




The Gift of CHOICE

merica is known throughout the world as a land of economic opportunity available to all its citizens to freely pursue within the established laws of the land. This economic opportunity is predicated on our fundamental freedoms that were established by our forefathers upon their arrival to America when they subscribed to the Mayflower Compact in 1620. The compact basically acknowledged that God was the author of the moral foundation that man should live by, which brought forth and established civil law and order. This theme carried on and eventually became an integral part of the Bill of Rights and then incorporated within The United States Constitution. This free Nation, with our democratic republic form of government, along with our economic opportunities, is a direct result of God's blessing and prophecy concerning this land that we call America, as recorded in the Book of Mormon.

America's industry, after World War II, once focused on defeating the evil that had raised its ugly head to take away individual freedom of choice, now focused its attention to economic growth and opportunity. Some Thoughts on being a FITS BANA TO

ooking back on forty-six years of marriage to my wife Margret, I can clearly see the learning experience involved. But more importantly I can see how beautifully and practically God's word lays out a pattern that, if followed devotedly, leads to satisfaction and joy.

Like many men I tried a more selfish way of conducting marriage. As a result my marriage became a separation and pending divorce. Wisely, we let God's word and the influence of the Holy Ghost intervene in our lives at that critical time. We also sought counsel from an uninvolved person with knowledge of scripture and the nuances of hu-

man behavior. These actions helped turn us away from the destructive course we had been on to a more charitable and forgiving course, saving

our marriage. Caring friends and relatives also helped by their prayers, and by not taking sides or spreading gossip. Twenty-nine years of growing love and devotion to our marriage have followed, like a flower gradually opening to its full-bloomed beauty. So I feel an abiding desire to share with other husbands thoughts drawn from my experiences and from the word of God.

Four scriptural principles come to mind when I contemplate what actions on my part resulted in joy and satisfaction in my marriage. They are in the Bible and Book of Mormon simply stated, easy to remember and simple to apply. But determination and sacrifice are required in the application, the same as with any serious effort for good in our lives.

First: Leave your growing up family and make a new family with your wife. Memorize these words spoken by our Savior in answer to a Pharisee's question:

"—He which made them at the beginning made them male and female, and said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh. Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh..." (Matt 19:5-6).

A husband must take this commandment literally. Throw off any influences, efforts and opinions from your former family that do not honor and respect your wife, and devote yourself first and foremost to her needs and the needs of your new family. You are her husband. Act like it all the time.

Second: Be the love leader in your home and family. Dedicate yourself unselfishly to this cause, making all necessary sacrifices. Consider Paul's words to the church at Ephesus:

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church, and gave himself for it..." (Eph 5:25).

Memorize that statement and link it in your mind to these words from I John:

"Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgement: because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear.... We love him because he first loved us." (1 John 4:17-19).

When a husband wholeheartedly, without fear, loves his wife with a perfect love like the love of Christ for His church (not waiting for her to do ye. And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts..." (Col 3:12-15).

You are her husband. Act like it all the time.

prove her love for him), he will find a happy, responsive and submissive wife in his house. When God made them male and female he designed him (that's you, husband) to initiate love, and her to respond to that love. If you are not getting the response you expect it is time to take stock of what you are initiating.

Third: Be the prime example of charity and forgiveness in your home, just as Christ is for the church. Remember it is part of loving first to forgive first if trouble arises between you and your wife. Pray daily for the pure love of Christ to always be in your heart. Read and reread the following verses often:

"Put on therefore as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, long-suffering, forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also

So if you quarrel, instead of being the first to place blame for the disagreement, be the first to forgive in the same way as Christ has forgiven you. Forgiveness is not words-it is action. This includes the action of exercising the pure love of Christ (all of it) toward her, just as Christ has done toward the Church, and as part of this exercise initiating a discussion of possible solutions to the problem, reflecting on the will of God for your marriage. Memorize the key words in this passage explaining the pure love of Christ:

"And charity suffereth long, and is kind, and envieth not, and is not puffed up, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil, and rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in truth, beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things; wherefore, cleave unto charity, which is the greatest of all, for all things must fail; but charity is the pure love of

Christ and it endureth for ever...pray unto the Father with all the energy of heart, that ye may be filled with this love...that when he shall appear, we shall be like him..." (Moroni 7:51-53).

It is at least as important as auto maintenance or keeping your rifle clean for deer hunting. A wise husband checks often to see if the fruit of the spirit is intact in his life and in

A wise husband checks often to see if the fruit of the spirit is intact in his life and in his household.

An honest reading of these verses will illuminate your strengths and your weaknesses. Review them often and work daily to improve by strengthening your weak areas. Are you easily provoked? Discuss it with your wife. Let her help you to know when you are showing anger. Are you seeking your own (manipulating situations to get things the way you want them without proper regard for your wife's needs and wishes)? Discuss your desires and hers with your wife on a regular basis to avoid the fallout that comes from selfish behavior. Examine each point of your practice of charity in this manner, seeking your wife's input. Soon she will be doing the same in response to your lead—because you have first loved her enough to provide her with an improved husband—you.

Fourth: Constantly test your success as a husband. Call it marriage maintenance.

his household. Memorize the checklist Paul gave to the Galations:

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law" (Gal 5:22).

If these things are not all present in your marriage it is time to seek, with your wife, the intervention of God's Spirit in your marriage in prayer and take the lead in an effort to restore what is missing. If the task is too difficult, seek help from good counsel before it is too late. Remember the condition of your marriage effects more than just you and your wife. It leaves its mark for good or bad for generations to come.

"The Lord is long-suffering, and of great mercy, forgiving iniquity and transgression, and by no means clearing the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation" (Numbers 14:18).

Look around. You can see this truth played out in many families. So we're talking serious business here. Where do you stand as a husband if you are not keeping all of God's commandments in regard to charity and forgiveness in your marriage? Make a commitment to do it right for the sake of your wife, your kids, your church family and future generations.

So to summarize, the four principles I have offered here are:

Leave your growing up family and make a new family with your wife as Jesus taught in Matt 19:5-6.

Be the love leader in your home as suggested in Eph 5:25 and I John 4:19.

Be the prime example of charity and forgiveness in your home as taught in Col 13:12-15 and Moroni 7:51-53.

Constantly test your success as a husband using as your indicator the fruit of the Spirit as described in Gal 5:22.

LISTEN To the Silence

"... Stand still, and consider the wondrous works of God" Job 37:14.

he world today is very busy. We human beings exist in a time when electronic sights and sounds bombard us from all sides. Images of worldly temptations are displayed all over the landscape and in the marketplace. Sounds of wickedness, pictures of evil are displayed on screens in public and in the privacy of the home. There is very little time that is silent in our daily lives. We are constantly distracted by the concepts these images and sounds represent. It is hard to hear God.

In the perfection of Eden Adam and Eve experienced all the joys of God's blessings and creation. The greatest joy was the daily presence and companionship they shared with the Lord Himself. This joy continued as long as those first human beings spent their time listening to, and focusing their attention and activities on, God and His voice. Then Satan entered— intent on his goal—to distract his victims from the voice and guidance of God. Satan appealed to their physical senses in tempting them to doubt God's word and to believe a lie. He appealed to their human nature.

What is the driving force of human nature? It is to satisfy the physical senses. Physical senses respond to various stimuli: sights, sounds, smells, textures, temperatures, thoughts. *THOUGHTS?* Do our physical senses respond to thoughts? *Thought* is: reasoning power; the power to imagine; the process of thinking. The definition of *think* is: to form or have in the mind; to have an opinion (believe); to reflect on (ponder); to call to mind. Notice that the MIND is mentioned in this definition as the location of our thinking—our *thoughts*.

Where are the physical senses located? They exist in the body—the flesh, bone and blood body. What is it that operates the body? THOUGHTS. Our thoughts—which come from our soul, our spirit, our MIND—operate

our body. Solomon states that "...as he thinketh in his heart, so *is* he..." (Proverbs 23:7). Our thoughts generate and control the actions of our physical body. The Scriptures are full of references to show that it is by *thought* that we will be judged.

King Benjamin warned his people: "But this much I can tell you, that if you do not watch yourselves, and your thoughts, and your words, and your deeds, and observe to keep the commandments of God, and continue in the faith of what ye have heard concerning the coming of our Lord, even unto the end of your lives. ye must perish" (Mosiah 2:49). Alma warns that our thoughts will condemn us in his answer to Antoniah (see Alma 9:22-25). Christ warned His disciples against evil thoughts (see Matt 15:19). In Hebrews 4:12 Paul says, "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

God has placed us on earth to make a choice between eternal life or eternal death. He has created all things as a means for each soul to choose either to serve Him and be redeemed through the atonement of Christ and returned to His presence, or to reject Him and be forever cut off from Him. He gave us a body to house our soul, our spirit—to use as a means of making our choices.

"What, know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ve have of God, and ve are not your own. For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (1st Corinthians 6:19-20). Our bodies are to be the Lord's temple. God has placed our souls in a structure that will, by one means or another, cease to exist. The soul He has given us will not cease to exist—ever. The "temple" has a finite allotment of time. It serves as a vehicle by which our soul will travel the path of our daily life. God has given us the right, the privilege, the task of choosing the path. Our path determines our destination: the place where our soul will exist through eternity. (Eternity being a concept beyond our comprehension.) Our path goes through the geography of our daily lives. To a certain extent, we choose the geography through which we travel. How do we do this? We do it by the choices we make in every thing we do, say, THINK. We do it by how we choose to occupy our time while our soul dwells in our body—our temple.

How <u>do</u> we occupy our time? With what do we fill our temple? What substances, sights, sounds, pastimes, adornments, nourishment, thoughts, do we use to occupy and decorate our temple? To what being do we bring honor and glory in our temple?

We must seek shelter, safety, **nourishment** to keep the body alive and able to make choices. *Nourishment* means 1. to provide with food or substances necessary for life and growth. 2. to foster the development of; to promote.

When our basic needs are met, we seek things and people that give us "pleasure." In this current portion of the finite time that God has allotted for all mankind, people have an enormous amount of "free" time, and seek entertainment as a means of filling that time and experiencing "pleasure." What is entertainment? It is popularly described as activity designed to relax, to take one's MIND off of the dreary aspect of maintaining the basic needs of our self, or our family—to DISTRACT.

Do we have any basic needs other than shelter. safety, nourishment? Yes. We need **salvation**. Satan desires, and constantly strives, to DISTRACT us from an awareness of that great need, and from the effort that must be made to achieve it. What does Satan use to distract us? He appeals to our human nature just as he did in the Garden. He offers us many tempting ways to spend our time and occupy our thoughts. One example could be music.

Most people spend some time listening to, or producing, music. Music is sound -noise consisting of combinations of any or all of the following: melody, rhythm, words (thoughts!). Music is defined as: the art of arranging sounds in time to produce a composition that elicits an aesthetic ("aesthetic": from Greek word for sense perception) response in a listener. Music occupies a wide range of type, style—even PURPOSE. Some people have an appreciation for music, some have a talent for it. Some cannot produce it, nor perceive it. Music is generally regarded as a form of "art," the use of skill and imagination in the production of things of beauty.

There is a common axiom— "beauty is in the eye of the beholder," implying that what one individual finds aesthetically pleasing may not be so to another, and that there is no standard. Is there a Godly standard for beauty in art forms? Yes, there is. There are many references in God's holy word that could be quoted, but a most simple direct statement was made by Paul to the Thessalonians: "Abstain from all appearance of evil" (1st Thessalonians 5:22).

Music that contains sounds, images, words (**thoughts**) that are degrading, violent, profane, lewd—or in any way UN-Christlike appeals to that base human nature that the Lord has put us here to overcome. If we fill up the **mind** of our "temple" with these "nourishments"—what will we promote—what will we cause to grow in our soul? Can we judge (make a choice based on a standard) the nature and source of the music we listen to? Current "popular music" can be described—at best—as "frivolous" (1. unworthy of serious attention: trivial. 2. inappropriately silly.), at worst – containing a very dangerous "appearance of evil." It distracts us, as do other carnal temptations—liquor, cigarettes, drugs, partying, etc.,—from the voice of God. To distract us from His voice is the express purpose of Satan.

We run a grave risk of becoming addicted to and makan idol of these distractions—the carnal. "And what worldly things. agreement hath the temple of God with idols? For ye are the temple of the living God: As God hath said. I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Wherefore, come out from among them and be ve separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing, and I will receive you, and be a Father unto you. and ye shall be my sons and daughters saith the Almighty (2nd Corinthians 6:16-18).

Can we hear His voice when we fill the ears of our "temple" with "unclean things"? Will He walk in our

"temple" when we fill it with "unclean things" viewed? We can not. He will not. We must keep our ears, eyes, thoughts ready to hear, see, think His word. Nephi advises us: "Wherefore, I said unto you, Feast upon the words of Christ: for behold the words of Christ will tell you all things what ye should do" (2nd Nephi 14:4). Christ's own words state what He expects of us: "Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness. If thy whole body therefore be full of light. having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as where the bright shining of a candle doth give the light" (Luke 11:35-26).


If Christ were to enter the room as we are "relaxing," could we face Him with a clear mind, with a body (temple) full of light?

Christ is, of course, always in the room with us. He would always speak to us in that "still, small voice." How can we hear Him? By abstaining from, and by avoiding the distractions that Satan dangles before our eyes, our ears, our thoughts, our senses.

Listen to the silence, in stillness, considering His wondrous work.

FIVE POWEREDS

or my tenth birthday my mother gave me a book titled *The Wonders of Biology*. The subject captured my interest and as years went by I earned college degrees in Biology education and a doctorate in invertebrate zoology. With that background I originated, conducted and supervised biological and ecological research projects and taught biological sciences in high school and community college.

I did not grow up with a church affiliation. During my college years I had an ambition to study and do research in organic evolution. So why, in an increasingly secular and anti-Christian world, do I believe those first five words Moses wrote at the beginning of the Book of Genesis? My objective here is to give an answer to that question for myself and for the many others educated in science who believe that God is the architect and creator of life in all of its fascinating and varied forms.

"In the beginning, God created." By these five powerful words Moses gave science an infinitely reliable base from which to observe and explain. Creation is purposeful action. It requires a plan, a reason to execute the plan and a need to have processes and procedures in place for that execution. In short: an intelligent design and the power and resources to bring it to fruition. Biological science has been unknowingly uncovering evi-



dence for this design and the accompanying power and resources for more than a century by using established methods of testing and observation in an effort to explain and predict what occurs in nature.

Microbiologists and organic chemists have pieced together an extensive understanding of how living organisms and our own organs and individual cells, function to produce and use life giving and life sustaining substances. The more these things are understood the more there emerges a picture of myriad sequential and cycling biochemical processes that cannot operate in part. If any part is missing the whole process will fail; therefore, each sequence or cycle of reactions must have originated in complete form. This presents a situation known as irreducible complexity.

Biochemists have worked out many metabolic life processes found in the approximately three trillion cells present in our own bodies. They are called metabolic pathways and they have been charted as sequences and cycles of identifiable biochemical compounds found in living cells. A chart of all metabolic pathways currently known in the human body would be much too large to print on these pages. These pathways offer many illustrations of irreducible complexity and intelligent design. The following describes one such illustration:

The food molecule that powers the energy producing chemistry of nearly all living things is glucose from the digestion of carbohydrates. This process provides one small example of how metabolic pathways work. Within cells, energy derived from glucose is held, carried and exchanged by an oscillation

between forms of a molecule called adenosine phosphate. When energy is available in the cell adenosine diphosphate (ADP) becomes adenosine triphosphate atoms released in the cycling process described above release high energy electrons (e-). These electrons enter an electron transport system and are passed from molecule

(ATP) by the addition of one phosphate unit. When energy is needed for some process in the cell an enzyme breaks the phosphate bond that formed ATP and the molecule returns to its ADP configuration. The breaking of this bond releases energy in the cell. This goes on in every cell of every living thing. The energy to cause these reactions comes from a complex process which breaks down glucose molecules, uses oxygen from the blood, releases carbon dioxide (CO2), produces ATP and provides activated hydrogen atoms. This process involves a repeating cycle of reactions through a series of nine organic com-The ninth compounds. pound is converted to the starting compound in the series by addition of carbon and hydrogen derived from glucose and the cycle repeats.

The activated hydrogen

to molecule in a chain of molecules called cytochromes. This releases a special type of energy into the cell which enzymes can apply to the formation of much more ATP. Like a storage battery, this ATP becomes stored energy in the cell. A specific enzyme must be present to facilitate each reaction that occurs in this process. Enzymes are proteins produced in all living cells from biochemical information provided by DNA.

The cycling molecules, proteins and cytochromes alluded to in the illustration above are all found in living cells. However, only a few are present in the general environment. Most are products of life processes within the cells. This means that the chance of all necessary processes of life starting up simultaneously by accident to begin even the simplest forms of life are virtually

zero. One could take up the equally complex processes of photosynthesis, protein synthesis or the replication of DNA and find similar situations.

The DNA found in the nucleus of every cell of plants, animals and microbes contains all of the information needed to produce every one of the thousands of proteins and other molecules needed for life functions, including the enzymes mentioned above. The DNA also has all necessary information for the development of each human being with all of their individual and personal characteristics from a fertilized egg to adulthood and beyond. each process irreducibly complex patterns of cycling and sequential biochemical processes are in play. The origin of this chemically stored information cannot be explained through natural selection. There must be an infinite intelligent source for the information. As scientists learn more about these processes the whole picture continues to increase in its complexity and its amazing interdependence and coordination. No logical thinking person could imagine a situation in which all of these things could start up accidentally. They are an outstanding evidence for the intelligent design embodied in

those first five words of Genesis, "In the beginning, God created."

Where there is an intelligent design there must also be a designer and a purpose for the design. So why aren't thousands of scientists and teachers coming forward saying all that we have learned and teach calls for the acceptance of a creator God? Well. many are beginning to do this. That is why there is an effort to permit the teaching of intelligent design along with evolution in the schools of some states. However. there is an unwritten rule in place that allows only a naturalistic view based on Darwin's theory of natural selection to be taught in public education. It is called methodological naturalism. The fact that newer discoveries make the theory of intelligent design a more reasonable explanation for the beginning of life on earth and the origin of species is kept out of the discussion.

Teaching and research depend on grants from government agencies and salaries paid by school and university boards. They continue to insist that the naturalistic rule stay in place. Adding to the problem, the world of science is still dominated by scientists, textbook writers and publishers whose arrogant personal agenda

constantly supercedes truth. They don't want anything taught that might bring religion or the Bible into the discussion. They also continue to promote an erroneous and distorted idea of what the founding fathers of our nation intended by separation of church and state by making it apply to all aspects of religion. Behind it all is the reluctance of carnal man to accept that there was "in the beginning" an infinite being that man can not see, explain, describe or control.

What can believing parents of students do? Ask politicians what they believe and vote accordingly. Discuss these things with other parents and make an organized appeal for a fair presentation of all views of the origin of life in the school curriculum. Teach our own understanding at home, at church and in conversations with friends and relatives. Ask your pastor to invite a knowledgeable person to make a presentation on intelligent design as it relates to science and scripture.

emperance is self-control. It is having control or restraint over one's own desires and natural impulses. It is moderation and self-restraint in action.


"And now I would that ye should be humble, and be submissive, and gentle; easy to be entreated; full of patience and long suf-

fering; being temperate in all things; being diligent in keeping the commandments of God at all time;" Alma 5:39.

This scripture, like so many that we have read, gives us several elements of the fruit of the Spirit that we are required to have in our lives. Here, we are admonished to be temperate in all things.
