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

# Reflections on the 42H OLEMMA



uring a meeting of the Council of Apostles by telephone I was nominated and elected to address the concerns, preparations and fears with the impending year 2000 ahead. During our meetings held prior to the April 1999 Conference we determined to set aside time to fast and pray for the Lord's direction concerning this date referred to as Y2K, as many in each of our respective fields of responsibility had asked our opinions and the Council had also received a letter from members of the Church of Christ asking that we pursue this concern.

On Monday, March 29, 1999, the apostles engaged in fasting and prayer. The individual names of those who stood in need, the locals and missions in the United States, Mexico, Canada, Honduras and throughout the world were given over to the Lord. The morning was spent in this manner with all members participating and we were blessed with the Spirit being felt by all. A short break was taken and we once again assembled with the brother in charge asking that we place Y2K before the Lord to know His will.

Earlier in our meetings we had discussed this concern with our collective knowledge, intelligence, talents and skills. As I tried to absorb this wealth of information (and there was considerable) I thought to myself—"they have certainly picked the wrong man for this job." This was confirmed as I measured each man's input; the more we tried to make a simple statement and to know the future,



the more complex and consuming the task became.

Now my brother had asked that we, I, place this matter before the Lord. I remember thinking as I knelt in the season of prayer, I am on the faith side of the prayer I had not yet offered. Faith is the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things unseen. I was taught this by a brother that helped me to come to know Jesus Christ, and he hammered this definition into my hard head. Once I offer this prayer, I am on the potential knowledge side of my prayer. What if He does not answer? The Spirit's

prompting brought me back to my sense of duty and I turned to pray, to cry out, to God, which I was glad to do, feeling the Spirit bring a sense of relief, release and great joy! I had received no answer within myself but felt comforted and cared for from above.

After the season of prayer had concluded we arose and a brother turned quickly to offer a scripture reference given to him during our prayers. This brother knows and has a good understanding of the Holy Word and a good memory; the Lord could have placed the entire scripture on his heart and I am confident my brother would have remembered. The Lord placed on his heart only the book, chapter and verse. As I reflect upon this I am sure the Lord chose this manner so that no one, not even the brother, could say this was his heart's desire or his mind's opinion and not the Lord's will manifested. As our brother read from the Word, Matthew 6:33—"But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you"—I realized my (our) faith was exercised; our prayers were heard, and knowledge was received!

As we discussed this scripture we marveled at how the Lord had taken a complex issue and had made it so simple that even we, you and I (His children) will understand.

Our priorities must be God first in all things, the spiritual health of not just ourselves but the Body of Christ, and all those who will seek after righteousness.

His commandments and continued revelations must be incorporated in our daily lives that we will be as "salt and light" to the world.

We are dependent upon Him in this life for our livelihood, our physical continuance and our well-being.

Following are some of the scriptures and thoughts we offered and shared with each other that have brought us comfort and helped to reconcile our sense of overall "well-being."

"Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world. Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God: And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world. Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world. They are of the world: therefore speak they of the world, and the world heareth them. We are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error" 1 John 4:1-6.

(There are many "prophets of doom" and many glean money as "profits of doom"!)

"Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon. Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. And Simon answering said unto him. Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net. And when they had this done, they enclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, Depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord" Luke 5:4-9.

(The proper sense of our own nothingness vs. the magnitude of God is necessary, and after we have exercised all our talents, skills and strength to then follow the command and will of God is to succeed.)

(The main thrust of chapter 24, though filled with endtime troubles, is the coming of Christ—the Second Coming, and this time with His Power.)

Then let them which are in Judaea flee to the mountains; and let them which are in the midst of it depart out; and let not them that are in the countries enter thereinto. For these be the days of vengeance, that all things which are written may be fulfilled. But woe unto them that are with child, and to them that give suck, in those days! for there shall be great distress in the land, and wrath upon this people. And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled. And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken. And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh" Luke 21:19-28.

God has a time-table; we must patiently wait for it to unfold [to be revealed]; in spite of all the horrendous things that will transpire we, through our faith exercised, will still have cause to look up and express joy as our redemption [Jesus Christ] draws near.

(Babylon, the World, will fall in a "day." The saints of God will have cause to "rejoice.")

"And it shall come to pass in that day, that the Lord shall set his hand again the second time to recover the remnant of his people. which shall be left from Assyria, and from Egypt, and from Pathros, and from Cush, and from Elam, and from Shinar, and from Hamath, and from the islands of the sea. And he shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel, and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth" 2 Nephi 9:126-127.

(An ensign established; an assembling of the Tribes of Israel will take place.)

"Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man" Luke 21:36.

("Watch"; to be vigilant, patient and exercised in faith—"Pray"; to be supported and delivered.)

"Surely the Lord God will do nothing, but he revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets" Amos 3:7.

(The Lord's revelations have not ceased with those that hope, pray and have faith.)

t is very easy, even tempting to get caught up in the rush to be prepared for this date that is fast approaching. From the outside as I began to look at the opinions of others, most of these were leaning if not pushing what is most easily obtained in the media towards a major disruption in our lifestyle. I turned to my newest toy, one I dragged my feet trying not to purchase, the computer. On this the source of our impending problems I was amazed at the amount of material that is found on this subject of Y2K. The preponderance of articles points to a major if not total disruption of our way of life that many say we may never come back from; over the precipice, not just teetering and then to recover our balance. As I continued to digest this information I began to develop indigestion! Almost all of these free sites? wanted something in return for this lifesaving information: money!

Money in return for being able to maintain my life, even my lifestyle; now that is tempting.

As I continued to dig I found some of these Y2K guru's hoping that America actually will fall. Their sense of duty or calling is to facilitate this fall, using the Bible to legitimize the demise, and with the collapse to take their rightful place as a leader of the reconstructed state.

Still others, not quite as radical or alarming, come on much softer, offering all kinds of remedies, precautions, preparations and ways to avoid disruptions. I began to like what they

offered until I read the fine print and found that again money was very much appreciated, even required!

I am sure some of you reading this are saying: "Wait just a minute, you don't know what you have found. Some of these give all their time, energy and talents; and charge no money at all." There may well be some that are moved with compassion for their fellow man, but I know in my profession that there are manufacturer's representatives that charge nothing up front. If I like what I see or feel the need after they have pointed out my shortcomings I place an order for the product. The manufacturer ships my order to fill my perceived need, I pay his bill and he continues to support his representative in the field.

I continued to look into Y2K and found a good concise article found in *Time* magazine dated January 18, 1999. The article is entitled "The History and The Hype," by Chris Taylor. Following is a time line and a few brief quotes:

- 1890 Herman Hollerith develops an electrically driven census system that reads punch cards. Six years later, he founds the company that becomes IBM.
- Presper Eckert build ENIAC, the first electronic digital computer, and go on to make UNIVAC, the first computer sold commercially. It runs on Hollerith cards.

- 1957 Grace Murray Hopper creates Flow-matic, the first computer language written in plain English. Two years later, it forms the basis of COBOL. To save precious room on the cards, years are abbreviated to two digits (e.g. 1957 is represented as 57)
- 1960 Anticipating problems later on, Robert Bemer and 47 other computer scientists began lobbying for the four-digit year.
- 1964 IBM introduces the spectacularly successful System/360 mainframe, which retains the two digit year.
- 1967 The White House orders the National Bureau of Standards to settle the date debate. Under pressure from the Pentagon, the bureau sticks with the two-digit year.
- 1979 Bemer makes the first widely published prediction of the Y2K crisis, in the journal "Interface Age." The reaction is overwhelming; he retires three years later.
- 1993 Curious nuke watchers at NORAD turn their computer clocks forward to Jan. 1st, 2000—and the ICBM alert system crashes.
- "Doomsday 2000" article appears in "Computer World"; he launches himself on the lecture circuit.
- 1995 IBM finally acknowledges the Y2K bug—and announces

- plans to help its customers make "timely year 2000 transitions."
- 1996 At the behest of Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan, the Congressional Research Service writes its first report on Y2K. Moynihan warns Clinton of the "Year 2000 time bomb."
- Jager Year 2000 index"—a collection of stock options in 18 bug-fixing firms. It jumps 100% in its first year of operation. Y2K consultants, among them the Garter Group, start cashing in.
- 1997 At an industry summit, Bill Gates blames Y2K worries on those who "love to tell tales of fear." A year later, Microsoft admits being "slow" on the Y2K uptake.
- 1998 Y2K merchandise (mugs, clocks and caps) goes on sale. The White House appoints John Koskinen as its Y2K czar. Most government agencies get a failing grade in Y2K readiness.
- 1999 March 31: Koskinen's preliminary deadline for all computer system fixes.
- 2000 Jan. 1st: The moment of truth.
  - "—Though most of the dire predictions connected with date—the year 2000 computer bug's moment of truth—are unlikely to come true, a little computer generated chaos would provide a fitting conclusion to a 40 year

story of human frailties: greed, shortsightedness, and a tendency to rush into new technologies before thinking them through."

It is interesting to note that one of the Restoration groups, the LDS—Mormons—contracted the aid of Robert Bemer, who helped write the COBOL language in the late 1950s. Their problem: they realized to research genealogy on the computer they would need the 4-digit year; the 2-digit year would prevent their research out of this century. The capability or technology to ready all computers 40 years ago was available!

"From 1995 on, Y2K awareness had a kind of critical mass. Congress, the White House and the media all got wind of the bug at about the same time. After making too little of the problem for so long, everybody began to make, if anything, too much of it."

"The fact is that no one on the planet really knows what will happen when 01-01-00 rolls around. ...In a century in which man splits the atom, spliced genes and turned silicone into data, the tale of Y2K—how we ignored it for 40 years, then flew into a tizzy—will not be remembered as our finest hour."

From your concern and ours—after exhaustive research, after writing this article and each of you taking the time

to read it, I trust that each of you appreciate how our God was able to cut through the complexities, fear, ignorance and shortness of time. Matthew 6:33: "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." It cuts right through to the quick, doesn't it? But that is what the word of God is.

Heb. 4:12: "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

Good advice on food preparation and storage can be found on the LDS web site. Good advice on emergency preparedness may be found on the American Red Cross web site, a small sample follows:

1 Check with manufacturers of any essential computer-controlled electronic equipment in your home to see if that equipment may be affected. This includes fire and security alarm systems, programmable thermostats, appliances, consumer electronics, garage door openers, electronic locks, and any other electronic equipment in which an "embedded chip" may control its operation.

- 1 Stock disaster supplies to last several days to a week for yourself and those who live with you. This includes having nonperishable foods, stored water, and an ample supply of prescription and nonprescription medications that you regularly use.
- As you would in preparation for a storm of any kind, have some extra cash or traveler's checks on hand in case electronic transactions involving ATM cards, credit cards, and the like cannot be processed. Plan to keep cash or traveler's checks in a safe place, and withdraw money from your bank in small amounts well in advance of 12/31/99.
- As you would in preparation for a winter storm, keep your automobile gas tank above half full.
- In case the power fails, plan to use alternative cooking devices in accordance with manufacturer's instructions. Don't use open flames or charcoal grills indoors.
- Have extra blankets, coats, hats, and gloves to keep warm. Please do not plan to use gas-fueled appliances, like an oven, as an alternative heating source. The same goes

for wood-burning or liquid-fueled heating devices that are not designed to be used in a residential structure. Camp stoves and heaters should only be used out of doors in a well-ventilated area. If you do purchase an alternative heating device, make sure it is approved for use indoors and is listed with the Underwriters Laboratories (UL).

- Have plenty of flashlights and extra batteries on hand. Don't use candles for emergency lighting.
- Examine your smoke alarms now. If you have smoke alarms that are hard-wired into your home's electrical system (most newer ones are), check to see if they have battery back-ups. Every fall, replace all batteries in all smoke alarms as a general fire safety precaution.
- Be prepared to relocate to a shelter for warmth and protection during a prolonged power outage or if for any other reason local officials request or require that you leave your home. Listen to a battery-operated radio or television for information about where shelters will be available.
- 1 If you plan to use a port-

able generator, connect what you want to power directly to the generator; do not connect the generator to your home's electrical system. Also, be sure to keep a generator in a well-ventilated area—either outside or in a garage, keeping the door open. Don't put a generator in your basement or anywhere inside your home.

Theck with the emergency services providers in your community to see if there is more information available about how your community is preparing for any potential problems. Be an advocate and support efforts by your local police, fire, and emergency management officials to ensure that their systems will be able to operate at all times.

We are on the faith side of Y2K, soon, very soon, we will be on the knowledge side of Y2K.

Let us continue to seek a closer walk with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Let us prepare for a disruption as man's fears are brought to view; use common sense.


Let us prepare not just for our own, the Body of Christ; but the poor, naked and hungry.

# Christ in the Feast of Hanukkah

"Now it was the Feast of Dedication in Jerusalem, and it was winter. And Jesus walked in the Temple, in Solomon's porch" (John 10:22-3).

hat is the only biblical reference to a well-known winter holiday that Jesus celebrated, a holiday many will celebrate this month. You know it by another name, (hint: it's not Christmas!). No, from December 13 to 21, my Jewish people will celebrate the Feast of Dedication, commonly known as Hanukkah.

Many are surprised that the only Bible verse mentioning Hanukkah is found in the New Testament. That is simply because the holiday commemorates an event that occurred during the interTestamental period, approximately 165 BC. A Syrian King named

Antiochus invaded the Jewish nation and demanded that my people abandon the God of Israel and His ways. His plan: forced "Hellenization." That meant imposing Greek customs, including idolatry, on the people. It meant forbidding the practice of the Jewish religion, including circumcision. Ultimately, to ensure that no one could worship the God of Israel, Antiochus defiled the Temple in Jerusalem. He placed idols in the house of the Lord and sacrificed a sow upon the holy altar. He not only defiled God's Temple, but he took the title "Epiphanes," which means 'God manifested,' and demanded to be worshipped. In response to his blasphemous claim to deity, the Jewish people modified his title, calling him "Epimanes" (crazy).

It was a terribly dark period in Israel's history, but God raised up a small band of heroes led by a family known as the Maccabees (Maccabee means "hammer"). They waged a successful rebellion against Antiochus and drove the Syrians out of Israel. The Feast of Hanukkah commemorates the victory God gave the Jewish people over Antiochus and his mighty army. We call the holiday Hanukkah (dedication), because the high point of our victory was rededicating the Temple in Jerusalem.

Many legends surround this historic event, but the most famous is the "miracle of the oil." It is said that when the Maccabees recaptured Jerusalem they immediately set out to rededicate the Temple. But they faced a pressing problem; they needed consecrated oil to rekindle the sacred candelabra. They found only enough for one day—and it would take a full eight days to procure enough oil for Temple use.

The thought of lighting this great candelabra only to see it go out again was heartwrenching. Yet the zeal to rededicate the Temple was so strong that, despite the dilemma, they decided to light the candelabra. A traditional saying arose from this Hanukkah story: "nes gadol haya sham," which means,

"a great miracle happened there." The great miracle was that the oil, enough for only one day, continued to burn for eight whole days, enough time to make and sanctify new oil. According to this legend, this is why we celebrate Hanukkah for eight nights and why the Hanukkiah (Hanukkah menorah) is lit for eight nights as well. It's a good story, but it isn't mentioned in the earlier accounts of the Maccabbeean revolt, such as 2nd Maccabees. The legend of the oil isn't mentioned until much later, in the Talmud. Maybe a day's worth of oil supernaturally burned for eight days and maybe it did not.

Many believe that a more likely reason why we celebrate Hanukkah for eight days is that the Maccabees, upon recapturing Jerusalem, conducted a belated Feast of Tabernacles celebration. Remember, Solomon himself had chosen that very same Feast of Tabernacles to dedicate the Temple when it was newly built. So the eight-day festival of joy and thanksgiving would have been an especially appropriate way to commemorate the rededication of the Temple.

In any case, it is still appropriate at Hanukkah to say, "nes gadol haya sham, a great miracle happened there." The miracle of Hanukkah is the miracle of God's preserving power. Israel's victory over Antiochus and his mighty army showed forth that miraculous power.

God staked His reputation on His promises to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when He vowed to preserve and sustain their descendants forever. No wonder Satan has attempted to annihilate the Jews throughout history! Antiochus was one of Satan's agents in his diabolical scheme to destroy the Jews and so make God a liar! In fact, the prophet Daniel predicted the wicked deeds of Antiochus (Daniel 8-11) and even depicted him as a type of the anti-Christ, the beast of Revelation 13.

The Jews of Jesus' day were well aware of the events that had led to the Feast of Dedication when they approached Him in the holy Temple on Hanukkah. It was in the context of that recent history that they said to Jesus, "If you are the Christ, tell us plainly" (John 10:24). If Jesus really was the Messiah they reasoned, He had the power to preserve the Jewish people from the tyranny of the Romans, just as God had preserved them from evil Antiochus. Jesus answered them with a rebuke, "I told you, and you do not believe" (v. 25).

Jesus boldly asserted His Messiahship. He claimed divine power to preserve and sustain His people, but not in the manner they had hoped for and expected. "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand" (v. 27-8). Jesus' power to preserve was not a temporal, physical power. It was eternal and spiritual—and it was based on faith in Him as the Holy One of God. The salvation He offered was not from Roman oppression but from the oppression of Satan, sin and even death itself.

The rededication of the Temple was a reminder of God's power to keep His prom-

ises and preserve His people Israel.

But One greater than the Temple stood on Solomon's porch that day. And He made an astounding claim. "I and My Father are one" (v. 30). Remember, this is Hanukkah. Fresh in my people's minds was the fact that they had rightly rejected the false claims of Antiochus. Now here is Jesus, standing in the Temple asserting His own claim to deity. The reaction of my people was predictable. "Then the Jews took up stones again to stone Him" (v. 31). And if He hadn't been who He claimed to be, they would have been absolutely right to do so.

When my people rejected Antiochus, God kept His promises, miraculously preserving them. But when the Jewish leaders wrongly rejected Jesus' claims that day, they missed an even greater miracle than Israel's against-all-odds victory over the over-

whelming Syrian army. They missed the miracle of Immanuel, God with us. That miracle gave Jesus the right to claim power to preserve those who come to Him. Only as God come in the flesh is Jesus "able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him."

God does keep His promises, even when we fail to recognize it. He said, "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel. For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 7:14; 9:6). Jesus fulfilled these precious promises from God. In Him, God has proven His faithfulness to Israel and to all the world.

This month, those of us who have accepted His claims can celebrate the miracle of Hanukkah as well as the miracle of Christ's birth. Because God keeps His promises, He will save and sustain Israel. Because God keeps His promises, He will save and keep all those who call upon His name through faith in Immanuel, our Messiah Jesus. Because God keeps His promises, He has made each blood-bought believer to be His own Temple, where Immanuel, God with us, has taken up residence. And so because God keeps His promises, please join us in dedicating ourselves anew to live for Him by the power of the Ruach ha Kodesh, the Holy Spirit who burns within us.

A child revels in his times of fun and fellowship with his father.


How it thrills the child of God to have those moments of sweet communion with his Father above.

#### HIGHLIGHTS:

## ■ BACK TO THE ORIGINAL PURPOSE

We have returned to the original purpose for our solemn assemblies. It is quoted in part here: "By numerous prophecies we know that the day of the Lord is nigh at hand...that great destruction will come upon all people before the great and dreadful day of the Lord.

"Therefore, Resolved, That the whole membership of the Church of Christ, from the youngest child to the oldest member, be called to a solemn assembly, that a period of fasting may be sanctified unto our God

"...That we seek to lay hold on the promise recorded in Joel 2:32, 'And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be delivered: for in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the Lord hath said, and in the remnant whom the Lord shall call.'

"...That the whole church may be united in one heart and one mind, that the guidance of the Lord may be made known to us, and that the power of Pentecost may cover us as the waters cover the sea, that the servants of the Lord might go forth in boldness and power and speak the word without fear unto the utmost ends of the earth."

#### ■ UNITY OF THE SAINTS

Satan attempted to distract us from the purpose for which we were assembled. Part of that purpose as stated is that we "may be united in one heart and one mind." This was accomplished in an unusual way. Friday our Brothers Jay Moser and Gale Brantner were in charge. We all moved in a quiet, orderly way to the lawn, then were ordered by the police to the "Stone Church" lawn across the street. We prayerfully waited for the men left inside. The police were able to take control and our ministry all came out unharmed. Then we all joined hands as several were asked to pray. All who passed on the street witnessed our unity.

Our adversary tried to put a lasting fear into the hearts of our people in the Lord's own house. Yes, we were naturally startled. Some of us could not believe it was happening. And yes, we were very concerned. But we were not overcome with fear. We saw acts of bravery. In testimony of the fact that the Lord was with us to calm us, the police thanked us by way of Brother Roger Bruner for our being cooperative and orderly.

In the afternoon session we were all counseled by Brother Brian McIndoo that in order for a healing to take place for those involved that it was necessary to talk it out, and so

there was time given for testimony of the Lord's intervention in saving our lives, in the peace He gave us, and for our expressions of our feelings about this experience. There was concern and many prayers for the children who witnessed this traumatic event. One child was administered to the next day for the fear it brought and received a wonderful blessing. In the evening service one heard, while singing three hymns, the choirs of angels amongst the voices of the congregation.

The Lord was truly triumphant! It was a test. Might we know that He will be triumphant in any fearful situation in the future? But it will require that we follow Him by coming out of the world and its systems, submitting our lives to Him, then having faith and trusting that His will will surely be done. Then, no matter what happens it will be well with us.

## ■ ORDINATION TO THE OFFICE OF APOSTLE

Apostle Frank Fann was in charge with the other nine apostles, present at the Conference, assisting. We were all sad that our dear Brother and Apostle, Robert Jensen, couldn't attend this year because of circumstances beyond his control.

Brother Fann asked us to let the Spirit of the Lord come into our hearts and praise Him

After the ordination Placido gave his testimony that his calling came as a surprise to him and then after that didn't think much more about the call. # Roma Levi Harrison

oma Levi Harrison of Urbana, Missouri, passed away Thursday evening, May 13th, 1999, at his home. Roma lived in Dallas County the majority of his life and graduated from Skyline High School in 1962. After high school he joined the Navy. Because his dad, Ellis, was in poor health and Roma was an only child, he received an honorable discharge so he could help run the farm.
