



Youth: The Future and the NOW

have often heard many of us speak about the future of the Church of Christ and mention our youth are the future. This year as we celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Teen Camp, I feel to write to the parents of those who are 12 to 18 years of age, and even parents of young men and women up into their 20s, or anyone starting families of their own. should the real work begin with our youth? The Lord gave us the first examples of where He starts working with our youth.

Jeremiah 1:4-7: "Then the word of the Lord came unto me, saying, Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations. Then said I, Ah, Lord God! behold, I cannot speak: for I am a child. But the Lord said unto me, Say not, I am a child: for thou shalt go to all that I shall send thee, and whatsoever I command thee thou shalt speak."

Mark 10:13-16: "And they brought young children to him, that he should touch them: and his disciples rebuked those that brought them. But when Jesus saw it, he was much displeased, and said unto them, Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God. Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God

as a little child, he shall not enter therein. And he took them up in his arms, put his hands upon them, and blessed them."

III Nephi 8:23-26: "And when he had said these words, he wept, and the multitude bear record of it, and he took their little children, one by one, and blessed them, and prayed unto the Father for them. And when he had done this he wept again, and he spake unto the multitude, and saith unto them, Behold your little ones. And as they looked to behold, they cast their eyes towards heaven, and they saw the beavens open, and they saw angels descending out of heaven as it were, in the midst of fire; and they came down and encircled those little ones about; And they were encircled about with fire; and the angels did minister unto them, and the multitude did see and hear, and bear record; and they know that their record is true, for they all of them did see and hear, every man for himself..."

These three scriptural examples remind us God is inter-

ested in us even before we are born, and once we have been placed here on earth, He desires to bless us and our future. It reminds us that we have been created for a purpose in God and He will strive to help us accomplish that purpose. There are so many examples in scripture of God using children to accomplish all kinds of marvelous things. Let us consider some young men and women who played an important part in God's plan, encouraging our faith today through what we read about them. Some were as young as eight years old when responsibility was thrust upon them.

II Chronicles 34:1-3: "Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned in Jerusalem one and thirty years. And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the ways of David his father, and declined neither to the right hand, nor to the left. For in the eighth year of his reign, while he was yet young, he began to seek after the God of David his father: and in the twelfth year he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem from the high places, and the groves, and the carved images, and the molten images."

Josiah was 16 years old when he began to seek after God, and he became the last and most righteous king in the kingdom of Judah. The space and time would fail me to tell of all those written about, but see if you remember the stories of a few of these godly young men and women who did a mighty work for the

Lord. Do you remember these names in your scriptures? Moses, David, Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego, Ruth, Esther, Mary, Timothy, Titus, Nephi, Alma II, sons of Mosiah, Helaman, Moroni, Mormon, and many others all began doing a mighty work for God in their youth.

Sometimes, I wonder if we really believe God will use our sons and daughters for His great purposes. We forget it requires parents to take seriously the responsibility given to them by God. Fathers have a great responsibility—one to which they will ultimately answer to God.

Ephesians 6:4: "And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord."

Deuteronomy 6:5-7: "And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up."

God reminded the children of Israel what was required to bring their children up in the nurture and admonition of God. It requires a commitment of your time and your life: giving time to your children not just for sporting activities, but most especially for sharing Christ and His words that guide our lives. This must

be done first by example, and then by sharing Christ day by day with them. Even though fathers will ultimately answer to God for the spiritual upbringing of their children, also remember mothers have a great responsibility in this, and often have more time to help prepare them for what they may have to face or do for the Lord someday. Mothers, if you knew your children would face some great peril in their lives, would you try to prepare them? Most of you have heard the many prophecies of the latter days and the days preceding the return of Christ, and we are all reminded that these days would try our faith. Are you mothers and fathers taking time to prepare your children and young people for the future? One of my favorite stories about youth is in the Book of Mormon and reminds us that if we take serious effort to prepare our children it may bless and preserve them in their future.

In the 26th chapter of the book of Alma in the Book of Mormon there is a story recorded about 2,000 young men that were sons of a group of people called the Anti-Nephi-Lehites who had been Lamanites, but were converted to the Lord through the work of Ammon and the sons of Mosiah. They had made a covenant with God that they would never kill again with a sword, because of the many murders they had committed before they were converted to the Lord. This group of people had been given a place in the land of the Nephites to live and became numbered with the Nephites. In the beginning of this chapter, we read that the Lamanites had come into the land and were making war with the Nephites and were very successful. The Anti-Nephi-Lehi group was being protected by the lives of their Nephite brethren. The fathers of these young men were about to break their covenant with God and take up arms against their enemies to assist the Nephites in driving the enemies from their lands. But Helaman convinced them not to break their covenant with God. These people had 2,000 sons who had never made that covenant not to kill. They took up their weapons of war and asked Helaman to lead them in assisting their brethren, the Nephites. against their enemies. Later, another 60 young men were added to their number. From this point, I am going to take a few excerpts from this chapter to finish their story and capture the results of two different battles and the outcome of these young men.

Alma 26:10-11: "For behold, in the twenty and sixth year, I Helaman, did march at the head of these two thousand young men, to the city of Judea, to assist Antipus, whom ye had appointed a leader over the people of that part of the land. And I did join my two thousand sons (for they are wor-

thy to be called sons) to the army of Antipus; in which strength Antipus did rejoice exceedingly; for behold, his army had been reduced by the Lamanites because their forces had slain a vast number of our men; for which cause we have to mourn."

Alma 26:50-58: "And it came to pass that again when the light of the morning came, we saw the Lamanites upon us, and we did flee before them. But it came to pass that they did not pursue us far, before they halted; and it was in the morning of the third day, on the seventh month. And now whether they were overtaken by Antipus, we knew not; but I said unto my men, Behold, we know not but they have halted for the purpose that we should come against them, that they might catch us in their snare; therefore what say ye, my sons, will ye go against them to battle? And now I say unto you my beloved brother, Moroni, that never had I seen so great courage, nay, not amongst all the Nephites. For as I had ever called them my sons, (for they were all of them very young,) even so they said unto me, Father, behold, our God is with us, and he will not suffer that we shall fall; then let us go forth; We would not slay our brethren, if they would let us alone; therefore let us go, lest they should overpower the army of Antipus. Now they never had fought, yet they did not fear death: and they did think more upon the liberty of their fathers, than they did upon their lives; yea, they had been taught by their mothers, that if they did not doubt, that God would deliver them. And they rehearsed unto me the words of their mothers, saying, We do not doubt our mothers knew. And it came to pass that I did return with my two thousand, against these Lamanites who had pursued us."

Alma 26:64-67: "And now it came to pass that we, the people of Nephi, the people of Antipus, and I with my

two thousand, did surround the Lamanites, and did slay them; yea, insomuch that they were compelled to deliver up their weapons of war, and also themselves as prisoners of war. And now it came to pass that when they had surrendered themselves up unto us, behold, I numbered those young men who had fought with me, fearing lest there were many of them slain. But behold, to my great joy, there had not one soul of them fallen to the earth; yea, and they had fought as if with the strength of God; yea, never were men known to have fought with such miraculous strength; And with such mighty power did they fall upon the Lamanites, that they did frighten them; and for this cause did the Lamanites deliver themselves up as prisoners of war."

Alma 26:92-104: "For behold, Ammoron had sent to their support a new supply of provisions, and also a numerous army of men. And it came to pass that those men whom we sent with the prisoners, did arrive in season to check them, as they were about to overpower us. But behold, my little band of two thousand and sixty, fought most desperately; yea, they were firm before the Lamanites, and did administer death unto all those who opposed them; And as the remainder of our army were about to give way before the Lamanites, behold, those two thousand and sixty were firm and undaunted; yea, and they did obey and observe to perform every word of command with exactness; Yea, and even according to their faith, it was done unto them; and I did remember the words which they said unto me that their mothers had taught them. And now behold, it was these, my sons, and those men who had been selected to convey the prisoners, to whom we owe this great victory; for it was they who did beat the Lamanites; therefore they were driven back to the

city of Manti. And we retained our city Cumeni, and were not all destroyed by the sword; nevertheless, we had suffered great loss. And it came to pass that after the Lamanites had fled, I immediately gave orders that my men who had been wounded should be taken from among the dead, and caused that their wounds should be dressed. And it came to pass that there were two hundred, out of my two thousand and sixty, who had fainted because of the loss of blood; Nevertheless, according to the goodness of God, and to our great astonishment, and also the joy of our whole army, there was not one soul of them who did perish; yea, and neither was there one soul among them who had not received many wounds. And now, their preservation was astonishing to our whole army; yea, that they should be spared, while there was a thousand of our brethren who were slain. And we do justly ascribe it to the miraculous power of God, because of their exceeding faith in that which they had been taught to believe, that there was a just God; and whosoever did not doubt, that they should be preserved by his marvelous power. Now this was the faith of these of whom I have spoken; they are young, and their minds are firm; and they do put their trust in God continually."

Forgive the length of the quotes, but I hope you got caught up in the story. Mothers and fathers, I know you love your children and I encourage you to give them a faith and trust in God from your teachings at home. There are many things coming and you have an opportunity to prepare them, just as these mothers prepared their sons for a time when they would be called upon to do something

that would require great faith and trust in God.

The Teen Camp, still after 25 years, wants to be part of your youth's life. We hope to encourage them and assist you in showing them the joy of fellowship with those of like mind and the joy of serving God. The staff at Teen Camp continues to pray for you, parents. You have an awesome, but worthy, task before you. Today, I encourage you to take seriously the responsibility God has placed upon you and make the most important activities in the life of your kids those activities that strengthen their faith and trust in God. Reject the idea that just spending time is important and all that they need. How we spend our time and what effect that has on our children should be the most important concern about their spiritual well-being. It will define them today, in the future, and in the role God will have in their life.

I want to end by telling you that during our sacrament service this January 5, 2014, three children in our congregation bore a testimony as they felt led by the Spirit of God. What a blessing we felt in that service. Your youth are called to take their place and share their faith in God right now. Do not wait for a better time to encourage them in God's desire for them and what He wants their lives and service to be. I was so blessed

by God to be told by my dad from my earliest memories that God had a work for me to do, and I might very well be the next Nephi or another man of great faith in God and given an important task in service to God. I want to leave you with the words of a father who wrote to his son, the words of life which came from the love he had for God and the great love for his son. May these words encourage you in the task of raising godly young men and women for a light to this generation is my prayer.

Alma 17:68-70 "O remember my son, and learn wisdom in thy youth; yea, learn in thy youth to keep the commandments of God; yea, and cry unto God for all thy support; Yea, let all thy doings be unto the Lord, and whithersoever thou goest, let it be in the Lord; yea, let thy thoughts be directed unto the Lord; yea, let the affections of thy heart be placed upon the Lord for ever; counsel the Lord in all thy doings, and he will direct thee for good: Yea, when thou liest down at night, lie down unto the Lord, that he may watch over you in your sleep; and when thou riseth in the morning, let thy heart be full of thanks unto God; and if ye do these things, ye shall be lifted up at the last day."

The First Church That Was Built On The Temple Lot



The little meeting house shown in the picture above was built in 1887, and was the first building ever erected on the Temple Lot. The Searchlight tells us -- "For almost fifty years" the surrounding ground or lots were bought and sold and houses were erected upon them, "but for some reason no one ever built upon the Temple Lot." (Vol. 1, No.2, p. 5.)

For eleven years the membership worshiped in this little building and held their conferences therein, but on September 4, 1898, a demented individual burned the building. Four years later it was replaced by the structure that stands upon the Temple Lot today.

In this picture were such well known names as Geo. P. Frisbey, Richard Hill, J. R. Haldeman, Geo. D. Cole.

The Saints Return to the Land of Zion

The Revelation given to Granville Hedrick, April 24, 1864: "Hear,O ye people, and hearken to the counsel of your Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, who are called by My name and keep My commandments, you who have sought to know My will concerning My people, who have professed My name, and entered into the new and everlasting covenant to keep all the counsels and commandments of the only true and living God; hear, then, these things which are revealed unto you by the power of His holy spirit; prepare, O ye people, yourselves in all things, that ye may be ready to gather together upon the consecrated land which I have appointed and dedicated by My servant Joseph Smith and the first elders of My church, in Jackson County, state of Missouri, for the gathering together of My saints, that they might be assembled in the day of My chastening hand, when your Lord will pour out His wrath and indignation upon the ungodly. And inasmuch as My church and people have been driven and scattered, therefore take counsel of Me, your Lord and director, who says unto you: Prepare yourselves and be ready against the appointed time which I have set and prepared for you, that you may return in the year A. D. 1867, at which time the Lord, by your prayers and faithfulness in all things, will open and prepare a way before you that you may begin to gather at that time" (from the Truth Teller, vol. 1, No. 1, p. 4).

From the Outline History: "After receiving the revelation of Granville Hedrick, given April 24, 1864, in which they were instructed to prepare for the gathering to Jackson County, Missouri, we find, in spite of many hindrances, and much opposition, that by the winter of 1866-67, the saints in Woodford County, Illinois, began their migration to Missouri. A caravan was formed consisting of several covered wagons, which traveled in the dead of winter across Illinois and Missouri to the Missouri River, arriving at Independence, Missouri, in February, 1867. When the first caravan reached the Missouri River, opposite Blue Mills, they found the river frozen from shore to shore, and covered with several inches of snow and slush. Some of the members hesitated about crossing for fear the ice would break through and property and lives would be lost. Elder George P. Frisbey, who seemed to be in the lead, admonished them that the Lord promised to 'prepare the way' for their return, and expressed his faith by driving out on the ice amidst much anxiety and the prayers of the other members of the caravan. He proceeded on his journey, the wheels of his heavy wagon leaving a deep track in the melting snow, until he reached the Jackson County side of the Missouri. A great cheer went up from the others, and one by one they spaced their wagons, and proceeded to follow the track of Elder Frisbey, until all had safely crossed on the ice without loss of life or property. They landed near Blue Mills, which is northeast of Independence, Missouri, and from there proceeded to their destination."

Many of those fifty-seven saints from Woodford County, Illinois, who made this trip to "Zion" were pictured in this photo of the first building ever built on the Temple Lot property. This photo was used for the cover of a 1938 Zion's Advocate, and sister Angela Wheaton, who was a Frisbey family descendant, listed the names of those original travelers she knew of that had traveled to Missouri in 1867.

Young People's Camp



The Yucatan Young People's Camp of the Church of Christ was held from July 25 to 28, 2013. The theme was "Let's Clean Our Hearts" (Matthew 5:8). The camp took place at an ecological hotel in the town of Dzan, Yucatan. During the days of duration, the young people had the great opportunity to have Bible studies, fasting, bonfire, youth themes, times for praise, conferences, workshops, etc., that were of great use in spiritual and temporal life.

Ministers attending: Ronnie Gill, Felipe Uluac and Darin Crull talked about the central theme of the camp. Plácido K. Matú had the responsibility of the conferences, which were very interesting. The subjects were: greed, envy, anger, idleness, gluttony, impurity and pride. These are things that can make the hearts of young people unclean.

Francis Evelin Nahuat Koyoc, an active young person in the church, taught a theme to the campers: "Making Decisions During Adolescence." Plácido K. Matú expounded to the campers between 17 and 22 years old: "Secrets for a Happy Marriage."

A workshop, "Growing Together," also taught by Francis Evelin, was interesting

for the campers. Techniques were taught on how to care for newborn babies. These are things that they will need when they become parents. Another activity of interest which they will not forget was that on the first day of camp they were given an egg to keep. They had to keep it clean and carry it to all the activities. Any group which was careless with this object, got it dirty or broke it, would lose the competition. This caught their attention because any small careless act would make their hearts impure rapidly and could destroy it or make it irreparable.



Vicente Poot Puc

September 1, 1925~January 17, 2014

Ticente was born in Ticul, Yucatan, in 1925. Life was difficult for poor Mayan people in those days. At an early age he was working from daylight to dark six days a week. On his one free day he was in the tropical forest caring for his cornfield or hunting wild animals for food for the family. Vicente was married to Agustina Serralta in 1946. They had five children. Vicente had very little formal education, but to hear him speak one would never guess it. I first met Vicente in my second visit to Yucatan. He came to the room Betty and I were renting and spent the afternoon trying to converse with us. It was difficult for him to converse with someone who spoke no Maya and just a little Spanish, but he was patient and persevered. A few days after Betty and I left Yucatan, he and his wife were baptized in August of 1954 by Brother Clarence Wheaton. Vicente taught himself to read English and received the Advocate. He had committed the Scriptures to memory. When I returned to Yucatan in 1970 with Apostle Leon Yates, Vicente and his family had settled in a small village in the rain forest of Quintana Roo. He had built a



large, thatched-roof home on a large tract of land. He had a big patch of corn, bananas and other tropical fruit trees. He had several rows of pineapples, strawberries, tomatoes and other vegetables. He hunted deer, both for the family and to sell. Vicente was then an elder in the church and the pastor in this town of Chunhuhub. He had converted a large congregation of believers, and they had built a church building in which to meet. Vicente was called to be an evangelist in June of 1974 by Bro. Yates. He was always reaching out to new people in new towns. Bro. Yates and I walked with him 17 km. to hold services in a village. Several families were converted and now have established the large congregation of Cancun. Vicente had great musical talent. He has written many beautiful hymns. Twenty-two of them are in our Spanish hymnal. Apostle Jay Moser and I owe Vicente a debt of gratitude, if not our lives. We were visiting the church in Cancun where Vicente also acted as pastor. That night he was inside the house of a member and we were sleeping in our camper on the street. About 2:00 A.M. there was a pounding on our door. It was a band of well-armed outlaws or narco-trafficers. They forced us out into the street. One of them made me get back inside to show him where our money, or drugs, was located. Just as the man was threatening me with a knife I heard a familiar voice. It was Brother Vicente. He had waded right into the middle of this group of armed men and did a great job of encouraging them to get in their vehicles and leave two missionaries alone. There are many people who will always remember Brother Vicente Poot.
