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
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

Our High Calling (A PECULIAR TREASURE UNTO THE LORD)

"Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine: And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel. And Moses came and called for the elders of the people, and laid before their faces all these words which the Lord commanded him. And all the people answered together, and said, All that the Lord hath spoken we will do. And Moses returned the words of the people unto the Lord" (Exodus 19:5-8).

blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works" (Titus 2:11-14).

"But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light; Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy. Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, *abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul*" (1 Peter 2:9-11).

In the first two scriptures the word was directed to the children of Israel. They had been chosen out of the world to be a peculiar people unto the Lord, set apart from all other nations. The latter two scriptures are directed to the Christian church established by Christ. These were a people called out of the world, also to be a peculiar people unto God.

Consider the contrast between Abraham and Eli. Abraham was chosen because God knew he would command his children and his household after him. Eli and his household was rejected because he failed to command his sons to righteousness.

The warning today is for us to separate ourselves from the wicked, to come out of Babylon, and to not touch any unclean thing. It is the responsibility of parents to keep themselves unspotted from the world, and to bring

up their children in the admonition and nurture of the Lord.

We are also told to,

"Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world. the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever" (1 John 2:15-17).

We live in a very difficult time. Wickedness abounds on every hand. Materially we have everything that can be

imagined, but we have suffered spiritually as a consequence. We have televisions and computers with Internet access where, with just a push of a button, or the click of the mouse, we can view the vilest of material, things which in former times one had to go out of the way to obtain. And we can do this in the privacy of our homes. The scriptures instruct us to "...have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret" (Ephesians 5:11-12).

"Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God" (1 Corinthians 6:9-10).

What is worse: personally partaking of evil, or watching it vicariously on the screen? As a man thinketh, the scriptures tell us, so is he. If we fill our minds with evil, our minds will become evil. Rather, we are admonished to look for the beautiful and think on the good. In Isaiah we read,

"The sinners in Zion are afraid; fearfulness hath surprised the hypocrites. Who among us shall dwell with the devouring fire? who among us shall dwell with everlasting burnings? He that walketh righteously, and speaketh uprightly; he that despiseth the gain of oppressions, that shaketh his hands from holding of bribes. that stoppeth his ears from hearing of blood, and shutteth his eyes from seeing evil" (Isaiah 33:14-15).

If we want to escape the judgments to come we need to be watchful what we take pleasure in, whether by design, or carelessly. So much that we see on television. movies, or on videos are evil and fit the description above. They are not at all edifying to the soul, even though they may be considered entertain-The time could be ment. more profitably spent studying the scriptures or doing good works.

The Psalmist wrote, "who shall stand in his holy place?" He answers by saying, "He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart" (Psalm 24:3-4).

are these; Adultery, fornication. uncleanness. lasciviousness, Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God" (Galatians 5:19-21).

Television and the Internet are not the only offenders. There are also magazines, books, filthy music, casinos, and questionable entertainment of all kinds. We have become lovers of pleasure, though, hopefully, not more than lovers of God. The young are particularly vulnerable to the influences and temptations of the society in which we live. It is for these I am especially concerned. In how many ways do we emulate the world? How much are we in the world but yet not of it? Are we truly seeking first the kingdom of God? Alma and Ammon could not bear the thought of any soul perishing in hell. Where do we stand in this work of the gospel?

As to the world's dress, we have this from the scriptures,

"In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array, But (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works" (1 Timothy 2:9-10).

There must be a reason for this admonition about modest apparel. Immodest dress causes many men, inadvertently, to lust. The scriptural injunction addressed to men is, "That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart" (Matthew 5:28). Immodest or skimpy attire makes this task doubly the more difficult for men, a thing unfair to them, and inconsiderate of those women thus sporting themselves.

While it is unavoidable out in the world, it is truly out of place in the church. It severely detracts from the spirituality of our meetings while distracting those around them from full attention to the Spirit. Paul acted charitably to the weaknesses of men lest he should be the cause of their sinning, when he said, "Wherefore, if meat make my brother to offend. I will eat no flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend" (1 Corinthians 8:13).

"There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, *who walk not after the flesh*, but after the Spirit" (Romans 8:1).

"For they that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but

they that are after the Spirit the things of the Spirit...So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God...But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you...And if Christ be in you, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness...For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live (Romans 8:5, 8-9, 10, 13).


Earlier Paul said, "For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing" (Romans 7:18).

The Book of Mormon says that it is the flesh which gives the spirit of the devil power to captivate and bring one down to hell.

Again exclaims Paul, "O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?" (Romans 7:24).

Nephi also expresses like sentiments, "O wretched man that I am; yea, my heart sorroweth because of my flesh" (2 Nephi 2:31).

Today the spirit of adultery and fornication is a very strong one. The world is overcome with this spirit. It is difficult for the young to resist when everything about them is screaming for its acceptance. Thus we must be



more vigilant than ever before. We live in a different world from that which I grew up in during the 40s and 50s. It is a time when wicked men and seducers have waxed worse and worse. It is also a time when the love of many has waxed cold. All have become hardened. "As it is written. There is none righteous. no, not one" (Romans 3:10). Says Jeremiah, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?" (Jeremiah 17:9).

It is a terrible time for kids to grow up. Our young people are in critical need. The world has come into the church to a degree which is alarming to the extreme. The church should be a safe sanctuary where one can meet with the Lord without worldly distractions. We once had a spiritual admonition through one of our elders (now an apostle) warning us about what spirits we bring with us into the church. That was many years ago. Yet today, that admonition is more true than ever before. We need to take a more certain stand against unrighteousness in the church, and reaffirm the righteousness which is in God.

The word from the Lord is,

"Flee fornication. Every sin that a man doeth is without the body; but he that committeth fornication sinneth against his own body. What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:18-20).

"But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks. For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheri-

tance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience" (Ephesians 5:3-6).

The time for procrastination is over. The time of repentance is now, for time is short. The 6000 years of history are rapidly closing. The warning is,

"...Take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares. For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man" (Luke 21:34-36).

Thy Will Be Done

e read in Psalms 91 verses 11 and 12: "For he shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways. They shall bear thee up in their hands, lest thou dash thy foot against a stone."

I believe these words of scripture written by David, and I can see how they apply to our lives when I read the rest of Psalm 91, but as with any scripture taken out of context they can be misapplied and used incorrectly. The meaning of these two verses is not really pertinent to our study; however, the way they are misused in Matthew 4:6 is. It is a good example of taking the word of God, the truth, and applying it incorrectly. We see Jesus being tempted by Satan the second time. The first response from Jesus was, "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of I have seen names on prayer lists where literally thousands of prayers are offered up in behalf of a loved one, with much fasting and mighty prayer, and yet they were not healed. God." These words show the importance that Jesus puts on the written word. The verses that Satan quoted in Matthew 4:6 were Psalms 91:11 and 12. Satan recognizes the value of misapplying scripture, the truth, and the written word of God to deceive. Jesus shows us with his response, "It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God," that those words of truth were not used correctly. He also shows how the application of other scriptures gives us better understanding of how they must all fit together.

Some other scriptures I would like you to consider are Matthew 7:7 and 8, where Jesus tells us to, "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you; for every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him who knocketh it shall be opened." In Matthew 21:22 Jesus tells us "all things whatever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive."

In the 5th chapter of James, verses 13 thru 16, it says:

"Is any among you afflicted? Let him pray. Is any merry? Let him sing psalms. Is any sick among you? Let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed any sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray for one another, that ye may be healed. The effectual, fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

I believe with all my heart in those promises that have been given to us by Jesus and other great men of God. I have witnessed miraculous healings for myself and for others near to me. I believe that God gives us miraculous healings from time to time because of His love and His mercy.

I also know that I have praved many times for healing for a loved one and that healing was not given. I have seen many times when humble, spiritual and heartfelt prayers were offered by the Lord's ministry and the faithful followers of the Lord and vet the healings were not given. I have seen names on prayer lists where literally thousands of prayers are offered up in behalf of a loved one, with much fasting and mighty prayer, and yet they were not healed. Why?

In the 17th chapter of

Matthew we can see we are not alone with this dilemma. Verses 14 thru 21:

We must also recognize that miracles don't just happen to us, or for us, because of our profession of Christ as our Savior, or necessarily our righteousness or the righteousness of others.

"...And when they were come to the multitude, there came to him a certain man, kneeling down to him, and saying, Lord, have mercy on my son; for he is lunatic (epileptic), and sore (greatly) vexed: for offtimes he falleth into the fire, and ofttimes into the water. And I brought him to thy disciples, and they could not cure him. Then Jesus answered and said. Oh faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I suffer you?

Bring him here to me. And Jesus rebuked the devil, and he departed out of him; and the child was cured from that very hour. Then came the disciples to Jesus apart, (privately) and said, why could not we cast him out? And Jesus said unto them, Because of your unbelief; for verily I say unto you, if ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, remove from here to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible to you. Howbeit, this kind goeth not out but by praver and fasting."

In 3rd Nephi 4:2 we read, "And there was not any man who could do a miracle in the name of Jesus, save he were cleansed every whit from his iniquity." We can read in Alma 8:33, "But it is by the prayers of the righteous that ye are spared...."

In these few verses we can see our prayers must be fervent, we must be righteous, we must fast, we must have great faith, we must call for the elders of the church and they will pray over us and anoint us with oil, they must be cleansed from their iniquity also, we must ask forgiveness for our sins, we must confess our faults to God and to one another, we must pray for one another for healing, we must not doubt, we must ask, we must seek, and we must knock. In Philippians 4:6 Paul tells us to "let your requests be known unto God."

I remember a story in the *Guideposts* booklet called Angels on Earth. A young man was in a very serious auto accident. He said he remembers leaving his body three times and three times he was told to go back because his family was praying and God would heal him. His miracle took several years but he was healed.

We must also recognize that miracles don't just happen to us, or for us, because of our profession of Christ as our Savior, or necessarily our righteousness or the righteousness of others.

In Matthew 7:21-23 we read some more words of Jesus:

"Not every one that sayeth unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my father, who is in heaven. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? And in thy name have cast out devils? And in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto

them, I never knew you; depart from me ye that work iniquity."

There are many more scriptures we need to learn or study to understand why God doesn't give us what we want all the time. Let's look at a few more.

In 2nd Corinthians 12:7-10 the apostle Paul says:

"And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of revelations, there was given to me a thorn in the

flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure. For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. And he said unto me "My grace is sufficient for thee; for my strength is made perfect in weakness." Most gladly, therefore, will I rather glory in my infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake; for when I am weak then I am strong."

Here we see that the apostle Paul came to the Lord three times before he realized the Lord would rather have him weak and humble (and useable) rather than free him from his physical afflictions. Surely Paul was a righteous man and his faith was sufficient for a healing but his weakness was to be a constant reminder. It was his "cross to bear."

Matthew 16:24-27 says:

"Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me. For whosever will save his life shall lose it; and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it. For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul? For the son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and then he shall reward every man according to his works."

I think the Lord is trying to tell us we concern ourselves with the physical or temporal things of this world more than we should. (See Matthew 6:19-34.) And we don't consider the spiritual things as much as we should, or as much as God would like us to. I know that is a hard thing for people to accept. When you see someone you love dearly suffering or dying vou don't want that to be God's will. I WANT MY WILL TO BE DONE!!!!!!!! and then I think about the examples that Jesus showed to us in the few short years He had on this earth. Every aspect of His life was an example for us. In Matthew 6:9 he taught us how to pray. "Our Father, who art in heaven. Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. THY WILL BE DONE!!!" Picture Jesus in the garden praying before the soldiers came to take him away. The agony He must have been in, knowing what was going to happen to Him, and knowing the despair His followers must endure for the next

three days before His resurrection. In His prayer, as recorded in Matthew 26:39, He said, "O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt." ("THY WILL BE DONE.") Can you see what would have happened if Jesus had said, "My will be done?" There would have been no atonement for our sins.

Do you remember those two men that were crucified with Jesus, one on either side of him? One mocked Him, and one said, "Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. Jesus said, "Verily I say unto thee, Today shalt thou be with me in paradise." He could have helped the thief to be freed from his crime or freed from his sin. Jesus chose a spiritual blessing rather than a temporal blessing for the thief, and a spiritual blessing for us rather than a temporal blessing for Himself.

He suffered and died for you and for me, to take upon Himself the sins of the world so that we may have eternal salvation from the pain and suffering and evils of this temporal world that we must sometimes endure, and have eternal life with God and with our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Paul says in 2nd Timothy 2:5, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

Jesus says, "It is written." It is our responsibility to know what is written, and God's promise to give us understanding if we diligently and humbly seek spiritual understanding of those things we read.



/ y story begins many years ago. I was just a young girl. I went to Sunday school and studied about Jesus and believed in Him and His teachings. I was born and raised in a rural community near Houston, Missouri. My parents were dutiful, faithful. and sincere in their religion. I remember talks my mother gave my older sister. She said, "Kneel each night by your bed and ask God to keep you from the evil of the world." These words were implanted in my heart and were helpful to me in younger years. She wrote in our family Bible: "Anna, read this book and be a good girl." This has had a great influence in my life. I lost my mother when I was eleven vears old. Only those who have been through this know how hard it was. Ours was a very close family.

While I was in high school I was not ashamed to tell my friends that I did not want to do any of the things

I thought I could not invite Christ to share. It did not matter to me that because I did not attend many of the popular get-togethers some were not my friends. There were those who liked me for what I was and I felt no need to worry. Living for Christ was more important to me than total social acceptance. The admonition of my mother still lingered. I'm sure God in His wisdom prepared me for life without her.

I attended a Union Sunday school. In it were many wonderful people. At fourteen I was "saved," and was baptized and joined my family's church.

Later I taught classes in Sunday school, served in many ways, and studied my Bible. The power of the gospel did not seem to be a part of the lives of my associates. I was married and two years later our first child, Alzada, came. Then Ireatess, Mary Jane and Florence Marie. How I loved those little ones He had loaned and placed in my care! How helpless I felt in the early family years without a mother to turn to.

I realized more and more my responsibility in rearing my children to be God-loving and fearing. I turned to God in prayer and continued to search the scriptures. 

The Lord Has Watched Over Me

I would like to share a testimony with you about the beginning of my life. When I was about two months old, there was fluid found at the base of my brain and it was causing me to have seizures. I don't know exactly what the doctors did to treat it but I know that the Lord blessed me and made me well.

A few months later, my parents were told that I had polyps growing at the base of my vocal cords and they needed to be removed through laser surgery. My mom asked my grandpa, the late Apostle Jensen, to administer to me. I had the surgery and everything was fine until a few months later when they started to grow again. That went on for about five years. I have had over 20 operations dealing with that problem, and I remember going in for shots every day for a period of time after each surgery.

One of the problems I had during that particular time was that I wasn't able to cry because of the polyps. My mom says

that she could hear my cradle rattle when I would try to cry or when I needed something. After the surgeries, when I could cry and be heard again, she said that my cradle couldn't be heard anymore.

When I was about three they thought that everything was back to normal, but when I was four or five the polyps had started to grow again. Since nobody knew about it, there was nothing that could be done. One night when my mom came home from work and everyone was asleep, she says that she had a feeling that she needed to check on me. When she did, she found me holding my throat with my hands. I had been suffocating because the polyps had grown so much that they had blocked my airway so I couldn't breathe. My mom called an ambulance and I was later life-flighted to a hospital.

I am thankful to the Lord that He has spared my life many times. I realized all of the consequences that I could have faced, such as having my voice box removed. But I know that the Lord has watched over me. I am extremely thankful, and I also believe strongly in the power of administration.




