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

"Woe to the land shadowing with wings," Isaiah 18.

The Marvelous Work and Wonder, by Daniel MacGregor, explains this land to be the continents of North and South America, with the United States of America as the land upon which verse 3 points.

"All ye inhabitants of the world, and dwellers on the earth, see ye, when he lifteth up an ensign on the mountains; and when he bloweth a trumpet, hear ye."

As we consider this na-

tion and its people we find it is truly a blessed land, with our borders open to receive all that have a desire to participate in the world's greatest experiment, that of a republic with liberty for all.

"And thus the Lord did pour out his blessings upon this land, which was choice above all other lands; and he commanded that whoso should possess the land, should possess the land, should possess it unto the Lord, or they should be destroyed when they were ripened in iniquity; for upon such, saith the Lord, I will pour out the fullness of my wrath," Ether 4:22.

Take time, each of you, to number the blessings of this, our homeland. The wealth of the waters that protect, provide transportation, food and quench our need for daily water. The fertile earth that provides not only for our own but allows us to care for the needs of others, bread to maintain life and fill the physical hunger. ground which we count as riches. With these blessings comes a responsibility; more than that, it is a sacred duty:

"...He commanded that whoso should possess the land, should possess it unto the Lord.... And he had sworn in his wrath unto the Brother of Jared, that whoso should possess this land of promise, from that time henceforth and forever, should serve him, the true and only God, or they should

be swept off when the fullness of his wrath should come upon them. And now we can behold the decrees of God concerning this land, that it is a land of promise, and whatsoever nation shall possess it, shall serve God, or they shall be swept off when the fullness of his wrath shall come upon them. And the fullness of his wrath cometh upon them when they are ripened in iniquity; for behold, this is a land which is choice above all other lands; wherefore he that doth possess it shall serve God, or shall be swept off; for it is the everlasting decree of God. And it is not until the fullness of iniquity among the children of the land, that they are swept off. And this cometh unto you, O ye Gentiles, that ye may know the decrees of God, that ye may repent, and not continue in your iniquities until the fullness come, that ye may not bring down the fullness of the wrath of God upon you, as the inhabitants of the land have hitherto done. Behold, this is a choice land, and whatsoever nation shall possess it, shall be free from bondage, and from captivity, and from all other nations under heaven, if they will but serve the God of the land, who is Jesus Christ who hath been manifested by the things which we have written" Ether 1:30-35.

Again in these verses it speaks of possessing the land by serving the true and only God. Each of us are guaranteed choice by the true God. As a nation and a people we are drifting apart from God towards iniquity. The scriptures describe this time as ripening, and God waits until a nation is fully ripe before

He lifts His protective hand. The nature of our natural man is always quick to sin and slow to remember God. These verses also name the God of the land whom we are to serve as Jesus Christ.

"And now it came to pass that when Moroni, who was the chief commander of the armies of the Nephites, had heard of these dissensions, he was angry with Amalickiah. And it came to pass that he rent his coat; and he took a piece thereof, and wrote upon it, In memory of our God, our religion, and freedom, and our peace, our wives, and our children; and he fastened it upon the end of a pole thereof. And he fastened on his head-plate, and his breastplate, and his shields, and girded on his armor about his loins; and he took the pole, which had on the end thereof his rent coat (and he called it the title of liberty), And he bowed himself to the earth, and he prayed mightily unto his God

for the blessings of liberty to rest upon his brethren so long as there should be a band of Christians remain to possess the land; For thus were all the true believers of Christ, who belonged to the church of God, called, by those who did not belong to the church; and those who did belong to the church, were faithful; Yea, all those who were the true believers in Christ, took upon them, gladly, the name of Christ, or Christians, as they were called, because of their belief in Christ, who should come; and therefore, at this time, Moroni prayed that the cause of the Christians, and the freedom of the land might be favored" Alma 21:40-45.

As the events of September 11, 2001, played out, each of us were witness to the disbelief, shock, sorrow, fear and loss of individuals—as a people and a nation. As the flag of our nation was displayed with pride and with the warmth of love instead of disdain and reproach I remembered this passage:

"And it came to pass that he rent his coat; and he took a piece thereof, and wrote upon it, In memory of our God, our religion, and freedom, and our peace, our wives, and our children; and he fastened it upon the end of a pole thereof... (and he called it the title of liberty)" vs 41, 42.

R e p r e s e n t a t i v e Gephardt from the state of Missouri said: "Terrorists believe liberty is our weakness; it is our strength!"

"Thus saith the Lord God: It shall also come to pass, that at the same time shall things come into thy mind, and thou shalt think an evil thought: And thou shalt say, I will go up to the land of unwalled villages; I will go to them that are at rest, that dwell safely, all of them dwelling without walls, and having neither bars nor gates, To take a spoil, and to take a prey; to turn thine hand upon the desolate places that are now inhabited, and upon the people that are gathered out of the nations, which have gotten cattle and goods, that dwell in the midst of the land" Ezekiel 38:10-12.

This evil thought has been the subject of many sermons and classes. The ones I have attended usually concluded that the evil thought would be some sort of armed invasion-an army, if you will, invading the land of unwalled villages, to them that dwell safely, having neither bars nor gates. The terrorists certainly had an evil thought! Did they succeed in taking away our liberty? If liberty is our freedom of movement, then yes! If liberty is taking for granted the blessings of this land, then once again yes! If liberty is only for self and not considering or helping another's struggle through and for life, then yes, they (the terrorists who had an evil thought) removed all these from our lives

IF LIBERTY is the title

of liberty as Moroni hoisted ("In memory of our God, our religion, and freedom, and our peace, our wives, and our children") then the answer is

NO, they did not take away these liberties, but instead caused each of us to REMEM-BER the Lord.

Yes, how quick we are to do iniquity, and how slow to remember the Lord God.

How do we POSSESS THE LAND? Do we point the finger and make accusation. or should we instead bend the knee? Remember when Y2K was the fear and concern in all our lives? Everyone had opinions but no one had the answer. In answer to the Body of Christ and our own questions the Council of Apostles met to seek the Lord and ask His divine direction. I remember as we knelt thinking to myself, "What if He does not answer?" This was not doubt in what we were about to ask or doubt in Whom we were asking or His ability to answer. It was a

fear, reverence and love rolled into one about approaching God for an answer that no man held. After a season of prayer we rose and one member relayed to us a scripture and verse which had been given him, but not the knowledge of the content of that verse. We read Matthew 6:33:

"But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."

That was our answer then, and I am confident this is how we are to possess the land, seeking first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, not the pointing of fingers. We are to seek on bended knee in fear and love.

How do we POSSESS THE LAND? Does being a member of the Church of Christ entitle us to the possession of this land?

"And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these" Mark 12:30-31.

We are to possess the land in all meekness and humility, loving God with all we are and hope to be in Jesus Christ. Then comes the hard part: we are to love others as

Jesus loves you and I. How do we POSSESS THE LAND?

"Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. Wherefore take unto vou the whole armour of God. that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints ... " Ephesians 6:10-18.

We wrestle, according to the scriptures, not against flesh and blood. We are to use all just and lawful means (including arms) to resist the wrongs in this world—our strength! To be fully armored we must put on the armor of God, the WHOLE armor of God! The scripture says having done all, to stand, and that is the measure of faith—to stand!

We are to possess the land in all meekness and humility, loving God with all we are and hope to be in Jesus Christ.

"Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God. Whosoever therefore resisteth the power. resisteth the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to the evil. Wilt thou then not be afraid of the power? do that which is good, and thou shalt have praise of the same: For he is the minister of God to thee for good. But if thou do that which is evil, be afraid: for he beareth not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon him that doeth evil. Wherefore ye must needs be subject, not only for wrath, but also for conscience sake. For for this cause pay ye tribute also: for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing" Romans 13:1-6.

Our President has stated


we are engaged in a struggle of good against evil and "good will prevail." He has further stated we will bring evil men to justice or take justice to evil men.

SERMON

Caught, Up, In, PROPHECY

y last evening in Yucatan, Sunday. March 11th, found me announced as the speaker at the anniversary service for the dedication of the church in Uayalceh (in Maya, "the place where the deer drink"). Sitting at the front of the church, watching the young congregation as they listened to their pastor, I was suddenly overtaken by the Holy Spirit. The knowledge was borne in upon my heart that there were important, basic principles of which, through my negligence, these young believers were not yet fully aware. In that moment, overcome by emotion, I dedicated myself to the task of developing lessons that would bring to them the basic, and fundamental, teachings of the Restored Gospel.

The first of those lessons was a three-day study about Book of Mormon prophecies (three pages of them) that relate specifically to the indigenous people of America. The lessons included evidences of the fulfillment of those prophecies that had already come to pass, and oh, how these young people reveled in the learning and understanding of these meaningful messages! Today I would ask you, "Are you caught up in, do you revel in those prophecies of the Book of Mormon that relate to God's promises to the Gentile peoples of this land?" I would review a few of them:

"...It is wisdom that this land should be kept as yet from the knowledge of other nations..." (2 Nephi 1:16).

As you think of the warravaged nations of Europe, Asia and Africa, doesn't your heart rejoice at the strategic placement of this America to which the Lord guided our forefathers?

"Wherefore the promises of the Lord are great unto the Gentiles, for he hath spoken it, and who can dispute? But behold, this land, saith God, shall be a land of thine inheri-

tance; and the Gentiles shall be blessed upon the land. And this land shall be a land of liberty unto the Gentiles: and there shall be no kings upon the land, who shall raise up unto the Gentiles. And I will fortify this land against all other nations..." (2 Nephi 7:16-19).

The pages of our American history are filled with ample evidences of the veracity of this promise of God to America and her people.

These are the blessings our fathers have known, and they have been passed on to us. So accustomed are we to these marvelous blessings of God, we have come to take them for granted—that is, *until the eleventh of September.* A new world dawned over America's shores that fateful morning. Now Americans everywhere are wondering—will our children and grandchildren be able to enjoy these precious gifts that have so long been ours?

As one analyzes the pages of the Book of Mormon. it becomes evident that God's promises to, and covenants with, the people of America contain so many facets and intricacies that a careless and indifferent people would find themselves in a dangerous position. The fear gripping every element of our society today demonstrates that we recognize this is now our position. An important point for us to consider is that only a small minority of our population is even aware of these prophetic words of God.

So, by the same token, an observant, concerned and obedient people would find themselves greatly challenged by these prophecies. I propose that believers in the Book of Mormon now find themselves in the unenviable role of a Prophet Jeremiah, an Abinadi or a Samuel. Why these three? Each of them were moved by the Holy Spirit to proclaim the words of the Lord to an indifferent people who had no desire to hear them. What words does America need to hear? I shall quote but two vitally important passages:

"Therefore, wo, be unto the Gentiles, if it so be that they harden their hearts against the

Lamb of God: For the time cometh, saith the Lamb of God, that I will work a great and a marvelous work among the children of men: A work which shall be everlasting, either on the one hand or on the other: either to the convincing of them unto peace and life eternal, or unto the deliverance of them to the hardness of their hearts and the blindness of their minds. their unto being brought down into captivity and also unto destruction, both temporally and spiritually, according to the captivity of the devil, of which I have spoken" (1 Nephi 3:213 - 216).

This great and marvel-

ous work is none other than the coming forth of the Book of Mormon and the Restoration of the Church of Christ, both of which have been largely ignored or vilified by America's majority. Has America's rejection of this great work played a role in the terrible destruction that has come upon her? It appears undeniable to me!

"And now we can behold the decrees of God concerning this land, that it is a land of promise, and whatsoever nation shall possess it, shall serve God, or they shall be swept off when the fullness of his wrath shall come upon them. And this cometh unto you, O ye Gentiles, that ye may know the decrees of God, that ye may repent, and not continue in your iniquities until the fullness come, that ye may not bring down the fullness of the wrath of God upon you, as the inhabitants of the land have hitherto done. Behold, this is a choice land, and whatsoever nation shall possess it, shall be free from bondage, and from captivity, and from all other nations under heaven, if they will but serve the God of the land, who is Jesus Christ..." (Ether 1:31, 34, 35).

The iniquities of America to which this passage refers were enumerated by none other than Jesus Christ, and

...The people of America must serve Jesus Christ: He must be made Lord of this land.

are found in 3 Nephi 7:34. The list includes the following:

- Rejection of the fullness of the Gospel.
- Being lifted up in pride over all the nations of the world.
- A nation caught up in lying and deceit.
- A ministry engaged in priestcraft.
- An abundance of murders.
- Whoredoms.

As we analyze the meaning of these various categories, it is like reading the headlines of our daily papers. And woe be to the politician or minister who speaks out against them in specific, recognizable terms. Shall we be quiet, shall we apologize for frankness, as did one popular minister, or shall we be a Jeremiah, an Abinadi? Of all the points raised by Moroni in this passage from Ether, the one that most stands out is that the people of America must serve Jesus Christ: He must be made Lord of this land.

In this perilous time when we should be turning to Him with all our hearts. I am filled with concern as I feel the pulse of America's religious thought. In August of this year there appeared two "headlined" invitations in our local newspaper to come hear a famous Buddhist teacher explain their teachings. And where was to be his podium? In the local Anglican Church. On October 1st, the following headline appeared in our paper:

"Valley Church Explores Other Faiths in Wake of Terror"

"Rather than hear another sermon on strengthening their own Christian beliefs, members of Christ's Church of the Valley heard from a Sikh, a Mormon and a Muslim on Sunday."

A number of interesting thoughts come to mind as I read these words but the words of the article itself make my main point. I also grow concerned as I hear our political and religious leaders encourage America to respect and extol Islam, Sikhism, Buddhism and

other anti-Christ religions, with never a mention of returning to our own religious roots. Just as the great American principle of "separation of church and state" has been misapplied as a bias against religion in general, another great American principle, "freedom of religion," is seemingly being transformed into a bias against Christianity.

America has been caught up in prophecy! Not only prophecy found in the Book of Mormon, but in Biblical prophecy as well. September 11th ushered us into a new world, "a new kind of war" that will encompass the world, all of which is prophesied in Revelation 16, verses 12 through 14. There is not time here to go into detail about that prophecy, but I intend to cover it in a new series of articles in the Advocate. America has been caught up

in a planned deception about this important book of the Bible. That, too, is something we need to explore.

The important decisions that our leaders are now making, are out of our control, out of our hands. We have little, if anything, to say about them, yet we shall all be greatly affected by them. One might well ask, "Is there nothing I can do?" Yes, there is much we can do, and should be doing. Let's consider just a few of these things.

We can be engaged in mighty prayer before God. His ear is attainable. "But he. being full of compassion, forgave their iniquity, and destroyed them not: yea, many a time turned he his anger away, and did not stir up all his wrath." (Psalm 78:38). And the Apostle Peter wrote, "For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers..." (1 Peter 3:12). Let us pray for this nation, and her leaders. Let us pray that this people shall return to God.

In times past, when in moments of crises, our leaders have urged America to repent and turn to the Lord. This is such a time! Let that repentance begin with us. Sincere repentance turned God's

wrath away from ancient Nineveh. It can do so today. Even if the majority of Americans did not do so, ofttimes the minority has prevailed. "And after they shall have been brought down low in the dust, even that they are not, yet the words of the righteous shall be written, and the prayers of the faithful shall be heard, and all those who have dwindled in unbelief, shall not be forgotten ... " (2 Nephi 11:83). Though their nation was destroyed, the prayers of righteous Enos, Alma, and Mormon were heard by the Lord, and their descendants would hear the words of their fathers. Perchance the prayers and repentance of a righteous few might deliver this nation.

• We can witness to the truth. We have received the fullness of the Gospel, a message of importance to deliver to the people of the world. Our duty is to be preaching and witnessing about God's word. When God performed His marvelous Restoration, He gave counsel and commandments to this Church of Christ. "And *let your preaching be the* warning voice, every man to his neighbor, in mildness and in meekness" (B of C 40:36). Shall all be happy to hear that loving, warning voice? Of course not! The Lord, Himself, gave answer to that question: "And the poor and the meek shall have the gospel preached unto them, and they shall be looking forth for the time of my coming, for it is nigh at hand" (B of C 37:17).

We can, and we must, trust in the Lord. In answer to the question, "What can we do now?" I heard one lady say, "I am going to trust my president, our leaders and our Armed Forces." Each of us should be supporting these three but, meanwhile, our trust shall be in the Lord. It is He alone who could tell His people, "**Fear thou not**;

"Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness"

for I am with thee: be not dismaved: for I am \mathbf{thv} God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness" (Isaiah 41:10). And what is His promise to this people in this very hour of need? "Wherefore, the righteous need not fear: for saith the thus prophet, they shall be saved..." (1 Nephi 7:37). Never forget this beautiful promise to His people when all the forces of evil are gathered together against them: "And

they were armed with righteousness and with the power of God in great glory" (1 Nephi 3:231).

Blessed with victory and peace, may the heaven-rescued land Praise the Power that has made and preserved us a nation! Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just; And this be our motto. "In God is our trust!" And the Star-spangled Banner in triumph shall wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the hrave

LAYING ON OF HANDS—the Fourth Principal

The gift of the Holy Spirit is received through the ordinance of the Laying on of Hands. This is the birth of the Spirit, or baptism of the Spirit.

"Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (John 3:5).

This makes us citizens in the Kingdom of God, the Church of Christ, and we are now part of His body, His Church.

The Bible teaches us that the Holy Ghost is that power that "enlightens" (Alma 16:145), and that it is this Spirit that "inviteth, and enticeth to do good." (Moroni 7:11). It is through our obedience to the gospel that we may have the Holy Ghost as an "abiding comforter" (John 14:26). Both the baptism of water and the Spirit complete the "New Birth" and we are now prepared to walk in a newness of life and to continue to follow the doctrine of Christ and to not fall away.

Other uses for the Laying on of Hands are the Blessing of Children, Healing of the Sick, and the Ordaining of the Ministry.

QUESTIONS for class, to spark thought and conversation:

1. Did Jesus sprinkle water or baptize little children?

Answer—Jesus did not sprinkle water or baptize little children. He said, "Suffer little children and forbid them not, to come unto me; for such is the kingdom of heaven." And He laid His hands on them and blessed them. (Matthew 19:13-15.)

2. What example did Jesus give us for healing the sick?

Answer—He said, "Is there any sick among you? Let him call for the Elders of the Church; and let them pray over him, anointing with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of Faith shall save the sick and the Lord shall raise him up" (James 5:14-15).

3. What example did Jesus give us for Ordaining the Ministry?

Answer—"They laid their hands upon them, and said, In the name of Jesus Christ I ordain you to be a priest (or if he be a teacher, "I ordain you to be a teacher") to preach repentance and remission of sins through Jesus Christ, by the endurance of faith on his name to the end. Amen" (Moroni 3:1-2).

4. What gifts are given by the Holy Spirit?

Answer—Faith, Wisdom, Knowledge, Miracles, Healings, Tongues, Prophesy, Interpretation of Tongues, and Discerning of Spirits. (I Corinthians, 12th chapter.)

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

A Great Faith



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
He Knows Us

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I was born February 14, 1923, and my parents named me James Wendell Martin. I was the last of 9 children, and the only one living now. My parents had moved to Independence so that an older sister, 22 years older than I, could be nearer better doctors. She died when I was a couple of months old. When I was born, they laid me on the bed beside her, and she said "Hi Jack." We moved back to the farm near Collins, Missouri, when I was about two years old. I was a good sized lad before I learned that my name was not lack.

As I was growing up, I remember several of the ministry visiting our home, particularly Apostles Mohler, Bozarth, Wheaton, Gould, and Smith. My cousin, Ray Martin, and his wife Blanche asked for baptism, so Bro. A. M. Smith baptized all three of us. I don't think he had any idea that my proper name was James instead of Jack, so I was baptized as Jack. As the years passed, I began to worry that I had not been baptized by the right name. Yes, most people still know me as Jack. Oh yes, Jim Shaw was one that was called that day. I probably could name them all but will not for fear that I might miss one.

God calls whom He will, through whom He chooses, and may or may not give evidence to everyone that thinks he should personally receive that evidence. I love and respect that apostle that might have cast a shadow of doubt because he did not receive his evidence.





obert "Bob" Lee Ely passed away Monday, May 21, 2001, at St. Mary's Hospital in Grand Junction, Colorado, of natural causes. He was 77.
