shall return, even the remnant of Jacob, unto the mighty God" Is. 10:20-21.

"In that day shall the branch of the Lord be beautiful and glorious, and the fruit of the earth shall be excellent and comely for them that are escaped of Israel. Purpose of the 1997 Solemn Assembly

(And this Conference year)

In past years the importance of humbling ourselves before the Lord has been stressed. We feel that again the importance of humility should be emphasized. In Helaman 2:31 we can read where members of the church were persecuted by their own brethren: "Nevertheless, they did fast and pray oft, and did wax stronger and stronger in their humility, and firmer and firmer in the faith of Christ..." We are also reminded that our humbled themforefathers selves before the Lord, and the power of the Lord was with them. In like manner the Lord can be with us in greater power if we humble ourselves sufficiently.

We should have mercy. kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness and longsuffering in each of our lives. It is important that we forbear, or bear with one another, as well as forgive one another (see Colossians 3:12-13). "And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts..." Colossians 3:14-15. "And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you" Ephesians 4:32.

In every aspect of the Lord's work there is the need for the presence of the Holy Ghost. We must pray that the Lord will call laborers into His harvest and that the promise of the Lord will be with them: "And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following" Mark 16:20. "God also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Ghost, according to his own will" Hebrews 2:4.

The following is a list of some specific needs for which we should pray:

- 1 Pray for the continuing conference year, that the Lord's will might be accomplished and that unity might prevail in our midst.
- **2** Pray for a greater outpouring of the love of God in our hearts. (Moroni 7:52-53)
- **3** Pray for greater humility in our lives. (Mosiah 1:119-120)
- 4 Pray to God for forgiveness of our sins, and that the Lord would purify and sanctify our hearts so that we can accomplish His will.
- 5 Pray for the ministry that

- they might be faithful in their responsibilities.
- 6 Pray for the young families and the whole family structure that we might have strong families who can endure the stress of the world and the problems of life.
- 7 Pray for the responsibility of parents to God and to their children. (Ephesians 6:4 and Mosiah 2:25-27)
- 8 Pray for our little children and our young people that they might have the strength to resist the temptations of the world.
- **9** Pray for the duties of our youth toward God and their parents. (Ephesians 6:1-2)
- 10 Pray for the endurance of faith and Christian unity in service to our God. (Matthew 24:13; Colossians 3:12-15; 1 Corinthians 15:58)

att. 3:11:

"I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I..."

The phrase "Unto repentance" is only found once in the Bible but thirty-three times in the Book of Mormon. About fifteen of them are in reference to baptism. Therefore I think it is important to know the definition of the word *unto*.

So if we place some of the definitions into our first scripture we get something like this: "I baptize you with water as an action for which you are particularly fitted, for a direction toward repentance." Or, "I baptize you with water as a person spoken to, and effected by the action of repentance." The possibilities are many, but the thing that interested me most was the preciseness of this wonderful, amazing, and perfect word.

You probably thought you were done with repentance as a first principle of the doctrine, but your life has been filled with more and more repentance since you were baptized. You

know that is true from experience, and the word "unto" brings that out. So keep on keep'en on. It's what you've come this far for.

The definition of the word "unto" from Webster's Third International Dictionary:

Used as a function word to indicate (UFWTI) direction and completion of movement toward a place, destination, or object.

Function: n. 1. The action for which one is particularly fitted or employed.

2. a. Assigned duty or activity.

Used as a function word to indicate (UFWTI): movement, inclination, or tendency toward an enriched object.

UFWTI: aim, purpose or destiny.

UFWTI: a person spoken to, or the recipient of an action, or the person effected by an action ("unto you is born this day...a savior" Luke 2:11.)

UFWTI: something arousing a response of responsive action.

PHOENIX, ARIZONA

Greetings from Phoenix! Please accept my apology for my negligence in keeping up on the Phoenix news last year. I pledge to make 1997 a better year.

Joel Yates has been elected our pastor for another year and Gordon McCann will be our assistant pastor.

On January 9, we gathered in a memorial service for Esther Caviness. Don McIndoo spoke about the inspiration that Esther and all the founding families of the Phoenix local have been to him. Esther Caviness was the first editor of *The Hand of Fellowship*. We're grateful for her willingness to serve. The little paper that began in 1956 continues to strengthen and inspire us 41 years later. Esther's family reminisced about her courage, humor and determination, qualities we all need to strive for.

The first sacrament service of 1997 that our family was able to attend was very uplifting. The theme of the service seemed to be "Be Patient in Prayer." Melissa Briggs, a friend of the Mosers (and becoming a friend to all of us!) who has been worshipping and studying with the church for some time gave a beautiful testimony. She testified that as she strove toward the gospel she got more opposition from family and worldly acquaintances. She received a direct manifestation from God to be patient for He was with her. I won't give you the details of her experience because I know she'll want to share that with you later herself! Sister Debbie Brown spoke of a commitment to fast until certain things were resolved in her life. She had been very faithful but had weakened one day and broken the fast. In her remorse, she was given the testimony that God is listening and will answer her prayers.

On January 22, we had a special worship service in which members of the congregation shared favorite scriptures.

On Valentine's weekend, the Phoenix ministry met in fasting and prayer. Pastor Yates asked the ministry to focus their prayers on six needs:

- Seek the Lord's forgiveness and sanctification to be more effective in our ministry.
- That the power of God might be more fully manifest in our priest-hood responsibilities and duties.
- The need for a greater outpouring of the gifts of the spirit on the priesthood and the people.
- Help against the power of the evil one that is working to destroy our church.
- A greater outpouring of the love of Christ so that we can be more receptive to the cries of our people.
- The spiritual needs of the local congregation.

On February 16, Priest Bob Hedrick preached to us about *The Purpose of Trials*. "A trial is a test of progress. If God wants us to take a test and we say, 'No, I can't,' we're not going to progress. When we fail a trial God will give us another. He will keep working with us. He will say, 'Remember that test I gave you? It's still here.' Don't get upset by trials; expect and overcome."

That evening, Elder Joel Yates preached about What it means to be a servant. Speaking to the ministry, he said, "It doesn't matter what part you have; those who have this are to be down there in the trenches." And addressing all of us he said, "We're caught up in 'What I want to do' so much that we forget others. If everything we do as a family unit is for us, how can we teach our children to serve? We do ourselves and our children a great disservice when we don't spend time in service. We may be guilty of vanity in our prayers if we pray for our brother who is sick and don't visit. Let's not pray about things and leave them there—let's act. That's being a servant."

In the Adult Sunday School class we've been studying the story of Jacob in the book of Genesis. We've learned how throughout time God has transformed sinful men into servants when their hearts turned toward Him. God transformed **Jacob** from a supplanter, a schemer (the meaning of his original name), into **Israel**, which means prevailer, he who strives with God. Yet Jacob's human nature remained. When he was slothful or self-willed, his life faltered; when he relied on God, he was a powerful servant.

In a recent prayer service, Sister Chris Moser testified of praying about a particular need and waking in the night with the scripture that answered her prayer.

Sister Helen Kidd shared an experience that her mother, Blanche Martin, had in caring for Helen's uncle. Blanche's brother Clyde was seriously ill and had been sent home from the hospital to die. Sister Martin was caring for him. She was told by the spirit to have her brother administered to but was fearful about suggesting this to him, as he was not a spiritual man. The spirit spoke to Blanche twice more, and she responded. Clyde agreed to administration. He began to gain strength and later turned his life around to become a Christian who was to live for quite a few more years.

Our pastor admonished us to give more time to fasting and prayer for greater power and blessings in our lives, particularly the gift of healing. He has asked us to pray for these signs in our work with our Native American brothers and sisters.

Please continue to pray for the work on the Navajo Nation. The ministry are making shorter, more frequent trips to minister to people on a more regular basis. Whenever possible, they leave children's lessons with young families in hopes of awakening them to their spiritual heritage.

The preachers of the month were Brothers Glen Gill, Frank Fann, Andy Brantner, Larry Beem, Randy Sheldon, Ron Temple, Marvin Ely and Jay Moser. Their sermons were full of timely admonitions to which we all need to give heed.

When Jesus appeared to the people on this continent, he prayed unto the Father for them that they might be one with Him as He and the Father are one. He prayed that the Holy Ghost would be given to all that believed on His words. Through the Holy Ghost we can have that oneness, even as the oneness between the Father and Jesus Christ, with them and with one another (III Nephi 5:29-43; 9:20-29).

The elements that comprise oneness are obedience, humility, submission, and love. We make these choices every day. The pure love of Christ can be made evident to the world through us. No man can serve two masters. Outside influences are afflicting the Church. We must not underestimate this problem. Our vocation is to be a child of God, to live as one. The gift of the priesthood is for the perfecting of the people until we all come to the measure of the stature of Christ. We are to be perfect (Matthew 5:48). To have the Spirit abide in us we must live holy.

Parents, live that example of a true disciple of Christ for your children's sake. If any are lost it must be by their own choices, not by our failing to be and live as He has commanded. What do we spend our time on? There is a song: Take time to be Holy. Take time with Jesus alone, run not before Him, each thought and each motive in His control. Speak oft with the Lord, morning, noon and night, and all the time in between.

Psalms 101 says to behave wisely in a perfect way, view no wicked thing or make friends of wicked persons, those who live by lies and deceit. We are to walk in a perfect way, abiding in Him, feeding on His word, being obedient. God has made many pledges for this life, all good things we stand in need of—if we are obedient.

Matthew 7:21: Why do we call Him Lord yet not do what He says to do? There is more to faith than just believing that He is. That belief includes obedience and living Christlike in our daily lives. Christ came that the world might be saved. That salvation begins with a commandment. John 15:12-13: "...Love one another as I have loved you. Greater love bath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." The first commandment is to love the Lord with all thy heart, might, mind and strength; the second to love the neighbor as thyself. All of His law is encompassed in these two.

We need to take time to be holy; we need to learn what that means, because the things of this world have become more important than the things of God. These things keep us from living holy. Romans 12:1: We are to be a living example, a living sacrifice, which is a reasonable requirement, to prove what is the good, acceptable and perfect will of God. We are to be patient in tribulation, instant in prayer, blessing those that persecute even to serving the needs of our enemy, thus overcoming evil with good.

Faith and works are like two oars of a boat; one without the other propels us in circles. Our walk with the Lord is a straight and narrow path. The road to Zion is both spiritual and temporal, and they must be in harmony with each other. The spiritual comes first, that desire for His will in our lives that we can come to that measure of the stature of Christ (Ephesians 4:11-13).

The necessity for Zion on this earth is apparent for our temporal well being. Book of Commandments 64:25: The will of the Lord concerning his saints, then and now, that they be assembled unto the land of Zion. Acts 2:44 says, "And all that believed were together, and had all things common...." Isaiah 53:8 speaks of laying all on the altar as Christ did. Do we need all that we have? No. This is a temporal step.

A great and marvelous work is to be accomplished, the field is already white. None can assist except they are humble, full of love, having faith, hope and charity. We are to be the example of Christ to the world, as persons, as

a people.

Apostasy is to turn away from that which one has believed. Becoming entangled in sin leads to apostasy. Such things as pride and anger can lead to apostasy. If these afflict us we must repent or we cannot inherit the kingdom of heaven. To repent is to cease from those sins. We must become humble, gentle, patient, temperate and diligent in keeping the commandments of God. It was pride that destroyed the people after Jesus was here (Alma 5:39).

Church apostasy begins in individuals, by personal failure in obedience, by acts of omission, as well as commission. If our personal testimony is weak we become subject to deception. We begin to excuse our errors. To withstand the onslaughts on our faith we need to love our faith, not only to say but to do.

Moroni 6:6-7: They met together oft to fast and to pray, and were strict to see that there was no iniquity among them, and conducted their meetings as the Spirit led. Jesus went to the cross willingly because He knew what the result of His sacrifice would be. We have reason to know what the result of our choices will be. What we do, what we choose, predicts the future both here and hereafter. We need to stop and think if what we are doing is worth the cost. Sometimes it's a fearful thing to do the right thing. But not to can be a fearful thing

The scripture is a testimony of the presence of God in all circumstances both in time and eternity. We should fill our hearts with the desire to live to His honor, to never bring shame upon His name because we claim to be His followers but live contrary to His will and teachings. We are called to sacrifice our will for His, even as he sacrificed His will for the Father's. We need to start laying up treasure in heaven today. Tomorrow may be too late. We pray, Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Are we ready for that?

In III Nephi 9:65 the Father said to Abraham, "... In thy seed shall all the kindreds of the earth be blessed, unto the pouring out of the Holy Ghost through me upon the Gentiles..." Verse 67: "And I will remember the covenant that I have made with my people...."

That covenant is referenced in Duet. 33:13: and of Joseph he said, there follows the blessings of his land, this land. Verse 17: "...And they are the ten thousands of Ephriam and they are the thousands of Manasseh." The sign of the fulfillment to be when these words of Christ would be brought forth from the Gentile to the seed of Lehi upon this land, then they may know that the Father hath commenced the fulfilling of His covenant to the people of Israel. In that day a great and marvelous work will be done among them.

If the Gentile repents His church is to be established among them (III Nephi 10:1). Is it? Has it not been? That Church is to assist both the repentant of the seed of Ephriam and the native American to build the city, the New Jerusalem (verses 2-3). "And then shall the power of heaven come down among them; I also will be in the midst, and then shall the work of the Father commence, at that day even when this gospel shall be preached among the remnant of this people" III Nephi 10:4. III Nephi 7:16-26: at that time the work is to commence among all the dispersed of Israel to gather them back to the land of their inheritance.

Book of Commandments 48:59-62 states that His people are to be established in righteousness in a place of safety called Zion. Steps we may take towards that end: pray to desire it; pray for His will for us as individuals; pray for a work to do; pray that He open the

way; pray for strength; pray we learn to listen for His will; pray to be submissive to Him and each other; and pray that we be able to attain to that righteousness required to be permitted to have a part in Zion, and be protected from the calamities to come.

John 3:16-17: God so loved the world that he sent his son, not to condemn but to save. We must come to the Father through faith in Jesus. Without faith it is impossible to please Him (Hebrews 11:6). Romans 5:1-2: we are justified by faith and by faith can have hope. If we love him we are to be obedient (John 14:15). He waits for us to come: He alone has the answers to this life's problems. We must be of a broken heart and contrite spirit, to be meek and lowly. Without faith there is no hope; and then there must needs be charity, for without charity our faith and hope are in vain (Mormon 7:167). Our faith and hope lie in sacrifice, the death and resurrection of Christ.

He is the light and life of the world. We can share in that light by following Jesus. To do so we must do the things He said to do. Our lives should radiate Jesus to all about us. Then where He is we may be also. We must use today to prepare to be there at the right hand of God tomorrow.

God works in marvelous ways. The resurrection of Christ is of utmost importance to each of us. God sees all things, every problem, even all our sins, and He prepared a way that

we can be saved from them. Christ sacrificed Himself to rescue us from the result of our sins. All we can do is repent. Without that sacrifice we would have no hope. There is no situation we cannot be saved from if we yield to Him.

We must seek Him with all our heart: we must let God's word dwell in our minds and hearts. We must learn His instructions and follow them. God can change the life of any and all that come to Him. To be forgiven we must also forgive others. And to forgive we must also forget. In order to forget we must not dwell upon the matter in our minds, or speak of it to others. James 3:2: if any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man. We need, with Paul (Phil. 3:13), to forget those things which have offended if our forgiving be read (Phil. 4:8), and to think on whatsoever thing is true, honest, of virtue and praise. There is always something nice to say about everyone. We can do all that the Lord requires with His help. We must stay our hearts upon Him knowing He is able to supply all our need. This is the hope that draws people to Jesus, His love and forgiveness for us in His sacrifice made, and the promise that He will wipe away all tears. His death and resurrection affects all things.
