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
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

GOD'S PLAN for Success in Changing Times

In the last two issues of the Zion's Advocate I have been writing about God's goal of salvation for each of us and how the Church organization plays such an important part in accomplishing God's goal. Just like our physical bodies need several important things to maintain our life and be able to function normally, the body of Christ needs several things to operate normally in a spiritual sense. There are five themes needed for success in the Church. They are Systems (God's rules, procedures and principles as found in His word), Integrity, Customer Service, Accountability and a Risk Management system. Each one of these things is necessary for the body to function according to God's perfect design, and they are all connected. These terms are not terms we use very much and need some explanation.

Part 3

In the last issue, I wrote about God's Systems and how His word provides the framework for the body to function correctly and lays down the specifics of everything that pertains to the function of the body. In this article we will explore Integrity and how it relates to the wellbeing of the body and why it is necessary.

INTEGRITY – Completeness, uprightness in character.

The word of God provides us with the description of how the Church should look and how its members should act, what they should do or not do, etc. It lays down the core values of a Christian life. This is how God's systems relate to Integrity and provide the framework for us to know what God expects of us as we take our place in the body. They also provide us with specific job descriptions for our part of the body so we know what we should be doing and can then determine if we are doing things right—the way God designed it. When I speak of integrity in the body, I am talking about knowing what God expects of us and doing it His way. That is, what makes us upright in character.

We must get out of the habit of thinking that we are individuals and it does not matter what we do.

Just like with any job, if we do not do things according to the written manual and procedures things do not work correctly and each piece does not fit into the design right. should be a great concern for us in the Church, because when we do not take seriously the commandments and instructions of the Lord we fail in our progress to fulfill our purpose. Of course when we fail, we do not just fail ourselves—we fail the body and the Church does not work as it was designed. We must get out of the habit of thinking that we are individuals and it does not matter what we do. When we fail to follow God's instructions it hurts everyone. To illustrate this point we will consider Alma 2:8-18:

"And it came to pass in the

eighth year of the reign of the Judges, that the people of the church began to wax proud, because of their exceeding riches, and their fine silks, and their fine twined linen, And because of their many flocks and herds, and their gold, and their silver, and all manner of precious things, which they had obtained by their industry; And in all these things were they lifted up in the pride of their eyes, for they began to wear very costly apparel. Now this was the cause of much affliction to Alma, yea, and to many of the people whom Alma had consecrated to be teachers, and priests, and elders, over the church; Yea, many of them were sorely grieved for the wickedness which they saw had begun to be among their people. For they saw and beheld with great sorrow, that the people of the church began to be lifted up in the pride of their eyes, and to set their hearts upon riches and upon the vain things of the world; That they began to be scornful, one towards another, and they began to persecute those that did not believe according to their own will and pleasure. And thus in this eighth year of the reign of the Judges, there began to be great contentions among the people of the church; Yea, there were envyings, and strifes, and malice, and persecutions, and pride, even to exceed the pride of those who did not belong to the church of God. And thus ended the eighth year of the reign of the Judges; and the wickedness of the church was a great stumbling block to those who did not belong to the church; and thus the church began to fail in its progress. And it came to pass in the commencement of the ninth year, Alma saw the wickedness of the church, and he saw also that

the example of the church began to lead those who were unbelievers, on from one piece of iniquity to another, thus bringing on the destruction of the people...."

Our strength as a body comes from doing the will of God, striving for perfection, and being obedient to His commands.

We see from this example of the Church in Alma's day that without integrity, or a desire to keep God's word, the Church will fail to accomplish its main purpose of salvation for its members and its secondary purpose of being a light for the world to call others to salvation. Instead, we see the example of those in the Church leading others in the Church—and even those outside the Church—on from one sin to another, so the body was on the verge of breaking down completely.

We have some of these same problems in the Church today among our members not wanting to live the Gospel, or justifying themselves when others bring it to their attention. As long as this condition exists among us the Church will fail in its progress. Is this what we want to see in our day, or do we have a stronger personal resolve to place the core values of Christian living in our lives? If we as individuals, as well as col-

lectively, do not take hold of the principles of godly living and fight valiantly against the temptations of our adversary, these same things may be written of us to the point that we may be guilty of bringing on the destruction of the people in judgment.

By the example of the Church long ago we were shown the great need we have for integrity. Our bodies can survive when everything is not perfect, as long as several essential parts are functioning, but there is a big difference between surviving and functioning correctly as God designed us. This is also true in the makeup of the body of Christ. It can survive with a core group of Christians that will walk God's narrow way with a whole heart, but the body will be filled with trouble—becoming sick, feeble, and unable to accomplish the purposes of the Lord for lack of strength. Our strength as a body comes from doing the will of God, striving for perfection, and being obedient to His commands. In the next scripture we see the Church functioning perfectly, complete in every sense, because the members walked in integrity and followed the Lord with all their heart.

IV Nephi 1:17-2: "And it came to pass that there was no contention in the land, because of the love of God which did dwell in the hearts of the people. And there were no envyings, nor strifes, nor tumults, nor whoredoms, nor lyings, nor murders, nor any manner of lasciviousness; And surely there

could not be a happier people among all the people who had been created by the hand of God: There were no robbers, nor murderers, neither were there Lamanites, nor any manner of ites; but they were in one, the children of Christ, and heirs to the kingdom of God; And how blessed were they, for the Lord did bless them in all their doings; yea, even they were blessed and prospered, until an hundred and ten years had passed away; and the first generation from Christ had passed away, and there was no contention in all the land."

It is hard to imagine in our present world how wonderful it would be to see the Church working as God designed it, everyone doing their part in service to God and treating each other with kindness and love. Those in the Church took the word of the Lord seriously because the love of God was in their hearts, and there never were a happier people. Focus on this scripture. The Church will be like this again in the future.

In the first article I quoted from the scriptures showing what the Church will look like when Christ returns to His bride as prophesied. In Revelation 19:7-8 we read:

"Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready. And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints."

We, especially the women of the Church, are familiar with

what it takes to get ready for a wedding. There is much to do for the wife (the Church) to make herself ready. Most

women start out by finding the right dress to wear, and can spend a great deal of time finding that perfect dress. That is just the start! There are arrangements to make, shoes to buy, hair to be done.... Hopefully you get the picture by now—there is much to do. In the spiritual sense of the Church, we know what our dress will look like. It will be clean and white and can only be purchased by the sacrifices of God's people from the pleasures and sins of the world.

Since we do not have on that beautiful garment yet, what will it take to become the precious bride of Christ? The Apostle Paul spoke of the process that Christ as a husband to His bride is putting the Church through.

Ephesians 5:25-27: "Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; That he

might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish."

The process that Christ has for the Church involves the washing of water by His word. The only way to be truly cleansed from unrighteousness is to begin to take seriously what is written in His word and apply it to our lives. The real challenge is to find a way to sustain the changes that we need to make. We know what things need to change in our lives and have the best intentions, but find it hard to keep the change going. We also find ourselves procrastinating making those needed changes for fear. We find ourselves in our own personal Gethsemane, fearing the road to a more righteous walk because it entails crucifying our hearts from the affections and lusts of the world. Even as Christ, because of His love for us, His bride, was willing to walk that road, we will only be able to walk that road when we have a love for the King in our hearts.

Getting back to our need for integrity as a Church, we will never be successful until we live the core values of a godly life, and when we choose not to, we set ourselves up for the judgment of God upon us. I believe the scriptures bear out that we are in a sifting time prior to the return of the Lord. Those of us not true to the Lord will be exposed and sifted out by the judg-

ment of God. Alma, when he faced the great problems in the Church in his day, was given words to declare to the people of the Church, which we also should give heed to in our day.

Alma 3:90: "And again I say unto you, the Spirit saith, Behold, the ax is laid at the root of the tree; therefore every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit, shall be hewn down and cast into the fire; yea, a fire which can not be consumed; even an unquenchable fire."

Alma 3:97-102: "And finally, all ye that will persist in your wickedness. I say unto you, that these are they who shall be hewn down and cast into the fire, except they speedily repent. And now I say unto you, all you that are desirous to follow the voice of the good shepherd, come ye out from the wicked, and be ye separate, and touch not their unclean things; And behold, their names shall be blotted out, that the names of the wicked shall not be numbered among the names of the righteous, that the word of God may be fulfilled, which saith, The names of the wicked shall not be mingled with the names of my people. For the names of the righteous shall be written in the book of life; and unto them will I grant an inheritance at my right hand. And now my brethren, What have ye to say against this? I say unto you, If ye speak against it, it matters not, for the word of God must be fulfilled."

I have had a great fear for the Church of Christ because of what has been written concerning the Church in the latter days. Let's consider the warning of impending trial and judgment regarding the people of the Church as written in 1 Peter 4:12-19:

The Lord will have a tried people, and these trials will show the Lord those who truly love Him and are willing to suffer for Him.

"Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto vou: But rejoice, inasmuch as ve are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ve may be glad also with exceeding joy. If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye; for the spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part he is evil spoken of, but on your part he is glorified. But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or as a thief, or as an evildoer, or as a busybody in other men's matters. Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed: but let him glorify God on this behalf. For the time is come that judgment *must begin at the house of God:* and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God? And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear? Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God commit the keeping of their souls to him in well doing, as unto a faithful Creator."

The Lord will have a tried people, and these trials will show the Lord those who truly love Him and are willing to suffer for Him. This should cause us to reflect on where we now stand in our lives. There are those in the Church that live the core values of the Kingdom of God and there are those that live some of them but not all, and vet others who may not even know what the core values are. We need to be working together to help, teach, and encourage one another to the high calling of integrity and love. This is the only way we will accomplish the goal of God for His people and survive spiritually until the coming of the Lord in Glory.

I hope that with the help of the word of God I have been able to show how important integrity is in the body of Christ and how needful it is for the Church body to work effectively. We have covered two of the five things that are necessary for the body of Christ to work correctly and effectively. The other three, customer service, accountability and risk management will be covered in the next couple of issues of the *Advocate*.

Pondering the Words of JESUS CHRIST

Item 30: Prudent Proclamation of Divine Truth

Matt: 7:6 Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you (Same in 3 Ne 6:18).

Jesus was very judicious in revealing himself as the Son of God until near the last of His ministry among the Jews. Generally He identified himself as the "Son of man," except among His disciples. To the scribes and Pharisees, and to the High Priest, it was blasphemous of Him to declare His divinity, of which they had heard His disciples declare.

Yet, the prophets before Him boldly declared the guilt of those of Israel in their departures from the com(Quotations are from the King James Authorized Edition of the Bible and from the 1908 RLDS Edition of the Book of Mormon; same chapters/verses as Independence Edition.)

mandments of God, and of His judgments to be visited upon them because of it. There came numerous times also, as Jesus knew full well, when His disciples would lose their lives for His name's sake, giving up all they held dear or was necessary for daily sustenance, and undergoing horrible means of torture until their decease; and much of this was presumed by their tormentors to be in the interest of maintaining divine truth.

Aside from this, it is wisdom, generally speaking, to withhold from unbelievers the mysteries of the kingdom of God, who would hold such in contempt, ridiculing by the learning of man, and oft-times being able to subvert the believer and to destroy his faith.

Luke 8:10 And he said, Unto you it is given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God: but to others in parables; that seeing they might not see, and hearing they might not understand.

Alma 9:15 -20 And now Alma began to expound these things unto him, saying, It is given unto many to know the mysteries of God; Nevertheless they are laid under a strict command, that they shall not impart only according to the portion of his word, which he doth grant unto the children of men; according to the heed and diligence which they give unto him; And therefore he that will harden his heart, the same receiveth the

lesser portion of the word; And he that will not harden his heart, to him is given the greater portion of the word, until it is given unto him to know the mysteries of God, until they know them in full; And they that will harden their hearts, to them is given the lesser portion of the word, until they know nothing concerning his mysteries; And then they are taken captive by the devil, and led by his will down to destruction.

Item 31: The Biblical Golden Rule

Matt. 7:12 Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

Luke 1:31-36 And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise. For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye? for sinners also love those that love them. And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what thank have ye? for sinners also do even the same. And if ye lend to them of whom ye hope to receive, what thank have ye? for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil. Be ye therefore merciful, as your Father

also is merciful (See 3 Nephi 6:24).

Nothing could be plainer than this; but Jesus said: "...this is the law and the prophets." This is not simply good counsel; it is God's law, the breaking of which deprives one of desirable favor with God; and without repentance and correction, it occasions God's judgment.

Item 32: The Strait Gate

Matt 7:13, 14 Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it (Same in 3 Ne 6: 25-26).

Luke 13:24-29 Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able. When once the master of the house is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are: Then shall ye begin to say, We have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets. But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence we are; depart from me, all we workers of iniquity. There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrust out. And they shall come from the east, and from the west, and from the north, and from the south, and shall sit down in the kingdom of God.

It is important to understand the difference between "strait" as used correctly in the foregoing texts, and "straight." The definition of strait which fits most closely is said to be archaic; it means "righteous; strict." It has very narrowly defined limits. However the word "straight" is most correctly defined as "extending uniformly in one direction without curve

or bend." It is also defined as "not deviating from truth, fairness, or honesty; upright; reliable." The two terms would appear as being synonymous, and so it is except as used in our texts. When Jesus said, "Enter ye in at the strait gate," and again, saying to those who would be knocking and seeking to enter into the kingdom of God, "I know you not whence ye are," He is thus making the way more narrowly defined than as being a broad search for truth: He here alludes to the fact that HE is the way, the truth and the life (see John 14:6); very strait indeed!

John 10:1-2 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. But he that entereth in by the door is the shepherd of the sheep.

John 10:7-15 Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep. All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them. I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and know my sheep, and am known of mine. As the Father knoweth me, even so I know the Father: and I lay down my life for the

Jesus Christ is the WAY, the STRAIT GATE to eternal life. Now notice the difference between strait and straight as used in our texts:


2 Ne 6:81-82 Behold, the way for

man is narrow, but it lieth in a straight course before him, and the keeper of the gate is the Holy One of Israel: and he employeth no servant there: And there is none other way, save it be by the (strait/w.a.s.) gate, for he can not be deceived; for the Lord God is his name.

2 Ne 13:11-15 And again: It sheweth unto the children of men the straightness of the path, and the narrowness of the (strait/w.a.s.) gate, by which they should enter, he having set the example before them. And he said unto the children of men, Follow thou me. Wherefore, my beloved brethren, can we follow Jesus, save we shall be willing to keep the commandments of the Father? And the Father said, Repent ye, repent ye, and be baptized in the name of my beloved Son. And also, the voice of the Son came unto me, saying, He that is baptized in my name, to him will the Father give the Holy Ghost, like unto me; wherefore, follow me, and do the things which ye have seen me do.

Again: THE STRAIT GATE is Jesus Christ. We must not simply believe on His name, but keep His commandments, repent of our sins, and follow His example by going into the waters of baptism as He did, and this too, being administered by a divinely appointed servant of God (see 2 Ne 13:6 & 3 Ne 5:24-26). For sinful man, the completeness of entrance into the Strait Gate (Jesus Christ) comes through the bestowal of the Holy Ghost as an Abiding Comforter, being administered also by those possessed of priesthood after the order of the Son of God by the laying on of hands (see Acts 8:12-17 and Moroni 2). The straitness of this gate is not recognized but by few, though many have sought to enter in by the doctrines of men and by human provisions not compatible with the words of Jesus Christ; and such practitioners are the hirelings referenced by Christ. Again, review Matt. 7:14.

Articles of Faith & Practice

God determined in the beginning with Adam after his transgression that men would have to labor diligently to sustain themselves and those in their charge ("in the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread," Genesis 3:19). God understood that this labor would occupy most of their time so He provided direction by way of com-

mandments to govern their labor efforts. These commandments were given so that we might stay focused on what was ultimately important, which was to worship God.

"Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work," (Exodus 20:9-10).

The Apostle Paul, when writing to the Thessalonians, reminded them of the commandment that he had taught them during his time with them.

"For even when we were with you, this we commanded you, that if any would not work, neither should he eat" (II Thessalonians 3:10).

During the time when the Apostle Paul was in Rome and in prison he wrote to Timothy to provide direction

Article #18

We believe that men should labor for their own support and that of their dependents. Ministers of the gospel are not absolved from this responsibility but when chosen or appointed by the church to devote their entire time to missionary work, their families are to be provided for out of the general church funds. The admonition of Christ that the ministry should not provide purse or scrip for their journey, but go trusting in God and the people, is applicable.

and instruction to this young minister. One of the instructions that Paul left with Timothy was the following:

"But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel" (I Timothy 5:8).

One of the teachings and beliefs of the Church of Christ, which is not common within the world of religion today, is the expectation for the ministry to provide for their own support. It was the Apostle Paul who, again by way of example, taught the importance of the original commandment of God for men to work for their support. The Apostle Paul was a tent maker by trade (Acts 18:3) and labored to support himself and those that traveled with him (Acts 20:34).

"Feed the flock of God which

is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind;" (1 Peter 5:2).

After Alma had ordained priests he taught them the commandments as was given him of God. One of the commandments that Alma had instructed the Priests to follow was:

"And he also commanded them that the priests, whom he had ordained, should labor with their own hands for their support;" (Mosiah 9:57).

Alma provided the reasons for priests to labor with their own hands for their support:

"And the priests were not to depend upon the people for their support; but for their labor they were to receive the grace of God, that they might wax strong in the Spirit, having the knowledge of God, that they might teach with

power and authority from God" (Mosiah 9:59).

"That every man should esteem his neighbor as himself, laboring with their own hands for their support; Yea, and all their priests and teachers should labor with their own hands for their support, in all cases save it were in sickness, or in much want: and doing these things they did abound in the grace of God." (Mosiah 11:154-155)

GOD WARNS NEPHI

REFERENCE: 2 Nephi 1:5-21, 3:22-25, 4:1-20, 29-45.

INTRODUCTION: In our last lesson Lehi and his little band had reached the shores of the Promised Land. They began life in their new home. The seeds so carefully brought from across the ocean were planted in the ground. God blessed the seeds with rain. They grew into fields of tall grain and vegetables. Roaming through the fields and forests of the new land were animals of every kind. There were animals to hunt for meat and animals to tame for farm work.

By this time Lehi had grown very old. He knew that he would soon die. Before Lehi went home to be with the Lord there was something he wanted to tell his family.



A Memorial

e near the one-year anniversary of the passing of a dear sister in the Gospel, a wife, mother, grandmother, aunt and sister in-law. We desire to submit this memorial/obituary as a remembrance of Doris Emily Jensen. She was born September 15, 1918, in Bonner Springs, Kansas, and passed from this life and taken to her heavenly rest Tuesday, August 15, 2003, in Lee's Summit, Missouri.

Her service was held at 9:30 AM, August 15, 2003, at Speaks Suburban Chapel, Independence, Missouri, with interment beside her husband, Apostle Robert Jensen, in Bellevue Cemetery, Bellevue, Nebraska, that afternoon.

Being born of Godly parents, Sister Doris was the oldest daughter of Ethel and Ben Winegar. At just short of 10 years of age she committed her life to Christ, being baptized in Independence, Missouri, on the Temple Lot, and remained a steadfast member of the Church of Christ for over 75 years.

Doris' life changed forever when she met a young man from Iowa who was visiting two aunts. They needed some help getting wood chopped for the coming northern Minnesota winter and he was volunteered to help. She is survived by daughters Marilyn and Vic Ostermiller of Bedminster, New Jersey, Kathy and Ralph Clark of Lone Jack, Missouri, and son David Jensen of Bellevue, Nebraska; grandchildren and great-grandchildren Douglas Ostermiller of Haverton, Pennsylvania, Jeffrey Ostermiller of Mount Laurel, New Jersey, Cindy, Tim and Karah Flemki of Evansville, Wisconsin, Lisa and Terry McGhee of Independence, Missouri, Jerry Clark of Missouri, and his children Crystal and Shawn, and Jacob and Paul Clark of Lone

Jack, Missouri; also sisters Lillian Gould and Vida Hill of Minnesota, sister-in-law Helen Dewaele of Council Bluffs, Iowa, and many nieces and nephews and a host of friends.

She is gone, but her legacy of loving and faith lives on in those who will remember her always. She leaves behind a lasting tribute to the human spirit. Even in her later years when she was in need of much help, Doris continued to share with others her talents of painting and writing poetry. Following is a poem written by Doris in the spring of 1991, showing the beauty she saw in God's gifts of nature.

Alfonso Gradis

March 24, 1946~March 22, 2004

Ifonso Gradis passed away on the 22nd of March,

2004, in a mishap on his way home from work. His family is very torn right now for his loss, and so are we as a group here in Honduras.

Alfonso was born the 24th of March, 1946, and passed away just two days before his birth date. His wife's

name is Gloria Rodriguez Sanchez, and they were married on the 13th of May, 1994, after many years of living together. Both Apostle Alvin Moser and I participated in Alfonso's baptism into the Church of Christ on the 21st of July, 2002. He has left behind his father of 98+ years of age and several brothers. He also left behind six boys and three girls, all mostly grown up, one of which is a member of the

Church of Christ. He was buried on the 23rd of March, 2004, in the community



graveyard.

Alfonso was a very patient man, and always full of good advice. One thing that sticks out in my mind as I remember him is the time we were studying about the responsibilities of a husband and wife, and how a husband has the responsibility to help his wife come to church. The next meeting both he and his wife were late. I chided him for his tardiness, and he said that his wife needed to finish

washing clothes (by hand), so he sat down to help her finish so she could come.

There are not many men in Honduras that would wash clothes by hand to help their wives come to church, but he did—not because it was his custom, but because the word of God told him that he had to help his wife.

Alfonso was a great example for us all.
