



EDITORIAL

We are to Bear GOOD FRAJT

"Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away: and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit" (John 15:2).

t the end of my tour in South Korea, as an active member of the US Air Force, I was transferred to Davis Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson, Arizona. One of the things that I remember seeing in my new desert dwelling surroundings were these beautiful orange citrus trees that could be found everywhere on base which were full of fruit. Seeing those oranges on the tree reminded me of an experience that I had early in my military career. One of my friends, after returning from visiting his family in Florida on leave, had brought back a large navel orange for me to try. It was a good sized orange with a thick peel which made it very easy to get to the fruit inside. I broke off a wedge and took a big bite of it that instantly filled my mouth with the sweet juice of the fruit. It was the most delicious orange I had ever eaten, so sweet and juicy. I kept thinking about that experience every time I would pass one of those citrus trees on base. I finally broke down and snatched one of the nicer looking oranges that I could reach off of the tree. With much excitement and anticipation I peeled the orange. The peeling was thinner and the wedges were a bit more difficult to pull apart but it still looked pleasing to the eye. I took a big bite of it and immediately my mouth was filled with the sourest tasting juice that I had ever tasted, more sour than a lemon. Needless to say, I removed the foul tasting juice and orange as quickly as possible without attracting too many onlookers. I later found out that what I had experienced was a Seville (sour or bitter) orange tree which was very popular in the valley and could be found growing wild in some areas. The tree is used for rootstock and is very dependable for grafting other cultivars (cultivated or hybrid) of orange tree for producing fruit that can be eaten or juiced. Well, I had learned a hard lesson that even though the fruit looked the same on the outside its contents were vastly different.

So what does all of this have to do with the topic scripture quoted above?

First of all Jesus is our "rootstock" just like the Seville orange tree is to the cultivars of orange which when grafted into the rootstock can become healthy branches that can produce good desirable fruit. Without a good rootstock the cultivars cannot bear good fruit. If we are not grafted into the rootstock, or in other words, have not accepted Jesus Christ by applying our faith, repenting of our sins and being baptized in His name, we cannot bear good fruit. This does not mean that just because we have repented and are baptized that we will naturally produce or bear good fruit. If so Jesus would not have said, "Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away...." So it is possible to have followed the Word of God by obeying the commandment of repentance and baptism and afterwards bear no fruit. It would be as in the example of the orange tree, once the grafts have been completed and take nourishment from the rootstock they grow and mature. Some branches produce just leaves and no fruit while others develop and produce fruit. So the branches that bear no fruit are eventually removed from the tree as to not cumber the fruit bearing branches.

The key to bearing good fruit after we have been grafted into Jesus Christ can be found in the following scripture verses:

We are to Apply our Faith

"Doubt not, but be believing, and begin as in times of old, and come unto the Lord with all your heart, and work out your own salvation with fear and trembling before him" (Mormon 4:93).

Feast upon the Word of God

"Wherefore, I said unto you, Feast upon the words of Christ; for behold the words of Christ will tell you all things what ye should do" (2 Nephi 14:4).

"For the commandment is a lamp; and the law is light; and reproofs of instruction are the way of life:..." (Proverbs 6:23).

Our Works will Prove our Faith

"Even so faith, if it bath not works, is dead, being alone. Yea, a man may say, Thou bast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works" (James 2:17-18).

Now let us consider what Jesus meant by the concluding statement of the topic verse: "... and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit." I would like to take you back to the example of the orange tree and to the cultivars of orange which had been grafted and were bearing fruit. I have a tangelo tree in my backyard which is a cross between an orange and tangerine. I thin or purge the fruit on each branch every vear after the blossoms have set and the fruit begins to grow on the branches. The purpose of purging the fruit is to remove the fruit that has visible defects. to prevent the branches from breaking under the weight of the fruit as it develops, and to allow the remaining fruit to mature into a more desirable fruit to eat. This thinning process occurs at least two to three times during the growth period of the fruit. By the end of the fruit growing season I have a crop of nice juice filled tangelos to enjoy. Jesus works in our life in similar manner and we can find the purging process in the following scripture verses:

God has Given us Time to Grow

"And the days of the children of men were prolonged, according to the will of God, that they might repent while in the flesh; Wherefore, their state became a state of probation, and their time was lengthened, according to the commandments which the Lord God gave unto the children of men. For be gave commandment that all men must repent;..." (2 Nephi 1:107-9).

He Searches our Hearts

"I the Lord search the heart, I try the reins, even to give every man according to his ways, and according to the fruit of his doings" (Jeremiah 17:10).

We are to Purge Ourselves of Uncleanness

"Be wise in the days of your probation; strip yourselves of all uncleanness; ask not, that ye may consume it on your lusts, but ask with a firmness unshaken, that ye will yield to no temptation, but that ye will serve the true and living God" (Mormon 4:94).

"He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).

The scriptures are plain where God does plan to harvest His vineyard,

or in other words, there will be an end to this mortal life.

"Wherefore I will lay up unto mine own self of the fruit for a long time, according to that which I have spoken. And when the time cometh that evil fruit shall again come into my vineyard, then will I cause the good and the bad to be gathered: And the good will I preserve unto myself; and the bad will I cast away into its own place. And then cometh the season and the end; and my vineyard will I cause to be burned with fire" (Jacob 3:150-153).

The works that we do in this life will come before the God who created us, to be judged either worthy to keep or to be cast off as undesirable.

Our God is a merciful God and has provided a clear path for us to follow where if we choose to walk down that path we will produce good fruit for our Creator to rejoice and savor in.

The Path that will Produce Good Fruit

"And the first-fruits of repentance is baptism; and baptism cometh by faith, unto the fulfilling the commandments; and the fulfilling the commandments bringeth remission of sins; and the remission of sins bringeth meekness, and lowliness of heart; and because of meekness and lowliness of heart, cometh the visitation of the Holy Ghost, which Comforter filleth with hope and perfect love, which love endureth by diligence unto prayer, until the end shall come, when all the saints shall dwell with God" (Moroni 8:29).

The Choice is Ours to Make

We recently attended Brother Norman Warfield's memorial service. We are reminded of the reality that we do not have an unlimited lifetime to work on our relationship with our heavenly father! We only have until the Lord determines we have had enough time to complete the tasks that He has set before us, or has need of us at His side. Or in the instance of evil forces we recall six people killed and many wounded at a political rally in Arizona. One of the victims was 9 years old.

If we read the prayer requests

on the CCEG we know that there are all different ages that are sick and some that may be in their last days or some that are waiting for organ transplants which generations ago was only a dream. I believe that God gives wisdom to doctors to do their work for our benefit and that they sometimes act as His hands. I was pleased to see a doctor on TV that said they can only do so much and that it is good and necessary to acknowledge miracles when they happen. We are not given to know why some lose their life early and others live long lives despite the ravages of disease or failing physical bodies. We grieve when we lose family and friends, especially before we think it is time!

However, do we use these opportunities to reflect on the nature of our relationship with God and Jesus Christ? We are known individually to our Creator. He is aware of the desires of our soul, whether they are righteous or if they are not. He knows every sin we have committed or thought about committing and He also knows when we allow His spirit to guide us to do that which is pleasing to Him. We have a level of protection that we are sometimes not aware of; for example, think about times you may have missed an accident or nearly fallen, or been injured. Do we think of this as luck or count it a blessing and share it as a testimony? God allows us to choose what to do and how to live our lives. He doesn't threaten to beat us over the head with something if we make poor choices.

Do we purchase life insurance? Will it make our life easier? Not really; however, it may reduce the worry about those we will leave behind and provide them with some money. Does money guarantee security? No, it does not! We should be more concerned with insuring our salvation by establishing a relationship with Jesus Christ. He promises to love us unconditionally, even when we mess up or lose our way. This doesn't mean He will not be disappointed or have sorrow as He watches us, but He is always ready to accept us back into the fold. Matthew 23:37 says,

"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!"

He has set up a system with a circuit breaker, or a master reset switch, if you will. A circuit breaker is designed to shut off a circuit if the load is too heavy and would cause danger to the system.

A master reset is similar to rebooting your computer when it is getting confused because it has been running too long and gets its bytes in a bind. It has to go back to square one and recheck its data and commands and sort everything out so it will function properly. We have a similar option when we get confused or have messed things up; it is called repentance. We should stop what we are doing and evaluate if we can safely continue on the path we are on. Maybe we will just bog down a bit while we sort things out, or perhaps we will have to make a fresh start. We may need to go back to the beginning and compare the commands with our functions to see if they balance or are going to cause conflicts. Satan likes to throw bad code or instructions at us and tell us it is okay, that it will function fine with our operating system. This is a lie. It does not work and eventually it will lead to the failure and corruption of our operating system. You may not think so, but a computer is a simple system that operates based on programmed instructions which it will follow precisely. When the instructions are in conflict it causes problems. We have precise instructions in the Bible and Book of Mormon and if we were to follow them explicitly we would have less conflicts and internal turmoil. In our society we are barraged with a variety of operating systems (religions or philosophies), each one saying it is the best. Some say they are new and improved to match the times and others say our programming will run with whatever you are using. If you have ever shopped for computer programs, commonly known as software, on the box will be a listing of minimum system requirements. This tells how much memory, processor

speed and graphics capability is needed and helps us to buy a program that is suitable for our machine's operating system and capabilities.

Our software, the Bible and Book of Mormon, have very simple minimum requirements. It only requires a desire to learn what is inside (instructions) and a willingness to incorporate the contents into our lives. This also means cleaning out the old and corrupt programs (SIN). This plan is compatible with legacy systems (those no longer made or are old fashioned) and all current models. The software differs from computer instructions in that it influences the user to conform to a set system rather than adapting the software to a variety of systems which causes many conflicts.

The Creator did not make different instructions for different people. He made them to apply to all people and situations! He prepared the path that would be best for us to follow. This path will lead us to walk in harmony with the gospel of Jesus Christ and to hold on to the rod of iron, not a thread of deceit that is blown about by every breeze that passes.

1st Nephi chapter 3, verses 23-87, tells of Nephi's desire to see the vision that his father Lehi had. It includes prophecy of the colonial Americans and the book they would have, the Bible. It shares the story of the birth of Jesus Christ and that He would be crucified for our sins. Verses 165-211 talk about the Bible and how many plain and precious things had been taken out of it by the great and abominable church, and testify to the coming forth of the Book of Mormon which would again give us the fullness of the Gospel. Verses 212-216 state,

whoso repenteth not, must perish; Therefore, wo, be unto the Gentiles, if it so be that they harden their hearts against the Lamb of God; For the time cometh, saith the Lamb of God, that I will work a great and a marvelous work among the children of men; A work which shall be everlasting, either on the one hand or on the other; Either to the convincing of them unto peace and life eternal, or unto the deliverance of them to the hardness of their hearts and the blindness of their minds, unto their being brought down into captivity and also unto destruction, both temporally and spiritually, according to the captivity of the devil, of which I have spoken."

Please read this entire chapter to get the complete thought, as it is too long to quote here.

We have the opportunity to be forgiven, which is different than hitting the delete key. Delete just removes the file from the table of contents but it is still in the book. When you are forgiven it is taken from the book too.

Here we have the admonition of what will befall us if we chose not to repent or use the reset switch, if we stay with the computer illustration. If a computer has bad or conflicting code it is not able to achieve the optimal performance it was designed for. When it is permanently powered down it will still have the bad code in it. When we die in our sins that is how we will be judged. If we die in righteousness we will be judged in righteousness!

We have the information or programming before us. Do we install it and protect it with the love and direction of our Savior, or do we stick with corrupted files that will never lead us to salvation?

A Lesson Learned, A Friend Remembered

bout 6-8 weeks ago my friend Norman Warfield told a story while a bunch of us guys were gathered together to watch our weekly football game on Monday night. Being a bit distracted at the time I didn't think much about it. I filed it away as a footnote or anecdote to be drawn upon if ever I were in a conversation which required a story prompting the listener to shake their heads and say, "No kidding? Huh!" and then move on.

More recently, the night Norman passed away, I was awake wrestling with worry as a bout with a few of my life's recent regrets pummeled my conscience. I remembered his story and a new perspective about charity began to shape my understanding. I would like to share my convictions with everybody, but first I need to tell Norman's story as I remembered it that night.

Norman and a few of his buddies were out camping/hiking in Arizona when

they happened upon a rattlesnake. Everyone took notice and decided that if we leave it alone, it will leave us alone; everyone, except someone known only to me as, "The Big Dummy."

—I would like to point out that there is a very good chance that "The Big Dummy" may read this and I would like to make clear that this is Norman's story, not mine, and he left you anonymous. Continuing...

Said dummy decided to

pick up the rattlesnake. I imagine the group watched with apprehension as he handled the venomous snake, but as evidenced by the look on Norman's face as he recounted the story so many years later, they were incredulous when he picked up a second rattler someone spotted slithering nearby.

At this point Norman paused for effect or for a response from the rest of us, but I was engrossed in the football game so I was not quite as astute as my brother who looked away from the game and said something equally incredulous. Just in case you are like me and you didn't get it right away either, I will explain. If you have ever picked up a snake, if you know anything about snakes, or if you have watched Crocodile Hunter enough times you would know that a snake wraps its body around whatever is holding it. With the second snake in his other hand, it is true that "The Big Dummy" was holding two snakes; conversely true is the fact that two poisonous snakes were now holding on to each of his arms. Yeah, let that sink in a little....

I have to digress here a bit and say that growing up in Phoenix, a few years back, I learned a *healthy respect* for rattlesnakes. Our home was close to the desert and I spent many hours building tumbleweed forts and tromping through the Western Diamondback's habitat. I have a *healthy* respect for them. When you are in the desert loading your older brother's BB gun and the BB's roll out the end of the barrel and onto a dried leaf you immediately jump as high and as far away as you can. Upon your eventual return to Earth and the return of a second rattling sound once more behind you and at a distance of the approximate length of the barrel of your older brother's BB gun, a *healthy* respect demands that you drop the gun and get outta there as fast as you can. Sorry big brother. Apology long overdue. :)

Norman explained that the rest of the group had a similar *healthy respect* and wanted nothing to do with the nasty little creatures, but "The Big Dummy" forced their hand. They were necessarily required to remove the snakes from his arms.

"We had to help him let go of the rattlesnakes." —Norman Warfield.

That's the story. Simple enough, kind of funny even. Metaphorically, I am "The Big Dummy." I make mistakes all the time. I get myself into problems that are easily avoided with a little charity and a lot of humility. I seem to be short of both. I am continually picking up snakes. I had an "A-Ha" moment that night. The embarrassing conviction that I would like to share is that I need charity. I am dependent upon it. I don't want to discuss what charity is. There are smarter people than I who can tackle that one. The simple scriptural answer we all know is that charity is the pure love of Christ. My testimony is that I cannot live without it.

I am "The Big Dummy" every time I sin. I need my fellow campers who are accompanying me on my journey. Without you I can't put the snakes down. That's Charity. That is why I need it. I don't need it for me. I need YOU to have it, for me.

If YOU lack charity for me...I will die.

That is why we have to have charity for one another. It is a lesson we have all been told. We have all spent time searching through the scriptures studying charity. The rattlesnake story was only an illustration, but it was one that I needed. It came at a time when I was holding onto a few rattlesnakes. It was a lesson learned, from a friend remembered.

Directions to Camp Far Westa from Kansas City:

Take Interstate 35 north to 36 Highway west at Cameron, Missouri. Continue west on 36 for approximately 10 miles. A sign for the Camp Far Westa will be on the right side of Highway 36. (The campgrounds are approximately 1 mile east of Stewartsville, Missouri.)

Transportation:

MISSION STATEMENT: The Church of Christ TEEN CAMP is committed to edifying all who attend through spiritual education and Godly Association in a fun and moral atmosphere. Commitment to this goal will create an environment where the youth will be invited and encouraged to engage in a spiritual commitment that will help to equip them to take their place in the service of Jesus Christ.

CAMP RULES are to facilitate the camp mission and maintain the safety and well-being of all campers and staff. Campers who do not obey the rules will be subject to disciplinary action which may include being sent home at their parent's expense.

- 1. You are expected to behave in a Christian manner at all times.
- 2. You are expected to obey all safety rules.
- 3. You are expected to participate in all classes and activities.
- 4. You are expected to stay with the group unless special permission is given. Pairing off or groups found in unapproved areas will not be tolerated.
- 5. Sexual misconduct will not be tolerated.
- 6. You are expected to remain on the camp grounds at all times.
- 7. You are expected to wear modest apparel at all times. Inappropriate clothing includes bikini swimsuits, tank tops with straps less than 1.5 inches or with drooping armholes, T-shirts with inappropriate slogans or innuendo, concert T-shirts, shirts that expose the midriff or short shorts. All campers are required to wear a colored T-shirt while in the swimming pool.
- 8. You are expected to turn in all prescription medication to the camp nurse.
- 9. You are expected to leave all body piercing jewelry at home, including gages (girls can wear one pair of earrings in their ears).
- 10. You are expected to turn your vehicle keys over to the Camp Director if you drive to Camp. Keys will be returned when Camp is over. Access to vehicles will not be allowed during Camp. Vehicles will be parked in designated areas.




Sarah Elizabeth Olson born 12-27-10
