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

# THE ENTRANCE

"O then, my beloved brethren, come unto the Lord, the Holy One. Remember that his paths are righteousness. Behold, the way for man is narrow, but it lieth in a straight course before him, and the keeper of the gate is the Holy One of Israel: and he employeth no servant there: And there is none other way, save it be by the gate, for he can not be deceived; for the Lord God is his name" II Nephi 6:79-82.

Chiapas, in the bowels of the Temple of Inscriptions, lay a fabulous buried treasure, unseen for more than 1,200 years. Over it have marched warrior invaders, Spanish conquistadors, treasure hunters, grave robbers and archaeologists, all unaware of its existence because the entrance had never



been discovered.

It was not until the spring of 1949 that the Mexican archaeologist, Alberto Ruz, discovered the entrance to a stair well that descended into the bowels of the temple. By June of 1952 the debris from the stairwell had been cleared and fresh air pumped into the well. At last Ruz was able to enter the room in the depths of the temple and look upon the burial chamber of King Pacal.

Today I wish to consider with you another entrance; not to the riches of a buried Mayan treasure, but the far greater treasure of Life Eternal.

In the December 8, 2003, issue of *U. S. News & World Report* there was an article entitled "The New Evangelicals." Page 38 contained a description of these fast-growing denominations. They are depicted as having "...seeker-friendly services," "market-savvy approaches to expanding the flock" and, in general, a "theological fuzziness."

A forerunner, and perhaps the epitome of such new Christian thought, would be Robert Schuller of California's Crystal Cathedral. In his 1982 book, Self Esteem: The New Reformation, he is critical of the Protestant Reformation, saying, "...classical theology has erred in its insistence that theology be 'God-centered' and not 'man-centered'" (p. 64).

This man-centered theology is the basic foundation of the fast-growing "feel good and be happy" congregations of our day. It should remind a serious Christian of the Apostle Paul's prophecies of the future:

"For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables" (II Timothy 4:3, 4).

The primary goal of every believer should be entrance into the Kingdom of God and eternal life. That was the very purpose of Jesus Christ:

"And he cometh into the world that he may save all men, if they will hearken unto his voice;" (II Nephi 6:45).

Notice the restrictive condition attached: We must hearken to His voice or, as Nephi wrote earlier, we must come "...according to the words which shall be established by the mouth of the Lamb;" (I Nephi 3:194).

We must consider carefully the strictly defined words of Jesus Christ.

"Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it" (Matthew 7:13, 14).

Now the word used for "gate" generally represented the broad entrance into a city or the temple, so Jesus specified the entrance we are seeking; it is the gate which leads to life eternal. The true believer must enter through a "strait" gate (verse 13). Jesus said it would be a "narrow" way (verse 14). This brings us to **Hard Lesson #1**, for it implies the passage is with difficulty. The road is narrow; bounded by obstacles.

Just what are some of these obstacles we must confront? An important one is the idea that your happiness is paramount. Another might involve a conflict of interest between your will and that of God. I still occasionally hear a song that was once made popular by Frank Sinatra - "I did it my way." Other obstacles involve the cares of this life and our concern about material things. The Lord said, "For the gate by which ye should enter is repentance and baptism by water:" (II Nephi 13:24). That repentance involves a change in our way of thinking and living. Nothing could be more difficult!

"And now behold, my beloved brethren, I suppose that ye ponder somewhat in your hearts, concerning that which we should do, after ye have entered in by the way" (II Nephi 14:1).

This applies to us all and it leads us to **Hard Lesson #2**.

One who would enter into the kingdom must be ready to count the cost of discipleship (Luke 9:23). A part of that cost is often self-denial (Luke 9:23) and a readiness to take up our personal cross. (See also III Nephi 5:70–78.) The humble seeker of eternal life must persevere unto the end (Luke 9:62), realizing that salvation comes at the end of the road, not the beginning.

Because of the narrowness of the gate, Jesus said, "...Few there be that find it." (Matthew 7:14). This is **Hard Lesson #3**. Considering today's involvement with ecumenicalism, that thought alone defines our belief as extremist. Today the basic philosophy is that "All believers in Christ make up the church."

Many of you know that I love to read. When not studying the scripture or some Christian reference book, I often relax at the end of the day by reading a chapter in a Christian novel. One thing clearly stands out—how easy is the road one can choose today. I hear it, I read it all the time: just by saying a little prayer, by making a little confession, bingo—you're now a "saved, born again Christian."

But was this the way to the

kingdom that Jesus taught? Jesus said,

"And again I say unto you, Ye must repent, and be baptized in my name, and become as a little child, or ye can in nowise inherit the kingdom of God" (III Nephi 5:40).

What shall we believe about this Jesus? Did He teach a narrow, restrictive entrance into the kingdom? Absolutely! Is it possible there is another, easier entrance into God's Kingdom?

"Verily, verily I say unto you, that this is my doctrine; and whoso buildeth upon this, buildeth upon my rock; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against them. And whoso shall declare more or less than this, and establish it for my doctrine, the same cometh of evil, and is not built upon my rock, but he buildeth upon a sandy foundation, and the gates of hell standeth open to receive such, when the floods come, and the winds beat upon them. Therefore go forth unto this people, and declare the words which I have spoken, unto the ends of the earth" (III Nephi 5:41-43).

# The Fullness of the Gospel-Corrupted

nknown to most, the Vulgate and the New English translations omit about 3000 words to about 200 verses from the New Testament. As we would expect, collectively these versions prepare the way for the unity of the churches and pave the way for an Anti-Christ.

Much could be said about each one of these alterations but here are a few specific examples. After each verse, I have first listed the Bibles that omit the scripture, followed by the early work that supports the KJV reading. It is important to note that every reference listed, unless otherwise stated, dates earlier than the Alpha and B Alexandra readings that were used as the basis for the modern

day translations. Much of the reference material below comes from "O Biblios The Bible":

They remove, "Bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you and despitefully use you" Matt 5:44 KJV. (omitted by RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV marg., RSV, GN, LB, AMP, NASV, NEB, NWT, JB3) (included in Nephi 5:90, Peshitta Syriac, Ethiopian and Gothic versions 2nd Century: Athenagoras, Clemens Alexandrinus, Justin Martyr, Tertullian, Theophilus Antiochus; 3rd Century: Apostolic Constitutions, Origen).

They remove, "For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen" Matt 6:13 KJV, (omitted by DR, RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV marg., RSV, GN, LB, NSRB marg., NEB, NWT, JB. AMP italicizes the words, NASV places them in brackets, indicating "words probably not in the original writings (sic).") (This verse is included in 3 Nephi 5:106, 1st Century: 2 Timothy 4:1 8b (cross reference); 2nd Century: Didache (document of Apostolic Teaching, discovered 1875, (38) p 117), Tatian's Diatessaron, Old Syriac version (Peshitta); 3rd Century: Coptic and Sahidic (i.e. Egyptian) versions).

They remove "God" from "But seek ye first the kingdom of God," Matt 6:33 KJV, (omitted by RV, Ne, NIV, RSV, LB, AMP, NASV, NWT, JB) (appears in the 3 Nephi 6:11, Old Latin and Old Syriac of the 2nd and 3rd centuries, and Didache (2nd Century)).

They remove "to repentance" from "call the righteous, but sinners to repentance" Matt 9:13 & Mark 2:17 KJV, (omitted by DR, NIV, NAS, AMP) (appears in Moroni 8:9, Barnabas –ANF p. 139 (1st Century), Justun Martyr ANF p. 167, Clemens Alexandrinus ANF p. 602; (2nd Century)).

Out of thin air, the NEB adds the words "the rock" after Peter, so that Peter becomes the Rock on which we are to build Christ's church; they changed "Thou art Peter and upon this Rock I will build my church" KJV to "You art Peter, the Rock, and on this rock I will build my church" Matthew 16:18 NEB. (I find no ancient writing whatsoever that supports the NEB claim. II Nephi 12:34, Jacob 3:26-28; Heleman 2:74-75; 3 Nephi

8:43-44, all other Bible translations including DR are against this NEB translation).

They say that the last TWELVE verses of Mark's gospel are not in the oldest and most reliable manuscripts. However, the truth is that these verses can be found in virtually every old source with the exception of the extremely flawed Alpha and B from the fourth century. Their first source, the Vatican Manuscript (B), has a large gap where these verses were "As for the Sinaiticus cut. manuscript, it is written in the same-size letters throughout until you come to the place where the last twelve verses of Mark belong, then the letters become large and spread out, taking up enough extra space to allow the last twelve verses of Mark to appear in the smaller letters that had been used up until this time." Probably fearing a drop in sales, only the 1946 RSV edition has dared to actually omit these verses. Again, this is an attack directly on His gospel. Here are four of the twelve disputed verses: "And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. And these signs shall follow them that believe: In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them: they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover." Mark 16:15-18 KJV, (appears in Mormon 4:86, 87; 2nd Century: Old Latin and Peshitta Syriac versions, Papias, Justin Martyr, Irenaeus, Tertullian; 3rd Century: Coptic and Sahidic versions, Hippolytus, Vincentius, 'Acta Pilati'-by an unknown author, Apostolic Constitutions).

They change "Only begotten Son" John 1:14, 18; 3:16, 18; 1 John 4:9 KJV, to "One and Only" whatever that means (NIV: similar in RSV, GN, LB, NEB) (the phrase only begotten Son appears in Jacob 3:6, 16, Alma 9:54, 55, 68; Irenaeus -Book III, XI, 6; Tertulian -Against Praxeas, XV; Origen -Against Celcus, LXXI: Hippolytus - Against Noetus, Archelaus - Disputation with Manes, 32; Alexander of Alexandria - Epistles on the Arian Heresy).

They change "that Christ, the Son of the Living God" John 6:69 KJV, to "the Holy One of God" or similar meaning (RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV). This reading demeans Jesus the Christ, The Son of God, to only a holy person from God! (Supporting the KJV reading are 3 Nephi 14:1; Mormon 2:41, 4:95; the Peshitta and Hardean Syriac and some copies of the Old Latin; Cyprian - Epistle LXVIII.)

Twelve more verses in John (John 7:53-8:11) are either bracketed or removed, depending on the modern translation, claiming once again that these verses are not in the oldest and most reliable manuscripts."\*

These verses include the famous account of the woman caught in adultery where Jesus writes in the sand. (Early writings which include these scriptures are several Old Latin codi-

ces, the Didache (3rd century document of Apostolic Teachings), Apostolic Constitutions (4th century) and Eusebius (324 AD) citing Papias (150 AD) as recognizing the passage. The Montanists (2nd century) were also aware of the passage. Jerome (385 AD), who included it in the Vulgate after surveying older Greek copies, stating it was found "in many copies both Greek and Latin," before 415 AD.)

They change "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it to you" John 16:23 KJV, to "if you shall ask the Father for anything, He will give it to you in My name." The new translation for this verse teaches that it is no longer necessary for us to pray in Christ's name! (Changed in the NAS, ASV RSV, NASB, NJB.) (Works that support the KJV reading are 3 Nephi 7:27, 8:3, 51, 54, 61, 69, 13:6 Moroni 7:26; Papyri 22 and Cyprian - ANF p. 448 both 3rd century.)\*

They remove "And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said. I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God" Acts 8:37 KJV. In this verse, Philip is telling the eunuch what more was required of him before he could be baptized. One can see why Satan would oppose this verse. It shows us that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and it does not allow for infant baptism. Once again, they remove a fundamental teaching of the gospel of Christ. (Omitted by RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV marg., RSV, GN, LB marg., NEB, NWT, JB. AMP italicizes the words, NASV brackets the

verses) (supported by Old Latin (2nd century), Tertullian (2nd century), Irenaeus (180 AD) and Cyprian (250 AD) – Treatise XII, Book III, 43; Pacian (370 AD) and the Vulgate (5th century).)

They alter "the judgment seat of Christ" Rom 14:10 KJV, to "judgment seat of God" or similar reading (RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV marg., RSV, GN, LB, AMP, NASV, NEB, NWT, JB), which removes Jesus as the judge (in favor of the KJV reading is 3 Nephi 13:43, Mormon 1:86,89,3:22; Polycarp (1st/2nd century), Tertullian and Marcion (both 2nd century)).

They omit "unworthily" from "For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body." 1 Cor 11:29 KJV, (omitted by the RV, NE, NIV, NKJV marg., RSV, GN, AMP, NASV, NEB, NWT, JB) (for the KJV reading 3 Nephi 8:60; Old Syriac versions, Gothic versions; Apostolic Constitutions ANF p. 470 (3rd Century)

They change "Confess your faults" KJV, James 5:16, to "Confess your sins" or similar (DR, RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV, RSV, GN, NASV, NEB, NWT, JB. AMP has "sins" as one of a range of possibilities) "Ruckman(2) p 100-1, (24) p 79-80, indicates that "paraptomata" ("faults") is in ALL existent Greek manuscripts containing the passage and states that "hamartias" ("sins") has NO manuscript authority whatsoever. This example shows how the progenitors of the modern textual critics (Westcott, Hort, Nestle) will willfully (see comments on Col. 2:23) alter the words of God to accommodate Roman Catholicism—in this case the heinous Confessional."

They remove "in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one. And there are three that bear witness in earth" 1 John 5:7 KJV, (omitted by the RV, Ne, NIV, NKJV marg., RSV, GN, LB, NASV, NSRB marg. (insisting that the words have no manuscript authority and are an interpolation), NEB, NWT, JB, AMP italicizes the words.) (Supporting the KJV reading are: 3 Nephi 5:38 which has a very close reading; "the Old Latin text of the 2nd century, including manuscript r (5/6th cent.) and the "Speculum," a treatise containing the Old Latin text, and several fathers. Fuller (4) p. 213, citing Wilkinson, states that the passage was found in the Old Latin Bibles of the Waldenses, whose text pre-dated Jerome's Vulgate. See also Ray (15) p. 98, who states that this "Italic" Bible dates from 157 AD. Also supporting the KJV: Tertullian - Against Praxeas XXV, Cyprian - Epistle LXXII, 12, Cyprian -Treatise I, 6; Priscillian (385) AD), Idacius Clatus (385 AD). Here is the quote from Cyprian (250 AD.): "He who breaks the peace and concord of Christ, does so in opposition to Christ; he who gathereth elsewhere than in the Church, scatters the Church of Christ. The Lord says. I and the Father are one: and again it is written of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, And these three are one."

The name Lucifer is re-


moved from these translations and almost all new Bible dictionaries. In these versions, he also becomes the "morning star," a title that is Christ's alone. "How art thou fallen from heaven. O Lucifer, son of the morning! ... Yet thou shalt be brought down to HELL." Is 14:12, 15 KJV. Notice also that his fate is now the grave and not hell: "How you have fallen from heaven O MORNING STAR, son of the dawn.... But you are brought down to the grave." Here is another example where there are no original Hebrew manuscripts that give the translators authority to make these changes. The KJV reading is also found in 2 Nephi 10:34.

So we see by the above examples that the KJV is far superior when compared to the earliest witness and the Book of Mormon. But when the Book of Mormon came forth, was and is the KJV perfect? The answer is unfortunately, no. Don't get me wrong, they did a fantastic job with the manuscripts they had to work with. And I do believe the KJV with its Antioch majority type scriptures will be "established in one" (1 Ne 3:196) with the Book of Mormon. That said, however, remember that many scriptures were lost in the first and second century that are causing people to "stumble" to this day. This was the reason we were given the Book of Mormon in the first place.

(THE PROPHECY OF DANIEL 2)

"But there is a God in heaven that revealeth secrets, and maketh known to the king Nebuchadnezzar what shall be in the latter days. Thy dream, and the visions of thy head upon thy bed, are these; As for thee, O king, thy thoughts came into thy mind upon thy bed, what should come to pass hereafter: and he that revealeth secrets maketh known to thee what shall come to pass. But as for me,

this secret is not revealed to me for any wisdom that I have more than any living, but for their sakes that shall make known the interpretation to the king, and that thou mightest know the thoughts of thy heart.

"Thou, O king, sawest, and behold a great image. This great image, whose brightness was excellent, stood before thee; and the form thereof was terrible. This image's head was of fine gold, his breast and his arms of silver, his belly and his thighs of brass, His legs of iron, his feet part of iron and part of clay. Thou sawest till that a stone was cut out without hands. which smote the image upon his feet that were of iron and clay, and brake them to pieces. Then was the iron, the clay, the brass, the silver, and the gold, broken to pieces together, and became like the chaff of the summer threshingfloors; and the wind carried them away, that no place was found for them: and the stone that smote the image became a great mountain, and filled the whole earth. This is the dream; and we will tell the interpretation thereof before the king.

"Thou, O king, art a king of kings: for the God of heaven hath given thee a kingdom, power, and strength, and glory. And wheresoever the children of men dwell, the beasts of the field and the fowls of the heaven hath he given into thine hand, and hath made thee ruler over them All. Thou art this head of gold. And after thee shall arise another kingdom infe-

rior to thee, and another third kingdom of brass, which shall bear rule over all the earth. And the fourth kingdom shall

be strong as iron: forasmuch as iron breaketh in pieces and subdueth all things: and as iron that breaketh all these, shall it break in pieces and bruise. And whereas thou sawest the feet and toes, part of potters' clay, and part of iron, the kingdom shall be divided; but there shall be in it of the strength of the iron, forasmuch as thou sawest the

iron mixed with miry clay. And as the toes of the feet were part of iron, and part of clay, so the kingdom shall be partly strong, and partly broken. And whereas thou sawest iron mixed with miry clay, they shall mingle themselves with the seed of men: but they shall not cleave one to another, even as iron is not mixed with clay.

"And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever. Forasmuch as thou sawest that the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands, and that it brake in pieces the iron, the brass, the clay, the silver, and the gold; the great God hath made known to the king what shall come to pass hereafter: and the dream is certain, and the interpretation thereof sure" (Daniel 2:28-45).

**First:** The Lord has made known what shall be in the latter days (vs 28).

**Second:** In the days of these kings God shall set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed (vs. 44).

"The stone smites the image on the feet, the toes of which signify the ten kingdoms into which Rome was divided. These must therefore be in existence at the period of attack: whereas they existed not until after the

days of Constantine. The whole four monarchies symbolized by the gold, silver, brass, iron, etc., must in some way or other be upon the stage together each in an independent form, both when the smiting takes place and when the God of heaven sets up his kingdom" (The Marvelous Work and a Wonder, p. 136).

"These words prove to us that when the kingdom of Christ shall first be established upon earth, there shall be found a representative of each of the four empires existing, each in its proper place.... And it is remarkable that we are now, at this moment, getting into the very position which the prophecy demands before it can be fulfilled. We have had for many ages three of these four empires represented upon earth - Persia representing the second; Turkey (as the possessor of Chaldea) representing the fourth. But there was not, for many ages, a representative of the third, or Grecian Empire. But the nature of the prophecy require four empires, and not three, before the time of the end; and so it has actually occurred, for about the year 1830, the Greek Empire re-appeared again upon the scene, and was established by the great powers of Europe, as a separate and distinct government under Otho, of Bavaria...so that nothing now remains but the establishment of the fifth empire - the eternal kingdom of God, not in heaven, but upon the earth. The Last Vials, pp. 5, 6, May, 1847" (*ibid.*, *P.141*).

"But in consequence of Roman power being now limited to its own original territory, and other powers having sprung up within the territories of Babylon, of Persia and of Greece, the image stands complete in its gold, its silver, its brass, its iron and clay...So that we can say within these three months, 1829, what never could have been said before that the whole image in its fourfold state, is at this time in distinct existence. These observations are important. - An Apology, etc., p. 26, Reverend W. W. Anderson, Literalist, vol. 1" (ibid., p. 141).

According to the words of this prophecy, all fourteen of these image kingdoms were to stand as separate and independent nations before the appearance of this stone kingdom. This brief window of opportunity, (the only time in all history that these fourteen kingdoms stood complete upon their feet), was in 1829/30. The ten kingdoms at this time were Austria, France, England, Netherlands, Spain, Portugal, Bavaria, Wurtemberg, Naples, and Sardinia. These were in existence at the time that Greece, the last of the four great kingdoms, regained her independence. The time was set. God's plan was now ready. And right on schedule. He revealed Himself to a young boy, 14 years of age, and

began to commence His great and marvelous work, one which will eventually result in the restoration of the whole house of Israel, both to the knowledge of the gospel and to the lands of their inheritance. It also brought to an end the reign of the papal Antichrist over the saints of God. Thus, judgment is restored to the saints (see Daniel 7 and Revelation 14), and the Church, the bride of Christ, is again upon the earth. Unlike the former church, set up in the days of Christ, this church will stand forever. It will never again be destroyed, nor be left to other people. ## **ZARAHEMLA**

It had now been almost four hundred years since the Nephites had been led by the Lord to the promised land. A good king named Mosiah ruled over the land of Nephi. The Nephites had forgotten God. They had become so wicked that it was no longer safe for the believers of God. God warned Mosiah to take those who loved Him and flee into the wilderness. Trusting God, Mosiah and his people left the land of Nephi which had been their home for so long. They took the sacred records with them.

As they traveled in the wilderness a great surprise was waiting for them. One day they found a whole new land filled with people! This land was called Zarahemla. Who were these people? Where did they come from? What happiness there was when the Nephites heard their story. "We are from Jerusalem. We were led to this land when Jerusalem was destroyed." There was one great difference between the people of Zarahemla and the Nephites. The people of Zarahemla had brought no records with the word of

God on them. Without His word to teach them, they didn't even believe in God anymore.

# DIFFERENCES in the SERMONS ON THE MOUNT Lesson Two

#### PHARISEES, SCRIBES AND PUBLICANS

There are other differences between the Sermons on the Mount between the Bible and Book of Mormon that highlight certain cultural differences between the Jews and Nephites. These differences are rather obscure and could have been easily overlooked by an unlearned farm boy such as Joseph Smith had he been plagiarizing the Bible as some critics claim. Below I have highlighted these differences in **Bold Italics:** 

Matthew 5:20 For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed [the righteousness] of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven.

3 Nephi 5:68 For *verily* I say unto you, that except *ye shall keep my commandments, which I have commanded you at this time*, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven.

These differences show the absence of the religious sects of Scribes and Pharisees among the Nephites. *Easton's Bible Dictionary* explains that the Scribes and Pharisees were:

**PHARISEES**: "Separatists (Heb. *persahin*, from parash, 'to separate'). They were probably the successors of the Assideans (i.e., the 'pious'), a party that originated in the time of Antiochus Epiphanes in revolt against his heathenizing policy. The first mention of them is in a description by Josephus of the three sects or schools into which the Jews were divided (B.C. 145). The other two sects were the Essenes and the Sadducees. In the time of our Lord they were the popular party (John 7:48). They were extremely accurate and minute in all matters appertaining to the Law of Moses (Matt. 9:14; 23:15; Luke 11:39; 18:12). Paul, when brought before the council of Jerusalem, professed himself a Pharisee (Acts 23:6-8; 26:4, 5). There was much that was sound in their creed, yet their system of religion was a form and nothing more. Theirs was a very lax morality (Matt. 5:20; 15:4, 8; 23:3, 14, 23, 25; John 8:7). On the first notice of them in the New Testament (Matt. 3:7), they are ranked by our Lord with the Sadducees as a 'generation of vipers.' They were noted for their self-righteousness and their pride (Matt. 9:11; Luke 7:39; 18:11, 12). They were frequently rebuked by our Lord (Matt. 12:39, 16:1-4). From the very beginning of his ministry the Pharisees showed themselves bitter and persistent enemies of our Lord. They could not bear His doctrines, and they sought by every means to destroy His influence among the people.

**Scribes**: In later times, after the Captivity, when the nation lost its independence, the scribes turned their attention to the law, gaining for themselves distinction by their intimate acquaintance with its contents. On them devolved the duty of multiplying copies of the law and of teaching it to others (Ezra 7:6, 10-12; Neh. 8:1, 4, 9, 13). It is evident that in New Testament times the scribes belonged to the sect of the Pharisees, who supplemented the ancient written law by their traditions (Matt. 23), thereby obscuring it and rendering it of none effect. The titles 'scribes' and 'lawyers' are in the Gospels interchangeable (Matt.

22:35; Mark 12:28; Luke 20:39, etc.). They were in the time of our Lord the public teachers of the people, and frequently came into collision with Him. They afterwards showed themselves greatly hostile to the apostles (Acts 4:5, 6:12)."

The sect of the Pharisees did not exist until 145 BC and the Scribes did not become theologians, so to speak, until after the Babylonian captivity, both of which occurred well after Lehi's migration to the new world, which explains why the Nephites would not be familiar with such sects and offices. Other differences include the absence of Publicans in the Book of Mormon "Sermon on the Mount":

**Matthew 5:45-47** That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same? 47 And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more [than others]? do not even the publicans so?

3 Nephi 5:91 That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven; for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good; therefore those things which were of old time, which were under the law, in me are all fulfilled.

Easton's Bible Dictionary: **Publican** – "One who farmed the taxes (e.g., Zacchaeus, Luke 19:2) to be levied from a town or district, and thus undertook to pay to the supreme government a certain amount. In order to collect the taxes, the publicans employed subordinates (5:27; 15:1; 18:10), who, for their own ends, were often guilty of extortion and peculation. In New Testament times these taxes were paid to the Romans, and hence were regarded by the Jews as a very heavy burden, and hence also the collectors of taxes, who were frequently Jews, were hated, and were usually spoken of in very opprobrious terms. Jesus was accused of being a 'friend of publicans and sinners'" (Luke 7:34).

Smith's Bible Dictionary: Roman Empire – "1. The first historic mention of Rome in the Bible is in 1 Macc. 1:10, about the year 161 B.C. In the year 65 B.C., when Syria was made a Roman province by Pompey, the Jews were still governed by one of the Asmonaean princes. The next year Pompey himself marched an army into Judea and took Jerusalem. From this time the Jews were practically under the government of Rome. Finally, Antipater's son Herod the Great was made king by Antony's interest, B.C. 40, and confirmed in the kingdom by Augustus, B.C. 30. The Jews, however, were all this time tributaries of Rome, and their princes in reality were Roman procurators. On the banishment of Archelaus, A.D. 6, Judea became a mere appendage of the province of Syria, and was governed by a Roman procurator, who resided at Caesarea. Such were the relations of the Jewish people to the Roman government at the time when the New Testament history begins."

As we can see here also, the office of Publican did not exist any earlier than 65 BC. Neither the words "Publican" nor "Roman" are ever mentioned in the Book of Mormon because Lehi and his family departed Israel well before these entities existed and this is why these names and offices are absent from the "Sermon on the Mount" when Jesus taught this sermon to the Nephites in the New World. There are many of these obscure differences that surely Joseph Smith, or even learned men of his day, would have been ignorant of, or would have overlooked, had they been trying to "create" a new "Bible" of their own in the early 1800s. I also find it very interesting how Jesus so eloquently and seamlessly handles these differences, yet brings forth the same identical teachings, which testifies of a higher intelligence and Divine authorship of the Book of Mormon.



I also told Him just what kind of a marriage I wanted...one centered on Him, His Son and HIS Church. We are told to pray about everything; our future spouse is a very important thing to pray about.

which is good, in faith believing that ye shall receive, behold it shall be done unto you" Moroni 7:26 (also other references found in 1 Nephi 4:13, Enos 1:24, Mosiah 2:36, Alma 13:51, 3 Nephi 8:51, and Matthew 21: 22—EIGHT witnesses!)

Back in the 1940s there was an old time missionary for the Church of Christ that God had led to work in the mission field, teaching the Gospel in Michigan. At the same time, my grandmother had been searching for the TRUE Church of Christ, the one

written of in the Bible...she found it through his teachings. His name was Lewis E. Welch. My grandparents and their children were brought into the church by the convincing of the Holy Spirit; they knew it was true.

About 50 years later, God decided it was time for me to meet old Br. L. E. Welch's great grandson, Bruce Haines. On our first wedding anniversary Bruce and I were enjoying our special dinner, when all of a sudden the Lord brought back a memory to me... one I hadn't thought about in many years. I remembered that as a very young girl I'd had something strange happen to me one day. My family and I were attending a funeral for someone in the Church. It was my first experience at a funeral; I didn't know what it would be like. I remember someone was crying very loudly during the service, but I couldn't see who. I wondered at the time, are all funerals like this? Later

after the service, I was standing with my family and I heard a voice tell me "THE MAN YOU'LL SOMEDAY MARRY IS HERE." I remember looking around to see who said that, but there was no one nearby. I was puzzled, yet I didn't say anything to anyone about it. Then out of curiosity, I looked around to see who WAS there that I knew. I wasn't interested in anyone at that time...I was too young to be thinking about who I would marry!

As the Spirit washed over me and the total RECALL of the experience was brought back to me, I was overwhelmed with the knowledge I'd been given of what had truly happened that day. I wept as I tried to explain it to Bruce: The funeral where I'd had this experience was for his great-grandfather, Lewis E. Welch! I knew then Bruce had been there, sitting over on the family side where I couldn't see him. I didn't know him or his family back then and still don't remember seeing them there. Bruce would have been a young man some years older than I. (A difference of 5½ years is large at that age.) Doing the math, we learned I was only 11½ years old! Bruce confirmed that it was his grandmother sobbing, "Pa, Pa," out loud that I must have heard.

It has taken me some time to understand why this happened, and why it was brought back to me when it was. I believe now that it was only to tell me that God is working in our lives...He knew what was going to happen all along, still giving us our choice, but ultimately knowing us and what choices we would make.

It was a further witness as to how He would work in my life in the years to come.

## **KENYAN ANNUAL YOUTH CAMP 2004**

hom shall He teach knowledge? And whom shall He make to understand doctrine? Them that are weaned from milk and drawn from breasts (Isaiah 28:9). Learn to do well, seek judgment, relieve the oppressed, judge the fatherless, plead for the widow (Isaiah 1:17). These were the readings on the material hung on the entrance of the school gate, which we had rented to hold the Annual Youth Camp for 2004.

Wednesday, the 8th of December 2004, was a special day for most of the youth of the Church of Christ (TL) Kenya. This day was the arrival day to the campsite. The weather was cool and favorable for most of us, and more especially those traveling from far distances. The registration started by 2:30 p.m. for those who had arrived earlier and the exercise took quite some time. We did the registration up to 8:00 p.m., and in total we had 23 congregations.

After the registration all the youths were shown to their respective places of accommodation; afterwards, all were requested to come back to the school dining hall for a word of prayer before our dinner was served. Elder Moses Ohuru was asked to pray for those who had not arrived that the Lord might protect them from all danger and harm, that they may arrive safely. He thanked the Lord for His mercies He had shown to us by guiding and protecting our youths to the campsite, as we had not experienced any breakdowns or accidents. And He remembered all those who had not arrived by that night that they may arrive safely. A prayer was offered by one of the Leaders for our meals and then the

meals were served. After dinner we dispatched the youths to their dormitories to rest as most of them had traveled a long distance and needed rest.

Thursday morning was well planned for; we woke up as earlier as 5.00 a.m. for prayers, then we would have our breakfast, and we started by 9.00 a.m. with introduction, the leaders and the congregations that had arrived. The climate was cool, but there were warm feelings of fellowship as all entered the school dining hall and saw each others familiar faces. For me I can say the anticipation of spiritual blessings and edification began its fulfillment as we joined voices and hearts singing choruses of praises to our Heavenly Father. The seats were filled to overflowing in the congregation. I realized that through the youth's ministry, the restoration gospel through the Church of Christ (TL) will be preached. I looked up on the front side of the dining hall and saw the leaders from the entire congregations and felt such a deep respect and reverence for their dedication and devoted service to God. The thought then came to me how much greater Christ's sacrifice was; my spirit felt encouraged to press forward just by looking at my brothers seated in front of the youths, ready to present their class, and the meeting hadn't even started vet!

Brother Michael, who is an elder in the Church of Christ, opened the program by relating how the Lord had blessed our church and the youths, and how important they were in the Church of Christ (TL), and asked the youths to listen carefully to the teach-

ings and take notes for future reference, and should ask questions where they did not understand. Brother Moses also spoke how important the youths were in our Church of Christ; He said that God has a real purpose for each of us and the young people should play an important part in our church today. He also reminded the youths that they needed to carry on the eternal purpose of God. I, Sister Margaret, was given an opportunity to encourage the youths before the class. I told the youths that we have a responsibility of the Gospel, a responsibility of the restoration; we need to stand up for Christ for the Lord and proclaim the truth to the world. No matter where we are, or what the opposition, we should stand up for Jesus and ensure that the true gospel of Christ goes on. I told the youths that Christ stood for each of us, even when we were unworthy, when we failed from time to time, and that the Lord is always merciful and gives us another chance. I told them that as a young generation we should be courageous and stand alone for the Lord. We should be separate from the world. We need to be the light of the world and tell the people the truth about His teachings from the Bible and the Book of Mormon and His true restoration. I reminded them that it is our turn, because when we couldn't stand, Jesus Christ stood for us.

The leaders were given an opportunity to give their classes as planned earlier; they gave classes on obedience, Restoration, Adulthood Faith and Doctrine, courtship, giving and the difference between the Book of Mor-

mon and the Holy Bible. There were some activities carried in the evenings: these were opening of the Bible and the Book of Mormon; we also did holding the Rod of Iron, and during this activity of holding tight to the rod of iron it rained so much, but our leaders and youths were not moved by the heavy rains. We had selected some of the leaders whom we imagined that they were those yhat were mocking and scorning at those who were faithful in holding tight to the rod of iron,

Now as the faithful (youths) continued to journey, the scorners and mockers were able to deceive some of the faithful ones, by misleading them to the broad way, from the truth that they were taught. Some were misled by materialistic things, like food, money, clothes and big religions! Matthew 7:13 was used as an example. But there were those who were able to endure to the end and the youths enjoyed the activities so much that they wished the camp could have been extended for another one week, but our financial situation could not let us. We had to depart the following day.

Sunday was a blessing day. Elder Moses Ohuru was the one preaching, and the topic was about **Prosperity brings sometimes Destruction** when we don't obey God! His text came from the book of II Chronicles 26:1-21; he explained how prosperity comes. He said it comes when we do things which are right in the sight of God. He quoted an example of how king UZZIAH did that which was right in the sight of God, helped even

though young. He told the listening congregation that when we seek the Lord with all our hearts, the Lord would never forsake us. He gave an expression from vs. 5 which says that King Uzziah sought for the Lord, and God made him prosper. He could not stop it there. He explained why prosperity sometimes brings destruction; he said that it was out of self exaltation, and by not keeping the commandments of God. He said that self exaltation brings self abasement. He asked all those who were in the gathering to be watchful, as most men exalt themselves so high that God cannot be able to use them. We learned from this sermon that God uses humble hearts, and refuses pride! Songs of praises, and choruses were song and surely the spirit of God was felt among us. Many were able to testify how the Lord had blessed them since we started the camp, and how wonderful for them to hear about the Book of Mormon which they hear people talk about as a demonic book, and they desired for more teaching and baptism. One brother testified how he felt about the Church of Christ, and how he desired to become a member, and asked more prayers as his wife had not accepted his testimony and dreams, and that it had been revealed to him that the Church of Christ was a true church and this was where they belonged, and not the Baptists! Many came forth and requested prayers for God's guidance that they may be able to make the right decision in their lives, and this was done by the elders.

Sunday evening was here and we thought it was fair to send those who came from near to their respective villages, as we were running out of food. We created any opportunity to thank all those involved in making this camp a success, and those who have persevered in the restoration gospel through the Church of Christ. The youths were reminded that all we need is a broken heart and a contrite spirit to come into God's house.

I want to thank all those who made this youth camp a success, mostly our Apostles Smith Brickhouse and Brian McIndoo, whom have been supportive in this work; all the brothers and sisters all over the countries of the Church of Christ (TL) who prayed for our youth camp to be a success; your contribution to the work here in Africa means so much to us, more especially the work in Kenya.

May God bless each and every one of you abundantly.
