



WORSHIP IN SONG AND THE SONG OF MOSES

People of various ages look back with nostalgia on songs of the 50s, 60s, 70s, 80s, etc. The entertainment industry has television extravaganzas to honor the entertainers that sell millions of recordings. They are called "artists" and praised for their achievements. This is the multi-million-dollar enter-

tainment business, pronouncing honor upon itself. But the quality of the product is seldom discussed and the value of its message to the good of humanity is not a consideration.

Other music has been performed with honor over centuries of time because of the quality of its composition and the timeless value of its message. For example, the oratorio "Messiah" George Fredric Handel, has been honored with thousands of performances all over the world, year after year, since its first performance in April, 1742. Church hymns are sung regularly that are even older. Unlike popular music, they continue to be sung generation after generation because they are born of the unchanging gospel message of an unchanging God. Is all this song really important to God? Song and singing are mentioned numerous times in the Bible and Book of Mormon. Let's consider a few references from scripture to provide an answer to this question.

"Now therefore write this song for you, and teach it to the children of Israel: put it in their mouths, that this song may be a witness for me against the children of Israel. For when I shall have brought them into the land which I sware unto their fathers, that floweth with milk and honev: and they shall have eaten and filled themselves, and waxen fat; then will they turn unto other gods, and serve them and provoke me, and break my covenant. And it shall come to pass, when many evils and trouble are befallen them, that this song shall testify against them as a witness; for it shall not be forgotten out of the mouths of their seed: for I know their imagination which they go about, even now, before I have brought them into the land which I sware. Moses therefore wrote this song the same day, and taught it the children of Israel" (Deuteronomy 31: 19-22).

Note that God had ordered Moses to write a song for a purpose important to His plan for the children of Israel. Moses' song was to have impact on the children of Israel in that when they had turned to other gods and broken the covenant this song would testify against them. It would then be remembered many generations later. How long would it be remembered? When would it be sung and what are the words? The answers to these questions were given to John near the end of the first century while exiled from Rome on the isle of Patmos.

"And I saw another sign in heaven, great and marvelous, seven angels having the seven last plagues; for in them is filled up the wrath of God. And I saw as it were a sea of glass mingled with fire; and them that had gotten victory over the beast, and over his image, and over his mark, and over the number of his name, stand on the sea of glass, having harps of God. And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the lamb, saying, *Great and marvelous are thy* works, Lord God almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints. Who shall not fear thee, O Lord, and glorify thy name? For thou only are holy: for all nations shall come and worship before thee; for thy judgements are made manifest.

And after that I looked, and behold, the temple of the tabernacle in heaven was opened..." (Revelation 15: 1-5).

John saw into the future to a time of fulfillment of the purpose of the song of Moses. He saw the saints from among the children of Israel. those who had overcome. They had accepted the new covenant of Jesus, the King of saints, and had stood firm even in the face of death. through the Roman persecution. He saw those who were not influenced and taken away from the pure gospel in the falling away. And the song also stood as a testimony against those who refused its message, turning instead to ritual and idolatry. John must have seen some familiar faces in the scene that unfolded before him. Now, accompanied by the harps of God, they were singing the song of Moses:

Great and marvelous are thy works,
Lord God almighty.

Just and true are thy ways, thou
King of saints.

Who shall not fear thee, O Lord.

And glorify thy name.

For thou only are holy.

For all nations shall come and
worship before thee.

For thy judgements are made
manifest.

In our church practice we often have services in which the principle activity is worship in song. They are important to us and we delight in them. Is there evidence, in scripture, that worship in song is important to the unchangeable God we worship? The answer is yes.

"And these are they whom David set over the service of song in the house of the Lord, after that the ark had rest. And they ministered before the dwelling place of the tabernacle of the congregation with singing, until Solomon had built the house of the Lord in Jerusalem: and then they waited on their office according to their order" (I Chronicles 6:31-32).

"And God gave Heman fourteen sons and three daughters. All theses were under the hands of their father for song in the house of the Lord, with cymbals, psalteries, and harps, for the service of the house of God, according to the king's order to Asaph, Jeduthun, and Heman. So the number of them, with their brethren that were instructed in the songs of the Lord, even all that were cunning, was two hundred four score and eight" (I Chronicles 25:5-7).

"And their meetings were conducted by the church, after the manner of the workings of the Spirit, and by the power of the Holy Ghost; for as the power of the Holy Ghost led them whether to preach or exhort, or to pray, or to supplicate, or to sing, even so it was done" (Moroni 6:9).

Note that the song service that Solomon had assembled was associated with the ark—the dwelling place of God's Spirit and the place of His holy word. Moroni wrote of the Holy Ghost leading the people to sing. So today we continue to honor the Word Made Flesh with song service, singing praises to the unchangeable God and recognizing with honor the grace of God given through the everlasting priesthood of His Son (see Moroni 8:19 and Hebrews 7:24-25). We do so with songs that pass from generation to generation down through time. Like the song of Moses, their words will stand as a witness against those who know but refuse. change or misuse their message.

There is much so-called music in the world today that presents another message. We hear new examples decade after decade, heavy metal, hiphop, rap, etc. Does the Bible comment on any of it adversely? How about rap. I call it "in your face chanting to rhythm." Job agrees, and David also had the experience. Even Solomon commented.

"But now they that are younger than I have me in derision, whose fathers I would have disdained to have set with the dogs of my flock.

—Among the bushes they

brayed; under the nettles they were gathered together. They were children of fools, yea, children of base men: they were viler than the earth. And now I am their song, yea, I am their byword. They abhor me, they flee far from me, and spare not to spit in my face" (Job 30:1, 7-10).

"They that sit in the gate speak against me; and I was the song of the drunkards. But as for me, my prayer is unto thee, O Lord,—" (Psalm 69:12-13).

"It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise, than for a man to hear the song of fools. For as the crackling of thorns under a pot, so is the laughter of the fool: this also is vanity" (Ecclesiastes 7:5-6).

The "crackle of thorns" seems quite appropriate for some things I've heard. By this we see that Satan also understands the natural response to rhythm and song God built into his human creation. But Satan must depend on the rise to popularity of constantly changing musical forms and phrases to keep up an interest in his product, because the message is false and stirs only carnal emotions.

Are you wasting the time and talents God has given you on Satan's ever changing false messages or his efforts to pirate portions of the gospel message and put them to his own carnal uses? Like the song of Moses, music that truly praises God will endure through many generations and uplift mankind throughout time. And some day a new song will be sung before the throne of God. I want to be there to witness and hear. How about you?

"And he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne. And when he had taken the book, the four beasts and the four and twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them harps, and golden vials full of odors, which are the prayers of the saints. And they sung a new song saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; and hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth. And I beheld, and I heard the voice of many angels round about the throne and the beasts and the elders: and the number of them was ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands; Saying with a loud voice, Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honor, and glory, and blessing" (Revelation 5:7-12).

The Fullness of the Gospel-Corrupted

he purpose of the gospel of Christ is to instruct mankind on the exact points of His doctrine, that they might know how to come unto Him to be saved into His Kingdom. What could be more important? That is the reason that from the beginning Satan has sought to distort this message and alter the Lord's written word.

Fullness: Completeness; Gospel: To announce good news, a revelation of the grace of God to fallen man through a Mediator including the whole scheme of salvation, as revealed by Christ and His 12 apostles.¹

Those of Christ's Church have been given a great com-

mission to spread the plain and simple truth of the Lord's Gospel to the World. To do this, we must understand what His gospel is and what it is not. We must also be aware that Satan's disciples have once again perverted the right ways of the Lord. For the first time since the Reformation movement, Roman Catholics, leaders of the Protestants and Eastern Orthodox Churches have received a common, corrupted edition of the Bible.² The stage is now set for the abominable church to become united under one common book and ultimately, one leader. After all, this was, in fact, the goal of several of the leaders on the revision committees.3

"And the angel of the Lord said unto me: Thou hast beheld that the book proceeded forth from the mouth of a Jew; and when it proceeded forth from the mouth of a Jew it contained the fulness of the gospel of the Lord, of whom the twelve apostles bear record; and they bear record

according to the truth which is in the Lamb of God. Wherefore, these things go forth from the Jews in purity unto the Gentiles. according to the truth which is in God. And after they go forth by the hand of the twelve apostles of the Lamb, from the Jews unto the Gentiles. thou seest the formation of that great and abominable church, which is most abominable above all other churches; for behold, they have taken away from the gospel of the Lamb many parts which are plain and most precious; and also many covenants of the Lord have they taken away. And all

this have they done that they might pervert the right ways of the Lord, that they might blind the eyes and harden the hearts of the children of men. Wherefore, thou seest that **after** the book hath gone forth through the hands of the great and abominable church, that there are many plain and precious things taken away from the book, which is the book of the Lamb of God. And after these plain and precious things were taken away it goeth forth unto all the nations of the Gentiles; and after it goeth forth unto all the nations of the Gentiles, ...because of these things which are taken away out of the gospel of the Lamb, an exceedingly great many do stumble, yea, insomuch that Satan hath great power over them" 1 Ne 3:165-175. (All emphasis mine—DLT.)

When the gospel of the Lord proceeded from the *hand* (written record - DLT) of the Apostles it contained the fullness of the Gospel in its purity.

As we can see from the above text, before these records were sent to the world, Satan's church took away the most plain and most precious parts. By doing so, he could freely spread his lies, thus blinding the people's eyes and hardening their hearts, leading countless to their destruction. For over a thousand years, this abominable church simply killed anyone who opposed their doctrine or authority. The Bible itself was

forbidden to own. This came to an end with the Protestant Reformation movement when a few brave individuals translated the Bible into the modern languages of their day. As in the past, several paid with their lives in bringing forth these new Bibles. Although these Bibles were much improved over the Latin Vulgate of the 5th century, because of the changes already made to the text in the first few centuries, corruptions in the Greek text were passed on to these new translations. As a consequence of these alterations, we are told that the Gentiles stumbled and that priestcrafts thrived, resulting in their teaching their own doctrines. (See 1 Ne 3:171-183; 2 Ne 11:80-106; 2 Ne 12:1-12.) As we know, this all changed with the coming forth the Book of Mormon. Since that time "the very points of His doctrine" 1 Ne 4:19 are again known.

One may wonder, as I, why the Lord would allow this corruption to take place to His sacred scriptures. As I pondered this, I remembered Paul's words to the church at Thessalonica when he told them that Jesus Christ would "not come except there be a falling away first" ... "And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believe not the truth," 2 Thess 2:3, 10, 11. It was because wickedness entered into His church that He allowed this perversion to His Gospel. It appears from Jacob's account that this very

thing happened to the Jews of the Old Testament (OT) first. We are told that the Jews were a "stiff-necked" people who despised the words of plainness. So the Lord took away His "plainness" from them "that they may stumble." (See Jacob 3:20-25.) When He used these words and phrases to describe what happened to the Gentiles (1 Ne 3), He was talking about removing part of the gospel from the written word. Accordingly, we have numerous examples of missing books and verses in the OT, as well as the New Testament (NT). For instance, the OT does not have the words of Zenos, Neum or Zenock. The Bible authors themselves quote or paraphrase about 20 other writings that are not found in the Bible.⁴ In addition to these, early Christian writers also said they were quoting scripture, but these words are missing from the OT we have today. For instance, Irenaeus quotes an unknown Jeremiah text (AH 4.22, Dem 78), Justin Martyr said that Psalm 96:10 used to read: The Lord reigns "from the tree," and Barnabas of the first century quotes six additional passages (Barn 2, 6, 7, 11, 15, 16). And both Irenaeus and Clements quote the following omitted verse. Note the similarity between this lost verse and the reading in Nephi: "The sacrifice to God is an afflicted heart" Irenaeus 1 p. 483 Clements III chap. 12 Def: "afflicted" 6031 in Hebrew humble (self) "And ye shall offer for a sacrifice unto me a broken heart and a con*trite spirit*" 3 Ne. 4:49.

Within just a few years of Christ's death, the Apostles record the beginnings of the abominable church and the changing of the gospel. In his Epistle to Galatians (48-53 A.D.), Paul wrote: "I am amazed that you are quickly being transported away from him who has called you by grace of Christ, to a different Gospel, which is not another, except there are some troubling you and desire to pervert the gospel of Christ" Gal 1:6, 7. In about 52 A.D., Paul wrote his second Epistle to the Thessalonians about the "falling away," and that "the mystery of iniquity doth already work" 2 Thess 2:3, 7. A short time later (circa 58 A.D.), he had gathered together the Ephesian Elders to give them this warning: "For I know this, that after my departing shall grievous wolves enter in among you, not sparing the flock. Also of vour own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them. Therefore watch, and remember, that by the space of three years I ceased not to warn every one night and day with tears" Acts 20:30, 31. Around 64 A.D., Peter wrote: "... Even as our beloved brother Paul wrote to you, according to the wisdom given him...among which things are some things hard to understand, which the ignorant and the unsettled ones pervert, as also the other Scriptures, to their own destruction" 2 Pet 3:15,16.

With the other Apostles already martyred, John stood alone as the central authority of the Church of Christ. Between 85 and 95 A.D. he wrote: "Many false prophets have gone out into the World" 1 John 4:1. By the time he wrote Revelation (circa 96 A.D.), there were already false apostles (Rev 2:2) and the Churches of Asia Minor had considerable problems. (See Rev Ch. 2-4.)

We learn from Paul's prophecy in Acts that after his death (he was martyred between 62-67 A.D.), men were to arise in the ministerial ranks that would change the gospel. Paul was not the only Apostle to be killed during this period of great persecution against the Church. According to history and tradition, between 60 and 72 A.D., 8 Apostles were martyred! By 80 A.D., the Apostles Philip and Barnabas were also murdered, and with the martyrdom of Simon in 90 A.D. it appears that John stood alone in the office of an Apostle. So from about 72 A.D. on, with the central authority of the Church of Christ removed, the (abominable) church was free to coexist and to make alterations of their choosing. Early witnesses and modern scholars agree that changes to the scripture took place very early. Many times deliberately!



how the Church of Christ differs from other churches? Or how our church is better than any other? And does it really matter what church we join? If these or similar questions have come to mind then the material presented in this series should be helpful in answering these questions.

We have shown, in the previous article, that there was to

come a falling away from the true faith that was established by Christ 2000 years ago and that an evil power would rise which would overcome the church. But how long was this evil condition to continue within the church? Again our best source for an answer to this question is God's word.

THE TIME OF DARKNESS AND ITS DURATION

(THE WORDS OF THE PROPHETS)

THE PROPHECY OF DANIEL 7

"In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon Daniel had a dream and visions of his head upon his bed: then he wrote the dream, and told the sum of the matters. Daniel spake and said, I saw in my vision by night, and, behold, the four winds of the heaven strove upon the great sea. And four great beasts came up from the sea, diverse one from another. The first was like a lion, and had eagle's wings: I beheld till the wings thereof were plucked, and it was lifted up from the earth, and made stand upon the feet as a man, and a man's heart was given to it. And behold another beast, a second, like to a bear, and it raised up itself on one side, and it had three ribs in mouth of it between the teeth of it: and they said thus unto it, Arise, devour much flesh. After this I beheld, and lo another, like a leopard, which had upon the back of it four wings of a fowl; the beast had also four heads; and dominion was given to it.

"After this I saw in the night visions, and behold a fourth beast, dreadful and terrible, and strong exceedingly; and it had great iron teeth: it devoured and brake in pieces, and stamped the residue with the feet of it: and it was diverse from all the beasts that were before it: and it had ten horns. I considered the horns, and, behold, there came up among them another little horn, before whom there were three of the first horns plucked up by the roots: and, behold, in this horn were eyes like the eyes of man, and a mouth speaking great things. I beheld till the thrones were cast down, and the ancient of days did sit, whose garment was white as snow, and the hair of his head like the pure wool: his throne was like the fiery flame, and his wheels as burning fire. A fiery stream issued and came forth from before him: thousand thousands ministered unto him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him: the judgment was set, and the books were opened. I beheld then because of the voice of the great words which the horn spake: I beheld even till the beast was slain, and his body destroyed, and given to the burning flame. As concerning the rest of the beasts, they had their dominion taken away: yet their lives were prolonged for a season and time.

"I saw in the night visions, and, behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought him near before him. And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed. I Daniel was grieved in my spirit in the midst of my body, and the visions of my head troubled me. I came near unto one of them that stood by, and asked him the truth of all this. So he told me, and made me know the interpretation of the things.

"These great beasts, which are four, are four kings, which shall arise out of the earth. But the saints of the most High shall take the kingdom, and possess the kingdom for ever, even for ever and ever. Then I would know the truth of the fourth beast, which was diverse from all the others, exceeding dreadful, whose teeth were of iron, and his nails of brass; which devoured, brake in pieces, and stamped the residue with his feet; And of the ten horns that were in his head, and of the other which came up, and before whom three fell; even of that horn that had eyes, and a mouth that spake very great things, whose look was more stout than his fellows.

"I beheld, and the same horn made war with the saints, and prevailed against them; Until the Ancient of days came, and judgment was given to the saints of the most High; and the time came that the saints possessed the kingdom. Thus he said, The fourth beast shall be the fourth kingdom upon earth, which shall be diverse from all kingdoms, and shall devour the whole earth, and shall tread it down, and break it in pieces. And the ten horns out of this kingdom are ten kings that shall arise: and another shall rise after them: and he shall be diverse from the first, and he shall subdue three kings. And he shall speak great words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most High, and think to change times and laws: and they shall be given into his hand until a time and times and the dividing of time. But the judgment shall sit, and they shall take away his dominion, to

consume and to destroy it unto the end. And the kingdom and dominion, and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people of the saints of the most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey him. Hitherto is the end of the matter. As for me Daniel, my cogitations much troubled me, and my countenance changed in me: but I kept the matter in my heart" (Daniel 7:1-28).

The main points of this prophecy are as follows:

There were four beasts and upon the fourth there arose ten horns.

Another little horn arose after them.

This horn had eyes and a mouth speaking great things.

This horn made war with the saints and prevailed against them until the Ancient of days came or until a time, times, and the dividing of time.

Judgment is given to the saints.

Time came when the saints possessed the kingdom.

uestion 1 - What were these four beasts?

■ The First Beast: Babylon

■ The Second Beast: Medo-Persia

■ The Third Beast: Greece

■ The Fourth Beast: Rome

uestion 2 - What were the ten horns and the little horn that rose up after them?

"The ten kingdoms of the European portion of the Roman Empire were, in 570 AD., (a date which we will show to be an important milestone in the interpretation of prophecy), Visigoths, Avars, Lombards, Alemanni, Franks, Sussex, Wessex, Essex, Angles, and Jutes. In 1830 AD., the second pertinent milestone, the ten kingdoms were Austria, France, England, Netherlands, Spain, Portugal, Bavaria, Wurtemberg, Naples, and Sardinia" (Chronology of the Bible Augmented With Time Prophecies., pp. 188-189).

"This little horn is intended especially to represent that spiritual power of which the pope is the head and the visible image"-Seven Last Plagues, p. 177 - Rev. Robert Reid, AM. (The Marvelous Work and a Wonder, p. 39).

"Daniel hath described four great empires, not contemporary, but successive one to another. The fourth and last is represented as the greatest of all. After which it is divided into ten kingdoms, and the 'the little horn' groweth not up till after this division. So that this tyrannical power was to arise in the latter days of the Roman Empire, after it

should be divided into ten kingdoms. From Saint Paul, too, we may collect that the great power of the Roman empire hindered the appearing of 'the man of sin': but when that power should be diminished and 'taken out of the way,' then should 'the man of sin be revealed in his time.'...The beast hath also 'ten horns, and upon his horns ten crowns': so that ten complete kingdoms must arise out of the Roman empire before the appearance of the beast" -Bishop Newton, On the Prophecies, p. 714 (ibid., p. 71).

uestion 3 - What were the great words spoken by this horn?

"I do make holy and unholy; I do justify the wicked; I do forgive sins; I open and no man shutteth. All the world is my diocese. and I am the ordinary of all men, having the authority of the King of kings upon subjects. I am in all and above all.... If these things that I do be said to be done not of man, but of God, what do you make me but God?..!, being above all prelates, seem by this reason to be above all gods; whereupon no marvel if it be in my power to change times and abrogate laws, to dispense with all things, yea, the precepts of Christ" -Bolton's, The Great Antichrist, p. 48 (Cited in A)

Marvelous Work and A wonder, p. 57).

uestion 4 - Did the Papacy make war with the saints and overcome them?

"No computation can reach the numbers who have been put to death, in different ways, on account of their maintaining the profession of the gospel, and opposing the corruptions of the church of Rome. A million of the poor Waldenses perished in France: nine hundred thousand orthodox Christians were slain in less than thirty years after the institution of the Jesuits; the Duke of Alva boasted of having put thirty-six thousand to death in the Netherlands, by the hands of the common executioner, during the space of a few years. The Inquisition destroyed by tortures, one hundred and fifty thousand Christians, within thirty years. These are a few specimens, and but a few of those which history has recorded; but the total amount will never be known till the earth shall disclose her blood, and shall no more cover her slain. These were put to death by the secular arm; by that power, of which the empire was the head, and which subsisted in ten kingdoms: for the persecuting ecclesiastical power, condescended to employ kings and emperors as the executioners of its murderous decrees!" - Vol. 3, p. 947 (cited in A Marvelous Work and A Wonder, p. 58).

uestion 5 - How long were the saints to be given into his hand?

"It may not, however, be obvious to every person, that a time, times, and half a time, and 42 months, and 1260 years, are different forms of expressing one and the same number: it is proper therefore to make this plain. A time in the style of prophecy, means a year. A time, and times, and half a time, are one year; two years, and half a year, or three years and a But the primitive year, without intercalary days, consisted of 360 days; therefore three and a half make exactly 1260 days.... Protestant writers on prophecy are now almost universally agreed in opinion, that these days stand for years, and that the real prophetical period signified by them is 1260 years" -Reverend William Cunningham. On the Apocalypse, p. 181, fourth edition (ibid., p. 65).

"Twelve hundred and sixty years is surely the period of these antichristian Gentiles' occupancy of the visible church, and of the true church's captivity, in spiritual Babylon, and of her abode in the wilderness. During that period,

the true church can hardly be said to have any visible form, or distinct organiza-It is by this tion... Antichrist that the daily sacrifice - true religion, and spiritual worship in the church, has been taken away, and the place of Christ's sanctuary - the visible church - has been cast down, trodden under foot by false professing Gentiles, who acknowledge the pope as their head, for more than twelve centuries" - Case's Light on Prophecy, pp. 76, 264 (ibid., p. 66).

"Now all these numbers you will find upon computation to be the same, and each of them to signify 1260 years. For a 'time' is a year, and 'a time, and times, and the dividing of a time' or half a time, are three years and a half; and three years and a half are 42 months, and 42 months are 1260 days, and 1260 days, in the prophetic style, are 1260 years. From all these dates and characters it may fairly be concluded, that the time of the church's great affliction and of the reign of Antichrist will be a period of 1260 years" -Bishop Newton, On the Prophecies, 715 (ibid., p. 66).

uestion 6 - The beginning point of the 1260 years; when did it commence?

"Daniel teaches us that

the date of those 1260 years is to be sought for, not at any era while the Roman empire was one great monarchy, but after it had been broken into ten kingdoms" -Reverend G. S. Faber, On the Prophecies, p. 27 (ibid., p. 70).

"Cardinal Manning: 'In like manner the successive invasion of the barbaric hordes and above all the invasion of the Lombards extinguished utterly and destroyed the last vestige of the Roman Empire in Italy; it was utterly swept away. It existed no longer'" - Independence of the Holy See, pp. 13, 14 (ibid., pp. 74-75).

"Reverend E. B. Elliott, A.M., in his Horae Apocalypticae states that, 'The Lombards, a fresh and barbarous Gothic horde, had but recently come down from the Danube: it was in the year 570, and with the somewhat remarkable exception of Rome and a connected district, had seized upon and established their kingdom in Italy" - P. 398, vol. 1, fifth edition (ibid., p. 75).

"Reverend Bowers:
'They (the Lombards) began their march in the month of April of the Christian era the 568th...upon the reduction of that city, Alboinus was with loud acclamations proclaimed king of Italy by the Lombards and the whole

army, and from that year, the year 570, historians date the beginning of the Lombards in that country" - Bowers's History of the Popes, vol. 2, p. 444, 1750 (ibid., p. 75).

"H. Grattan Guinness, D.D.: 'With the Gothic invasion and the breakup of the western empire into ten kingdoms came the predicted Antichrist'" - History Unveiling Prophecy, p. 63 (*ibid.*, p. 76).

"Reverend Joseph Benson: 'It was not till the subversion of the western empire by the northern nations and the division of it into ten kingdoms, that way was made for the full establishment of the papal usurpation at Rome. 1 - Commentary Published for Methodist Episcopal Church, p. 411" (ibid., p. 76).

"Reverend Philip Allwood, B.D.: 'The north of Italy falling under the dominion of the Lombards, their kingdom became the tenth and last of those which agreeably to the prophetic intimation, should arise within what had been the territories of the empire of the west.... GENERAL SUNDAY SCHOOL ASSOCIATION

DIFFERENCES IN THE SERMONS ON THE MOUNT

INTRODUCTION: Critics of the Book of Mormon have accused Joseph Smith of plagiarism because the Sermon on the Mount in the Book of Mormon is the same as from the Bible. This accusation falls short for two reasons: First if God is an unchanging God then it stands to reason that He would teach the same precepts to the Nephites as He had to the Jews. Second is that closer examination of the two Sermons on the Mount reveals that the two books teach the same doctrines...however there are many remarkable and subtle differences that the critics failed to notice. These differences a copycat surely would have missed or not have considered, especially from an unlearned farm boy such as Joseph Smith. In this multi-part lesson I will go over many of these differences in depth with the scripture differences highlighted in Bold Italics for better contrast. It is not my intent to gloss over the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount but due to these teachings being repeatedly taught in other forums I instead wish to focus on these unique differences. This lesson deals with the different Oral versus Written teaching methods that a side-by-side comparison reveals.

Repeatedly the words "it hath been said" occur in the Bible, while "it is written" occur in the Book of Mormon passages. This seems to indicate the Jews relied more on oral teaching methods, whereas the Nephites relied more on written methods of teaching, in addition to preaching. The Nephites must have gained this because of the importance the brass and gold plates had in preserving their language and religion:

1 Nephi 1:82-83 And behold it is wisdom in God that we should obtain these records, that we might preserve unto our children the language of our fathers; And also that we may preserve unto them the words which have been spoken by the mouth of all the holy prophets, which have been delivered unto them by the Spirit and power of God, since the world began, even down unto this present time.

1 Nephi 5:229-231 Nevertheless, I do not write anything upon plates, save it be that I think it be sacred. And now, if I err, even did they err of old. Not that I would excuse myself because of other men, but because of the weakness which is in me, according to the flesh, I would excuse myself.

Ether 5:26 Thou hast also made our words powerful and great, even that we can not write them; wherefore, when we write, we behold our weakness, and stumble because of the placing of our words; and I fear lest the Gentiles shall mock at our words.

Exodus 4:10 And Moses said unto the Lord, O my Lord, I am not eloquent, neither heretofore, nor since thou hast spoken unto thy servant: but I am slow of speech, and of a slow tongue.

2 Corr. 10:9-10 That I may not seem as if I would terrify you by letters. For his letters, say they, are weighty and powerful; but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible.

Following lessons will cover other fascinating cultural differences between the Sermons on the Mount that will reveal the same unchanging God yet highlight the different cultures between the Nephites and the Jewish peoples.

Matthew 5:21 Ye have heard that *it was said* by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment:

Matt 5:27 Ye have heard that *it was said* by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery:

Matt. 5:31 It hath *been said*, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement:

Matt. 5:33 Again, ye have heard that it *hath been said* by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths:

Matt. 5:38 Ye have heard that it *hath been said*, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth:

Matt. 5:43 Ye have heard that it *hath been said*, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy.

3 Nephi 5:69 Ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, *and it is also written before you*, that thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment of God.

3 Nephi 5: 76 Behold, *it is written by them of old time*, that thou shalt not commit adultery;

3 Nephi 5:79 It hath been *written*, that whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement.

This includes calls to the ministry, the gifts of tongues, revelation and prophecy, etc.

We feel respect for the occasion and the place of worship is of vital importance at all times. Every service should be done reverently with an eye single to the Glory of God, because we come before

Him. We should avoid entering or leaving the sanctuary during times of prayer and preaching. We realize there are needs which cannot wait, but we ask all to care for them quietly so as not to disturb the Spirit of the service. Remember the Lord has promised to be "in the midst" of his people when they meet in His name.

We suggest we come in an attitude of fasting and prayer, but if there are those who cannot fast from food we only ask that you come in a fast from the cares and the things of the world. There will be no meals served in the building during these special meetings.

We invite all to come in an attitude of repentance and humility, and participate in this special time of worship with the hope that we may experience the workings of the Spirit of God in our midst. If you cannot attend, please support the effort with your prayers, and may God bless you according to your special needs.
