

News Bulletin

NEWS BULLETIN: Jerusalem, the City of David, the City of Zion, has been invaded. The walls have been broken down, the gates have been burned and the people have been carried away captive.

A news correspondent has interviewed a gentleman who escaped captivity. This is his story:

"I was in Shushan the

palace, that Hanani, one of my brethren, came, he and certain men of Judah; and *I asked them concerning the* Jews that had escaped, which were left of the captivity, and concerning Jerusalem. And they said unto me, the remnant that are left of the captivity there in the province are in great affliction and reproach: the wall of Jerusalem also is broken down, and the gates thereof are burned with fire."

This man showed great emotion and sadness. He continued his story:

"When I heard these words, I sat down and wept, and mourned certain days. and fasted, and prayed before the God of heaven, and said, 'I beseech thee, O Lord God of heaven, the great and terrible God, that keepeth covenant and mercy for them that love him and observe his commandments: Let thine ear now be attentive, and thine eyes open, that thou mayest hear the prayer of thy servant, which I pray before thee

now, day and night, for the children of Israel, which we have sinned against thee: both I and my father's house have sinned.""

The gentleman continued his lamenting concerning his sins and the sins of the people for not having kept the commandments of God. He concluded his prayer with these words:

"Now these are thy servants and thy people, whom thou hast redeemed by thy great power, and by thy strong hand. O Lord, I beseech thee, let now thine ear be attentive to the prayer of thy servant, and to the prayer of thy servants, who desire to fear thy name: and prosper, I pray thee, thy servant this day, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man. For I was the king's cupbearer."

This gentleman would only give his name as Nehemiah, but his words show us the haunting reality of a people's destiny who failed to prepare for an impending disaster.

Unfortunately, this news

item is a few days late as this event took place sometime around B. C. 446.

"But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day" 2 Peter 3:8.

NEWS BULLETIN: The Lord is bringing again Zion! His message to His people is to seek to bring forth and establish the cause of Zion!

This news bulletin is an update of the former news bulletin. It comes to us in the latter days: A. D. 1829. The message is: Don't let this people be unprepared like the Jews of old when disaster comes. Say nothing but repentance to them. Prepare them for the return of Jesus Christ, and warn them against being counted among the "foolish virgins" who took no oil with them in their lamps to meet the bridegroom. See Matthew 25:1-13.

INSTRUCTIONS IN PREPARING ONE'S LAMP:

] Fill the lamp with oil and keep it full.

RTrim the wick so that it will burn brightly.

5Clean all dirt and smudges off the globe so that the light will shine through.

A s we contemplate our situation we realize we have used what precious oil we had on the cares of this life, leaving our wick burnt and unattended. We need to cut the burnt part off, getting rid of our selfish concerns and cares. Being renewed in mind and spirit we move forward to complete our preparation.

Filling our lamps with oil of the right ingredients is of uppermost importance, but that isn't all that must be done. The light from our lamp must put forth light to dispel the darkness. We must clean the globe. There are smudges and dirt on the glass. Old and secret sins are evident and require the cleanser of repentance.

Another big, dirty and crusty stain that defeats all efforts to use the lamp is "I can't be perfect." This will require plenty of soap and water, along with a great deal of hard work, to get the stain off the glass. It will take some of Paul's special 'positive thinking' soap: "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" Phil. 4:13. If that doesn't work we might add Alma's humble testimony:

"Yea, I know that I am nothing; as to my strength, I am weak; therefore I will not boast of myself, but I will boast of my God; for in his strength I can do all things; yea, behold, many mighty miracles we have wrought in this land, for which we will praise his name for ever" Alma 14:92.

Our Lord has given the commandment: "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect" Matt. 5:48. Paul tells us to go on unto perfection after we have laid the foundation of faith, repentance, baptism, etc. (Heb. 6:1). He also tells us that God:

"...Gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ..." Eph. 4:11-13.

How much more positive thinking soap will it take to get that "I can't be perfect" dirty spot off our glass? If we each are to come unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ we will have to believe, first of all, that we can reach perfection. Otherwise the oil isn't going to do much good because our light (good example) can't shine forth.

The several spiritual qualities that make up the oil can be found in various scriptures. Peter speaks of them thus:

"Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord, according as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue: whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity" 2 Peter 1:2-7.

Great opportunity has been afforded us that we might be partakers of the divine nature by escaping the corruption that is in the world that comes through lust. The divine nature is the nature of God, which is distinctly different than the The Lord has natural man. made it possible for us to partake of His personal characteristics, becoming like Him in holiness. To do this we must believe in His words and the words of His servants. We must strive to fill our lamps with oil that has His divine characteristics.

FAITH is the necessary means by which we can fill our lamps with the ingredients of the "divine nature" oil. Paul gives us this definition for faith: "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" Hebrews 11:1. He gives the names of several

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individuals who have been examples of faith in Old Testament times: Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Sara, Joseph, Moses, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthae, David, Samuel and the prophets. Paul continued with these words:

"Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God" Hebrews 12:1, 2.

Jesus is indeed the author and finisher of our faith.

On the subject of **FAITH** let us go to the words of Moroni who also refers us to an ancient time (230-130 B. C.), and adds his own admonition from his inspirational viewpoint:

"Wherefore, whoso believeth in God, might with surety hope for a better world, yea, even a place at the right hand of God, which hope cometh of faith, maketh an anchor to the souls of men, which would make them sure and steadfast, always abounding in good works, being led to glorify God. And it came to pass that Ether did prophesy great and marvelous things unto the people, which they did not believe, because they saw them not. And now I. Moroni, would speak somewhat concerning these things; I would shew unto the world that faith is things which are hoped for and not seen; Wherefore, dispute not because ye see not, for ve receive no witness until after the trial of your faith, for it was by faith that Christ shewed himself unto our fathers, after he had risen from the dead; And he shewed not himself unto them, until after they had faith in him; wherefore, it must needs be that some had faith in him, for he shewed himself not unto the world" Ether 5:4-8.

Having increased our faith by looking with great anticipation for the return of our Lord we are to add to our faith **VIRTUE**, which is general moral excellence: right action and thinking; goodness and morality, chastity. This is especially important to young people and young adults who find it difficult to resist the immorality and lustfulness of the modern world. One must stand firm in righteousness and resist temptations, especially of the flesh. Over two thousand years ago Alma was guided to use the word of God:

"And now, as the preaching of the word had had a greater tendency to lead the people to do that which was just; yea, it had had more powerful effect upon the minds of the people than the sword, or anything else, which had happened unto them; therefore Alma thought it was expedient that they should try the virtue of the word of God" Alma 16:82.

KNOWLEDGE is also to be added that we might understand the truth and not be deceived through ignorance. Paul admonished Timothy in these words:

"Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" 2 Timothy 2:15.

Isaiah asks a question and answers thus: "Whom shall he teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? them that are weaned from the milk, and drawn from the breasts" Isaiah 28:9. This tells us that a degree of maturity and accountability is required in the growing process of a person as he learns the things of God. Mormon gives counsel to his son Moroni on this subject:

"Behold I say unto you, that this thing shall ye teach, repentance and baptism unto those who are accountable and capable of committing sin; yea, teach parents that they must repent and be baptized, and humble themselves as their little children, and they shall all be saved with their little children: and their little children need no repentance, neither baptism" Moroni 8:11.

Nephi tells his brothers of how the Lord gives knowledge to His people:

"For behold, thus saith the Lord God: I will give unto the children of men line upon line, precept upon precept, here a little and there a little: And blessed are those who hearken unto

my precepts, and lend an ear unto my counsel, for they shall learn wisdom: For unto him that receiveth, I will give more: and from them that shall say, We have enough, shall be taken away even that which they have. Cursed is he that putteth his trust in man, or maketh flesh his arm, or shall hearken unto the precepts of men, save their precepts shall be given by the power of the Holy Ghost" 2 Nephi 12:36-39.

Jacob spoke of the mysteries of God which are revealed to His people, pointing to the obtaining of the perfect knowledge of the atonement of Christ and his resurrection:

"Behold, great and marvelous are the works of the Lord. How unsearchable are the depths of the mysteries of him; and it is impossible that man should find out all his ways. And no man knoweth of his ways, save it be revealed unto him; wherefore, brethren, despise not the revelations of God" Jacob 3:9-11.

"And now, beloved, marvel not that I tell you these things; for why not speak of the atonement of Christ, and attain to a perfect knowledge of him, as to attain to the knowledge of a resurrection and the world to come? Behold, my brethren, he that prophesieth, let him prophesy to the understanding of men; for the Spirit speaketh the truth, and lieth not. Wherefore, it speaketh of things as they really are, and of things as they really will be; wherefore, these things are manifested unto us plainly, for the salvation of our souls. But behold, we are not witnesses alone in these things; for God also spake them unto prophets of old" Jacob 3:18-21.

In the world today so many indulgences are encouraged. **TEMPERANCE** is to be added to knowledge, which means being moderate in indulging the appetites, being self-restrained, being temperate in all things. Paul explains it in these words:

"And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway" 1 Cor. 9:25-27.

Alma admonishes his son Shiblon:

"And now, as ye have begun to teach the word, even so I would that ye should continue to teach; and I would that ye would be diligent and temperate in all things. See that ye are not lifted up unto pride: yea, see that ye do not boast in your own wisdom, nor of your much strength; use boldness, but not overbearance;

and also see that ye bridle all your passions, that ye may be filled with love; see that ye refrain from idleness; do not pray as the Zoramites do, for ye have seen that they pray to be heard of men, and to be praised for their wisdom" Alma 18:13-15.

Being patient in everyday situations is admirable but the patience of the saints of God is truly a righteous quality that distinguishes the prepared people with oil in their lamps as compared to the foolish virgins. **PATIENCE** means bearing or enduring pain, trouble, etc. without complaining or losing self-control; forbearing, tolerating delay, confusion, inefficiency; being steady, diligent, persevering. Words that are often listed with patience are meek, humble, submissive, long suffering. It is said the Lord tries our patience along with our faith.

"Nevertheless the Lord seeth fit to chasten his people; yea, he trieth their patience and their faith. Nevertheless, whosoever putteth his trust in him, the same shall be lifted up at the last day" Mosiah 11:23, 24.

"My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing" James 1:2-4.

"Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompence of reward. For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise" Hebrews 10:35, 36.

GODLINESS is to be added, which means divine; in the likeness of God, devout. Again Paul writes to Timothy:

"If any man teach otherwise, and consent not to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine

which is according to godliness; he is proud, knowing nothing, but doting about questions and strifes of words, whereof cometh envy, strife, railings, evil surmisings, perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself. But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out" 1 Timothy 6:3-7.

In the eyes of the Lord our relationship with others is very important, and it is an important ingredient in the oil of our lamp. Peter calls it **BROTH-ERLY KINDNESS**, but we find brotherly love sufficiently synonymous. Paul puts it this way:

"Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer; distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality. Bless them which persecute vou: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low

estate. Be not wise in your own conceits. Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men" Romans 12:11-18.

"But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another" 1 Thes. 4:9.

Now we are to top off our lamp reservoirs with this oil ingredient, **CHARITY**. The scriptures are plain that charity is the greatest of all and is truly a divine characteristic of God. The scriptural definitions tell us it is love, but not just any love: it is the pure love of Christ.

"Behold, the Lord hath forbidden this thing; wherefore, the Lord God hath given a commandment, that all men should have charity, which charity is love. And except they should have charity, they were nothing: wherefore, if they should have charity, they would not suffer the laborer in Zion to perish" 2 Nephi 11:107, 108.

"Wherefore, cleave unto charity, which is the greatest of all, for all things must fail; but charity is the pure love of Christ, and it endureth for ever; and whoso is found possessed of it at the last day, it shall be well with them. Wherefore, my beloved brethren, pray unto the Father with all the energy of heart, that ye may be filled with this love which he hath bestowed upon all who are true followers of his Son Jesus Christ, that ye may become the sons of God, that when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is, that we may have this hope, that we may be purified even as he is pure. Amen" Moroni 7:52, 53.

"Wherefore, there must be faith; and if there must be faith, there must also be hope; and if there must be hope, there must also be charity; and except ye have charity, ye can in no wise be saved in the kingdom of God..." Moroni 10:15.

"And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity" 1 Cor. 13:13.

"Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and of a good conscience, and of faith unfeigned..." 1 Timothy 1:5.

As we seek the Lord in prayer and study His word we find there is a never-ending supply of oil for our lamps if we earnestly strive to apply His word to our lives.

Kim Yates' dream: She saw Jesus. She thought, "Oh so that's what You look like." He held His hand out to her and she saw the prints of the nails in His hands. She asked the Lord what meaning it had for her life. She was given to know that it was just given for her peace. He saw her need. It was so sweet and uplifting to Kim.

A postle Don McIndoo's experience: Years ago Brother McIndoo was coming up the hill toward the Temple Lot, and praying about the work. He got a feeling of expectation. His heart was filled with the knowledge that one day, here on this spot, there would be a glorious encounter.

Some time after this he was preparing for the Navajo fair, and thinking of the booth they would be setting up, asked a sister to paint a picture of Jesus standing with hands extended toward some Navajo people. At the fair, this picture was displayed as a backdrop for the booth, with the caption, "...as many of the house of Israel as should come, that they may build a city, which shall be called the New Jerusalem" (III Nephi 10:2).

A young Navajo man came up to the booth. He was attracted to the picture and caption. He asked if we really believed that this would happen. He told of his experience in Independence. He had come to Independence on vacation. He saw a lot of Restoration sites. He drove up the same hill, referred to earlier, coming toward the Temple Lot. All of a sudden he could see a shaft of light coming out of heaven. He prayed. Later he dreamed that he was walking on this spot of ground. It was different. All the buildings were gone, swept clean. But he knew where he was. And he was walking behind the Saviour. The Saviour turned and pointed and said that He had to cleanse it.

John Case's vision on Sacrament Sunday of Conference: He saw a nice piece of cloth held in place in air, but he could not tell what held it. He had a real close view of it. He saw there were flaws. Thick pieces of thread all over were in agitation down to the fiber level—tearing and rearranging. When the agitation was finished, he saw the whole piece become smooth and as beautiful as any linen. The threads were all even, smooth, strong, and beautiful. There was one more process to be performed. It was now dim and it had to be cleansed. He was given to know that this represented the Church.

John Gill's testimonies: A Honduran, Miguel, had taken poison. He turned white and went limp as he was being taken to the hospital. In the hospital his heartbeat went to zero. Apostle Don McIndoo and Elder Ken Oar administered to him. Miguel opened his eyes and spoke. He lives today.

Lionel, who has visited here when he had an operation on his feet, deformed from birth, is a faithful member in Honduras. He is now a teacher and has a wife and two children. He and his wife were having marital difficulties. At one point his wife locked herself in their bedroom and wouldn't let him in the house. Everyone knew what was happening. There in Honduras this is unheard of. Lionel asked John to pray for them. Now they have a strong marriage and are strong members.

Lionel has had many trials. His mother tried to abort him twice, and when he was born she tried to drown him. We should cry for people struggling in sin. That is the kind of love we should have, not judging, but broken. If we have this we will grow without bounds. Pray for us.

There is an old couple in Honduras who are very poor. The Church gives them support by helping them with provisions. One time the man got sick. John came and prayed for him. While they were visiting, the man said, "My swelling is gone." He was healed.

Ken Oar's Dream & Testimony

Dream: He was walking towards the Church in Phoenix. All around was great destruction. There were huge holes in the ground. He knew it was the end. He saw his brothers and sisters of the Church in these holes. They weren't doing anything wrong. But they were oblivious to what was going on around them.

Testimony: For years, not a day went by that he didn't have alcohol. The Lord touched Him. He had to give up all his friends. He had to do things differently so that he would not be tempted above that which he could bear.

Elder Nicholas Denham: "The Lord wants to protect us as a chicken protects her chicks. The world will explode again one of these days. I hope we will be prepared. He has made a place for us to gather. I hope you will give consideration to it."

Bruce Haines: He and his family went to the R.L.D.S. auditorium to look for some books to buy. He saw all kinds of worldliness. He wanted to go back to the Church of Christ building. When he stepped on the Temple Lot grass, he had a wonderful feeling. "This is the place that we are to be. We are not perfect. But this is Christ's church. We should humble ourselves and seek the leading of His holy spirit and desire to be obedient. Great things are ahead for this Church of Christ."

Placido Matu Yam: He administered to a baby boy at 2 A.M. The child was almost dead. After administration, the child was healed. The most important thing is that we agree with the Lord.

It is difficult for him to translate from English to Spanish. He receives a blessing when he translates for one who preaches. He can say all the words without thinking a lot about it. He needs to pray, especially if the one who preaches speaks fast. He has faith that the Lord will guide the preacher by the Spirit.

Significant Thoughts from the Sermons:

- Christ will come to set up a kingdom of righteousness where He will gather all of His people with the host of heaven to dwell on earth for a thousand years, the Millennial reign. It is not too far distant when this will literally be fulfilled. They will be gathered on the terms of the purity of the gospel of Christ and be one with Him as He is one with the Father.
- We must be prepared and looking for Him.
- There will be a separation of the righteous from the wicked such as: At the time of Noah; when Jared, his brother and families came to this land; when Abraham was brought to a Choice Land; when Lehi was brought to the Land of Promise.

SCRIPTURE: "Come ye, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the bouse of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem" lsaiah 2:3. The mountain is the United States government.

- Zion, or the New Jerusalem will be in America, in Independence, Missouri. We wouldn't be here and have the Temple Lot if it weren't for the revelation that came through Joseph Smith pointing out the spot for the Temple, and the revelation received by Granville Hedrick in 1864 to gather to Independence, Missouri, and as a result, the faithful Saints coming here in 1867.
- Matthew 25:32-46 says there will be a separation of the "sheep" from the "goats." There are three classes of people: The "sheep," the "goats," and the "brethren."
- If you are not a part of the body of Christ when He comes, you will not be in Zion.
- Babylon must fall. Come out of the world.
- Revelations of the Redemption of Zion. Elder White's vision: It must come by power. There was a bright red ring that enlarged the borders of Zion by judgment. What degree of perfection do we need? There must be no deceit in our hearts. Those who will not stay are those who have not forgiveness in their heart and who do not speak the truth.

Elder Winegar's vision: There will be great

judgment poured out on the city of Independence. The Saints will gather at the Temple Lot. An apostle will tell them to go home and rest and then come back, but tell no one. The Lord will bring whom He will.

Apostle Archie Bell's dream: There will be a canopy (Zion) of safety for the Saints while the destruction takes place. The Saints are told not to look at the destruction.

The wedding feast of Matthew 22 tells us we must be cleansed and righteous to be invited to the Feast, (when Christ returns).

Scriptures: Revelations 14:6-7, Psalm 24:3-5.

- Trust in the Lord with all your heart.
- Don't worry too much about material things. The Lord is in control. Trust in Him as you would your earthly father.
- Walk by faith not by sight, II Corinthians 5:7.
- The Lord will give us what we need if we hearken to Him. If we do not get what we ask for, there may be something we need to change.

Scriptures: Proverbs 3:5-6, II Nephi 6:11, Matthew 5:16, Deuteronomy 11:92, Philippians 4:13.

- Move out in faith, believing. God will supply.
- Do not be over zealous.
- In the Last Days will come the "Day of the Lord" when He will pour out His wrath on the wicked.
- MA story told by Apostle B. C. Flint: In the horse and buggy days, a wealthy man who lived in the mountains and had a young daughter going to school in the valley. He wanted to hire a driver to take his daughter to school. There was a treacherous curve by a drop of several feet. He had an interview with three drivers, asking each one, "How close can you come to the edge without going over?" Two of the ones interviewed for the position claimed they could come very close without going over the edge. The third man said he was going to stay away as far as possible from the edge of that curve and as close as possible to the inside of the curve. This man was hired. The lesson: Do we want to do the minimum? Do all that we can do.
- Pay your tithing and do the weightier matter of the law—judgment, mercy, and faith. Matthew 23:23.
- Who may abide the day of His coming? Will a man rob God? ... Ye have robbed me... in tithes and offerings... a book of remembrance was written before him for them that feared the Lord, and that thought upon his name. III Nephi 11:2-20.
- If a man gives a gift grudgingly, he is counted evil before God. An evil man can do no good. Moroni 7:4-8.
- If you do not have faith in Christ you cannot be

numbered among His people. Moroni 7:44.

- You cannot have faith unless you have hope. You can have neither unless you are meek and lowly of heart, and the meek and lowly of heart are the only acceptable before God. Without charity we are nothing. Moroni 7:46-50.
- We must forgive others, have a broken heart and contrite spirit, be humble and submissive as a little child, repentant of sin, give thanks for what He has done for us.

Scriptures: Matthew 19:16, Alma 16:222, Isaiah 58.

- Have you considered who we are? We are chosen out of this world to be part of the kingdom. There is a lot of responsibility that goes with choosing.
- Christ told the whole plan of salvation in 11 verses.
- When Christ came He told the Nephites after His crucifixion, and after the destruction, that they were spared because they were the more righteous.
- Become as a little child.
- Put away the lust of the flesh and become as a Saint.
- Be willing to submit to the Father. Do it, not because it's easy or comfortable but because it is right.
- We must be humble to receive all the blessings of God.
- Put the needs of others above our own.
- Be patient with others in their weaknesses. Be calm, patient, and understanding.
- Be constant and unwavering, capable of calmly waiting the outcome of what we are told.
- Be constantly aware of the great love the Lord has for us. Don't complain. Be long-suffering.
- The greatest tool Satan has is our minds, our memory, in remembering our sins and mistakes to make us discouraged. The Lord forgives and forgets. Let go. This is faith.
- Prayer is only half the equation. Stay until you get an answer. Learn how the Lord speaks to you. Then you can be confident that it's the Lord speaking. Pray that you will understand when He replies by the impress of the spirit.
