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

# GOD'S COMMANDMENTS NOT GRIEVIOUS

ave you thought about how hard it is to keep the commandments of God? Sometimes it seems impossible and we become overwhelmed by the very thought of remembering all of them. Not long ago I was thinking about these things and realizing my humanity and the struggle between the carnal and spiritual man. Pondering this struggle, I was reminded of a scripture God had caused to be written to remind us of the importance of His commandments.

"By this we know that we

love the children of God, when we love God, and keep his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous" 1 John 5:2-3.

We are reminded in this scripture that showing God we love Him is by keeping His commandments. Even more importantly, we are reminded that His commandments are not weighty, burdensome or heavy. God's commandments were never intended to bring us down or burden us, but to protect us from Satan and the evil he desires to do to all of mankind. God. as our Father. has given us commandments to help and keep us in His love and safety, while each commandment brings blessing and good from God to us. The scriptures remind us of how God cares for us when we seek to do His will.

porting you from one moment to another; I say, if ye should serve him with all your whole soul, yet ye would be unprofitable servants. And behold. all that he requires of you, is to keep his commandments; and he has promised you that if ye would keep his commandments, ye should prosper in the land; And he never doth vary from that which he hath said; therefore, if ye do keep his commandments, he doth bless you, and prosper you. And now, in the first place, he hath created you, and granted





unto you your lives, for which ye are indebted unto him. And secondly: he doth require that ye should do as he hath commanded you, for which if ye do, he doth immediately bless you; and therefore, he hath paid you. And ye are still indebted unto him; and are, and will be, forever and ever; therefore, of what have ye to boast?" Mosiah 1:53-59. cursed with a curse, for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation. God reminds us that He blesses us immediately when we strive to keep His commandments. This does not always mean the road will be easy, only that it will be filled with blessing for those striving to keep His commandments. I have heard many testimonies of God's people who were blessed by keeping His commandments. I would like each of us to consider a few of these commandments and how we are blessed when we keep them.

Consider the commandment of tithing. The scriptures tell us the importance of paying our tithing.

"Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings. Ye are the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the fields, saith the Lord of hosts. And all nations shall call you blessed, for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith the Lord of hosts" 3 Nephi 11:11-15.

We read in this scripture of blessing and cursing in regard to giving back to God our tithing and offerings. Since God has provided everything for us, He considers it robbery not to remember His blessings to us by giving back a tenth to Him and more if we are able. In the Church of Christ we understand this to mean that we need to give our tithing to the General Church and it should be able to be used by God to further His work as He should choose. It should not be something we give to the Lord with strings attached or in a place where we are in control of how it is used. Offerings are those extra funds or whatever we are able to give beyond our tithing. In these things we have some opportunity to give for certain uses in God's work that we are able to choose to support.

I have heard so many testimonies of brothers and sisters who struggled financially and yet made the effort to give God ten percent first and foremost and how many blessings they have received. How many have testified of giving back to the Lord even though they did not have the ability to meet all of their debts or needs, and time and time again the Lord provided for them in miraculous ways, fulfilling His promise to open the windows of heaven and pour out a blessing without room to receive it all. This promise shows us again that God does not intend to make our way heavy, but He desires to bless us when we walk in faith and confidence in His commandments.

Many commandments seem small and inconsequential, but they have such great importance in the life of a Christian and the wonderful promise of God's blessing. One commandment I think we do not pay enough attention to is:

"Prove all things; hold fast that which is good. Abstain





from all appearance of evil. And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it" 1 Thessalonians 5:21-24.

Making Godly judgments about good and evil, as well as striving to refrain from going places and doing things that have an appearance of evil, were intended to keep the Christian man or woman from the strongholds of Satan's temptations. We know Satan desires to bind the children of men to bondage in sin, which carries the curse of misery and endless woe. God, on the other hand, gave a wonderful promise with the commandment to sanctify us, or make us holy, able to be preserved blameless until the Lord returns and we share in His joy, which is unspeakable. Most people wish keeping this commandment was as easy as it sounds, and yet we find it very difficult to follow—it requires a constant struggle. Remember the blessing and promise of this struggle found in Matthew 11:28-30.

"Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Once more we see the promise of blessing in our striving to keep the commandments of the Lord. We find rest and comfort in the promise that He wants to lighten our load and never intended the commandments to be heavy. The Lord desires to have a relationship with us and to be our constant companion. He wants to give us a life filled with the blessings of heaven and has shown us the love He has for us. May we each respond to our Lord in love and strive, fight

# Having a love for God is vital to wanting to keep His commandments.

Our yearning to keep the commandments of the Lord and receive the promise of His blessing must stem from our desire to keep the first great commandment.

"Master, which is the great commandment in the law? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment" Matthew 22:36-40.

Having a love for God is vital to wanting to keep His commandments. Most of us do many things to please someone with whom we want a good relationship. It can be no different in our relationship with the Lord. Christ made it very clear when He said:

"If ye love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever;..." John 14:15-16. and desire to keep His commandments and receive a lifetime of blessing.

# Florida Mission

In 2002 the Church approved the organization of groups of members into Missions where there is not ministry present to establish a | ocal Congregation. A Mission recognizes groups that have committed to meet together regularly and be identified and numbered among an official congregation of the Church of Christ.

Referendum Bill #1 of 2002 states in part:

"Missions—

An organized mission is a location where there are at least six baptized members, which meet together regularly, but in the absence of Elders they must depend upon missionaries to perform the Ordinances of the Gospel. Missions are also subject to the Articles of Faith and Practice and are governed thereby.

Missions will operate under the supervision of the Missionary (s) in Charge of the area in which they are located. They will welcome in and receive ministering by General Church officials and visiting ministry whenever circumstances permit them being present.

The criteria for Missions in the Church of Christ shall be as follows:

There will be at least six baptized members.

They meet together on a regular basis to hold meetings such as Sunday School, prayer and testimony service, study classes, song services and preaching services when visiting ministry are present and available.

They will hold their meetings at a predetermined location (home, rental building, church building, a plot of ground etc.). The baptized members of the Mission will elect officers from among themselves, such as a leader or coordinator, secretary, treasurer, bishops' agent, Sunday School teachers, etc.

**Q**A Leader will take charge of organizing and overseeing the services, coordinating with the Missionary in Charge, and make arrangements for visiting ministry to teach and preach to the congregation.

**D**A Secretary or Clerk, who shall take care of the secretarial work of the Mission and keep its records.

CA Treasurer, who shall be the financial agent for the Mission.

CA Bishops' Agent will collect tithing from members, issue receipts and forward the funds to the General Church.

They hold regularly scheduled Sunday School classes for the children and adults alike.

They will be established at the time an organizational meeting is held by the Missionary in Charge, and baptized members who desire to be members of that Mission will then be recorded and recognized as such by the General Church."

Since the approval of this referendum many missions have been established in Africa,





Honduras, Mexico and the Philippines. Each of these groups have been richly blessed by the commitment and united fellowship with others of the "Body of Christ." Missionaries, when able, continue to regularly minister, preach and perform the ordinances of the Church.

This past year a mission was formed here in the states. On April 24, 2005, six members of the Church located in Florida requested the approval to organize a Mission in Altoona, Florida. This was approved by the Missionaries and today the Altoona, Florida, Mission meets regularly at the home of George and Geraldine Payne. They have elected Bro. Tom Barton as their coordinator and Sunday School teacher.

Several missionaries schedule visits to the groups and minister to them as often as possible. Recently my wife Susan and I met with them, enjoying their fellowship. The group has grown in number with others of family attending whenever possible. They have grown spiritually and in their desire to serve. Presently they are studying in the Book of Mormon. Below is a picture of the group outside of the Payne home. Unable to attend the day we were there, but one of the original members of the Mission, is Nina Matheney.

# **Grace versus Works-based** Jaloation

n the previous installment of this article it was shown how it is by the grace of God that we are saved, yet it is by our works we are judged. Many Evangelical and non-denominational sects believe that once you accept Christ and confess Him with your mouth you are saved and cannot ever lose your salvation thereafter. This is clearly refuted by the following scriptures:

Isaiah 29:13 "Wherefore the Lord said, Forasmuch as this people draw near me with their mouth, and with their lips do honour me, but have removed their heart far from me, and their fear

toward me is taught by the precept of men:"

Matthew 7:21-23 "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity."

Luke 6:46-49 "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say? Whosoever cometh to me, and heareth my sayings, and doeth them, I will shew you to whom he is like: He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock. But he that heareth, and doeth not, is like a man that without a foundation built an house upon the earth; against which the stream did beat vehemently, and immediately it fell; and the ruin of that house was great."

James 1:22 "But be ye doers of

the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."

James 2:17-18 "Even so faith, *if it hath not works, is dead, being* alone. Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works."

"Thou James 2:19-20 believest that there is one God: thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble. But wilt thou know, Ovain man, that faith without works is dead?"

Clearly these passages show that only those who keep the commandments and teachings of Christ are true believers. Those who only profess God and worship Him with their lips but deny Him by their works shall not inherit the kingdom of heaven. James plainly states that faith without works is dead... it is utterly meaningless and vain. He also states that the devils believe in God yet surely we know that devils will have no place in heaven. Evangelicals believe that once we are saved we cannot possibly apostatize and fall, yet many of Paul's writings refute this:

1 Corinthians 9:27 "But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any





means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a cast-away."

Philippians 3:11-14 "If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead. Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus. Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

**Hebrews 6:4-6** "For it is impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost, And have tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come, If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put him to an open shame."

Clearly Paul did not take his salvation for granted. He states that he had not yet apprehended this salvation, but that he was pressing forward in the hope of obtaining it. He also stated in Hebrews it was possible for those who had been partakers of the Holy Ghost, who had been enlightened, to fall away into apostasy. The apostle Judas Iscariot is a perfect example. He started out as a chosen apostle who went forth performing mighty miracles like the rest...healing the sick, casting out devils etc., and later betraved Christ and committed suicide, yet hardly any Christian would say he was saved in the kingdom of heaven. Some dismiss this by saying he was never saved or was never a true apostle, but this is ludicrous. The Bible states that Mathias was chosen to replace Judas' ministry, so clearly he had it. Peter had a very sound perspective on the subject of apostasy. He himself denied Christ thrice yet was able to repent and be forgiven. All of the twelve apostles made many mistakes and were rebuked by

#### Acts 1:17 "For he was numbered with us, and had obtained part of this ministry."

Clearly then it is possible for a truly converted and "saved" Christian to apostatize. Israel...God's chosen people...apostatized many times throughout their history and faced harsh punishments when they did. Even chosen men like the prophet Balaam and King Saul were utterly rejected by God after their repeated apostasies. Peter speaks of this:

2 Peter 2:20-22 "For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them. But it is happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire."

Christ time and time again, yet were forgiven. It is common for a Christian to become converted and again entangled in the sins of their previous life, yet many are able to repent and recover. The key word in Peter's passage is being "overcome," wherein the Christian totally apostatizes and fails to repent and goes back to their old ways as a dog returns to its vomit. Typically these individuals become hardened and more evil than they ever had been before they were converted. Our prisons are filled with such individuals.

The next section of this series will cover works, the type of works that Paul states won't save you, and the Christian works that will. A closer examination of the scriptures can help clear up many misunderstandings of Paul's writings that so many stumble over.

Christ's light will always be there, however.

Be honest enough to see the weaknesses in ourselves that we see in others. He read John 15:1-5. If you are able to do good, be sure you understand you had some assistance, and the same goes with evil.

Br. Marvin read James 1:22-24. HE will cause to have things happen when HE desires it, not when we desire it. We have to strive to do HIS will and be the people HE desires us to be. We all need to rise to the need that God puts on our back.

After lunch and a song service our afternoon sermon was given by Elder Allen Kauffman. Br. Allen asked, "What are we willing to give up to draw apart from the world?" Br. Allen read Malachi 3:1-3. We don't have time to play, accumulate riches, etc. Our job is to preach and teach, whether they accept or not.

Do you feel like you are pulling yourself

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away from the love of the world? Do not be attached to these things. Are you willing to give these things up? If you can't, then the love of the Father is not in you.

Anti-Christ, what is it? We need to be prepared—it is in the world. It is a belief that Christ never came in the flesh. Where do we stand with God? What are we willing to give up for God? Are we willing to separate ourselves from contrary things and people? Are we willing to give of our time for the gospel? Separate ourselves from the world.

Br. Allen read James 1:27. We can love each other in spite of our differences. We can still work together-disagree but not be disagreeable. We're coming to a time when we have to work together.

After supper and a song service our evening sermon was given by Elder Jim Case. Br. Jim asked us, "What is infinity?" Endless...endless what? No beginning and no end. Eternity is the same. If we know just how long we have-does it change what we do at any given moment?

- Another brother related several personal experiences and a story that had been told to him by his wife's grandfather many years ago. He had been on a missionary trip in Yucatan with another of our missionaries. In a dream he saw they were in danger and was told to choose a different route to where they were going. - Romans 15:4—Hope.

How can we have hope if the gospel is always changing? There is an absolute truth of God, but the world teaches otherwise. Read it for yourself...the scriptures tell us.

If you're teaching from the scriptures you are always guiding right. If they disagree, they disagree with God.

After supper and another song service we were blessed to hear yet another sermon.

Br. Steve McGhee told us he feels reunions





are a time of rejuvenation. He doesn't like the term, "re-charging," as he hopes all of us are beyond that. He hopes we come that we might go on to perfection. Some of us are faltering, and some are satisfied.

We are naked without works. We need a plan; not just to keep ourselves unspotted from the world and convert family. It's more. There is more need to have the pure love of Christ! If we couldn't stand the thought of even one soul lost we'd have the pure love of Christ.

He read II Peter 3:1-14—People are willingly ignorant; they don't want to hear the gospel. What are you if you're not the body of Christ? Are you willing for any to perish? The Lord isn't. Aren't we to have the same will? ALL should come to repentance. Do something about it. Watch our numbers grow.

Apostle Roland Sarratt opened the Sunday service by welcoming us to the house of the Lord. He told us that he hopes we have all prepared ourselves for this solemn occasion. She turned around and went to and embraced him. That is what the Lord wants from us....to stop when we are going the wrong way (receiving rebuke) and come to Him with love and joy.
- Another brother testified of God's blessings as he shared a story or two with us. He repeated a story told to him by his wife's grandfather, Skeet Yates, of an experience he had years ago in Yucatan. He was doing missionary work there and he had been told this firsthand by one of the guides who had seen a "prophet." He and his group

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appear at the next town. At one town, the townspeople threw him into a deep well. He got out on his own; thus fulfilling a prophecy.

- The same brother also testified of an incident that happened to him many years ago. He was with two of his young friends out on the street in front of his house. They had small bullets and were throwing them down on the pavement and watching them explode. They laughed, having fun, not realizing the danger involved. He had a larger shell, a 12 gauge, in his pocket he was waiting to use. Just as he was about to throw it down, a man appeared and asked him what he had. He took the shell from him; and he walked away....and he disappeared.
- A brother testified that he had heard many testimonies this day from children whom their Heavenly Father had taken care of. He told of how he was led to tell a group of





young children a story about a wonderful playground they could all go to...if they followed the rules. Afterward, a 3 1/2 year old girl came up to him and asked him where it is and how can she get there? The keys are in the scriptures; the Lord says turn around and come to me! John 3:8 Book of Mormon to loving it, as he was exposed to it. He changed through choice, from a worldly man to a spiritual man.

• Infinity is a concept of time. Our goal should be to change our thoughts on life's preparation. Br. Mike read Psalms 90 where it tells us that man is given a

tells us we have to become as a little child and want to go to Paradise.

**Our final service for the 2006 Missouri Reunion was a sermon given to us by Apostle Michael McGhee**. Br. Mike reminded us our labors are <u>for</u> Christ. Br. Mike began reading at II Nephi 3:42, where Nephi speaks of his spiritual struggles.

He spoke of the powerful sermons we have heard during this reunion. His thoughts of the messages we were given and their points made were:

- Keep ourselves unspotted from the world. He read verses 43 & 44 and admonished us that it is our choice which path we walk on, or flirt with.
- Where will we be found? Will we be found blameless? Will we be cleansed in baptism and remain spotless?
- Do we take time to share this gospel with others? We were challenged to take this gospel to others. Br. Mike read verse 45 and spoke of Br. Prudencio. He told of how early on he went from hating the

fleeting time. He read from II Nephi 3:47-50. He told us of the visit he and Frank had with Br. Prudencio just before he passed away. They prayed for his release. Br. Mike spoke of Br. Prudencio and the largeness of strength and spirit that he had. He used him as an example for us, as we all need to rise to the need which God has placed on our back. He told us of a thought that had come to him a year ago-he pictured Br. Prudencio as being like a huge tree; worn and shriveled, yet producing shade and having much growth underneath. He was a take-charge person, but when he began to fail, others had to step up.

• When we are persuaded by Christ, we must rely on Him as we perform our labors for Him. Br. Mike told us the Philippines can be dangerous, but the Lord's protection is given. He admonished us to listen when a brother or a sister warns you. We don't always like to be given advice, but when it's scripturally sound, we'd better listen. He read verse 53.

- <u>It is not easy to do the right thing, but</u> <u>it's right to do the right thing.</u> We should not compromise or justify other than doing the right thing. There's no other choice than to do the right thing.
- This is our profession, spiritually. What is our goal after we take upon us the name of Christ? The answer should be <u>Eternal Life—sealed incorruptible</u>. Our soul must be sealed, our mind set and we must choose to do right CONTINUALLY. He read verse 57.
- Free to choose only for SELF. Br. Mike asked, How many others have we invited unto Christ, the treasure? He told us of Br. Prudencio's son (oldest of his and Lolita's), who is not a member of the church. He thought the Book of Mormon was a hoax until Br. Prudencio died. Now he is softened. Br. Mike told us of funeral customs there in the Philippines. They traditionally have 7-9 days of full funerals each evening. Sr. Lolita chose to have four. Because of the exposure the older son had to the Book of Mormon during those services, he is now beginning to see that the Bible and the Book of Mormon teach the same. He is now reading it and asking for more material. We all have opportunities where we can be used to further the work of the gospel. If we don't claim the opportunity it may be lost. Seize it, because if we don't...can we still be held blameless?
- <u>Hang in there.</u> Remember the tree he saw representing Br. Prudencio? Br. Prudencio bore fruit because his life was extended. It was through Br. Prudencio that the church made contact in the Philippines. His life had a purpose, and that purpose is now fulfilled. Others there will, and have already, picked up the work.

We are called to be witnesses for Christ.

At the close of the Reunion we were told to remember that each of us has a box of spiritual gifts. Our task is to take this box home, remember it, and **use** them.
