





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is a good time again to share with you the last part of my testimony, which I wrote in February of 2004.

Now after I received baptism there was a very big change in me because I received the gift of the Holy Ghost. So this time I decided to carry the Book of Mormon and the Bible on my walking ways, while the missionaries were already back in their country. Now what I did, I went to Moja Kwa Moja (straight ahead) to the brothers and sisters to explain to them what I had met and what was the meaning of the Book. When they took heed to all I told them, lastly they said that they had agreed even though they had many questions. From there we started to meet often, according to the days we agreed to fellowship. This time I had an opportunity to teach concerning our church, the Apostasy and the Restoration.

When we were continuing to meet at one of our sister's home, something happened; the same sister was attacked by malaria, and later on she was possessed with demons, and she started prophesying things which seemed to be right to the outsiders. Through this we got many oppositions from the surrounding people, mostly from different churches.

Now she started running here and there shouting that, "Everybody be aware of the demonic church which has come here, and very soon it will take your children to drink blood; already they have started to drink my blood because I had started to feel weak in my body." She also added, "There is a book they have and there is a snake inside, you'll see it when you burn the book."

Brethren, may I tell you this time the hand of God and His power were upon us where God helped us, when we didn't stop meeting to pray day by day at her home. People were astonished because they were seeing us day by day without yelling. This time her husband was not around; he was in the town of Kericho where he was working. May I say that it was a difficult and hard time of which I can't explain.

One day I walked to her home where she was born and this time she had been taken with her father. In the time I intended to enter in the house where she was she started to tell me that, "You are a devil worshiper, so what I can help you is go and burn that book which you have."

This is the time I experienced the power of God. When she was still talking those broken words she added not to touch her. In my heart I started to tell God that, "I know my God, you'll not leave me alone and it is the time You have to show Your mighty power towards Your children."

When I finished this silent praver I felt much power in me, and it forced me to pray in a loud voice by rebuking the devil and his demons. In the time I finished praying I found that sister lying down and in a small voice she was talking, "God forgive me." After this I stretched my hand and lifted her up and I told her, "Get silence, God has forgiven your sins as you have prayed." From that time that sister was normal and from there she is in the church and she is okay.

Few days finished and another chapter raised. Preachers from different churches started to tell people about me and the church I belong to is a demonic church. They went as far as to report to the chief how our church was eating children and drinking blood. The chief was ready to take me into prison, but he changed his mind and decided that he was to do investigation first. This time was a hard time to me because in our house there was none to come even to visit us. Not only that, when I tried to walk on the road if somebody was coming in front of me and noticed that I was the one coming in front of him or her, he or she was to find a way to escape. Bad luck during that time, there was rumors all over the country of stealing children.

One day I went with Brother Michael to the village of Kebabe where we had a gospel meeting. At the time we left home people went to my home and told my wife that "your husband has been found in a certain town with a child running, and he was chased with people who took him to prison and for a short time they didn't find him in prison."

So this thing troubled my wife and she was confused because she knew that I was at Kebabe. When we returned home my wife was surprised and happy to see me again because they had told her that people were going to wait for me on the way to kill me. So this time we stayed in fear especially in my house. The only thing we did this time we just trusted in God to protect us.

After a few days I heard a warning that in the time a child was lost from my area people were to come and burn me, my wife, my children, and my everything. In fact we had a hard life, especially to the members, because we were praying to God to protect our members and their children such that the devil may not have a chance to kill them. But I thank God because He heard our prayers and really He granted His protection to everybody (Psalms 23).

So there is nothing happening around my area like stealing children and I thank God of that because I have seen His hand towards me up to now. From there God has changed things because we have a big number of people who had agreed with the Gospel we are preaching by testifying that it is true, even though they have not joined the church.

It is when I came to know that it is true as the scripture says:

"I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.

"Behold, I will make them of the synagogue of Satan, which say they are Jews, and are not, but do lie; behold, I will make them to come and worship before thy feet, and to know that I have loved thee" (Revelation 3:8-9).

We met with our Nigerian brothers at the airport to take us to where we would spend the night. There were many to welcome us. After a good night's sleep, we had breakfast and set off to our destination, Ibadan. The drive was scenic, with plenty of palm, banana and orange trees. One rule of the road here. the horn must work before the car goes into gear. The people seem to be

Over the next several days we had meetings at the office with the leaders and two others, Paul and Simon, who are from two separate villages that are interested in the Church of Christ. We studied many subjects with them with the purpose to take the information back to their congregations.

There were twenty interested candidates for baptism between the three congregations, so we had three baptism studies in order to understand the knowledge and desire of each individual.

We had the opportunity to visit the town of Adu, about two hours from Ibadan. Samuel drove us in his brother's car that he graciously loaned to us. We were able to visit with some of the members there and speak with interested individuals as well. We were able to open up the church building and hold services. Once again, it rained. We had no power for lights, so we moved the pulpit near the door, where there was still some daylight. Both Smith and I preached here. We also visited with a man who recently lost his wife in an auto accident, leaving three young children, one being a newborn. We asked a blessing upon his family.

A plan was laid out for Samuel to visit Adu every other week. Thankfully, Samuel has a young man named Michael in his congregation who can lead services for him in his absence. When we left Adu and headed back to Ibadan, we had a breakdown, just a tire. Our brothers took care of it and we were on our way. The rough roads can make quick work of a tire.

On the day of the baptisms, a nice spot had been found. The leaders, members and candidates all met and we gathered at the lake. We opened the baptism service with prayer, and one by one they entered the water. According to the Lord's blessing the rain held off until we had finished with the laying on of hands for the Holy Spirit. We believe that the work will flourish here and there will be many more souls won through Christ. There is a great need for ministry to be called; however, in God's time.

We had sacrament services at the Acobo, Alundi and Arissa missions. We enjoyed the sweet spirit with each of these groups of brothers and sisters. In this area there are many denominations teaching different doctrines. These people always appreciate hearing the fullness of the gospel and Christ's teachings from all those who have visited them from the Church of Christ. We ask an interest in your prayers for this area of the Master's vineyard. I hope to visit these dear people once again. As we departed for home, we were asked to tell their brothers and sisters in America that they love them, and to say "Hello."



Forest Eugene Maley

August 21, 1918 – October 27, 2005

orest Eugene Maley was born August 21, 1918, in Perry, Iowa, to Levi Wm. and Frances Lauretta Tullis Maley. His family of eight moved to Lamoni, Iowa, where he attended school and graduated from Lamoni High School. After high school he began his working career as a typewriter repairman and shortly after worked in his relative's wooden leg business in Minneapolis, Minnesota. In those early days he held many jobs around the country, from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, to West Hope, North Dakota. He also attended trade schools in machine tool design and drafting, which then shaped his working career.

As a young man, Forest was a member of the Church of Christ, and later was called to be an elder in the church, and served as General Church Secretary for many years, and briefly as pastor of the Temple Lot Local.

In the early 1940s he came to Independence to a Church conference where he met Minnie "Irene" Yates. A romance blossomed, and on October 5, 1947, they were married. To this union were born five children: David Lee, Rebecca Susan, Bonnie Gayle, Julie Ann, and Mark Dean.

Forest was employed in the Kansas City area as a draftsman and machine tool designer at Butler Man-



ufacturing, Bendix Corporation, and Kenworth Motor Truck. In 1973, because of a shift in available work in his field he, Irene, Julie, and Mark moved to Cedar Falls, Iowa. He worked for several engineering firms in that area. In 1982 he and Irene moved to the Minneapolis, Minnesota area. There he was employed by FMC Litton and worked on weapons systems for the government. In 1988, at 70 years of age, he retired and he and Irene returned to their home in Independence. In 1996 when Irene's health began failing they moved to the home of their daughter in Higginsville, Missouri.

Forest passed from this life on October 27, 2005, in Lexington, Missouri, following a brief hospital stay with deteriorating health. Forest was preceded in death by Irene, his wife of 52 years, his parents, his sister Madilyn and brothers Tom and James. Survivors include one brother, Robert Maley, and one sister, Katherine Moyer, all five of his children, seven grandchildren, three great-grand children and many friends.

Visitation for Forest was held at the Carson-Speaks Chapel in Independence, Missouri, on Sunday, October 30th, at 7 p.m., and the service was Monday the 31st at 10 a.m. Forest's body was laid to rest in the Mound Grove Cemetery, next to his wife Irene, about two miles north of the Temple Lot Church of Christ. He was carried to his resting place by his two sons, three grandsons, and two sons-in-law.

Forest will always be remembered for the years that he was the General Church Secretary, before the days of computer and word processor, and the dedication that he gave to that responsibility.
