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

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

ver the past couple of years you may have noticed that the Zion's Advocate has gone through some significant changes in appearance. Change is never easy because it always takes us down the unfamiliar path. I remember my mother telling me a story about myself when I was a young child. She told me that she had a very hard time convincing me to give up my old full length pajamas (you know, the ones with the feet that button up the front) for the brand-new ones that she had bought for me. To me, my

old pajamas were comfortable and I felt they still had some more good nights left in them. My mom could see that I had worn holes through the feet and knees, along with the many stains from all the good things my mom had given me for breakfast that had not quite made it to my mouth. I would finally relinquish my old pajamas and wear the new ones and it would not be long until the new pajamas became my companion at night again.

It is my prayer that the changes that you have experienced with the new format of the *Zion's Advocate* will become your familiar companion once again.

To help you with making the adjustment to the new format I want to provide you with some of the reasons behind the changes. One of the biggest changes made was going from black and white to a full-color format, which required changing the paper type and sheen for improved quality. I know there are some that find this change most difficult, but it was done in an effort to bring to life our people and experiences through pictures, along with the written text, while maintaining the integrity and

dignity of the paper. We want all age groups to be interested and excited in the work of the Lord by looking at the published pictures and reading the articles or having the articles read to them. The map and list of Apostles on the back of the front page is a reminder to us all that the world is before us and our God is our strength. I am reminded of the following scripture verse: "And thus we see, that by small means, the Lord can bring about great things" (1 Nephi 5:36).

You may have noticed that the Advocate is being published every other month. There are several reasons for this change, which are:

- Cost To publish the Advocate monthly in its present format would place it outside the constraints of the current budget.
- Contribution the majority of the published content is provided by volunteers.
- Content The contributions must conform to Church doctrine, beliefs and practices in order to fulfill our mission as "Zion's Advocate," thus becoming an extension to our missionary outreach.

Another change you may have seen is that the "Notices"

have been relegated to the second to the last page, thus being reduced (i.e. Camp for all Ages, Women's Retreat and Obituary notices) to fit on that page. These changes have been made in an effort to be fair to all while controlling costs by maintaining a certain amount of pages published per issue (20 pages).

With the major changes behind us our focus is now consistency with the new format so that the readership (that would be you) will look forward to reading editorials, articles, mini series on specific subjects, testimonies, local news reports and notices (i.e. future events, obituaries, and available books, tracts, and lessons).

God has blessed us with many new brothers and sisters in Christ who have joined us in these last days to be a witness to the world that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and that He has given authority to His church to represent him here on earth. Our missionaries, being led by the Spirit of God, are traveling many miles across many nations doing the will of our Father in fulfillment of the following prophecy:

"...And blessed are they who shall seek to bring forth my Zion at that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost..." (1 Nephi 3:185-187).

Let us all be diligent in being *Zion's Advocate* by seeking new ways to:


Oblations

A STATEMENT FROM THE COUNCIL OF APOSTLES AND THE GENERAL BISHOPRIC REGARDING TITHES AND OFFERINGS.

The Council of Apostles and the Bishops wish to clarify to the Church the commandment and subsequent blessing of the giving of tithes and offerings, what these free will offerings consist of, who they should be given to and the associated blessings promised.

The Book of Mormon states in 3 Nephi 11:1-19:

"And now it came to pass that when Jesus had expounded all the scriptures in one, which they had written, he commanded them that they should teach the things which he had expounded unto them. And it came to pass that he commanded them that they should write the words which the Father had given unto Malachi, which he should tell unto them. And it came to pass that after they were written, he expounded them... Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ve



say. Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings. Ye are cursed with a curse, for ye have robbed me. even this whole nation. Bring ve all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in my house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the fields, saith the Lord of hosts. And all nations shall call you blessed, for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith the Lord of hosts."

So important is this instruction and promise that Christ, after teaching His doctrine in the Americas, felt led to instruct the Nephites to record these words of Malachi that they would have them and that we would know today that Christ gave them utmost significance.

We are not to rob the Lord "in tithes and offerings." We are not to be negligent in our responsibility.

The Apostles and Bishops therefore sense the need to clarify what is the Church's belief on the giving of tithes and offerings.

• TITHES

- A. Generally calculated as being 10 percent of your increase (income). Hebrews 7:1-9; Alma 10:8, 9
- B. To be given freely to those in need.
- C. Offerings are intended to support the missionaries, support the poor and

Tithes are not to be done in place of all the other responsibilities of a Christian; rather, in conjunction with them.

- B. Obedience in tithing brings bountiful blessings. 3 Nephi 11:9-13; Proverbs 3:9,10
- C. Tithes are not to be done in place of all the other responsibilities of a Christian; rather, in conjunction with them. Matthew 23:23; Luke 11:42
- D. Tithes belong to God and should be put in the hands of the General Bishopric to be used at their discretion according to instructions from the General Conference. The blessing is in releasing it to the Lord for His use, not ours.

• OFFERINGS

A. God desires us to generously give a portion of our riches to help others. These offerings are to be donated above the paying of tithing. Luke 6:30-34; 1 Corinthians 16:1 clothe the naked. Luke 3:9-11; Romans 15:25, 26; Luke 10:1-12

D. Offerings are also given as needed to the local congregation for their storehouse and administration; also to those that are in need wherever the need might be.

In Summary: The Church of Christ believes in the principle of tithing ten percent of our income. These gifts are to be given to the General Church Bishops who have been appointed stewards over the Lord's temporal affairs. Fulfilling this commandment will result in a multitude of blessings as promised of the Lord and testified by many of the Church.

In addition we are instructed to give offerings to our congregations, missions and the needy throughout the church and the world. These gifts are to be given to Local Congregations, Missions, special Local funds and individuals as each of us feels led.

May the Lord bless us as we strive to do His will.

Fruit of the Spirit





oy is cheerfulness. It is the emotion of great delight or happiness caused by something good or satisfying, the feeling of gladness based on love, grace, blessings, promises and the nearness of God that belongs to those who believe in Christ—that deep abiding inner rejoicing in the Lord.

"And now, behold, if

Joy

Adam had not transgressed, he would not have fallen; but he would have remained in the garden of Eden. And all things which were created, must have remained in the same state which they were, after that they were created; and they must have remained forever, and had no end. And they would have had no children; wherefore, they would have remained in a state of innocence, having no joy, for they knew no misery; doing no good, for they knew no sin. But behold, all things have been done in the wisdom of him who knoweth all things. Adam fell, that men might be; and men are, that they might have *joy*" II Nephi 1:111-115.



Adam and Eve dwelled in the Garden of Eden in a state of innocence. They were content, but they did not know true joy because they knew no misery. However, after they sinned, their eyes were opened and they then knew the difference between good and evil. Once they had experienced misery and sorrow they were able to experience true joy, which is the opposite

"But the fruit of the Spirit is Love, Joy, Peace, Longsuffering, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith, Meekness, Temperance: against such there is no law." Galatians 5:22-23 of misery. In God's plan, "Men are, that they might have joy," but we are not guaranteed joy in this life. Just because we experience misery does not mean we will experience joy. We will only experience true joy if we are faithful servants to God. in the truth of Christ and they were baptized. These people experienced the hardships of life, and then found a better life through Jesus Christ. They were now experiencing great joy and we all have this same opportunity.

We can have joy in this life, but it will not compare to the joy that we will experience in the kingdom of God.

"Then Philip went down to the city of Samaria, and preached Christ unto them. And the people with one accord gave heed unto those things which Philip spake, hearing and seeing the miracles which he did. For unclean spirits, crying with loud voice, came out of many that were possessed with them: and many taken with palsies, and that were lame, were healed. And there was great joy in that city." "...But when they be*lieved Philip preaching the* things concerning the kingdom of God. and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women" Acts 8:5-8, 12.

This scripture is a good example of people having great joy because they put their faith in Christ and turned their lives over to Him. They had evil spirits removed from them, they were healed of their afflictions, they believed "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience" James 1:2-3.

When we have trials in our lives, do we "count it all joy?" This is not an aspect of joy that most of us look for-We often tend to ward to. think of trials as something that we want to avoid, but they are an important part of our lives. They make us stronger, they humble us, and they make us more patient. We should be glad when we have these problems because when we overcome them they make us a stronger, more righteous person. Without problems, most of us would not grow spiritually. When life is going smoothly we tend to get complacent and can become spiritually lazy; some even fall away and are lost.

"But, behold, the righteous, the saints of the Holy One of Israel, they which have believed in the Holy One of Israel; they which have endured the crosses of the world, and despised the shame of it; they shall inherit the kingdom of God, which was prepared for them from the foundation of the world; and their joy shall be full forever" II Nephi 6:42.

We can have joy in this life, but it will not compare to the joy that we will experience in the kingdom of God. God has prepared unspeakable things for those that are willing to serve Him to the end. This joy He has prepared for us will last for eternity and have no end.

The Burden on My Heart

hroughout the days we've spent together there's been a burden on my heart, and every day it got amplified. Our sister Manon kept choosing songs that amplified this burden on my heart. And the other evening the quartet sang so beautifully. *My God Thou Seest Me*. There in the final stanza were the words, Let Israel have light that their eyes once again may see and forever be *blessed*. That's the burden on my heart.

I'm going to turn to some words that I know are favorites to everyone that uses the

Book of Mormon, the words of King Benjamin. Mosiah 2:20: "Even so I would that ve should remember, and always retain in remembrance, the greatness of God, and your own nothingness...." By that he doesn't mean that you have no value. You are of great worth to God. By that nothingness He really means my inability to resolve my problems, to make the correct decisions, to atone for my sins and errors without Jesus Christ, and without the presence of His Holy Spirit.

"And his goodness and long suffering towards you unworthy creatures, and humble yourselves even in the depths of humility, calling on the name of the Lord daily, and standing steadfastly in the faith of that which is to come...." STEADFASTLY. I can't hardly read that word without it reminding me of another of my favorite scriptures, and one that must apply to each one of us. 3 Nephi 3:15,16: "And thus there became a great inequality in all the land." This is talking about a time just before the crucifixion of Christ. There was a time when everyone was expecting Him and wait-

ing for Him, but now a change had taken place, just like changes are taking place in our country. "Insomuch that the church began to be broken up; yea, insomuch that in the thirtieth year the church was broken up in all the land, save it were among a few of the Lamanites, who were converted unto the true faith: And they would not depart from it, for they were firm, and steadfast, and immovable...." FIRM, STEADFAST, IMMOV-**ABLE.** that's what we must be.

Mormon wrote a letter to his son Moroni and he said, "While we're in this tabernacle of clay we have a labor to perform and we must do it diligently." **DILIGENTLY**. What does that word mean? It means we're going to be prompt, it means we're going to be ready at a moment to take up our burdens, our responsibilities. It means when there's a service of the Church of Christ we're going to make every effort necessary to be there and to be there on time and to participate. When there's any activity going on in the Church of Christ we're going to be a

part of it. I can't overemphasize the importance of being steadfast, immovable, unwavering and diligent in our service to the Lord, especially in this day in which we live.

I'm going to go back to King Benjamin: "...Standing steadfastly in the faith of that which is to come, which was spoken by the mouth of the angel...." A few pages before this, King Benjamin had an experience. In the night he was awakened by an angel. Mosiah 1:97: "For behold, the time cometh, and is not far distant, that with power, the Lord Omnipotent who reigneth, who was, and is from all eternity to all eternity, shall come down from heaven, among the children of men and dwell in a tabernacle of clay."

There's another angel that announced the birth of Christ to a group of shepherds on a hillside. Luke 2:8-10: "And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people." We must remember that this announcement—these tidings of great joy—are to all people. Jesus Christ came to minister to all people and to have them become reconciled to our Heavenly Father. eternal in His presence, the message of encouragement, of hope, of freedom from bondage and captivity—that was the message.

But this is the restored gospel—to preach Jesus Christ to every nation, kindred, tongue and people....

In Luke 4:16-19 it says He went back to Nazareth and as was His custom, He went into the synagogue and stood up to read: "...And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when he had opened the book he found the place where it was written, The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the broken hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, To preach the acceptable year of the And he closed the Lord. book." Where was He reading? In Isaiah 61:1 He read, "... To proclaim the acceptable vear of the lord, and he closed the book. And the day of vengeance of our God." Why did He not read that? He didn't read that because that was not His mission at that time. Reconciliation to our Father in Heaven, the offering of life

That last portion of that reading reminds me of another prophecy, the vision of John in Revelation 17:6, 7: "And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven having the everlasting gospel to preach to them that dwell on the earth, to every nation, kindred, tongue and people saying with a loud voice fear God and give honor unto Him for the hour of His judgment is *come*." **THIS** is the day. The hour of God's judgment is coming, is the message for us to be proclaiming. The day of God's wrath poured out upon the nations of the world and those who fight against Him and against our Lord Jesus Christ and against the gospel He brought and restored here.

Yes, we do need to preach freedom and liberty and life and reconciliation to our Father and hope, but we also need to be aware that we're living in the day that is applicable to that verse in Isaiah 61 that Jesus didn't read 2,000 years ago. It is to be read today. People are to be warned today.

We praise the Lord that the gospel was restored here in America. America was the only place that it could have been restored at that time in history. It's easy to get a little proud, happy...comfortable. All over the world, especially the third world, we, America, are known for our pride and feelings of superiority to the rest of the world. In the words of the Apostle Paul to the Gentiles in Rome, "Lest ve be wise in vour own conceits, lest you begin to think of yourself more highly than you ought to." Then he reminded them of God's plan for Israel.

I'd like to remind you of God's plan for Israel. It's important that we recognize Israel's place in the eves of God. That's the burden on my heart. Deuteronomy 32:8-10: "When the most High divided to the nations their inheritance, when he separated the sons of Adam, *he set the bounds of the people* according to the number of the children of Israel. For the Lord's portion is his people; Jacob is the lot of his inheritance. He found him in a desert land, and in the waste howling wilderness; he led him about, he instructed him, he kept him as the apple of his eye." "Apple of His eye"

It doesn't mean what it says literally. In Spanish, we read that verse, "Israel es la niña, de su ojo." That's an idiom of speech also. I want to tell you exactly what that means in Spanish. "Israel is the FO-CUS of God's eye." His eye now, yesterday, in 1830, was focused on Israel. Every prophecy that relates to this latter day work, every prophecy that relates to the restoration of the gospel and on into the future, if you look carefully, there's a subtle meaning that incorporates Israel, that ties and binds the peoples of this restored gospel to the house of Israel.

And where is Israel? Deuteronomy 4:26-29: "I call heaven and earth to witness against you this day, that ye shall soon utterly perish from off the land whereunto ve go over Jordan to possess it; ye shall not prolong your days upon it, but shall utterly be destroyed. And the Lord shall scatter you among the nations, and ye shall be left few in number among the heathen, whither the Lord shall lead you. And there ye shall serve gods, the work of men's hands, wood and stone, which neither see, nor hear, nor eat, nor smell. But if from thence thou shalt seek the Lord thy God, thou shalt find him, if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul." The vision John saw. the beautiful vision, another angel flying through the midst of the heavens with the everlasting gospel of Jesus Christ to preach to every nation, kindred, tongue and people, because **that's** where we find Israel today.

Not that every nation, kindred, tongue and people weren't intended to hear the beautiful message of Christ. We remember what the angel said—to all people came that wonderful gift. But this is the restored gospel—to preach Jesus Christ to every nation, kindred, tongue and people, because that's where God's focus is, on Jacob, and that's where they are.

I read an interesting article in a newspaper not long ago. I'm reminded of it because we've been writing to men in Argentina, Uruguay and Chile who are asking about the gospel of Jesus Christ. This article said there are a great number of Latinos, people who have lived there all their lives, that have recently discovered that they are really Jewish. How did that happen? Because back in the 1400 & 1500s when the inquisition was going on in Spain and Italy and other nations of Europe many of these Jews, to save their families and their lives, changed their names, converted to the Catholic religion and immi-

grated to America. They have lived here for 400 years as Catholic people but are Ja-They are Israel and cob. didn't know it until recently. I read an interesting article in *Time* magazine about the descendants of Aaron, who they are and where they are. There is the picture of the face of a black man, from a country just north of Kenya, a descendent of Aaron. His DNA carries the proof. This is where Israel is, scattered abroad on the face of the earth among the Gentiles. In Mormon 2:37 is a letter of Mormon addressed to the house of Israel, and also to the Gentiles who have care for the house of Israel. That has been given to us. That is our duty that came with this restored gospel, that came with the fullness of the gospel. We are irrevocably tied together with Israel because of the restoration of the gospel.

In that message of Paul to the Gentiles, "Lest ye be wise in your own conceit," he said blindness in part has come upon Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles come in. The fullness of the Gentiles—there are probably a thousand interpretations of what that means. In the Book of Mormon it's very clear. Nephi is speaking to his followers and to his family and to his brothers. He's telling us about the olive tree and how the natural branches of the olive tree shall be grafted in because of the fullness of the Gentiles. He refers to the latter day after his seed has fallen into unbelief and the Messiah has shown Himself here in America. In the latter day this gospel, this fullness of the gospel. will be revealed to the Gentiles and they will carry it to Israel. That is God's prophecv in Isaiah 11. The same prophecy is in the Book of Mormon, 2 Nephi 9.


A few years ago our Brother Placido's father had a dream, a dream that I believe was inspired of the Almighty. In his dream he was walking in the jungle and he came out into an area that had been cleared. Sitting there by the fence was a young man seated on a rock dressed in a white robe and reading a book. When he saw Brother Placido emerge from the trees he stood up and approached him. He extended the book and said, "Read this." The book was the Book of Mormon. The prophecy that he said to read is the prophecy of Isaiah in chapter 11: "And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious. And it shall come to pass in that day, that the Lord shall set his hand again the second time to recover the remnant of his people...." The man said, "This work has begun with your people." And why has it begun there? Because the restored gospel was taken back to them. The fullness of the gospel, the Bible and the Book of Mormon, were taken back to them and they have come into the fold. Yes, Israel shall be gathered.

The Apostle Paul went on to say "And all Israel shall be saved." This is clarified in the final words of Nephi. 2 Nephi 15:9: "I have charity for the Jew, I say Jew because I mean them from whence I came. I also have charity for the Gentiles. But behold, for none of these can I hope, except they shall be reconciled unto Christ, and enter into the narrow gate, and walk in the straight path, which leads to life...."

My prayer is that even now God is touching the hearts and the minds of people to be ready to receive that gospel message.

hen my daughter was ten years old she kept having trouble with pain in her stomach. The little town of Metaline Falls where we lived had an x-ray machine and nothing else. The doctor x-rayed her and the best he could tell was that one kidney was tipped and had adhesions. We made an appointment to take her to Spokane hospital for surgery. We stayed overnight with some people in Spokane. The people in whose house we stayed were moving at the time. I helped them move and it took all night. Before we left for the hospital we had our daughter administered to. Like most hospitals, if you have a seven o'clock appointment you get in at eleven. It was noon before they were ready. The doctor took an x-ray and couldn't find anything wrong. He took a couple more from different angles and couldn't find anything wrong so he told me to take her home. By this time I had been awake for over 24 hours.

About twenty miles out of Spokane the highway goes by a little town called Clayton. I remember driving by that. The next thing I remember, we were driving down a long gliding hill towards the town of Chewalah. My wife nudged me and said, "Honey." I opened my eyes and looked. My hands were lying in my lap. My wife had been sleeping on my shoulder and my daughter was sleeping on her shoulder. When I woke up I felt completely rested, my eyes

didn't burn or anything. We had driven on a winding road at least 25 miles!

The first week of September Rich and I went to the Oregon coast. When we returned I had a message on my cell phone from my service manager who was in charge of the bank while I was away. On the message she told me that there was a problem with the vault. A vault not working at a bank is not a good thing.

When I arrived Monday Sandra, my service manager, was at the door to greet me. She explained to me that the vault would not open the whole time that Rich and I were gone...this was a total of eight days. I asked Sandra if she was joking about this—it really wasn't a funny joke. She wasn't joking. She told me they tried everything to get the vault open. They even called in our vault specialist to help open it, but nothing seemed to work. The cost of this would be around \$25,000 and there was no guarantee that it would work.

At that time Sandra told me

that there was no other option and lots of people were getting upset that they (we) had no access to our customers' safe deposit boxes and money. I also realized that deposits from our customers had not been processed for a week. This was a huge problem: we had no access to anything.

Now Sandra, who has absolutely no religion in her life, said to me, "Karen, you need to pray about this." She was absolutely right! I went over to my office and sat down at my desk and humbly prayed about it. I asked the Lord if He could please help us in our time of need. Shortly after this I called Rich about the vault and told him that I had prayed about it. Rich told me that he would pray about it also. About fifteen minutes later I asked one of the tellers if he would try and open the vault with me. He told me, "Karen, it's not going to open," and I told him, "Let's give it a try!"

We put our combinations in, reached down towards the handle and turned it. Sure enough. the vault popped right open on the first try. I looked up towards the sky and said, "Thank you, Lord." As other employees started coming into the branch, they all asked if the vault was still closed, and Sandra said to them, "Just ask Karen how it openend." They all came to me and I was able to testify and witness to others of the awesome power of prayer and the wonderful blessing that the Lord gave us.

At the time of this experience, he and two other ministry there were having difficulty with a problem; all three had different ideas on how to handle it. They discerned that they needed to rely on the Lord, that they needed to lay down their differences and let Him direct. After they knelt in prayer they did the Lord's work, and did His will with His strength. They pulled in the same direction. We need to come to the Lord united and in humility.

Another brother spoke of a time when at Ministers' Conference he heard a beautiful harmony with their combined voices. He was in awe and drank in the beauty of it. The second song was the same. It was impressed upon him that when we are working together in unity it is beautiful to God as he hears and feels the harmony. God is bringing us together, even though sometimes it doesn't seem like it. We must not lose sight of it. We can have a beautiful harmony. Immediately following this testimony a song was called for which seemed to fit the very sweet Spirit we were feeling. The phrase stood out, "Let those who love the Lord" as we sang, We're Marching to *Zion* with such feeling that our voices must have been a sweet smelling savor to our Lord.

A brother gave a beautiful testimony of God's hand at work when he told us of his experience two years ago when he was led by the Lord to make an appointment for an exam. He was diagnosed with cancer some time later. Because of the Lord's leading it was caught at just the right time. The blessing he saw was in the knowledge that he was in the Lord's hands; there was a purpose. He knew he could trust in the Lord. The greater blessing is in having these testimonies to share. Our duty is to recognize God's hand at work and the blessings He showers upon us, to do His will and to give Him all the glory.

A brother spoke of an experience that has stuck with him 85 years, from when as a young man his grandfather chose him to go on a missionary trip with him. He believes that there are only two kinds of people: some that are part of the problem and those that are part of the solution. He believes obedience is that ingredient in life that pleases God, and that it behooves us all to look at ourselves and know how we look to God. Our deeds need to glorify God.

A brother told us that his parents lived right in the area of the church for many years, but never knew of the church. It wasn't until many years later, after they had left the RLDS church and moved away, that they met a family and learned of the Church of Christ. His father, who had a belief in the Book of Mormon, told him to read it and have a witness of it himself. That he did, and he was so blessed to have had that. Now he is being blessed with getting to know extended family and share that belief with them.

Another brother spoke of an old

time elder who once administered to a man that cut his fingers off accidentally...God put them back on. As another had given a heartfelt prayer for his unborn child, it was brought back to this brother that God has demonstrated His will when His children come to Him in heartfelt prayer, and that he is confident that His will shall be done on earth and we will be the recipients.

A brother told us he believes these prayer services have made a great difference in past meetings. He told us about a tree in Yucatan which thrives all year long when other trees are dried up. This one is near the city water plant, so it is nourished all year long. We should be like that, always bearing fruit for the Lord. He admonished us to pray that God will be mindful of our desire for His direction.

A brother gave us an admonishment, saying that parents need to find the direction and discipline for their children, for if they don't how can they have it to pass it on to their children. God says to keep His commandments, and that is how we show Him we love Him. The world doesn't know us, for our fruits are not as abundant as they should be. He told us that we should not be just hearers of the word, but doers. We must please God in all our ways.

Another brother told us of a time when he was called upon to administer to a woman. The doctors couldn't do anything for her. During the administration he asked the Lord to close the hole in her heart. The woman asked him to perform her funeral. Days later the woman left the hospital, and the doctors couldn't find a hole in her heart. It is so wonderful when the Lord takes us and uses us. He also told of a time when he asked the Lord for a testimony of the Book of Mormon. He was told by the Spirit, "Why? You believe it."

Another brother told of people in the jungle who want to hear the gospel. It takes a day's wage to travel to a church service, yet they still come. Those that come to services ask for the missionaries to travel into the mountains to visit their family and friends. There are a people there that will listen, they'll take the time.

Another brother told of a job he has taken recently. He feels there is a purpose for his being there. It's not a job he wants to do, but God must have a purpose. He has learned already that it is a time of self-evaluation as his fellow employees have learned that he is in the ministry. He asked if we are afraid people will find out who we are and what we believe in? It IS all about serving Jesus Christ! We must have the strength and courage to do His will. He admonished us that we might be the one link in the chain that sets it all up for Christ; we don't want to be a weak link!

Another brother told of an experience he had when he was 11 or 12 years old. He had dashed out into the street (after looking both directions), but as he was in the center of the road a car was bearing down on him. All of a sudden it was as if a hand stopped him. The car went by and he continued on, not thinking about it again for years. God was there and protected him. In his missionary travels he has seen that in some places all they have is God—their faith is sufficient many times.

Another brother told of a miracu-

lous experience he had as the child of a missionary family. The family was camped in a tent in the area where their father was ministering. One day their father was away, their mother was busy working and the children were playing outside the tent. In the sky they saw a tornado bearing down on them! Their mother quickly gathered the children into the tent and they began to pray. Through the flap of the tent they saw the tornado come right to their tent, then divide in half and go around the tent before joining together again. The force of the tornado was strong enough to lift the children slightly off the trunk on which they were sitting, but no one was hurt!

In another prayer service a comment was made by a brother that hit home to many. We were told that we often refer to "our" church, or "my church." It was pointed out to us that this is wrong—we need to remember it is "CHRIST'S CHURCH!" We do not own it, but it is our responsibility to take care of things until HE returns. We must look to Him for His direction and let Him do the leading.

A sister told us she wonders all the time how can God use her when she is so weak. Then she heard what was said the other day in the service and she knows now that God can use us in spite of our weaknesses.

SOLEMN ASSEMBLY AND CONFERENCE

SOLEMN ASSEMBLY: Two days of supplication to the Lord for the work of the Lord and for the spiritual needs of His people of the kingdom of God, and in preparation for the conference.

BUSINESS MEETINGS: Monday through Wednesday morning.

MORNING PRAYER SERVICES: Prior to the business meetings, Monday through Wednesday.

COUNSEL OF THE MINISTRY: To focus our minds: *"If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land" II Chronicles 7:14.*

The meetings of the church in ancient times were led by the Spirit, and by the power of the Holy Ghost (Moroni 6:9).

Prayer: Supplication and exhortation. The Lord's Prayer: direct, to the point. We need the spirit of prayer. Pray that laborers be sent into the field. Do not multiply words. We need unity of prayer. Seek to unite in prayer to do God's will and go in the same and right direction. Pray for the work. Pray for our enemies. The disciples prayed; Christ had to command them to "pray on." What an expression of faith! They were filled with desire. "Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near" Isaiah 55:6.

Theme of prayers: Pray for the souls of those *"which have eyes, and see not; which have ears, and hear not"* Jeremiah 5:21. And for the effect of the Church of Christ on those outside.

God's people: *"A book of Remembrance was written before Him for them that feared the Lord, and that thought upon His name"* Malachi 3:16 & Nephi 11:19.

Submit to God. Resist the devil. First acknowledge His power, that we are nothing. Then we can resist the devil and tell him to get behind us (James 4:7-10).

His word is one of the most powerful tools to resist the devil. The Lord used it when the devil came to tempt Him in the wilderness. Draw nigh to Him and He will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands and purify your hearts—these indicating action and attitude. Our actions must be motivated by righteousness. Have a godly sorrow. Humble yourself and He shall lift you up.

Spend time with the Word every day. We learn "Line upon line, precept upon precept." It is a lifelong quest. *"Eye bath not seen, nor ear beard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God bath prepared for them that love him"* (I Corinthians 2:9.)

Miracles are done away because of unbelief (Moroni 10:15-21).

This is the Lord's church. He is interested in even the smallest detail. We should put aside our ideas and ask the Lord. He will direct us.

SACRAMENT SERVICE: A communion of the Saints with their Lord, including many prayers and testimonies, and singing of hymns.

SERMONS: Apostle William Sheldon, Apostle Smith Brickhouse, Elder Michael Bevaart, Apostle Placido Koyoc Matu and Apostle Don McIndoo.

Apostle William Sheldon:

We're living so close to the coming of Christ, yet it's so far from the hearts of man today. The Prince of Peace is coming to Zion, the New Jerusalem in this generation. And it is, perhaps, sooner than any of us realize. He will bring with Him a great multitude of those who have gone before us who have had a desire toward God. The things of the here and now will pass away, but the things of God will continue. There are certain things that will happen relative to His coming. The meat of the gospel is written in the prophecies, those things pertaining to our Savior and His judgments which were poured out on Israel in ancient times but will also be in the latter days. He commanded people to come to the Land of Promise from the Tower of Babel, from Jerusalem with Lehi, and now in the latter days to our places of deliverance in Zion and in Jerusalem. These are momentous times.

Apostle Smith Brickhouse

The work in Africa has experienced many blessings and growth. The work now has opened in the Congo with two congregations, one with twenty people and one with forty people. They need our prayers. The work also opened up in India last year. Their belief in reincarnation prevents those people from having hope as we do in the resurrection. There are two groups now meeting for Sunday school. We need strong congregations united in purpose that the body might be whole and may be able to grow spiritually. "This gospel...shall be preached in all the world...unto all nations and then shall the end come...But of that day and hour knoweth no man... Therefore be ye also ready for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh" Matthew 24:14, 36, 44. In the last days there will be two churches, the Church of the Lamb of God whose numbers are few, and the church of the devil. This land is a choice land. It is the place of the New Jerusalem, of the holy sanctuary of the Lord. And also Jerusalem, which will be built up a holy city unto the Lord...two places to be cleansed for holiness. Things are going to happen on this land. The more you know the more you are comforted. We must get this book out because the more a person knows about Christ, the more comfort he has. We need to take this book to others and not be afraid. His people are willing to bear one another's burdens. We mourn with those that mourn, comfort those that stand in need of comfort, and stand as witnesses of God at all times. (See Mosiah 9:39-40.) "May God grant unto you that your burdens may be light, through the joy of his Son" Alma 16:200.
