



"Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh" (Matthew 25:13).

"So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, even at the doors" (Matthew 24:33).

"And take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon vou unawares. For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man" (Luke 21:34-36).

There are two great signs and a number of lesser ones which pinpoint the day in which we live. We are not left in doubt concerning these matters. The Lord spoke to the Pharisees and Sadducees as follows:

"When it is evening, ye say, It will be fair weather: for the sky is red. And in the morning, It will be foul weather to day: for the sky is red and lowring. O ye hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky; but can ye not discern the signs of

the times?" (Matthew 16:2-3).

And so it is with us today.

# THE TWO GREAT SIGNS

# The First:

"And as it was in the days of Noe, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man. They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all. Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they did eat, they drank, they bought, they sold, they planted, they builded; But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed them all. Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed" (Luke 17:26-30).

Other than eating, drinking, and giving in marriage, etc., how was it in the days of Noah and Lot? Gen 6:11 says, "The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence." This was the condition that existed in the days of Noah. In the days of Lot it was rampant homosexuality. Christ is telling us that when these two conditions exist

again as they do today, it would be a sign that His coming is near. In fact, these signs are now speaking to us in thundertones.

# The Second:

Both Matthew 24 and Luke 21 speak of tumultuous events occurring in the end times. Concerning Jerusalem he says, "Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled" (Luke 21:24). After likening these events to the fig tree signifying the close approach of summer or the imminence of the kingdom of God he says, "Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass away, till all be fulfilled" (Luke 21:32), speaking of the generation when these things were to come to pass. The trodding down of Jerusalem ended in 1948 with the creation of the state of Israel, the Jews once again regaining sovereignty over their own land after more than 2000 vears of Gentile rule.

Shall we remain forgetful of these things? Do we not realize how close we are to the conclusion of the matter? We urgently need to awaken from our slumber and begin to prepare for the return of our Lord and Saviour, lest we be found not to be ready, nor have the oil we must have in our lamps if we desire at all to

enter in. Must we wait until the midnight cry before we begin our preparation for our Master's return? According to a spiritual dream had by our late Apostle E. Leon Yates in 1957, it was then 5 minutes to midnight. Only a few seconds must remain before that cry.

Our responsibility is, perhaps, threefold. The **first** is that we need to awaken to our situation lest we be caught both unaware and unprepared.

Paul gives warning as follows:

"For yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night. For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape. But ye, brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief. Ye are all the children of light, and the children of the day: we are not of the night, nor of darkness. Therefore let us not sleep, as do others; but let us watch and be sober" (1 Thess. 5:2-6).

The **second** is that we need to depart from evil. Included in this is the instruction to:

"Flee out of the midst of

Babylon, and deliver every man his soul: be not cut off in her iniquity; for this is the time of the Lord's

vengeance; he will render unto her a recompence" (Jer. 51:6).

"And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues" (Rev. 18:4).

"Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you" (2 Cor. 6:17).

The **third** is that we are responsible for taking the gospel to all the world in ful-

fillment of the scriptural prophecy found in Matthew 24:14:

"And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come."

But what will likely happen? We know that, no matter how one may look at it, six thousands years of history are practically concluded. Yet the world is continuing headlong as if there will be no end. It is true that there are some Christians who are aware of the time in which we live, but how many of us have been lulled into a false security? The scriptures declare that if we are not watching and waiting we shall find ourselves unprepared to meet the Lord, and our situation will be one of weeping and many tears of sorrow.

The Consequence if we are not ready:

"For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God? And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear?" (1 Pet. 4:17-18).

And again,

"The Son of man shall

send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity; And shall cast them into a furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth" (Matt. 13:41-42).

This purging will fulfill the scripture which says,

"And it shall come to pass, that he that is left in Zion, and he that remaineth in Jerusalem, shall be called holy, even every one that is written among the living in Jerusalem" (Isa. 4:3).

# A Word to the wise:

"Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up. Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh. Who then is a faithful and wise servant. whom his lord hath made ruler over his household, to give them meat in due season? Blessed is that servant, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so doing. Verily I say unto you, That he shall make him ruler over all his goods. But and if that evil servant shall

say in his heart, My lord delayeth his coming; And shall begin to smite his fellowservants, and to eat and

drink with the drunken; The lord of that servant shall come in a day when he looketh not for him, and in an hour that he is not aware of, And shall cut him asunder, and appoint him his portion with the hypocrites: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Matt. 24:42-51).

Though there is woe pronounced against the sinner in Zion; there is a promise held out to the righteous in the time of trouble ahead. We find this as follows:

"The sinners in Zion are afraid; fearfulness hath surprised the hypocrites.

Who among us shall dwell with the devouring fire? who among us shall dwell with everlasting burnings? Hethatwalkethrighteously, and speaketh uprightly; he that despiseth the gain of oppressions, that shaketh his hands from holding of bribes, that stoppeth his ears from hearing of blood, and shutteth his eves from seeing evil; He shall dwell on high: his place of defence shall be the munitions of rocks: bread shall be given him; his waters shall be sure" (Isa. 33:14-16)

The early elders of the Restoration were aware of the measurement of time, for they wrote in the Times and Seasons that 6000 years would wind up the scene and usher in the return of Christ. This knowledge seems to have left the collective consciousness today. Even the early church fathers, writing in the first and second centuries of the Christian era, declared their understanding of this matter. One example follows:

"For in as many days as this world was made, in so many thousand years shall it be concluded. And for this reason the Scripture says: "Thus the heaven and the earth were finished, and all their adornment. And God brought to a conclusion upon the sixth day

the works that He had made; and God rested upon the seventh day from all His works.' This is an account of the things formerly created, as also it is a prophecy of what is to come. For the day of the Lord is as a thousand years: and in six days created things were completed: it is evident, therefore, that they will come to an end at the sixth thousand year" (Irenaeus Against Heresies, The Ante-Nicene Fathers, vol. 1, p. 557).

Question: If we knew for a certainty that approximately three years was all that remained, that sometime during that interim Christ could very well make His appearance, what changes would we make in our lives, what preparations would we make, etc.? Or would we continue as we always have? We need to think very seriously about these things for Christ will, at some point, surely come, and it is evident that we are living in both the last time and the last generation.

Here follows a summary of events yet remaining. It could be argued from this that 3, 5 or even 10 years is not sufficient time for all these events to take place. Nevertheless I present these to you for your consideration of those things that remain. Whatever the case, God's

word will not return unto him void and neither will He delay His coming.

# I'm Just a Mother

few months ago, when I was picking up the children at school, another mother I knew well rushed up to me. Emily was fuming with indignation.

"Do you know what you and I are?" she demanded. Before I could answer—and I didn't really have one handy—she blurted out the reason for her question.

It seemed she had just returned from renewing her driver's license at the County Clerk's office. Asked by the woman recorder to state her "occupation," Emily had hesitated, uncertain how to classify herself.

"What I mean is," explained the recorder, "do you have a job, or are you just a...?" "Of course I have a job," snapped Emily. "I'm a mother." "We don't list 'mother' as an occupation...'housewife' covers it," said the recorder emphatically.

I forgot all about her story until one day I found myself in the same situation, this time at our own Town Hall. The clerk was obviously a career woman, poised, efficient, and possessed of a high-sounding title, like "Official Interrogator" or "Town Registrar." "And what is your occupation?" she probed. What made me say it, I do not know. The words simply popped out.

"I'm a Research Associate in the field of Child Development and Human Relations."

The clerk paused, ball-point pen frozen in mid-air, and looked up as though she had not heard right. I repeated the title slowly, emphasizing the most significant words. Then I stared with wonder as my pompous pronouncement was written in bold, black ink on the official questionnaire.

"Might I ask," said the clerk with new interest, "just what you do in your field?" Coolly, without any trace of fluster in my voice, I heard myself reply, "I have a continuing program of research (what mother doesn't) in the laboratory and in the field (normally I would have said indoors and out). I'm working for my Masters (the whole darned family) and already have four credits (all daughters). Of course, the job is one of the most demanding in the humanities (any mother care

to disagree?) and I often work 14 hours a day (24 is more like it). But the job is more challenging than most run-of-the-mill careers and the rewards are in satisfaction rather than just money."

There was an increasing note of respect in the clerk's voice as she completed the form, stood up, and personally ushered me to the door. As I drove into our driveway, buoyed up by my glamorous new career, I was greeted by my lab assistants—ages 13, 7, and 3. And upstairs, I could hear our new experimental model (six months) in the child-development program, testing out a new vocal pattern.

I felt triumphant. I had scored a beat on bureaucracy. And I had gone down on the official records as someone more distinguished and indispensable to mankind than "just another..."

What a glorious career.

conversation between friends...
We are sitting at lunch, when my friend casually mentions that she and her husband are thinking of 'starting a family.'

"We're taking a survey," she says, halfjoking.
"Do you think I should have a baby?"

"It will change your life," I say, carefully keeping my tone neutral.

"I know," she says, "no more sleeping in on weekends, no more spontaneous vacations...." But that is not what I meant at all.

I look at my friend, trying to decide what to tell her. I want her to know what she will never learn in childbirth classes. I want to tell her that the physical wounds of child bearing will heal, but that becoming a mother will leave her with an emotional wound so raw that she will forever be vulnerable. I consider warning her that she will never again read a newspaper without asking, "What if that had been my child?" That every plane crash, every house fire will haunt her. That when she sees pictures of starving children, she will wonder if anything could be worse than watching your child die.



I look at her carefully manicured nails and stylish suit and think that no matter how sophisticated she is, becoming a mother will reduce her to the primitive level of a bear protecting her cub. That an urgent call of "Mom!" will cause her to drop a souffle, or her best crystal, without a moment's hesitation. I feel I should warn her that no matter how many years she has invested in her career, she will be professionally derailed by motherhood. She might arrange for childcare, but one day she will be going into an important business meeting and she will think of her baby's sweet smell. She will have to use every ounce of her discipline to keep from running home, just to make sure her baby is all right.

I want my friend to know that everyday decisions will no longer be routine. That a five year old boy's desire to go to the men's room rather than the women's at McDonald's will become a major dilemma. That right there, in the midst of clattering travs and screaming children, issues of independence and gender identity will be weighed against the prospect that a child molester may be lurking in that restroom. However decisive she may be at the office, she will second guess herself constantly as a mother.

Looking at my attractive friend, I want to assure her that eventually she will shed the pounds of pregnancy, but she will never feel the same about herself. That her life, now so important, will be of less value to her once she has a child. That she would give it up in a moment to save her offspring, but will also begin to hope for more years—not to accomplish her own dreams, but to watch her child accomplish theirs.

I want her to know that a cesarean scar or shiny stretch marks will become badges of honor. My friend's relationship with her husband will change, but not in the way she thinks. I wish she could understand how much more vou can love a man who is careful to powder the baby or who never hesitates to play with his child. I think she should know that she will fall in love with him again for reasons she would now find very unromantic.

I wish my friend could

sense the bond she will feel with women throughout history who have tried to stop war, prejudice and drunk driving.

I hope she will understand why I can think rationally about most issues, but become temporarily insane when I discuss the threat of nuclear war to my children's future. I want to describe to my friend the exhilaration of seeing your child learn to ride a bike.

I want to capture for her the belly laugh of a baby who is touching the soft fur of a dog or a cat for the first time. I want her to taste the joy that is so real, it actually hurts.

My friend's quizzical

look makes me realize that tears have formed in my eyes. "You'll never regret it," I finally say. Then I reach across the table, squeeze my friend's hand and offer a silent prayer for her, and for me, and for all of the mere mortal women who stumble their way into this most wonderful of callings—the blessed gift of God and that of being a Mother.

Please share this with a Mom that you know, or a future Mom you know.


# God Sees All Things

Dear Brothers and Sisters,
Last evening I was working at the fire department and
responded to a 5-alarm fire.
During the fire one of our firefighters was killed when he was
trapped in a collapse and ran
out of air. Numerous crews
worked for 25 minutes to bring
him out; it was a very difficult
and emotional time for all of us.
This man's name was Bret
Tarver and he was a friend of
mine, and well thought of by all
of us who knew him.

He was forty-one years old and leaves behind a wife and three girls; the oldest is ten years old. Having a daughter that is ten myself it was a very long night for me, realizing how hard this will be on his family. Please pray for this family in this time of grief and pain.

This was especially hard for us in the fire department because we have not lost a fire fighter on a fire in a number of years. Some of my station crew members were on one of the crews that were used to reach this man and were not able to get him all the way out before a collapsing roof and low air bottles made them leave him. Our

truck should have been one of the first units on scene, but for some reason we kept getting tied up on other calls and got

there late in the fire. This was an extremely dangerous fire and several crews became lost in the building and five firefighters had to be rescued. I continue to wonder why we were kept away, and realize that we would have been right in the middle of all the collapses had we responded earlier. We would have been involved in the searching

for the firefighters that were down and may have been in a position to lose our own lives. I know that God sees all things, and even though we wished we were there to help rescue our fellow brothers I must acknowledge that the Lord protected us and kept us out of harm's way, and for this I must praise him.

I know that God is always watching out for us and we have no need of fear with Him in control, yet I was awakened again to the need that I have to better prepare my life to meet my Savior. I thank him for letting me go home to my wife and kids and for another day of life to prepare for the day when I shall see my Savior face to face.

Thank you for your prayers and letting me get some thoughts off my chest.

The church of the devil, the whore of all the earth, is in all the nations, and has brought millions of Christians into captivity and caused to be put to death over 50 million Christians, and this because of riches and the praise of the world. - There are 7 identifying elements of all denominations of the world in opposition to the little flock:
- 1. - 4. A relaxed standard of morality It's coming into the Church of Christ. If it applies to you, you have aligned yourself with that opposing church.
- 5. A new viewpoint of the Book of Revelation—the rapture. The popular "Left Behind Series" is selling a lie. God has taken away the understanding. Isaiah says that Babylon was destroyed because they lived carelessly.
- 6. A spirit of rebellion No one wants to be told anything, not open-hearted and humble, not willing to accept chastisement for their soul's sake. Jeremiah spoke: "Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths, but they said, We will not walk therein...I set watchmen over you...But they said, We will not hearken," Jeremiah 6:16.
- 7. **Doctrine of the church is perverted** The Church is called by Christ's name, if they're living His doctrine, III Nephi 12:18-19. His doctrine is taught by the apostles.
- The House of Jacob will go through and tread down. The indigenous people of many Central and South American countries are bringing their governments down. It can happen here also. We're scared to talk about the Catholic Church or any other philosophy. It isn't politically correct anymore. We're at war. If you aren't aware of these things,

- then you are a potential victim.
- Nephi, in his vision, saw the mother of abominations gathered in multitudes all over the earth to fight against the Lamb of God, I Nephi 3:229. Verse 32, The wrath of God will be poured out on the great and abominable church. There are wars and rumors of war among nations that belong to her. When you see these things lift up your head and rejoice for your salvation draweth nigh. Then the work of God shall commence among His scattered people, fulfilling of His covenants. The power of the Lamb of God will be upon His Church and covenant people. They will be armed with righteousness and power of God. There is no reason to fear if our heart is right.
- God is jealous. He doesn't want His people to worship idols. Man has the disposition to lower God to man's humanness, and at the same time elevate himself. We become used to society's mockery of God and Christ. We are conforming to the attitude of the world, which is an anti-Christ viewpoint.
- Ephesians 4:11-16: He gave the priesthood in the church "...for the perfecting of the saints...That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine (change our minds)...." This is the day of deception, Matthew 24:24. We want to be the elect and not be deceived. We must know the truth. Joseph Smith was told by the Lord not to join any of the churches because their creeds are an abomination.
- There has been an explosion of knowledge in the latter days. A lot of information is available to us. Do not go to any source for the truth but the Lord. Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church, not man. In the early church Satan created an office, the Presidency. Some have said that Christ appointed Peter to be the head, which led to the Pope as "head" to the influence of false doctrine. We do not recognize His position. We need to consult the Lord in the affairs of the Church. The Lord is right. No one else is. "One Lord, one faith, one baptism...." There is only one way and one doctrine. The Church is subject unto Christ. "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No man cometh unto the Father, but by me" John 14:6.
- There must be no disputations among us, III Nephi 5:29. "Blessed are ye if ye shall give heed unto the words of these twelve which I have chosen from among you to

- minister unto you, and to be your servants" Verse 45.
- Controversies in the Church can be resolved only if the Lord makes the correction. When the disciples debated over the name of the Church, Jesus asked them why they were disputing over the name. Would He say, for example, "Why do you dispute over the Sacrament?" We don't want to talk about controversial issues for fear of offending and stirring the people up, but there will come a day when Jesus will confront His people.
- It takes faith to forgive. It takes faith to get along with each other. This gospel is simple so that even our children can understand. We must be pliable so that the Lord can use us. If we live a decent life and are prayerful, we will come to the unity of the faith. The Lord will bring this people into a oneness. Find a way that you and your brother or sister can agree. "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity" Psalm 133:1-3!
- II Peter Elders, feed the flock of God. Christ suffered persecution in His ministry. Christ calls us blessed when we are persecuted for righteousness' sake. There is persecution coming from within the Church, from our own people. Persecution causes us to grow if we don't let it overpower us. Verse 12 says that we should be glad when we are persecuted and that our reward is great. God has promised us that if we are faithful, He will give us a way to overcome persecution. It makes a better Christian or a bitter Christian. We must become stronger, more loving, kind. We are told to love our neighbor and our enemies.
- We must have unity. A kingdom divided against itself shall not stand. We can have unity through prayer and gatherings to discuss our disagreements. Let's talk about it.
   Ask God to reveal the truth.
- By love, serve one another. Differences will melt away. Set aside the attitude that, "We know all." The opposite of humility is when we think we know all the answers. Humble yourselves. Don't let Satan drive a wedge between us. Paul feared when he returned to the Corinthians that he would find debates, envyings, wraths, strifes, back-bitings, whisperings, swellings, tumults, II Corinthians 12:20. When we have unity we don't have these.
- Ephesians 4:11- God set up the Church.

- There is no other Church. We can't drag people to Church to enjoy the gospel of Jesus Christ. They must desire to come. They must desire to work toward perfection. That love is perfection.
- Ephesians 4:13 He set the ministry in the Church to perfect us, "Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ" Ephesians 4:14. People today are tossed to and fro. They don't want to be told they must come to perfection. The church is a social function where they have a good time. What is your purpose for going to Church? We go to church to worship God through song, preaching, prayer and fellowship. If it's for any other reason we are fooling ourselves.
- The Apostles are our spiritual leaders. They're not better than anyone else. But they have a job to do. Your job is to come and be fed the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Word of God.
- Psalm 24 Who shall ascend? Examine our lives to see if we qualify. We come together to be reminded and not stumble and fall into pitfalls. I have to be reminded daily. Do we love God with all of our heart, mind, and soul? Enough to sacrifice our life for the gospel of Christ? I think you would, because when I go to Conference and Reunion, you're there. I think you will stand steadfast in the face of the storm.
- The scripture says we are to be a peculiar people. Our belief in the Book of Mormon sets us apart from the churches of the world. We need to pray for those who do not know Jesus Christ and the gospel. Pray for those who ridicule us for our beliefs.
- There are always two sides to a coin. Which side is right? Ask God to reveal the truth to us.
- "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you." Examine yourself before God. Are we truly submitting ourselves to God?
- This is a serious business. What is going to happen to your soul? Where will you spend eternity? We are trying to make you consider, "Is my life right before God? To the young people. Young people can die too. Today is the day of your salvation. Today is when you need to prepare for tomorrow. All must consider, "How do I stand before

- God?" How do you conduct yourself? We need to prepare our lives. Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord and He will lift you up. **Be a doer and not hearers only**. Consider the life to come.
- A question I hear all the time, Why? Why were you created? To glorify God. He created our weaknesses (Ether 5:26) that man might be humble. If men humble themselves, the weak things become strong. Weakness is for a purpose. Why did God create the beauty of the earth and our ability to see it, a variety of foods, animals for pets, music and ears to hear?
- Revelations 4:9 John's vision of heaven. He created us for His pleasure. Everything we do should be an effort to please Him, to serve and be an example. Colossians 12:9 Redemption is through Him. By Him were all things created, and for Him. God gives us opportunity to have joy in our lives. All things of the earth pale in comparison to eternity with Him. He wants us to have joy, but it's not an excuse for bad behavior. Our joy is subject to our obedience (John 4:15).
- Ecclesiastes 12:13 "Fear God and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man." This is our whole job.
- Mosiah 1:119 "The natural man is an enemy of God." Put off the natural man. Become like a child "willing to submit to all things that the Lord seeth fit to inflict upon him." "The child is the 'natural man.' The world revolves around Me. If I'm not happy nobody is going to be happy." We spend our whole life fighting that. We weren't created for our own pleasure but to please God. The difference between the natural and spiritual man is like the difference between dogs and cats. The dog says (of humans), "Look at those things. They feed me and give me water. They let me in and out. They must be gods." The cat says, "Look at those things. They feed me and give me water. They let me in and out. I must be a god." The natural man will say, "I can't submit. What about my feelings? What about my rights?" We submit to all kinds of things in our lives, our employers, the law of the land, to our animals. We're willing to submit because we learned through experience that we will receive an immediate reward or punishment. But with God we have a different attitude, the reward or punishment might not be immediate, and might even not be in this lifetime. God is worthy to be praised.

- He hears and answers prayer. We please Him by following His commandments and being an example to all around us. He didn't create me to be a parent or to have a job. That's part of it. But He created me to please Him. As soon as we start bringing praise to ourselves, the natural man comes in. For example, in singing specials, it's hard not to let the natural man take over when someone compliments us. We might say to ourselves, "Yes, I do have a good voice." Moses in the desert let the natural man take the glory for providing the water. We have to be careful.
- Alma 16:152 compares the word to a seed. When we plant a seed we don't know if it's a good seed. Plant the Word in your heart. It continues to grow and bear fruit. Reach out and try to please God. It becomes a habit and grows. It becomes delicious to us and to God. III Nephi 12:25. He will be lifted up to draw all men unto Him. It's how we live our life.
- There are things in this world to separate us from God. We're living in a day of deception.
- We hope and pray that we are the children of God. At our baptism we told the Lord that we were going to do His will. How does God see you in your relationships? Every time you say or do something contrary to God's law, you have part in Satan.
- Matthew 4:1-10 Christ's temptation. Every day we are tempted by the devil. Every day we have to fight the devil. The devil tempted Christ to ask Him to turn the stones into bread. The devil holds out enticements to you to tempt you. This story is an example of Christ and how we can overcome temptation like Him. If we succumb to these enticements, we will be separated from God. The Book of Mormon says that temptations blind the eyes and harden the hearts of men. Be careful of temptation, even if it looks like something good. We can be enticed to miss a service for sports or other things. We say, "It's just one service. That won't hurt." Be careful of enticements that put you in debt so that you can't pay tithing. These separate you from Christ. The list could go on and on of things that entice us to do other things than what we're told to do.
- Doubt can separate us from God. III Nephi 1:38. The people forgot the signs and wonders that had been experienced. They began to harden their hearts and their

minds were blinded and they began to disbelieve. Satan led them to believe that the doctrine of Christ was foolish and vain. In the early Church they had such great faith that the Church grew and they were blessed. Then doubt entered in, doubt in the Word of God, that maybe there wasn't a Restoration. I believe that we're the only Restoration church left. Luke says, "Neither be ye of a doubtful mind." Doubt starts out small. Eventually you doubt the whole Book of Mormon. That little doubt leads to a separation from Jesus Christ. When we start to doubt a word, a phrase, we had better ask God for deliverance and guidance lest we separate ourselves from God.

- Satan has put pride in our hearts to separate us from God. The pride of man is an enemy of God. The devil uses pride because it's natural to man. The Book of Mormon says the pride of your hearts can destroy your soul.
- Alma 16:98 Do we praise God in the sanctuary and then walk out the door and never mention His name until the next time we are in church? He sees our hearts. He knows. James 4 "God resisteth the proud but giveth grace to the humble." God must have a humble, submissive people to work with so He can mold this Church. We are growing in numbers. We had 260 and more baptisms this year. For God to do more we must become less proud.
- Satan puts greed in our hearts to separate us from God. James 5:1-5 We all need money to sustain us, but we shouldn't live our lives to make money. The Book of Mormon says that if we live a Christ-like life, He will give us wealth, IF we use it for good. Psalms 112:1-3 Pray that we delight in His commandments. It is the wealth of Jesus Christ and His goodness of the Scriptures, His Holy Word, that is much more precious than silver and gold.
- The hunger for power will separate us from God. This was more evident in the early Church. The Church was organized in 1830 simply, then entered a hunger for power to rise above one another, to be someone of authority, to have the last say. Thus, the First Presidency, the office of one who has the final say and that power. There was a power struggle at the death of Joseph Smith. The church split because men wanted that power. If we hunger for power we are separating ourselves from God.

- The works of the flesh separate us from God. Galations 5:19 - "The works of the flesh...are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings...." Are any of these in the Church today? Have any of these separated us from the love of Jesus Christ? Most of these have crept in. Shame on us! It is because we have gone the way of the world to lessen our chances to come closer to God. Is it because we aren't strict enough or haven't preached enough? The world does not think these are wrong. They should be an abomination to us. It's going to be hard for us to stand before the Judgment bar. The Lord will ask, "What about the works of the flesh? We will say the world and my friends were doing it." That answer will bring punishment and damnation.
- Our conduct can separate us from God. Our attention, quietness, reverence. Many times we're doing something else instead of paying attention to that which will give eternal life. How about respect of the church building and the preacher? He sees several conversations going on and people wandering in and out. Church attendance? Do we see you only at Conference and social events? How about taking and not giving? We're like sponges. There's work to be done. There are takers and there are givers. If you're only a taker, you're separating your self from God. Mark 7:7 calls those hypocrites.
- Be a believing people, not doing those things which separate us from God. Obey His commandments and live a Christ-like life so that you can stand before His judgment seat and hear, "Well done thou good and faithful servant."
- Ephesians 6:10 "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil."

James 1: Man is not tempted of God but is drawn away of his own lust, which makes us sin. Every good gift is from the Father. "... The wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God."

Mosiah 13:34 - We are judged by the Word in the Scripture. It is not common for the voice of the people to desire that which is not right. We do business by the voice of the people for decisions concerning the affairs of the Church. The judgments of God will come with great destruction if the voice of the people choose wrong. The people of the land need to be governed by the Lord, Jesus Christ. Otherwise His judgments will come upon them.



her and her family, Janelle and Beth.


Here are a few thoughts from recent sermons you might want to consider:

Later that year the Pinder family, including twins Amanda Sue and Kelly Lynne, moved to Phoenix, Arizona. On December 15, 1990, Charles and Amy renewed their vows before the

Church of Christ with Emery Pinder, father of the groom, performing the service.

On November 9, 1993, Charles officially adopted Amanda and Kelly. He was a very good Dad and instructed the girls in the Gospel of Christ. He also stressed the importance of education and living a life in a manner that would please God. If you know these pretty young ladies, you also know that Charles and Amy have been successful in raising two bright, responsible daughters who are seeking the will of God in their lives.

After being able to purchase the house of Sister Evalena Sills, which was a great blessing, the Pinders redecorated and made a lovely home for their family. Charles enjoyed working on their home and used his skills as bricklayer, plumber, carpenter, and landscaper.

Chuck was an excellent employee and worked at various places

throughout his adulthood: Dow Chemical; Avanti Circuits; Mayo Clinic in Scottsdale, Arizona; BioTherapies in Michigan and finally for Great Western Chemical in Oregon.

He had quite a sense of humor and loved to tell jokes.

He was able to make friends easily and earn the respect of those he worked with. He was a good communicator and enjoyed visiting with people, especially his family in the Gospel of Christ.

Although he had many obstacles in his life, the Lord was often times merciful so he was the recipient of a multitude of miraculous healings. He received a kidney transplant only a week after his graduation from college, which he considered one of the mightiest of blessings bestowed by the hand of his Lord.

It was through being well versed in the word of God that Charles learned how to live a life of faith. His favorite Bible scripture was Isaiah 40:28-31:

"Hast thou not known? Hast thou not heard, that the everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? There is no searching of his understanding. He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might be increaseth strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall: But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk and not faint."

One of the Book of Mormon stories that helped inspire Chuck to increase his faith was in Ether 1:47-85.

It was by implementing the knowledge of the scriptures in his life and whole heartedly believing in the promises of the Lord that Charles was able to overcome much adversity. Like Job, when problems arose he always praised his Father in heaven for whatever blessings God chose to bestow. And most importantly, the Lord told Charles that "My grace is sufficient for you." Because of this, he was able to accept the will of God without reservation until he was called home to the paradise of God on March 29, 2001. He joyfully answered that call.
