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

What is the Difference?

recently had an opportunity to travel to the Re-Lpublic of Korea for my employer. It was not my first time, for I had served in the military and had been stationed in Korea twenty-six years earlier. As was the case then, I found the people to be friendly and eager to engage in a conversation with you in the best English that they knew. I took a Korean conversational language course during my first visit so I came this time a bit rusty but familiar with the customary greetings.

I spent a few days towards the end of my trip in Seoul, the capital city of the Republic of Korea. There I was able to relax where I took advantage of the pool, swimming a few laps then retiring to the hot tub since there was no one using it at the time. I had just got settled, enjoying the warm water bubbling around me, when an elderly Korean gentleman came over (with a man servant following close behind) and joined me. I looked over his way and smiled, as a non-intrusive greeting. He then took the opening that I presented and greeted me in English.

After the formalities an opening presented itself to me where I told him that though I worked for a company as a living I was also an ordained minister in the Church of Christ. He responded that he was familiar with our church. I assured him that I had my doubts that he was thinking of our church. I went on to explain that we were a small group of around 3000 members. Because of his age or the noise of the bubbles in the hot tub he repeated "Oh, 300,000 people?" I repeated the previous number a little louder where he was able to understand that we were in fact small and not the church that he had thought we were.

There was a short silence where I could see that he was forming more questions to ask of me. I said a prayer within my heart that I would have the wisdom to answer him in a way that would be to the glory of God. He wanted to know what our church believed in. I could tell that he was familiar with the Bible because of the questions that he posed. After explaining to him that I believed in the Book of Mormon but that we were not a part of the Mormon Church he seemed interested to hear more.

My mind temporarily went back to those days when I was stationed in Korea and had an opportunity to go to an orphanage. This orphanage had been sponsored by the base where I was stationed. The children loved to see us come and visit with them. The children would throng the visitor, with each child vying for his undivided attention. caretaker of the orphanage was a religious Christian man who believed in the power of God. I had an opportunity to share my religion with him and he shared his testimonies of how God had blessed the orphanage. He related many testimonies where God provided for their needs temporally. Some of these experiences were truly miracles. He confided in me that he believed his lineage was that of one of the lost tribes of Israel. At the time in my mind I thought that anything could be possible, but I had not before considered it.

Twenty-six years later and with a little more understanding of the history of the Korean people I related the story of the caretaker at the orphanage to the old man in the hot tub. He immediately understood what the caretaker was relating to; he himself had considered the possibility and had studied the subject from a scientific point of view. He knew I was from Phoenix, surrounded by different Native American tribes. He himself had been to Scottsdale on business several times in the past and had investigated several of the tribes. He told me that the Koreans have a birthmark that is peculiar to their people, which separates them from the rest of the Asian peoples. However, it links them genetically with the Native Americans in Arizona. I became excited and was rejoicing inside concerning the things we were discussing.

It was not long, though,


before the conversation went back to reality and he focused on the many other larger and well established Christian churches in Korea and in other parts of the world. He then posed the question that I stumbled with. "What is the difference between your church and the other Christian churches?" I had told him of the Book of Mormon and many of the different points of the doctrine of Christ where we find ourselves set apart from other churches, but that did not seem to sink in. It was now time for him to get out of the hot tub. We both had been in long enough, so we said our good byes. His ever patient manservant helped him out and they walked away.


My rejoicing quickly turned to discouragement with myself. How could I have been a more effective witness or advocate for my Lord? That experience stayed with me through the remainder of my stay in Korea and my return flight home. I gave that question much thought and prayer as I sought God for an answer as to what more I could have said.

Soon after my return I was scheduled to preach in Phoenix. I again approached God in prayer and He gave me the answer that I had been seeking. It came with the

simplicity only God could deliver. I am reminded of the words of Nephi when he said. "I glory in plainness; I glory in truth;" (2 Nephi 15:7). Simply put, we are the caretakers of the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The truth is what sets us apart from all other beliefs and religious sects. God has entrusted us to do as His Son was anointed to do here on earth: "to preach the gospel to the poor; ... to heal the brokenhearted. to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised. to preach the acceptable year of the Lord" (Luke 4:18-19). We are that "chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people" (1 Peter 2:9), the true advocates for Zion. The promises and blessings from God will be evident and demonstrated as we in faith "...seek to bring forth my Zion at that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost..." (1 Nephi 3:187).

"And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come" (Matthew 24:14).

CHAPTER TEN

Most historicists see chapters ten and eleven as an interlude that takes place between the sounding of the sixth trumpet (sounding the destruction of the Eastern portion of the Roman Empire in chapter 9) and that of the seventh trumpet, which will sound in chapter 11:15. This seventh trumpet will bring us to the final dispensation of time and the bowels of God's wrath to be poured out upon the enemies of Christ. This will be covered in

SECTION EIGHT:

INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF THE CHURCH

Chapter 16.

After the fall of Rome and the western part of the empire, the power of the papacy, or, that "man of sin" of 2 Thessalonians 2:3-7, arose to take its place. Chapter 9 ends on a sad note: Even though great woes were poured out upon the empire and Christendom, men were not repentant and continued in sin. The papacy itself was a primary source of corruption and evil. Barnes writes, "The state of the world, as described in ch. 9:20, 21, was such as to demand a reformation, or something that should be more effectual in purifying the church than the calamities described in the previous verse had been. Some such work as the Reformation is, therefore, what we should naturally look for as the next in order...." So most historicists view these chapters as relating to important things during the 1260 years of apostasy when the Catholic Church so strongly opposed the Reformation.

They see the "little book" of Revelation 10:8-10 as being the Bible with the Reformation now beginning to take place. This book, which is in the hand of the angel, is not sealed; it is open, or ready for use and study. In A.D. 1382 John Wycliffe completed the first English translation of the Bible and it was now being made available to the common man. The great men of the Reformation were using it to study and preach, speaking out against the false teaching of Catholicism. Probably because of this new interest in studying the Scriptures, The Council of Toulouse in 1229 forbade Catholics from reading it. Most Catholic priests had no access to the Bible. Even Martin Luther waited until after four years of university study before finding a copy of the Vulgate Bible in "the solitude and gloom of an Augustinian monastery." ² The majority of the Catholic clergy were illiterate and ignorant of the Bible. While the Protestant approach to the Gospel would be through study and preaching, the Catholic approach had always been through the sacraments of the Church, through ceremony and ritual.

This thought is borne out by the letter of a Franciscan missionary to the Indians of sixteenth century America to his friends in Europe, telling them "that he desired his friends would send him the book called the Bible; for he had heard of there being such a book in Europe, which might be of some use to him." 3

Eating the little book represents the church's happy re-Jeception of the Bible and the devouring of it by true Christians. It was sweet to the taste because it contained the beautiful words of Christ. John (perhaps representing the ministry) was commanded to prophesy, or preach, that which the book con-The book immediately tained. became bitter in his belly, indicating the awareness that its preaching would bring trouble and persecution.

In paragraph two, above, we quoted the words of the historicist, Barnes, saying there was a great need for "a reformation, or something that should be more effectual in purifying the church...."

That something which would be more effectual was to be the restoration of the Church of Christ. With the restoration of that church came another book, the

Book of Mormon, whose primary purpose was to be "the confounding of false doctrines" (II Nephi 2:21). It would, as did the Bible, bring great joy to those who read and believed it, but it would also bring great trouble and persecution to those who used it.

William Sheldon expresses his understanding that verses ten and eleven of chapter ten refer directly to the Apostle John and a latter-day ministry that will be Brother Sheldon believes that John did not die, but has remained on earth as did the three Nephites. The Bible says, "Peter seeing him saith to Jesus. Lord, and what shall this man do? Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? follow thou me" (John 21:21, 22). In the Book of Commandments there is this revelation which came in answer to the queries of the brethren as to whether John had tarried upon the earth: "And the Lord said unto me, John my beloved, what desireth thou? And I said Lord, give unto me power that I may bring souls unto thee. -And the Lord said unto me: Verily, verily, I say unto thee, because thou desireth this, thou shalt tarry till I come in my glory" (6:1). Relating all this back to chapter ten of Revelation, verse 11, the angel told John, "And he said unto me, Thou must prophesy again before many peoples, and nations, and tongues, and kings."

Do we hear God's, "May Day, May Day, Get Out!"? Some people will say, "There is always a more convenient time." We must pray out loud and silently, with full intent. Ask for forgiveness and strength. Be thankful for the Word.
- If God is with us we can do whatever He wants us to do.
- SCRIPTURES TO REMEMBER: The scriptures used referred to the need for humility and to continue in prayer, that the Lord's mercy will be extended. We are to seek Him while he may be found. Do not wait until the day of tribulation. Our ways are not His ways, His ways and thoughts are higher than ours.

"Fret not thyself because of evildoers, *Psalm 37:1;* There is a time and season for all things, *Ecclesiastes 3:1-15;* Be strong in the Lord, *Psalm 18;* "Come ye to the waters...come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Wherefore do ye spend money for that which is not bread? and your labour for that which satisfieth not?" *Isaiab 55 1-2.*

- PRAYERS: In relationship to the stated purpose for our gathering, the prayers centered around the work of the Lord, the filling of the vacancy in the apostleship, the apostles and their families, the return of more of the gifts and fruits of the Spirit and that our people would draw out of the world.
- · SONG OF ADMONITION: Singing the wonder-

fully inspired Admonition hymn we were reminded of the day that we are facing, a "momentous day." It called us to greater heights. We must be obedient so that we can be safe upon "Zion's hill" from the "devastating currents, fraught with woe." His coming is near and we must put away our sin and become His servants. "Peril waits upon the heedless! Grace upon the souls who try."

SUNDAY, March 31 THE LORD'S SACRAMENT HIGHLIGHTS

 COUNSEL: Deny ourselves. Do we look at the weight of our sin with sorrow? Sin separates us from the Body of Christ. Was Christ's sacrifice good enough for you, or should He have suffered more?

Flee from idolatry. Are you suffering today? Where is your allegiance? Are you partaking of the cup of devils? Are there things that take all your time away from the worship of God? Accept His sacrifice. Partake of it. Defeat lustful desires. He defeated sin and Hell, and so can you. There is no other way to defeat but by the sacrifice.

TESTIMONIES: Many testified of their blessing of parents, spouses, and the results of prayer and administration. They were thankful for the love of God's family and for the work.

- An elder shared his experience about a business trip and meeting a well-to-do Oriental man who, in inquiring about his beliefs, asked what the difference was between our church and other churches. After the man left this elder was disappointed in the answer he had given and began to ponder what he should have said. The Lord impressed upon him the very simple and direct answer: "We have the truth!"
- One told of her first administration by the elders of the Church before she was baptized.

She had been suffering from severe stomach problems. The elders were asked to come. As the elders prayed, their prayers were answered as they prayed. She could feel the effects starting from her toes and going up her body.

- Another brother had dreamed of the day when he would have the opportunity to go to Yucatan, Mexico, because of the testimonies of Apostles McIndoo and Moser. He has been privileged to be part of God's work in that area and feels inadequate. He encouraged young men and women that God has something for them to do. There are adventures waiting for them. God can afford them the opportunity for fulfillment.
- A husband told how much he appreciated his wife, and that the Lord had worked through her prayers to help him in a dramatic way one day at his work. Another time his life was spared. She told him to drive home from work slowly. He went home on the back roads and was tempted to go faster, but obeyed the warning. She told him she had a vision of him in a terrible accident. The next day, as he was in a parking lot, the steering arm broke and he couldn't control the steering.
- A Mother, on her family's first trip to Yucatan, was nervous about their unaccustomed circumstances in the very different environment there, and increased concerns when her son got ill. Through the day he steadily grew worse. At nightfall, he asked for one of the Yucatan Apostles, but no one knew where he was. When this elder returned in the middle of the night, after much kindly attention and fervent prayer, he administered to the son. In the prayer of administration he outlined a chain of things to happen in the healing process. From that time the son began to heal with everything happening as outlined in the elder's prayer, and in the same order.

PREACHING/PRESENTATIONS

Pictures were projected on the wall with each presentation showing the members of the Church in the foreign missions with explanation and background information. It made us appreciate the circumstances under which our missionaries to these foreign lands labor. We feel closer to our brothers and sisters in these places because we can put a face to the names we so often hear. We feel that we know them better, therefore love them more.

After each sermon/presentation we were treated to the pleasure of asking questions about the work of the mission, the people, their customs and the land. The answers given by our missionaries gave us a love for the people and a greater appreciation of the great task that lies before us for those missions.

On Sunday afternoon Apostle Jay Moser, assisted by Apostle Frank Fann, presented the Philippines and the members there to us. What can we do for the Church in the Philippines? Brother Moser urged us to be as strong as David was when he fought against Goliath. There are many "Goliaths" that want to destroy the Church. It takes courage to fight the "Goliaths." It isn't a matter of fear, it's a matter of making a choice. Courage is displayed in two ways. One is when you make the decision quickly, without thinking. The other is a conscious choice.

We have been here for 172 years. We are not a "fly-by-night" organization. We are established. We know what needs to be done. We have a responsibility to these people. Don't be led by emotion, be honorable, have integrity, be a light. We must grow. Pray that the Lord will bring the honest in heart to you. You have been prepared to do this work. Be ready emotionally and physically.

It is natural for Americans to want to change everything, Americanize. Sometimes it needs to be let alone. Don't be too busy with your own agenda, i.e.: make the world a better place for "me" to live in. Ask if it's essential. Our primary purpose is to save souls.

God is with us. Let it not be said that the messengers of life be afraid of the messengers of death. May it be said that we have been true.

*There are 205 members in the Philippines. There are three elders: Elders Prudencio Alameda, Demetrio Indangen, and Roger Manali.

• Monday evening Apostle Brian McIndoo, assisted by Apostle Smith Brickhouse, gave their story and appeal to us for the African mission. Brother McIndoo opened with a passage from Psalm 8 and asked, What is the Lord? He is the Supreme Ruler, the Supreme Authority, Our Lord. His Word is unquestionable. We do not interject our interpretation. We do not challenge His Word. We are insignificant compared to the magnitude of His creation

and His power. God sent His Son for us. He created all for us. We can stand in God's glory. How can we stand in God's glory, yet want the insignificant?

We are living in the last days. Prophecy is being fulfilled before our eyes. Churches are aligning with each other. When there are "save two churches" it will be obvious to those who know His Word. They have a "form of godliness but deny the power thereof."

Christ warned us of this day. Satan desires to have you to sift you as wheat. He will send the winds of fables, or false doctrines of the Rapture, No Hell, etc., and lust and pride to drive you away from the truth.

Christians in the world are comfortable. All is well in Zion. Everything is just fine. They are not seeking truth or righteousness, but are unaware of the time we are living in, are slumbering and sleeping.

Awake! Be not unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

Superstition or Truth? We hold the truth. We are the keepers of it. We have the responsibility to take it to the world. Don't follow the fables, but understand His Word and will for you.

What is the will of the Lord in the last days? We are of the Gentiles. We shall be Israel's "nursing fathers and nursing mothers" (II Nephi 5:19). They look to us as parents to show how they should be. We need to be strong and ready to be fathers and mothers to the world. The time is past for us to be lazy and weak, to sit back. We are to be the role model for the world.

Jacob 3:54-56. We are blessed in this nation so that we can do the work set before us. The Gentiles are grafted into the olive tree. Their strength will bring forth fruit.

Are we the examples of righteousness that we should be?

Responsibilities of the Ministry: Jacob 3:136, 137, 140. There is a great work before us. Even if every man in the Church were called to the ministry, we would still be few. Labor with your mights, with all your energy, when you feel like it and when you don't. Obey His commandments in all things. Get out of your comfort zone. Don't let pride get in your way. The gospel was taken from the Jews because they were stiff-necked.

Responsibilities of the Women: Sacrifice. Some have to let their husbands go, and are willing, for the sake of the Lord's work. They don't live normal lives as other women. They support their husband in their labors. Young girls, some day you will be called on to make the sacrifice. Are you willing? Are you excited? Are you going to support your husbands to do the work of the Lord?

Young Men, "Study to show yourself approved." Untangle yourself from the world. Prepare yourself. Study, pray.

We need more people to do this work. Everyone must pitch in. Don't be dependent. Don't create issues or doctrines to prevent you from being able to work among people of the world. God is preparing some of you right now.

* There are 400 baptized members. There are two organized locals, in Keneni and in Misisita. There are several other groups gathering regularly in church buildings. There is a church office in Kenya. There are two elders, Elders Michael Otero and Moses Ohuru.

The Sunday School Association donated money for supplies which were passed out to the locals.

 Apostle Don McIndoo, assisted by Apostle Jay Moser, gave the sermon and presentation on the Mexico and Honduras missions.

The Gentiles have the care of the House of Israel. Do you have sorrow for the House of Israel that they have not repented? We are reminded of Enos. He humbled himself and had concern for himself. Then God showed him and he began to grow in awareness and concern for others, even the enemy. We have a concern for Israel. II Nephi 1:3-8, 7:34-36 tells of the destruction of Jerusalem and the hope of a Promised Land. A Seneca Chief, Red Jacket, who died in 1830, said, "Our forefathers owned this great island." Jacob said that it was an inheritance forever. This land was consecrated for an inheritance for them forever if they keep the commandments. It is a conditional promise of protection, of security, prosperity, and peace upon this land.

The Son of God gave salvation to every man if they would hearken to His words. We need to be the ambassadors to the peoples of America to make them aware. The root cause of the 9/11 attack is the Muslim declaration of a

Great Jihad (holy war) against the Christian world. We need to find platforms to proclaim the prophecies of this beautiful book (Book of Mormon).

Nephi said there will be two churches. You will belong to one of them. The other is great and powerful. In the last year, in Chiapas, Mexico, twenty-two families of evangelical Christians were burned out of homes and forced to flee.

We are living in prophetic days. Just a handful of people understand. In Revelations 14:6, John saw another angel fly... having the everlasting gospel. This is the restoration of the gospel and ministry. In verse 8, there is another angel crying, "Woe" to those with the symbol of the Beast in their lives.

I Nephi 3:149-150: He beheld the Gentiles on the land of promise and his seed scattered and smitten. In Isaiah 49:14-16 Zion thinks the Lord has forsaken her, but He will not forget her. If ever you feel great loss, look at Christ's hand with the nail prints and your name written in His palm. He pleads our case before the Father. He lives and is concerned about His people.

God has a purpose for the House of Israel in the latter day. For Israel the Book of Mormon points up the truth of the Bible (I Nephi 3:191-192), puts down contention (II Nephi 2:21), teaches Christ (II Nephi 3:193-194), and tells what source to look to for a remission of sin (II Nephi 11:43, 148).

LETTER FROM SPAIN: A young man, Juan Jesus, of the Federal police, a Catholic, was interested in the Book of Mormon, so a Book of Mormon was sent to him. He finished reading it and said that it was a "marvelous experience," and claimed this book would change his life. Now he is reading it for the second time. He said, "I am enchanted by the Book of Mormon." He knows it is inspired of God. He cries with emotion when he reads it. He reads it every day and always carries it. "Through this marvelous book I have encountered Christ."

I Nephi 3:179 tells us the Abominable Church kept back the plain and precious things. The Gentiles stumble. We read and talk about the concepts in this book and think we understand, but not very well, such as the gathering of the house of Israel, the New Jerusalem, and Zion.

Let's be like Abraham. By faith he obeyed and went out not knowing where he went. He looked for a better city whose builder and maker is God. They all died not having received the promise.

It is prophesied that the seed of Jacob will hear the gospel. Roger Can called two men because of a dream that he had in which he was conversing with the Lord. He was given the names of the men and that they were to be called as elders. There were remarkable witnesses to both of the men's callings. For one, five years before, the pastor of his congregation knew the young man would be called, wrote his testimony to it on a piece of paper, sealed it in an envelope and gave it to young Placido. The ordination services are not sandwiched between. The opening remarks and sermon are in explanation of the ordination. Then a witness is called for.

Another experience was of a vision had by one seeing himself as an elder baptizing a young woman, who was not yet baptized. He questioned the Lord and went to the pastor about his concerns. The pastor said that he knew who it was. After the witness was given, the young woman walked forward and told the congregation that she was the one he saw in the vision and that she wanted to follow the Lord. She is the fifth generation descended from Sabrero who had the experience in the jungle with the prophet who told of the gospel that would come to them, brought by a white man. A righteous nation of Israel shall be raised up.

The members there think about you all the time. They love their churches, hymnals, and their Bibles and Books of Mormon.

* In Honduras there are 33 members. In Mexico there are 400 members with 13 locals served by 6 elders, 4 priests, and 1 evangelist.

ADDITIONAL PREACHING SERVICES by Elders Andrew Brown and Nicholas Denham. Sermon Points:

- The victory goes to the courageous.
- God is in control if we're willing to let Him. Happiness is to know that.
- Are you looking forward to the day when the trump shall sound? Are we watching for the return of our Savior to be redeemed from carnal death?
- The Lord does not want spectators. He wants

participants.

- Be a part of the cure, not a part of the problem. It's your job.
- Do you have the attributes of charity? Can they be seen?
- Do we reflect His glory and bring glory to His name?
- Thy will be done, not mine. Are we willing to submit to the Lord's will?
- Be awake that we won't be blind. Repentance makes sure of that.
- He will come as a thief in the night. Look for the promise to be revealed. Do we look forward to those things?
- · Be diligent, without spot, blameless.
- What do you stand for? Who are you? You are a representative of the Savior.
- Don't attach yourself so much to something that it destroys you.
- We cannot escape corruption if we are yoked to it. Come out of Babylon. Separate ourselves from the world. What is the world? If it brings you closer to Christ, it's good. The movie industry represents the world. The funds are used to destroy our beliefs. Are you willing to give up wealth that the Lord may dwell in you?
- Do people see a reflection of the Lord in you?
- Tithes and offerings are a commandment given to Israel, Malachi 3:8. If you want to get out of trouble pay your tithing. Do we need financial and health blessings?
- We should tell of our blessings, even the small ones, that the Lord gives.
- Our names are written in The Book of the Lamb. Sometimes we slip. We have an adversary who will try to get us to disobey.
- We want to be on God's side. We're in a warfare. We meet together oft to pray for one another and encourage each other to hold fast to the Rod of Iron that leads to the Tree of Life.
- The people of the United States are slipping.
 Our nation is based on believing and serving
 God. The Anti-God movement is moving fast.
- We should be concerned about the gathering.
 The time is coming that if we are not gathered
 here we will suffer. The Lord will look after
 those who obey. "How oft would I have gathered you, but ye would not."
- I want to see the Lord's work accomplished. I want to be of benefit to God and to you. May we grow in grace and understanding in the knowledge of the Lord.

SPIRITUAL EXPERIENCE

During one of the Apostle's meetings the week before the Conference, during a season of fasting and prayer, and while engaged in a period of meditation, the calling was given of Brother Ronnie Gill to the office of elder. After prayer several testimonies to the validity of the call were given. The call was given in answer to many prayers for the work in Honduras.

Hearts were poured out in prayer for the sick and afflicted and thanksgiving for answered prayer for the gospel, the growing missions to the seed of Jacob, for the calling of Ronnie Gill to the eldership, also for Justin Tarbell's successful surgery and for Marvin Fleming's blessing.
